TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and Marlins continue a four-game set tonight with the 14th of 19 meetings between the clubs...This is Atlanta's last trip to Miami this season...The clubs will meet again at SunTrust Park on August 20-21 to wrap up the season series.

The Braves went 14-5 (.737) against the Marlins last season, matching the franchise record for most single-season victories against Florida/Miami... The tied the mark first set in 2004 and matched in 2012...The Braves are 10-3 this season against Miami with six more games to go.

Last night's loss to Miami snapped the Braves' franchise-record seven-game winning streak in Florida/Miami...Despite the defeat, the Braves are 47-24 (.662) here, the best record by any National League team in Marlins Park...Among all major league teams that have played double-digit games here, they rank second...Tampa Bay is 13-6 (.684).

RH Julio Teheran is set to make his 24th career start against the Marlins, and the righty is 8-6 with a 3.72 ERA (57 ER/138.0 IP) in these games... He is 6-4 with 3.22 ERA (26 ER/72.2 IP) in 12 games, all starts, on the road against the Marlins.

LH Caleb Smith is 1-1 with a 4.15 ERA (8 ER/17.1 IP) in three career games, all starts, against the Braves...The lefty has faced the Braves twice this season, winning his only decision in his last start on July 6 at SunTrust Park...The lefty went 6.0 innings, allowing four runs, three earned, in a 5-4 victory.

ROSTER MOVE: The Braves today recalled RHP Patrick Weigel from Triple-A Gwinnett after optioning RHP Jeremy Walker to the Stripers following last night's game.

Weigel makes his second appearance on the active roster after the club recalled him on July 19 until optioning him on July 21...He did not appear in a game during that stint, and will be making his MLB debut when he enters a game.

Weigel appeared in 22 games, 17 starts, across two levels of the Braves' minor league system this season, going 5-2 with a 2.67 ERA (20 ER/67.1 IP)...He last pitched on August 6 at Rochester, going 2.0 scoreless innings with three strikeouts and no walks allowed.

Walker tossed 65 pitches in relief last night, going 3.1 innings and allowing five hits and one run.

SERIES OPENER: The Braves lost the opening game for the third time in their last four series...Overall, they are 19-19 in these games.

The club is 49-30 (.620) in all other games this season.

The Braves are 23-9-5 in series play this season, after winning 24 series all last season.

30 HOME RUNS: OF Ronald Acuña Jr. drove a 1-1 pitch out to right-center field in the eighth inning last night for his 30th home run of the season...He became the fourth player in Braves history to reach that milestone in a season prior to his 22nd birthday and the first since Andruw Jones in 1998.

The other two players are Bob Horner and Eddie Mathews.

Acuña Jr. is now four stolen bases away from a 30/30 season...He is looking to become the second player in baseball history to have at least 30 home runs and 30 stolen bases in a season prior to his 22nd birthday...The only player to do so was Mike Trout, who had 30 home runs and 49 stolen bases as a 20-year-old in 2012.

Only three other Braves have gone 30/30 at any age, with OF Ron Gant doing it last in 1990 and 1991.

OF Hank Aaron was the first to do so, accomplishing the feat in 1963, while OF Dale Murphy also did it in 1983.

Acuña Jr. is on pace for 42 home runs and 36 stolen bases...Only four players have ever gone 40/40 in a season, with the last being Alfonso Soriano in 2006...Jose Canseco was the first to do so in 1988, while Barry Bonds (1996) and Alex Rodriguez (1998) also accomplished the feat.

TEHERAN VS. MIAMI: RHP Julio Teheran has pitched exactly 6.0 scoreless innings in each of his three starts against the Marlins this season, allowing just nine hits and five walks while striking out 15.

Teheran is the first pitcher in franchise history to make three consecutive scoreless starts of at least 6.0 innings versus Miami.

Teheran's run is just the fourth time since 1908 that a Braves starter has had three straight such starts against one opponent in a single season...Warren Spahn first did so against Cincinnati in 1947, before Pete Smith did it against the Cubs in 1988...John Smoltz matched them in 2006 with three straight such starts against San Diego.

He is just the second pitcher in major league history with at least three straight scoreless starts of at least 6.0 innings against Miami...Stephen Strasburg did so in four straight starts from 2011-2012.

