**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets defeated the Marlins, 2-0, last night...The Mets continue their first homestand of the season, a six-game stand (4-0) against the Blue Jays (3-0) and the Marlins (1-0)...Following this homestand, the Mets are off on Thursday before the start of a six-game road trip against the A's (three games) and Twins (three games).

**LET'S GO STREAKING:** The Mets are on a season-high five-game winning streak...The team has won six of their last seven contests...New York is a season-high four games over .500.

**THANK YOU FANS:** Today's game has been moved to 4:10 p.m...As a thank you to our fans, anyone holding a ticket for today's game at the time of the announcement will receive a voucher for a ticket to any remaining Monday-Thursday Mets 2025 regular season home game in April and May at Citi Field, subject to availability...The digital voucher will be loaded into each attending patron's My Mets Tickets account (accessed by clicking the Vouchers tab) and will be accessible Wednesday morning.

**HAPPY BIRTHDAY:** Jeff McNeil celebrates his birthday today...We wish him well...Additionally, former Mets catcher Gary Carter was born on this Day..."Kid" was inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame in 2001 and was inducted into the National Baseball Hall of Fame in 2003.

**FEELING 22:** The Mets have allowed 22 runs in the first 10 games of the year, the fewest in franchise history...In 1971 and 1972, the Mets allowed 23 runs after the first 10 games of the year.

**SERIES-LY SPEAKING:** The Mets are seeking their third straight series victory and their second at home...The Mets have not lost a series at home since August 13-15 against the Athletics...They have won the last seven series at Citi Field.

**SHUT UP:** The Mets recorded their second shutout of the season last night...They are one of four teams with two or more shutouts this year...Last year, the team did not record a shutout until their 92nd game (7/11 vs. Washington)...Their 11 shutouts since July 11, 2024 are the second-most in the majors during that span...San Diego has recorded 15 shutouts in that span.

**ALWAYS JUAN:** Juan Soto has now reached base safely in each of his first 10 games as a Met, a career-high season-opening streak...His 10-game streak is currently tied for the seventh longest season-opening on-base streak in the majors this season...Has reached base two or more times in six games...Is tied for sixth in the majors with four doubles.

**IN THE CITI:** The Mets moved to 4-0 at home this season...For the sixth time in franchise history and first time in 10 seasons, the Mets have won their first four games at home (also: 1985, 1988, 2005, 2012 and 2015)...The Mets have posted a 0.75 ERA (3 ER/36.0 IP) at home this year...That is the best mark in the majors.

**HANG 10:** With their shutout last night, the Mets have pitched to a major league-leading 1.72 ERA (17 ER/89.0 IP) this season...It is the second-best mark in franchise history through the team's first 10 games of a season, trailing only the 1968 team (1.67)...Mets pitchers have also collected 92 strikeouts this season, which is the seventh-most strikeouts through the team's first 10 games in a season (108K in 2021, 107K in 2018, 106K in 2022, 103K in 2024, 101K in 2019 and 98K in 2017).

**THE PEN IS MIGHTIER:** Mets relievers have combined to post a major league-best 1.15 ERA (5 ER/39.0 IP) this season...New York relievers have stranded 18 of 20 inherited runners (90 percent) the best mark in the majors (min. five inherited runners)...The 18 stranded runners are the most the majors...Max Kranick and Reed Garrett have both stranded all six inherited runners this season, that is tied for the most in the majors without allowing an inherited runner to score.

**MARLINS-METS NOTES:** The Mets have not lost a season series against the Marlins since 2017...The Mets are 85-57 against the Marlins since Citi Field opened in 2009.

**A HIT'S A HIT:** Congrats to Francisco Lindor who recorded his 1,500th career hit last night...He is the 24th active player to reach the milestone...Is one of nine players to record 1,500+ hits since 2015.

**MAX POWER:** Max Kranick has stranded all six of his inherited runners, tying teammate Reed Garrett for the most in the majors without allowing an inherited runner to score...He extended his career-high scoreless inning streak to 12.0 IP (since: 5/7/22 at Cincinnati with Pittsburgh), including 7.0 innings pitched this season...He has retired 21 of 22 batters faced this season, holding his opponents to a .045 average.

**STRIKE THAT:** Kodai Senga has recorded 223 career strikeouts...His 223 career strikeouts are the 10th-most by a pitcher through their first 32 career games in major league history (since 1901)...It is also the third-most among Japanese-born pitchers in that span, trailing only Hideo Nomo (267) and Yu Darvish (249) and is the fourth-most by a Met, trailing Dwight Gooden (282), Matt Harvey (242) and Noah Syndergaard (231).

**FOR PETE'S SAKE:** Pete Alonso owns a slash line of .385/.467/.846 with three doubles, three home runs, 11 RBI and six runs over his last seven games...He has reached base safely multiple times in five of those seven games, including four multi-hit efforts.

