TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY
May 11, 2006: Hideki Matsui fractures his left wrist and is removed from the game in the top of the first inning vs. Boston. According to Rule 10.24 (c), his 1,768 consecutive-games-played streak as a professional (1,250 with the Yomiuri Giants and 518 with the Yankees) comes to an end. His streak as a Yankee is the longest since Lou Gehrig's (2,130).
May 11, 1903: In the fifth inning of the Highlanders' 8-2 victory at Detroit's Bennett Park, first baseman John Gangel hits the first home run in Yankees franchise history, an inside-the-park solo homer off Tigers pitcher George Mullin.
TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY
May 12, 1953: Whitey Ford throws a one-hit complete game shutout against Cleveland at Yankee Stadium, allowing his only hit to Cleveland pitcher Early Wynn (6th inning single) as the Yankees win 7-0.
May 12, 1925: Yogi Berra is born in St. Louis, Mo. A three-time American League MVP and 10-time World Series champion, Berra was elected to the Hall of Fame in 1972.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees continue their six-game road trip today with the final game of a three-game set at the Athletics (1-1 thus far)...will also play a three-game set at Seattle (Mon.-Wed.)...following this road trip, will return home for a six-game homestand featuring three-game series vs. the Mets (5/16-18) and Texas (5/20-22).

- Have won three of their last four games (since 5/6).
- Their +65 run differential this season is the second-highest in the Majors, trailing only Detroit (+77).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees fell to the Athletics, 11-7, on Saturday at Sutter Health Park...**Yankees pitchers** allowed a season-high 11R...**LHP Carlos Rodón** (6.0IP, 8H, 4R/ER, 0BB, 10K, 2HR) started and did not record a decision...**DH Aaron Judge** (2-for-5, 2R, 2HR, 3RBI) recorded his 41st career multi-HR game and second of the season, hitting solo home runs in the fourth and sixth innings...**PH/3B Oswaldo Cabrera** (0-for-1, 1RBI, 1SF) and **C Austin Wells** (0-for-1, 1RBI, 1BB, 1HP, 1SF) each hit sac flies in the sixth inning...**3B/2B Oswald Peraza** (1-for-3, 1R, 1HR, 2RBI) hit a go-ahead two-run HR in the sixth inning... **RHP Fernando Cruz** (0.2IP, 3H, 3R/ER, 2K, 1HR) took his first loss of the season after allowing a go-ahead three-run HR to Shea Langeliers in the seventh inning.

GOOD AS GOLD: INF **Paul Goldschmidt** has hit safely in 26 of his last 33 games (since 4/4), batting .354/.399/.480 (45-for-127) with 18R, 7 doubles, 3HR, 16RBI, 10BB/11BB, 2SB and 1SF.

- **Has hit safely in each of his 18 road games this year, batting .423/.458/.551 (33-for-78) with 12R, 4 doubles, 2HR, 8RBI, 5BB and 1SB...is one of only five Yankees in franchise history to hit safely in his first 18 road games of the season**, joining Derek Jeter (23G in 2007), Jack Lelivelt (21G in 1912), Ben Chapman (18G in 1933) and Patsy Dougherty (18G in 1904)...his 18-game road hitting streak is the longest by a Yankee since Derek Jeter's 44-game streak from 8/20/06-5/28/07.
- Has hit .441/.512/.588 (15-for-34) with 2 doubles, 1HR, 14RBI, 5BB/21BB, 1HP and 1SF with RISP this year...with RISP this season, is tied for fourth in the Majors in hits (tied for second in AL), ranks ninth in BA (fifth in AL) and tied for ninth in OBP (fourth in AL).
- Has reached base safely in 30 of his 39 games this season, batting .340/.391/.476 (50-for-147) with 23R, 8 doubles, 4HR, 18RBI, 12BB/21BB, 1HP, 1SF and 2SB.
- Ranks second in the Majors in multi-hit games (17, second in AL), ranks third in BA (third in AL) and tied for fifth in hits (tied for fifth in AL)...also ranks sixth in the AL in OBP.

HIGH VOLTAGE: INF **Anthony Volpe** has hit safely in his last 14 games vs. the Athletics (since 5/9/23), batting .373/.422/.576 (22-for-59) with 8R, 2 doubles, 2 triples, 2HR, 9RBI, 4BB, 1HP and 3SB over that span.

