TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners begin the final series of a 6-game road trip tonight with the first of 3 games at the Arizona Diamondbacks...Seattle previously wrapped up 3 games at the Los Angeles Angels (1-2)... following the series at the Diamondbacks, the Mariners will return home to T-Mobile Park for a 6-game homestand, with 3 games against the Cleveland Guardians (6/13-6/15) and 3-games against the Boston Red Sox (6/16-6/18)...today's game will be televised live on ROOT SPORTS with Aaron Goldsmith and Angie Mentink on the call and Brad Adam serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on Seattle Sports (710 AM) with Rick Rizzs and Gary Hill Jr. on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners won yesterday's series finale against the Angels by a 3-2 score, snapping a season-high 5-game losing streak...Seattle is 16-17 at home and 17-14 on the road this season...the Mariners are 16-8 in day games and 17-23 at night.

- Interleague Battles Seattle is 8-7 (.533) against National League teams this season.
- Hold 'Em The Mariners are 25-1 when leading after 7 innings and 28-1 when leading after 8 innings this season.
- What A Homer Seattle is 30-16 (.652) when hitting a home run this season, and 3-15 (.200) when being held without a homer.
- Length The Mariners are 21-7 (.750) when their starting pitcher goes 6.0+ innings this season, and 6-2 when their starting pitcher goes 7.0+ innings.
- Strive For Five Seattle is 22-6 (.786) when scoring 5+ runs in a game, and 11-25 (.306) when scoring 4-or-fewer runs.
- League Leader RHP George Kirby tallied a career-high 14 strikeouts in yesterday's start, tying the Major League record this season (also: Max Meyer-MIA).
- Roster Moves Today the Mariners recalled OF Dominic Canzone and designated for assignment OF Leody Taveras...Casey Lawrence cleared waivers and was outrighted to Triple-A Tacoma.

MARINERS.COM/VOTE...voting for the 95th MLB All-Star Game, set for Atlanta on July 15, is officially underway...fan voting is split into two phases with phase 1 running until June 26, with fans allowed to submit up to 5 votes per day during phase 1...after phase 1 is completed, the top 2 vote getters at each position (top 6 outfielders) will face off head-to-head in phase 2 of voting, which will determine who will start the All-Star Game, phase 2 of voting will run from June 30-July 2...the overall leading vote getter in each league will skip phase 2 and receive an automatic starting assignment...the All-Star starters will be announced on ESPN on July 2 and full rosters on July 6...vote for Mariners at Mariners.com/Vote.

<u>CAL RALEIGH, YOU ARE UNBELIEVABLE</u>...catcher <u>Cal Raleigh</u> is having an incredible season, batting .272 (63x232) with 44 runs, 11 doubles, 26 home runs, 53 RBI, 38 walks and 7 stolen bases, with a .380 on-base percentage, .655 slugging percentage and 1.035 OPS...he leads MLB catchers in virtually every offensive statistical category, and overall in the Majors ranks 1st in home runs, 2nd in slugging percentage, 2nd in OPS, T-3rd in extra-base hits (37), 3rd in total bases (152), 6th in RBI, 2nd in fWAR (4.2) and 3rd in wRC+ (191)...Cal has appeared in 63 of the Mariners 64 games this season.

MULTI-HOMER MADNESS...Cal Raleigh has recorded 15 multi-homer games in his career and a Major League-leading 5 this season...he has hit multiple homers on April 16 at CIN (one from both sides of the plate), May 2 at TEX (2 left-handed), May 27 vs. WSH (2 right-handed), May 30 vs. MIN (2 left-handed) and June 7 at LAA (2 left-handed)...Cal is tied with Alex Rodriguez for the 4th-most multi-homer games in Mariners history, trailing Ken Griffey Jr. (40), Edgar Martinez (22) and Jay Buhner (22) and is tied with Shohei Ohtani-LAA/LAD for the 3rd-most multi-homer games since 2022, trailing only Kyle Schwarber-PHI (18) and Aaron Judge-NYY (27).