**WE REMEMBER:** The New York Mets announced that the team will wear a tribute uniform patch all season long to honor Mets Hall of Famer Ed Kranepool...Kranepool passed away on September 8, 2024, at age 79...Kranepool played for the Mets from 1962-1979, spending his entire 18-year career with the Mets...He was a member of the 1969 Miracle Mets, a 1965 All-Star and the club's all-time leader in games played...Kranepool remains in the Mets all-time top 10 in many statistical categories including plate appearances, hits, at-bats, total bases, doubles, RBI, walks and runs scored...He was inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame in 1990.

**HIS NEW HOLMES:** Today, Clay Holmes makes his Mets Citi Field debut...For his career, the right-hander has made four appearances at Citi Field and has allowed two runs over 3.2 innings...On September 11, 2021, Holmes was the winning pitcher in a Yankees 8-7 victory over the Mets.

**YOU AGAIN?:** Holmes will face the Marlins for the second straight time...On April 2 at loanDepot Park, Holmes allowed two runs (1 ER) over 4.2 innings, gave up six hits, issued two walks and recorded six strikeouts...His six strikeouts in his last start matched a career best set in his second career big league start on July 14, 2018 with Pittsburgh...In 10 career games against the Marlins, Holmes is 1-1 with a 3.07 ERA (5 ER/14.2 IP), 15 strikeouts, nine walks and one save.

**NEW ROLE WHO DIS:** Holmes started for the Mets on Opening Day (3/27 at HOU) in just his fifth career major league start...The first four starts of Holmes' career came in his first big league season, 2018 with Pittsburgh...Holmes is 1-2 with a 6.86 ERA (15 ER/19.2 IP) in his career as a starter...He is just the 10th pitcher in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to start Opening Day having made four or fewer career starts prior, joining Marty Pattin (4, 1969), Tom Hall, (4, 1969), Fernando Valenzuela (1981, 0), Al Holland (1982, 3), Dave Nied (1993, 2), Tanner Scheppers, (2014, 0), Dustin May (2020, 4), Garrett Crochet (2024, 0) and Sean Burke (2025, 3)...Courtesy of Sarah Langs.

**LET'S TAKE A LOOK BACK AT LAST SEASON:** In 2024, Holmes made 67 relief appearances with the Yankees and pitched to a 3.14 ERA (22 ER/63.0 IP)...His career-high 30 saves ranked fourth in the American League and eighth in the majors...In his final outing of 2024, September 29 vs. Pittsburgh, Holmes locked up his 74th career save and moved into a tie with John Wetteland for seventh-most in Yankees history (since saves became an official stat in 1969)...Did not allow an earned run in his first 20 games of the season from March 28 - May 19, marking the second-longest season-opening streak in franchise history, trailing only Dellin Betances' season-opening 26-game streak in 2015 (since ER became an official stat in 1913)...His 20.0IP over that span were the most by any major league reliever who had not allowed an earned run during that stretch...Also did not allow an earned run in 23 games from September 25, 2023 - May 19, 2024, the second-longest streak of his career, trailing only a 29-game stretch from April 9 - June 18, 2022...Did not allow an earned run in 29 of his first 30 appearances of the season from March 28 - June 9, going 1-1 with 19 saves and a 1.23 ERA (4 ER/29.1 IP) over that stretch...His 19 saves were tied with Cleveland's Emmanuel Clase (19) for the second-most over that span, trailing only St. Louis' Ryan Helsley (21)...Allowed 14 runs (10 ER) in 14 games from June 13 - July 30...Was named to his second career All-Star team (also: 2022)...Over his final 22 appearances of the year, held opponents to a .188 (12-64) average and was unscored upon in 17 of those appearances...Appeared in 13 Postseason games and went 3-1 with a 2.25 ERA (3 ER/12.0 IP) and 12 strikeouts...Pitched in the Yankees first eight Postseason games...Became the fifth pitcher in major league history to appear in each of their club's first eight postseason games, joining Tyler Matzek (2021 with Atlanta), Greg Holland (2014 with Kansas City), Wade Davis (2014 with Kansas City) and Jesse Orosco (1996 with Baltimore)...Became the 11th relief pitcher in major league history with three or more wins in a single Postseason and the third Yankee to accomplish the feat (also: Sparky Lyle, 1977 and Mike Stanton, 2000).

**CLAYMATION:** Holmes became the seventh Mets pitcher to make their team debut as the club's Opening Day starter...The others are Roger Craig (4/11/62 at STL), Don Cardwell (4/11/67 vs. PIT), Mike Hampton (3/29/00 vs. CHC), Tom Glavine (3/31/03 vs. CHC), Pedro Martínez (4/4/05 at CIN) and Johan Santana (3/31/08 at FLA)...Courtesy of *Elias*...Additionally, Holmes celebrated his 32nd birthday on Opening Day...He became the seventh pitcher in major league history to start Opening Day on their birthday joining Vic Willis (4/12/1906 PIT at STL), Marty Pattin (4/6/1971 MIL at MIN), Bert Blyleven (4/6/73 MIN at OAK and 4/6/79 PIT vs. MTL), Catfish Hunter (4/8/76 NYY at MIL), Jon Lieber (4/2/01 CHC vs. MTL) and Ryan Drese (4/5/05 TEX at LAA)...Courtesy of *Elias*.

