AT A GLANCE: The Yankees conclude their five-game road trip tonight with the final game of a two-game set at Tampa Bay (1-0 thus far)...are 4-0 on the road trip after sweeping the Cardinals this past weekend and winning their series opener against Tampa Bay on Tuesday...following this road trip, will return home for a seven-game homestand, featuring a four-game set vs. Boston (Thurs.-Sun.) and a three-game series against Washington (8/25-27).
► Have won each of their last two completed series.
► **Have won each of their last four games (since 8/15), six of their last seven games (since 8/11), seven of their last nine games (since 8/9) and eight of their last 11 games (since 8/6).**
► *With a win tonight*, would match their season-high winning streak (5G from 4/14-18, 5/24-28 and 7/6-11).
► Their +109 run differential this season is the highest in the American League and the third-highest in the Majors.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees won their fourth straight game with a 13-3 victory against the Rays on Tuesday at GMS Field...**LHP Carlos Rodón** (6.0IP, 5H, 2R/ER, 2BB, 5K, 0HR, 1HP) started and earned his 13th win of the year after allowing only 2R/ER over 6.0IP...**Yankees batters** hit a franchise-record-tying 9HR...**DH Aaron Judge** (2-for-5, 3R, 1HR, 1RBI, 1BB) reached base three times and hit his 40th home run of the year with a go-ahead solo shot in the first inning...**LF/RF/CF Cody Bellinger** (4-for-5, 3R, 2HR, 3RBI), **RF Giancarlo Stanton** (2-for-3, 2R, 2HR, 4RBI, 1BB) and **3B José Caballero** (2-for-4, 2R, 2HR, 3RBI, 1BB) each recorded multi-HR games...**C Ben Rice** (1-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 1RBI, 1BB) and **2B Jazz Chisholm Jr.** (2-for-5, 1R, 1HR, 1RBI) also homered.

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters hit a franchise-record-tying 9HR on Tuesday at Tampa Bay (also 3/29/25 vs. Milwaukee)...are the only team in Major League history to hit at least 9HR in a game twice in a single season......marked only the fourth time in Major League history a team hit at least 9HR in a game, joining their own 9HR earlier this year on 3/29 vs. Milwaukee, the 1987 Toronto Blue Jays (10HR on 9/14/87 vs. Baltimore) and 1999 Cincinnati Reds (9HR on 9/4/99 at Philadelphia, with Aaron Boone hitting the Reds' first HR).
► Scored 13R on Tuesday at Tampa Bay...marked their 18th game this season with double-digit runs, the second-most in the Majors this season, trailing only Boston (19G).
► Have scored 53R over their last seven games (since 8/11), averaging 7.57 runs per game over that span...are averaging a Major-League best 5.19 runs per game this year...their 649 runs scored this season are the best in the AL and rank 12th in the Majors...their 649R are the most through their first 125 games of a season since 2019 (743R).

► **Have hit a Major League-leading 204HR this season, 17 more than the next highest team (Los Angeles-NL: 187HR) and 26 more than the next highest AL teams (Los Angeles-AL and Seattle: 178HR)**...their 204HR are their second-most through the club's first 125 games of a season, trailing only their 226HR in 2019.
► **OF Aaron Judge, INF/OF Cody Bellinger and DH/OF Giancarlo Stanton** hit back-to-back-to-back home runs in the first inning on Tuesday at Tampa Bay...**marked the third time this season Yankees batters have hit back-to-back-to-back home runs (also 3/29 vs. Milwaukee and 4/29 at Baltimore), setting a franchise record (confirmed by Elias).**
► **With INF/OF Cody Bellinger, INF/OF José Caballero and DH/OF Giancarlo Stanton** each recording multi-HR games on Tuesday, **it marked the second time in franchise history the Yankees have had three players hit at least 2HR in a game (also 5/30/61 at Boston - Mickey Mantle, Roger Maris and Bill Showron each hit 2HR).**

RICE RICE BABY: C/INF Ben Rice reached base twice and hit his 19th home run of the year with a solo shot in the fourth inning on Tuesday at Tampa Bay...has hit .317/.420/.610 (13-for-41) with 5R, 3 doubles, 3HR, 11RBI, 8BB and 1SF over his last 11 games (since 8/6).