Atlanta has two wins this season by a 1-0 score, and both have come in starts by Teheran against Miami.

DONALDSON STREAKS: 3B Josh Donaldson doubled last night to extend his hitting streak to a season-high 11 games...Donaldson is batting (13-for-39) with three home runs during his run, which dates to July 29.

Donaldson's career-long hit streak is 12 games, done from August 21-September 3, 2016.

Donaldson's streak is the second-longest active run in the National League...San Diego's Fernando Tatis Jr. has a 12-game run.

- A* Makes his 25th start of 2019...Is the 221st appearance of his career, and his 218th start.
- A* Faces Miami for the 24th time in his career, and for the fourth time this season...Is 8-6 with a 3.72 ERA (57 ER/138.0 IP) over his first 23 starts against the Marlins.
- A* Has not allowed a run against them this season...Is 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER/18.0 IP) in three starts.
- A* Has pitched exactly 6.0 scoreless innings in each of his three starts against the Marlins this season, allowing just nine hits and five walks while striking out 15.
- A* Is the first pitcher in franchise history to make three consecutive scoreless starts of at least 6.0 innings versus Miami.
- A* Teheran's run is just the fourth time since 1908 that a Braves starter has had three straight such starts against one opponent in a single season...Warren Spahn first did so against Cincinnati in 1947, before Pete Smith did it against the Cubs in 1988...John Smoltz matched them in 2006 with three straight such starts against San Diego.

- A* Among pitchers with as many starts against the East, Teheran's 2.77 ERA is third lowest...Only Patrick Corbin (2.65) and Jacob deGrom (2.73) have been better against their own division.
- A* Started against Kansas City on July 24, and held the Royals to four hits and two unearned runs over 6.0 innings.
- A* The start was his 13th of the season allowing one earned run or fewer, tied for second most in the majors among traditional starters...Only the Dodgers' Hyun-Jin Ryu (15) has more.
- A* Ryne Stanek had 25 such starts while opening for the Rays.
- A* The Atlanta-franchise record for such starts is 20, set by Greg Maddux in 2002.

2019 Recap

- A* Beat Washington, July 30, for his 73rd career win...Moved into sole possession of 10th place in Atlanta franchise history, passing Steve Avery (72).
- A* Since Teheran's first full season in 2013, no pitcher has made more starts for a single team than he has for Atlanta.
- A* Made his first start after the All-Star break, 7/13 at SD...Allowed three hits and three runs (two earned) over 6.0 innings in Atlanta's 7-5 win.
- A* Went 5-6 with a 3.75 ERA (42 ER/100.2 IP) in 19 starts before the break.
- A* For his career, is 29-27 with a 3.47 ERA (197 ER/511.0 IP) in 86 appearances, 83 starts, after the break...Is 44-42 with a 3.72 ERA in 133 games before the break.
- A* Made his third start of the season against Miami, 7/5 and fired 6.0 scoreless innings...Took a no-decision in Atlanta's walkoff win, 1-0.
- A* Has yet to allow a run to the Marlins this season, tossing 18.0 scoreless innings over three starts...Atlanta has two wins this season by a 1-0 score, and both have come in Teheran's starts against Miami.
- A* Was his 11th start this season allowing one earned run or fewer, tied for the most such outings among traditional starters in the majors...LAD's Hyun-Jin Ryu, TB's Charlie Morton and CIN's Luis Castillo also have 11.
- A* Ryne Stanek has 25 such outings opening for the Rays.
- A* Allowed eight hits and six earned runs, 6/18 vs. NYM...The outing stopped a streak of eight straight starts in which he allowed one earned run or less.
- A* His run of one-run starts spanned from May 5 to June 13, during which he ranked second in the majors with a 0.81 ERA (4 ER/44.2 IP)...Trailed just Hyun-Jin Ryu of the Dodgers (0.53 ERA).
- A* Teheran's eight-game streak was tied for the longest in the majors by a traditional starter this season, mathing a run by his rotation-mate Mike Soroka...TB's Ryne Stanek has a 14-game run while opening for the Rays.
- A* Made his 200th career start, 4/30 vs. SD...Allowed five hits and four runs over a season-most 7.0 innings.
- A* Became the ninth Braves pitcher to make 200 starts for the club since the team moved to Atlanta in 1966...Joins Phil Niekro (594), Tom Glavine (518), John Smoltz (466), Greg Maddux (363), Tim Hudson (243), Rick Mahler (218), Ron Reed (203) and Steve Avery (201).