MERRY GRISHMAS: OF **Trent Grisham** tripled on Saturday at the Athletics, his first triple since 7/1/23 at Cincinnati with San Diego...is hitting .304/.353/.413 (14-for-46) with 8R, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 5RBI, 4BB, 1SF and 1SB in 13 career games vs. the Athletics.

- Is hitting .276/.366/.612 (27-for-98) with 21R, 1 double, 1 triple, 10HR, 20RBI, 13BB and 1HP in 33 games this season...has 10HR in 33 games this season after hitting 9HR in 76 games in 2024.
- Seven of his 10HR this season have either tied the game (one) or given the Yankees the lead (six).
- Has 6HR in his last 15 games (since 4/19).
- Is tied for fourth in the Majors in game-winning RBI (six, tied for second in AL), tied for sixth in go-ahead RBI (eight, tied for second in AL) and tied for seventh in HR (tied for third in AL).

PERAZA POWER: INF **Oswald Peraza** hit a go-ahead two-run HR in the sixth inning on Saturday at the Athletics...is hitting .364/.500/.455 (4-for-11) with 1 double, 3RBI and 3BB with RISP this season.

MATCHING UP: The Yankees are 11-4 vs. the Athletics since 2023, 16-6 since 2022 and 20-9 since 2021.

ALL RISE: OF **Aaron Judge** **recorded his 41st career multi-HR game and second of the season (also 3HR on 3/29 vs. Milwaukee) on Saturday at the Athletics**, hitting solo home runs in the fourth and sixth innings.

- **His 41 career multi-HR games are the fourth-most by a Yankee in franchise history, trailing only Babe Ruth (68), Mickey Mantle (46) and Lou Gehrig (43)**...his 41 multi-HR games are the most by any Major League player through his first 1,032 career games (next: Ralph Kiner-35)...are the most by any Major League player since 2017 (next: Manny Machado-34).

- Has hit 329HR in 1,032 career Major League games, the most HR through a player's first 1,032 career games in Major League history (previous: Ralph Kiner - 287HR).

- **Leads the Majors in BA by 38 points, OBP by 48 points, SLG by 123 points and OPS by 199 points.**

- **Has reached base in 37 of his 39 games this year**, batting .396/.486/.772 (59-for-149) with 37R, 10 doubles, 2 triples, 14HR, 37RBI, 24BB/61BB, 2HP and 3SB.

- **Has reached base multiple times in 24 of his last 30 games (since 4/7), 27 of his last 34 games (since 4/3) and 29 of his 39 games this year**...his 29 games of reaching base multiple times this season are the most in the Majors.

- **Has hit 6HR in his last 10 games (since 4/29) and 7HR in his last 12 games (since 4/27-G2).**

- Over his last 30 games (since 4/7), has hit .420/.508/.732 (47-for-112) with 23R, 7 doubles, 2 triples, 8HR, 20RBI, 19BB/41BB, 1HP and 1SB.

- Has hit .467/.568/.833 (14-for-30) with 2 doubles, 3HR, 22RBI, 6BB/51BB and 1HP with RISP this year.

- In 41 career games vs. the Athletics, has hit .303/.415/.664 (46-for-152) with 32R, 8 doubles, 1 triple, 15HR, 41RBI, 28BB/21BB, 2HP and 1SF...has 4HR in his last four games vs. the A's (since 9/21/24) and 5HR in his last seven games (since 4/24/24).

BRONX BOMBERS: **Yankees batters have hit a Major League-leading 69HR this year, their most home runs through their first 39 games of a season in franchise history** (previous: 63HR in 2003)...have homered in a season-high 10 straight games (since 4/29), hitting 24HR over that span...marks their longest single-season home run streak since a 13-game streak from 5/21-6/4/24.

- Lead the Majors in HR (69), OBP (.344), SLG (.478), OPS (.823), total bases (632) and XBH (144), rank second in runs scored (223, first in AL) and runs per game (5.72, first in AL), third in BA (.260, first in AL) and times on base (521, second in AL), and tied for fourth in walks (157, second in AL).

- Have scored 33R over their last four games (since 5/6).

SAVED BY THE BELL: INF/OF **Cody Bellinger** reached base three times on Saturday at the Athletics...has hit safely in each of his last six games (since 5/3), batting .348/.423/.609 (8-for-23) with 5R, 2HR, 4RBI, 3BB and 1SB over that span.

