NATIONALS NEWS

WINNING WAYS

The Washington Nationals take on the Philadelphia Phillies tonight in game two of this three-game set from Citizens Bank Park...Washington took the first game last night, 13-2.

- All nine in the starting lineup collected at least one hit with seven producing multi-hit games...**José Tena** led the offense with three hits and a pair of RBI.
- Foster Griffin** earned his first win as a Major League starter last night with 5.0 innings of two-run ball with five strikeouts...It was Griffin's first Major League appearance since 2022.
- Brad Lord** worked 3.0 scoreless innings out of the bullpen with three strikeouts...He surrendered just one hit and one walk.
- Following this series, the Nationals will return home on Friday for their home opener against the Dodgers.

SERIES BUSINESS

With a win in one of the final two games of this series, Washington would start the season with back-to-back series wins for the first time since the start of the 2012 season (at CHC, at NYM).

- One more win and the Nationals would record their first series win over the Phillies since Sept. 27-29, 2024 at home and their first series win at Citizens Bank Park since June 30-July 2, 2023.

LET'S GET OFFENSIVE

Through the first four games of the season, the Nationals rank among Major League offenses in slugging percentage (1st, .479), runs (T1st, 31), OPS (2nd, .843), batting average (T2nd, .299), on-base percentage (4th, .364).

- Joey Wiemer** leads MLB in batting average (.800), OBP (.846), slugging (1.600) and OPS (2.446).

WINNING WITH WIEMER

Joey Wiemer, who was acquired off waivers in the offseason after he was designated for assignment twice, reached base in each of his first 10 plate appearances to start the season to match **Carlos Delgado** in 2002 for reaching in the most consecutive plate appearances to start a season since 1920, per *Elias Sports Bureau*.

- Wiemer was also the first player in Nationals history (2005-pres.) to homer in each of his first two games with the club.
- Wiemer fell just two plate appearances shy of the Nationals record for most consecutive plate appearances reaching base safely overall: 12 by **Juan Soto** from Sept. 21-24, 2021.
- Wiemer finished Spring Training with a walk-off home run in the final game at CACTI Park of the Palm Beaches.

REIGNING PLAYER OF THE MONTH

Outfielder **Daylen Lile**, who capped his rookie campaign as the National League Player and Rookie of the Month, is picking up where he left off...He has hits in each of his first four games to start the 2026 season, going 6-for-18 (.333) with a two doubles, three RBI and two walks.

- Last September, He led the National League in OPS (1.212), slugging percentage (.772), batting average (.391) and triples (7) during the month.
- On the season, Lile led MLB rookies with 11 triples and tied **Denard Span** for the most triples in a season in Nationals history (2005-pres.)...Lile had a chance to break the record on Sept. 20 at New York (NL), but instead, stretched it into an 11th-inning go-ahead inside the park home run.
- He led qualified NL rookies in average (.299), slugging (.498) and OPS (.845) and ranked in on-base percentage (3rd, .347), hits (6th, 96), extra-base hits (6th, 35) and runs scored (7th, 51).

SPRING TRAINING NOTES

The Nationals went 14-11-3 in Grapefruit League action, including a five-game winning streak from March 7-12.

- Washington's staff led Major League Baseball with a 3.12 ERA and a .191 opponents' batting average during the Spring...Their 1.20 WHIP ranked second in Major League Baseball.

PAUL TOBONI

Paul Toboni was named President of Baseball Operations on Oct. 1, 2025...Widely regarded as one of the best young executives in baseball, Toboni brings a fresh voice to the organization, providing valuable experience in scouting and player development to build around the Nationals' talented core of young star players.

- Toboni comes to the Nationals from the Boston Red Sox, where he most recently held the title of senior vice president, assistant general manager...In his time with Boston, Toboni oversaw player development at the Major and Minor League levels, as well as the MLB First-Year Player Draft and was one of the key voices in the organization's larger baseball operations strategy.

BLAKE BUTERA

Blake Butera was named Washington's eighth field manager on October 31, 2025 after spending the previous two seasons as the senior director of player development for the Tampa Bay Rays...He served as the Rays' Minor League field coordinator in 2023 following four seasons (2018-19, 2021-22) as a manager in their Minor League system.

- At Single-A Charleston, Butera was named Carolina League Manager of the Year in 2021 and 2022, won the Carolina League championship both seasons and the 2022 club was named Minor League Team of the Year by *Baseball America*.
- He began his coaching career with the Rays organization in 2017 as the bench coach for Single-A Hudson Valley and was promoted to manager in 2018, becoming the youngest manager in all of Minor League Baseball at the age of 25.

NATIONALS HISTORY

MARCH 31 (4-1)

2014 - **Anthony Rendon** doubled, homered and posted a then career-high four RBI to help the Nationals erase a pair of late deficits and defeat the Mets, 9-7, in a 10-inning season opener at Citi Field. Trailing by a run with two outs in the ninth, **Danny Espinosa** walked and **Denard Span** extended the game with a game-tying RBI double. A four-run outburst in the 10th inning propelled the Nationals to victory.

2019 - Tied at 5-5 in the bottom of the ninth inning, **Trea Turner** laced a walk-off solo home run off **Justin Wilson** to propel the Nationals to the 6-5 win. It was Turner's second career walk-off home run and his second home run of the day. He put Washington on the board in the third inning with a three-run home run off **Zack Wheeler**.