Jerry Blevins • LHP • 6-6 • 190 • 35 yrs • #50

Saves/Opp: 0/0 **Holds:** 7 **1st Batter/Retired:** 30/23 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 14/4

- Is 1-0 with 3.42 ERA (9 ER/23.2 IP) in 31 games with Atlanta...Twenty-six of his 31 appearances have been scoreless, including 13 of his last 15.
- On July 27 celebrated 10 years of major league service time.
- Allowed four earned runs in 1.0 inning , 5/7 at LAD...Has a 2.08 ERA (5 ER/21.2 IP) in his other 29 games.
- Seventeen of his 31 appearances have been less than 1.0 inning.
- Holding left-handed batters to a .154 (6-for-39) average with 12 strikeouts...Righties are 12-for-49 (.245) with 15 strikeouts.
- Atlanta acquired him from the Oakland A's on 4/28 in exchange for cash considerations...Was designated for assignemnt by Atlanta on 5/14 and re-signed to a major league contract on 5/18.

Shane Greene • RHP • 6-4 • 200 • 30 yrs • #19

Saves/Opp: 0/1 **Holds:** 0 **1st Batter/Retired:** 3/1 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 0/0

- Made his Braves debut on 8/3 vs. CIN, allowing a run in the ninth inning to blow a save...Has allowed a run in each of his three games with the Braves.
- Acquired from Detroit on July 31 in exchange for LHP Joey Wentz and OF Travis Demeritte...Prior to joining the Braves ranked fourth in the American League with his 22 saves, while his 1.18 ERA was the second lowest in baseball to San Diego's Kirby Yates among qualifying relievers.
- Was 0-2 with 22 saves and a 1.18 ERA (5 ER/38.0 IP) with 43 strikeouts and 12 walks in 38 games out of the bullpen for the Tigers this season.
- Finished tied for fourth in the league with 32 saves in 2018,
- Originally drafted by the Yankees in the 15th round of the 2009 First-Year Player Draft out of Daytona State College in Florida, Greene made his major league debut with New York in 2014...He worked mostly as a starter that season, and converted full-time to a relief role in 2017.

Luke Jackson • RHP • 6-2 • 210 • 27 yrs • #77

Saves/Opp: 17/24 **Holds:** 3 **1st Batter/Retired:** 50/34 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 18/8

- Is 6-2 with a 3.78 ERA (22 ER/52.0 IP) in 50 games this season...Has converted 17 of his 24 save chances after logging just one career save prior to 2019...His seven blown saves are tied for the most in the majors.
- Fanned all three batters he faced, 8/3 vs. CIN, to collect his sixth win of the season in his first appearance since the club acquired RHP Shane Greene at the trade deadline.
- Earned his 17th save, 7/15 at Milwaukee...Has four saves of at least 1.1 innings.
- Left-handers have just 14 hits in 77 at-bats (.182) against him...Righties are hitting .310 (40-for-129).
- Has fanned 70 batters in 52.0 innings for a career-best 12.19 SO/9.0 IP ratio.
- Recorded his second consecutive two-inning save, 5/15 vs. STL, to become the first Braves closer with back-to-back two-inning saves since Hall of Famer John Smoltz in 2002

- Surrendered a two-run home run at Minnesota on 8/6 for his third loss of the season and first with Atlanta.
- Acquired from Texas on July 30 from the Texas Rangers in exchange for LHP Kolby Allard...Made his Braves debut on 8/2 vs. CIN with a perfect eighth inning.
- Went 0-2 with a 3.08 ERA (13 ER/38.0 IP) in 38 games out of the bullpen for Texas this season with 43 strikeouts and just four walks.
- Before joining Atlanta, had a rate of 0.95 BB/9 which ranked fifth best among qualifying relievers in the majors.
- Was in his second season with the Rangers, joining Texas as a free agent in December of 2017... He spent the previous two years in Japan from 2015-2017, while also playing for Colorado and New York (AL).