ON A ROLL: INF/OF José Caballero recorded his first career multi-HR game on Tuesday at Tampa Bay, hitting a two-run shot in the second inning and a solo HR in the third...has hit .364/.440/.682 (8-for-2) with 7R, 1 double, 2HR, 4RBI, 3BB and 5SB in his first 11 games as a Yankee (since 8/1).
► **Over his last five starts (since 8/9), has reached base in 11-of-22PA, batting .444/.524/.833 (8-for-22) with 6R, 1 double, 2HR, 4RBI, 3BB and 4SB in that span.**

NEW YORK GIANTS: OF Aaron Judge and DH/OF Giancarlo Stanton homered in the same game for the fourth time this year on Tuesday (also 7/2 at Toronto, 7/8 vs. Seattle and 8/12 vs. Minnesota)...including the postseason, Stanton and Judge have homered in the same game 55 times (49 times during the regular season and six times during the postseason), the third-most games by a pair of Yankees teammates in franchise history, trailing only Lou Gehrig and Babe Ruth (75), and Yogi Berra and Mickey Mantle (56) - credit: *Elias*...the Yankees are 48-7 in those games (44-5 during the regular season and 4-2 during the postseason)...their 49 instances during the regular season are the third-most by a pair of Yankees teammates, trailing only Lou Gehrig and Babe Ruth (73), and Yogi Berra and Mickey Mantle (55).

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge reached base three times and hit his 40th home run of the season with a go-ahead solo shot in the first inning on Tuesday at Tampa Bay...**is one of only four players in Yankees history to hit at least 40HR in four seasons** (also 52HR in 2017, 62HR in 2022 and 58HR in 2024), joining Babe Ruth (11), Lou Gehrig (five) and Mickey Mantle (four)...**is the only Yankee to do so within his first 10 seasons**...is the sixth Yankee to hit at least 40HR in consecutive seasons (also 58HR in 2024), joining Babe Ruth (1920-21, '23-24 and '26-32), Lou Gehrig (1930-31), Mickey Mantle (1960-61), Jason Giambi (2002-03) and Curtis Granderson (2011-12).
► **Has hit a Major League-leading 15 first-inning home runs this year**...since 2024, 33 of his 98HR have come in the first inning...his 80 career HR in the first inning are the fourth-most in franchise history, trailing only Babe Ruth (126), Mickey Mantle (103) and Lou Gehrig (84).
► 20 of his 40HR this year have tied the game (four) or given the Yankees the lead (16).
► Has reached base safely in 101 of his 115 games this year, batting .333/.447/.691 (139-for-417) with 99R, 25 doubles, 2 triples, 40HR, 92RBI, 86BB/29IBB, 4HP, 5SF and 75B...leads the Majors in BA by 17 points, OBP by 32 points, SLG by 68 points and OPS by 123 points...his 7.5 WAR (FanGraphs) is 0.4 higher than the next highest player (Seattle's Cal Raleigh: 7.1 WAR).
► Has hit .341/.484/.648 (31-for-91) with 7 doubles, 7HR, 49RBI, 29BB/21IBB, 1HP and 5SF with RISP this year.
► Has reached base safely in 55 of his 59 road games this year, hitting .344/.454/.701 (76-for-221) with 49R, 11 doubles, 1 triple, 22HR, 49RBI, 44BB/17IBB, 2HP, 2SF and 35B, ranking first in the Majors in BA, OBP, SLG and OPS (1.155).
► **Has reached base multiple times in 75 games this season, the most in the AL and the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Shohei Ohtani (76).**

SAVED BY THE BELL: INF/OF Cody Bellinger recorded a season-high 4H and his 19th career multi-HR game on Tuesday at Tampa Bay, hitting a solo HR in the first inning and a two-run shot in the sixth...marked his second multi-HR game of the year (also 3HR on 7/11 vs. Chicago-NL)...**has 4HR over his last six games (since 8/11).**
► **Appeared at all three outfield positions in a game for the first time in his career on Tuesday...became the seventh player in franchise history to appear at all three outfield positions in a game**, joining Ichiro Suzuki (9/9/12 at Baltimore), Melky Cabrera (9/19/09 at Seattle), Gerald Williams (7/19/01 at Detroit), Joe Lefebvre (6/11/80 at California), Bobby Murcer (8/20/79 at Kansas City) and Tom Tresh (8/5/65 at Chicago-AL).
► Has hit .314/.376/.543 (33-for-105) with 4 doubles, 1 triple, 6HR, 53RBI, 14BB/11BB and 6SF with RISP this season.
► Has hit .302/.333/.585 (62-for-205) with 33R, 9 doubles, 2 triples, 15HR, 39RBI, 10BB, 1SF and 35B over his last 50G (since 6/17).
► Has hit 24HR in 115 games this year after hitting 18HR in 130 games with the Cubs in 2024.