SEÑOR SMOKE...right-hander Andrés Muñoz recorded his 18th save of the season in yesterday's matchup...in 27 appearances this season, Muñoz is 2-0 with a 1.35 ERA (4 ER, 26.2 IP) with 10 walks (2 intentional), 35 strikeouts and a 0.860 WHIP, holding opponents to a .144 batting average...Muñoz ranks T-3rd in saves (18) in MLB (also: Kyle Finnegan-WSH) and 2nd in the AL, trailing only Carlos Estévez-KC (19)...the March/April AL Reliever of the month set the Mariners record for most innings pitched (23.2) to begin a season without allowing an earned run.

RANDY ON THE RISE...Randy Arozarena went 3-for-5 with 1 run, 2 doubles, 1 RBI and 1 stolen base in yesterday's game...it marked the second straight contest in which he recorded 3 hits and the 5th time in his career he has recorded back-to-back games with 3+ hits...so far in June, Randy is batting .296 (8x27) with 1 run, 2 doubles, 3 RBI, 2 stolen bases and 2 walks.

WORKING THE COUNT...shortstop **J.P. Crawford** drew a walk in yesterday's game to extend his on-base streak to 9-games (5/30-c)...during the span, Crawford is batting .429 (15x35) with 3 runs, 4 doubles, 1 home run, 4 RBI and 6 walks, getting on base at a .512 clip with a 1.141 OPS...his .394 OBP this season ranks 10th in the Majors and his 15.3% walk rate leads all Major League shortstops.

#51...The Mariners announced Hall of Famer Randy Johnson's number 51 will be retired by the club during the 2026 season (exact date TBD)...Johnson's #51 will be the 5th number retired by the Mariners, joining Ken Griffey Jr. (#24), Edgar Martinez (#11), Ichiro Suzuki (#51) and Jackie Robinson (#42, retired by all MLB teams)...Johnson is the 13th player to have his number retired by multiple MLB franchises, while #51 is the eighth number to be retired by the same club for multiple players.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...George Kirby set a career-high in strikeouts in yesterday's game at the Angels, tallying 14 strikeouts over 7.0 innings pitched while allowing 2 hits, 2 runs, 2 earned runs, 0 walks and 1 home run, but...DID YOU KNOW?...that yesterday Kirby became the 3rd pitcher in franchise history to record 14+ strikeouts in a game without issuing a walk?...he joined Randy Johnson (2x) and Mark Langston as the only Mariners starters to accomplish the feat...Kirby was the youngest Mariner to do so at 27 years and 124 days old...it also marked only the 2nd time Mariners pitchers have combined for 18+ strikeouts and 1-or-fewer walks allowed in a game, with the other instance coming on June 24, 1997 when Randy Johnson threw a complete game with 19 strikeouts and 0 walks...since the start of the 2022 season, Kirby leads all Major League starting pitchers with the most starts without issuing a walk (38 G), ranking ahead of Miles Mikolas-STL (36 G) and Zach Eflin-3Tms (33 G).

ABOUT EMERSON HANCOCK.

- The 25-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 11th start of the season tonight and his 1st against Arizona...he is also scheduled to make the 26th start of his career and 2nd career start against the Diamondbacks
- Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (6th overall) of the 2020 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Scott Hunter on June 25, 2020.
- Spent 3 seasons at the University of Georgia, 2018-20...in 2020, was named Vince Dooley Athlete of the Year as the top male student-athlete at the University of Georgia.
- Was named to CoSIDA Academic All-America First Team in 2020.

LAST TIME OUT...ND on June 4 vs. Baltimore, he threw 5.2 innings, giving up 1 run on a season-low 2 hits with 2 walks and 6 strikeouts...it was his 2nd straight start throwing 5.0+ innings and allowing 2-or-less hits, and has allowed 3-or-less runs in 8 of 10 starts this season...in the 4th inning, Hancock struck out the side in order for the first time in his career.