**STAYING GROUNDED:** Since 2019, Holmes' 67.4% groundball rate is the highest mark in the majors during that span (min. 1000 BF)...In each of the last four seasons, Holmes' groundball rate has ranked in the top five in the majors, including a league-leading 77.0% mark in 2022 (min. 250 BF each season)...Additionally, Holmes has only allowed 18 home runs since 2019, the third fewest in the majors during that span behind only Emmanuel Clase (14) and Aaron Bummer (15) (min. 1000 BF).

**HOPE SPRINGS ETERNAL:** In five Grapefruit League starts, Holmes allowed two runs over 19.1 innings, pitched to a 0.78 WHIP and held opposing batters to a .109 (7-64) average...Four of Holmes' five Grapefruit League outings were scoreless starts, including his first three...Holmes started the Grapefruit League opener for the Mets on February 22 vs. Houston and threw 3.0 perfect innings...The right-hander registered a pair of eight-strikeout performances, March 9 vs. Washington (3.2 IP) and March 21 vs. St. Louis (5.1 IP)...His 23 strikeouts on the Spring were tied for sixth in the Grapefruit League and tied for 13th in the majors...Among pitchers with 15.0 or more innings, Holmes ranked third in the majors in ERA (0.93) and fourth in WHIP.

**REELIN' IN THE YEARS:** Holmes was selected by Pittsburgh in the ninth round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft out of Slocomb High School (AL)...He was signed by Pirates scout Darren Mazerowski, the son of Hall of Famer Bill Mazerowski...The 6-5, 245-pounder made his major league debut on April 6, 2018 with Pittsburgh vs. Cincinnati and appeared in 91 career games with the Pirates from 2018-2021...Was acquired by the Yankees on June 26, 2021, in exchange for INF Hoy Park and INF Diego Castillo...Established career highs in games (69), innings (70.0 IP), wins (8) and strikeouts (77) during the 2021 season...Became the Yankees closer in 2022 and recorded 74 saves from 2022-2024, the third-most in the AL and the 11th-most in the majors during that span...Earned a career-high 30 saves in 2024 and became the 11th pitcher in Yankees franchise history to record 30+ saves in a season...Is a two-time American League All-Star (2022, 2024) and was twice named American League Relief Pitcher of the Month (May 2022, Sept./Oct. 2023)...Over 16 career Postseason appearances, is 3-1 with a 1.35 ERA (3 ER/20.0 IP), a 0.90 WHIP and a .172 (11-64) batting average.

- Pitched 2.1 scoreless innings on April 5 against Toronto, which extended his career-high season-opening scoreless streak to 7.1 innings...He has retired 22 of his 26 batters faced (3 H, BB)...Was the 10th time in his career and second time this season that he has pitched at least 2.1 innings...Him and teammate Max Kranick are two of three relief pitchers in the majors to complete at least 7.0 IP and not allow a run (Other: Ben Casparius, LAD).
- Got the final two outs and picked up the save in the Mets 6-5 win on April 2 at Miami...It was his first career save after not recording one in his first 118 career appearances.
- Pitched 2.1 scoreless innings on Opening Day (March 27) against Houston.
- Made his second career Opening Day roster and his first with the Mets.
- Appeared in nine Grapefruit League games and finished with a 1.69 ERA (2 ER/10.2 IP) and 14 strikeouts.
- Began last season with Miami before he was acquired by the Mets on July 30 in exchange for INF Wilfredo Lara.
- Finished last season with a 5.14 ERA (12 ER/21.0 IP) and 51 strikeouts over 39 games between the Marlins and Mets.

- Pitched two scoreless innings and earned the win on April 2 at Miami...It was his seventh career win as a reliever and his seven wins since the start of the 2024 season are tied for the 15th-most amongst relievers during that time frame (Tied for 10th-most in the NL).
- Made his first career Opening Day roster.
- Pitched in six Grapefruit League games and surrendered two runs in 5.2 innings of work while striking out six.
- Was on the Wild Card, NLDS and NLCS rosters...He appeared in all three rounds and pitched to a 6.43 ERA (5 ER/7.0 IP) over six appearances.
- Recalled from Triple-A Syracuse on July 2...Also, with the Mets from April 4-5 and April 14-May 15.
- In 2024 he completed 36.0 innings in 23 relief outings and allowed eight runs (2.00 ERA), going 6-0 with three saves and 41 strikeouts...Was 1-3 with a 3.08 ERA (13 ER/38.0 IP) in seven starts.