STANTON ISLAND: DH/OF Giancarlo Stanton reached base three times, recorded his 37th career multi-HR game and notched a season-high 4RBI on Tuesday at Tampa Bay, hitting a solo HR in the first inning and a three-run shot in the fourth...marked his first multi-HR game since 7/8/23 vs. Chicago-NL...**marked his 442nd and 443rd career home runs, surpassing Dave Kingman (442) for 43rd place on the all-time home runs list.**
► **Is hitting .347/.413/.776 (34-for-98) with 20R, 3 doubles, 13HR, 31RBI, 10BB/2IBB and 1HP over his last 30G (since 7/6).**
► Has hit 4HR in his last five games (since 8/11), 10HR in his last 21 games (since 7/21), 13HR in his last 29 games (since 7/8) and 14HR in his last 33 games (since 7/2).
► Over his last 35 games (since 6/30), has hit .438/.581/.938 (14-for-32) with 1 double, 5HR, 24RBI and 11BB/2IBB with RISP.

ALL THAT JAZZ: INF Jazz Chisholm Jr. hit his 22nd home run of the year with solo shot in the third inning on Tuesday at Tampa Bay...has 2HR in his last four games (since 8/15) and 3HR over his last seven games (since 8/11).
► Is one of eight players in the Majors to have at least 20HR and 20SB this season, joining Seattle's Randy Arozarena (23HR/24SB), Chicago-NL's Pete Crow-Armstrong (27HR/30SB), New York-NL's Francisco Lindor (24HR/20SB), Los Angeles-AL's Zach Neto (21HR/22SB), Cleveland's José Ramírez (26HR/36SB), Seattle's Julio Rodríguez (24HR/23SB) and New York-NL's Juan Soto (31HR/20SB).

MATCHING UP: The Yankees are 8-4 vs. the Rays this season...**Yankees pitchers** have posted a 2.95 ERA (110.0IP, 36ER) in those games...have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in eight of those 12 games.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP CAM SCHLITTLER (1-2, 3.94 ERA)

RHP Cam Schlittler will make his seventh start of the year in tonight's series finale at Tampa Bay...the 24-year-old will make the start on extended six days' rest due to team off days on Thursday and Monday...made his sixth start of the season on 8/13 vs. Minnesota and did not record a decision (5.0IP, 2H, 1R/ER, 2BB, 6K, 0HR)...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in each of his first six starts, including 2R-or-fewer in four of his last five starts (since 7/22)...**became the 10th pitcher in franchise history to record at least 7K in his Major League debut**, joining Jordan Montgomery (7K on 4/12/17 vs. Tampa Bay), Luis Severino (7K on 8/5/15 vs. Boston), Masahiro Tanaka (8K on 4/4/14 at Toronto), Orlando Hernández (7K on 6/3/98 vs. Tampa Bay), Hideki Irabu (9K on 7/10/97 vs. Detroit), Al Leiter (8K on 9/15/87 vs. Milwaukee), Rich Beck (8K on 9/14/65 at Washington-AL), Vic Raschi (8K on 9/23/46 vs. Philadelphia-AL) and Bill Hogg (7K on 4/25/1905 vs. Washington-AL)...was signed to a Major League contract and selected to the active roster prior to the game on 7/9...in 15 combined games (14 starts) with Double-A Somerset and Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre this season, has gone 6-6 with a 2.82 ERA (76.2IP, 67H, 30R/24ER, 26BB, 99K, 4HR)...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 12 of his minor league appearances this season, including one-or-zero earned runs in 10 games (including four scoreless appearances)...**at the time of his Major League debut, was tied for ninth among minor league pitchers in strikeouts**...among qualified Yankees farmhands at the time of his debut, was tied for second in strikeouts and starts, ranked fourth in innings pitched, tied for fourth in wins and seventh in ERA...is currently ranked by *Baseball America* as the Yankees' No. 2 prospect and No. 93 overall prospect in baseball...is also ranked by MLB Pipeline as the organization's No. 3 prospect and No. 91 overall prospect in baseball...was a 2025 non-roster invitee in spring training...was named the winner of the 2024 Kevin Lawn Award as the Yankees' minor league "Pitcher of the Year" at the end of 2025 spring training...in 25 combined appearances (23 starts) with High-A Hudson Valley, Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre and Double-A Somerset in 2024, went 8-8 with a 3.36 ERA (120.2IP, 98H, 58R/45ER, 55BB, 154K, 10HR)...over parts of three minor league seasons in the Yankees organization (2023-25), has gone 15-16 with a 3.33 ERA (243.1IP, 214H, 113R/90ER, 102BB, 303K, 18HR) in 54 games (50 starts)...the Weymouth, Mass., native was selected by the Yankees in the seventh round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft out of Northeastern University (Mass.).