- In 15 career games vs. the A's, has hit .379/.448/.517 (22-for-58) with 12R, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 1HR, 6RBI, 8BB and 1SF.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP RYAN YARBROUGH (0-0, 3.72 ERA)

LHP Ryan Yarbrough will make his 10th appearance of the season (second start) today at the Athletics...the 33-year-old will pitch on extended seven days' rest...last pitched on 5/3 vs. Tampa Bay, allowing just 1R/ER in 4.0IP without recording a decision in his first start of the season (1H, 3BB, 2K, 0HR)...in nine games (one start) this year, has posted a 3.72 ERA (19.1IP, 15H, 8R/ER, 9BB, 18K, 3HR)...was signed to a Major League contract with the Yankees on 3/24/25...signed a minor league contract with Toronto on 2/21/25, and exercised an opt-out on 3/23/25...combined to go 5-2 with one save and a 3.19 ERA (98.2IP, 70H, 36R/35ER, 32BB, 65K, 11HR) in 44 relief appearances with the Los Angeles Dodgers and Toronto Blue Jays in 2024...his 98.2 innings pitched last season were the most among Major League relievers...over parts of eight Major League seasons (2018-25) with the Tampa Bay Rays (2018-22), Kansas City Royals (2023), Los Angeles Dodgers (2023-24), Toronto Blue Jays (2024) and Yankees (2025), has gone 53-40 with one complete game, three saves and a 4.20 ERA (787.1IP, 747H, 390R/367ER, 186BB, 617K, 102HR) in 205 games (69 starts)...the Austin, Tex., native was originally selected by the Seattle Mariners in the fourth round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft out of Old Dominion University (Va.).

LAST TIME OUT: Made his first start of the season (ninth appearance) on 5/3 vs. Tampa Bay, allowing just 1R/ER in 4.0IP without recording a decision (1H, 3BB, 2K, 0HR)...marked his first start since 9/28/23 at Colorado with Los Angeles-NL.
✦ Marked his fewest hits allowed in a start in his career.

HITTIN' THE ROAD: Will be making his sixth road outing (first start) of the season today...has posted a 2.45 ERA (11.0IP, 3ER) and 12K in five road relief appearances this season.
✦ In 2024, posted a 1.81 ERA (44.2IP, 27H, 9R/ER, 13BB, 28K, 3HR) in 20 road appearances with Los Angeles-NL and Toronto.
✦ In his career as a starter on the road, has gone 8-10 with a 4.27 ERA (194.0IP, 193H, 102R/92ER, 35BB, 142K, 27HR) in 36 starts.

VS. ATHLETICS: Has made six career appearances (two starts) vs. the Athletics, going 2-0 with a 4.56 ERA (23.2IP, 24H, 12R/ER, 8BB, 19K, 3HR).
✦ Made one appearance vs. the A's in 2024, allowing 1ER in 2.0IP of relief (3H, 1BB, 1K).
✦ In his two starts against the Athletics, is 1-0 with a 6.75 ERA (8.0IP, 6ER).

2025: In nine games (one start) this year, has posted a 3.72 ERA (19.1IP, 15H, 8R/ER, 9BB, 18K, 3HR).
✦ Has tossed at least 2.0IP in five of his nine appearances this season.
✦ Has allowed 1ER-or-fewer in seven of his nine outings this season.
✦ Was signed to a Major League contract with the Yankees on 3/24/25...signed a minor league contract with Toronto on 2/21/25, and exercised an opt-out on 3/23/25
✦ Made his 200th career appearance on 4/8 at Detroit.

2024: Combined to go 5-2 with one save and a 3.19 ERA (98.2IP, 70H, 36R/35ER, 32BB, 65K, 11HR) in 44 relief appearances with the Los Angeles Dodgers and Toronto Blue Jays in 2024.
✦ His 98.2 innings pitched last season were the most among Major League relievers...tossed at least 2.0 innings in 26 relief appearances and at least 3.0 innings in 13 of those games.
✦ Limited left-handed batters last season to a .120/.176/.211 (16-for-133) slash line.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Over parts of eight Major League seasons (2018-25) with the Tampa Bay Rays (2018-22), Kansas City Royals (2023), Los Angeles Dodgers (2023-24), Toronto Blue Jays (2024) and Yankees (2025), has gone 53-40 with one complete game, three saves and a 4.20 ERA (787.1IP, 747H, 390R/367ER, 186BB, 617K, 102HR) in 205 games (69 starts).
✦ Has held left-handed batters to a .210/.275/.340 (165-for-785) slash line in his career...has allowed just 23HR to 869 left-handed batters faced.
✦ Selected by the Seattle Mariners in the fourth round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft out of Old Dominion University (Va.).