IN HIS OWN WORDS

"We believe in throwing a lot of strikes and especially getting ahead. And it helps a ton. Not every game do you get a lot of first-pitch strikes, or maybe they get a couple hits now and there, and it's just about trusting it. Time and time again, how many times can you stay aggressive and get that first pitch.

LENGTH ON THE MOUND ... after his May 23 start vs. Houston, it marked his 4th start this season where he has tossed 6.0+ innings...he has tossed 6.0+ innings in 8 of his 24 career starts, and 5.0+ innings in 18 starts...in those 18 starts of 5.0+ innings pitched, the Mariners hold a 13-5 record.

BRINGIN' THE HEAT...this season Hancock has increased his average fastball velocity by 1.9 mph (94.6 mph), up from an average fastball velocity of 92.7 mph in the 2024 season...in his May 17 start against the San Diego Padres, Hancock threw a career-high 97.6 mph fastball to strikeout Jake Cronenworth in the 2nd inning...in that outing, 42 of his pitches touched 95+ mph which was nearly double his previous career-high of 22 pitches over 95 mph on April 17 vs. CIN...the fastest pitch he had thrown prior to 2025 was a 96 mph sinker on 7/07/24 vs. TOR.

SWINGS AND MISSES...recorded a career-high 15 swings and misses in his May 12th outing against the Yankees...has already recorded a career-high 29 swinging strikeouts across his 10 starts this season, passing a previous career-high 26 swinging strikeouts across 12 starts in the 2024 season.

LOCKING IT IN...his 3 starts on April 23, April 30, and May 6, marked just the

2nd time in his career with 6.0+ innings in 3 consecutive starts (also: 2024 season, 4/13 at CHC, 4/21 at COL and 4/26 at ARI)...has recorded more SO (38), and less runs allowed (29) in his first 10 starts this season compared to his first 10 starts of the 2024 season (33 SO, 32 RA).

AGAINST THE NL...Hancock has made 10 career starts against National League teams holding a 2-3 record with a 3.80 ERA (21 ER, 49.2), 1.24 WHIP, and a .243 AVG against, while collecting 39 strikeouts and 16 walks...in his last 5 starts against NL opponents he has a 3.57 ERA (9 ER, 22.2 IP), with 10 BB and 15 SO and a Mariners 3-2 record in those starts.

LATEST STRETCH...in his last 5 starts (5/12-c), Hancock has collected 1 quality start on May 23, and has allowed 27 hits, 14 earned runs, 10 walks and 21 strikeouts across 26.2 innings of work...across his first 10 starts of the season, the Mariners are 6-4 with Hancock throwing 5.0+ innings and 2-or-fewer walks in 8 starts of those 10 starts.

GET AHEAD, STAY AHEAD... when pitching ahead in the count this season, in 18.2 innings pitched Hancock has a .229 AVG against, a 0.86 WHIP, with no walks and 21 strikeouts.

QUICK TRIP TO TACOMA...after his 1st major league start of the season (3/30 vs. DET), Hancock was optioned to Triple-A Tacoma...between his two starts with the Rainiers, he allowed 4 runs on 9 hits (1 HR), 2 walks, 2 hit by pitches, and struck out 12 in 9.2 innings of work...between the 2024 and 2025 seasons, Hancock holds a 3.46 ERA (40 ER, 104.0 IP) and is 7-4 with Tacoma across 19 game starts.

THE the 6th starting pitcher in franchise history to pitch 5.0+ innings and allow 2-or-fewer hits in a Major League debut, joining Pat Rice, Ken Cloude, Taijuan Walker, Roenis Elías and Bryce Miller.

THE COMPLETE PACKAGE ... on July 21, 2024 vs. Reno, Hancock threw a 9.0 inning complete game shutout...it was the only 9.0 inning complete game shutout in Triple-A in 2024 and only 1 of 2 in the full-season minor leagues this year...there have only been 2 complete game shutouts in the Pacific Coast League since the start of 2019.