LAST TIME OUT: Made his sixth start of the season on 8/13 vs. Minnesota and did not record a decision (5.0IP, 2H, 1R/ER, 2BB, 6K, 0HR)...retired 13 of his first 16BF (1H, 2BB)...allowed a season-low 2H.

2025: Has made six starts this season, going 1-2 with a 3.94 ERA (29.2IP, 31H, 13R/ER, 14BB, 30K, 6HR)...has tossed at least 5.0IP in five of his first six career starts...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in each of his first six starts, including 2R-or-fewer in four of his last five starts (since 7/22).

- ✦ Made his Major League debut on 7/9 vs. Seattle, earning his first career win after allowing 3R/ER over 5.1IP (4H, 2BB, 7K, 2HR).
- ✦ Made his third start of the season on 7/28 vs. Tampa Bay, recording his first career loss after allowing 3R/ER in 4.1IP (7H, 4BB, 5K, 1HR).

WELCOME TO THE SHOW: Made his Major League debut on 7/9 vs. Seattle, earning his first career win after allowing 3R/ER over 5.1IP (4H, 2BB, 7K, 2HR).

- ✦ **Became the 10th pitcher in franchise history to record at least 7K in his Major League debut**, joining Jordan Montgomery (7K on 4/12/17 vs. Tampa Bay), Luis Severino (7K on 8/5/15 vs. Boston), Masahiro Tanaka (8K on 4/4/14 at Toronto), Orlando Hernández (7K on 6/3/98 vs. Tampa Bay), Hideki Irabu (9K on 7/10/97 vs. Detroit), Al Leiter (8K on 9/15/87 vs. Milwaukee), Rich Beck (8K on 9/14/65 at Washington-AL), Vic Raschi (8K on 9/23/46 vs. Philadelphia-AL) and Bill Hogg (7K on 4/25/1905 vs. Washington-AL).
- ✦ Was the first Yankee to earn the win in his Major League debut since Jhony Brito on 4/2/23 vs. San Francisco...is one of only six Yankees in the last 14 years (since 2012) to earn the win in his Major League debut (also Brito, Luis Gil on 8/3/21 vs. Baltimore, Nick Nelson on 8/1/20 vs. Boston, Jonathan Loáisiga on 6/15/18 vs. Tampa Bay and Masahiro Tanaka on 4/4/14 at Toronto).
- ✦ Became the fourth Yankees pitcher in the last seven seasons (since 2019) to make his Major League debut as a starting pitcher at age 24-or-younger, joining Randy Vásquez (24y, 204d on 5/26/23 vs. San Diego), Luis Gil (23y, 61d on 8/3/21 vs. Baltimore) and Deivi García (21y, 103d on 8/30/20-G2 vs. the Mets).
- ✦ Was the fourth Yankee to make his Major League debut this season, joining C J.C. Escarra, INF Jorbit Vivas and LHP Jayvien Sandridge.

ROAD TRIP: Will make his third road start of the season tonight...has gone 0-1 with a 3.60 ERA (10.0IP, 11H, 4R/ER, 5BB, 9K, 2HR) in two starts on the road this season...has allowed 2R-or-fewer in both of those starts.
