**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets enjoyed a day off yesterday...On Sunday, the Mets fell to the Mariners, 12-1, in Seattle...New York has dropped three straight games...The Mets are coming off their "Long Strange Trip" (4-6) going to Anaheim (1-2), St. Louis (1-0), Colorado (2-1) and Seattle (0-3)...The team returns home tonight for the start of a nine-game homestand against Oakland (three games), Miami (three games) and Baltimore (three games).

**METS CONNECT:** Yesterday, the New York Mets unveiled Mets Connect, the team's first-ever loyalty program, open to all Mets fans for the remainder of the 2024 season...The new program is designed to reward Mets fans with unique offerings and experiences while bringing them closer to the team that they love...Fans can easily join the program via the MLB Ballpark app to immediately begin earning points by scanning their digital membership card while transacting at Citi Field or participating in digital games wherever they are located...Enrollment is open to all Mets fans now via the MLB Ballpark app or by visiting metsconnect.com.

**SMILE TUESDAYS:** Mets shortstop Francisco Lindor hosted young girls from PowerPlay on Tuesday, as part of his Smile Tuesdays program...PowerPlay's mission advances the lives of girls through sports, helping them grow physically, emotionally, and academically stronger...PowerPlay's programming focuses on teaching girls fundamental skills in a variety of sports so they become confident in their athletic abilities and enjoy playing...Before attending the game, the young girls arrived early to watch batting practice and later met with Lindor to learn about his career, how he maintains a consistent routine, and the importance of dental hygiene...As part of the program, the participants also received dental tips from Dr. Howard Livers, DDS, and took home Mets swag and dental kits.

**BLACKBURN FLY:** Tonight, Paul Blackburn will make his home debut as a member of the Mets...He has made two starts as a member of the Mets and is 1-0 with a 1.50 ERA (2 ER/12.0 IP) with four walks and 12 strikeouts...Both appearances were quality starts...Tonight will mark the second start for Blackburn at Citi Field...On July 21, 2017, the right-handed pitcher took the loss, allowing four earned runs on six hits with one walk and one strikeout across 5.1 innings of work.

**HOME, SWEET HOME:** The Mets are 17-6 over their 23 games at Citi Field...The team has homered in all but three of those games, hitting .264/.352/.487 in that span with 49 doubles, two triples, 39 homers, 93 walks with an .838 OPS...New York is 30-29 at home this year (30-28) at Citi Field.

**INTERLEAGUE PETE:** Alonso has hit 53 home runs in Interleague Play...His 53 home runs against the American League is a franchise record, and the most among any player since he entered the league 2019...Mike Piazza was the previous record holder with 28 Interleague home runs.

**THEY'RE OUT OF OUR LEAGUE:** The Mets are 13-18 in Interleague Play this year...Last year introduced the new schedule format which had New York playing a total of 46 Interleague games in 2023, more than double their previous high for a single season (20)...The Mets went 19-27 against the American League...Overall, New York owns a 267-272 record in Interleague play.

**DON'T CALL IT A COMEBACK:** The Mets were a season-low 11 games under .500 on June 2 (24-35)...Since then, the Mets have gone 37-22...Their 37 wins are tied for the second-most in the majors in that span, while their .627 winning percentage is third-best...Following a loss on May 29, the Mets have played 63 games, going 39-24 in that span...Their 39 wins are tied for the second-most in the majors, while their .619 winning percentage is third-best...They have outscored their opponents 334-277 during those 63 games.

**A'S-METS NOTES:** The Mets are hosting the A's for the first time since July 21-23, 2017...The Mets have won four straight and five of the last six against the A's.

**GIVE ME A BREAK:** Jeff McNeil has hit six home runs in 22 games following the All-Star break, batting .324 (24-75) with 16 runs, seven doubles, three walks, 14 RBI with a 1.020...In 88 games prior to the break, he hit five home runs, batting .218 (64-296) with 35 runs, 14 doubles, five home runs, 24 RBI, 22 walks with a .591 OPS...In 32 games since the start of the series vs. Pittsburgh on July 5, McNeil is batting .300 (30-100) with 20 runs, 10 doubles, seven home runs, 19 RBI, six walks, one steal with a .345 OBP, a .610 SLG and a .955 OPS...He has recorded 228 career multi-hit games...That is 14th in Mets history...Buddy Harrelson is next with 231...He ranks 12th with 167 doubles...Mookie Wilson is 11th with 170 two-baggers.

**LUCKY STRIKE:** The Mets bullpen is first in the majors with 496 strikeouts this season...That already places them ninth in franchise history...The 2018 and 1999 teams are tied for seventh with 514 punchouts...The franchise record was set in 2021 with 658 strikeouts from the bullpen...Last season, Mets relievers recorded 571 punchouts, which was fourth-most in team history, but 27th in the majors.

**DINGERS:** The Mets are sixth in the majors and third in the Senior Circuit with 147 home runs this season...The Mets have six players who have hit 10 or more home runs this year (Pete Alonso, Francisco Lindor, J.D. Martinez, Brandon Nimmo, Mark Vientos and Jeff McNeil)...Last year, the Mets featured eight players with 10 or more home runs, tied for the third-most in franchise history.

**WHO'S ON THIRD?:** Last year, Mets third baseman hit a total of 14 home runs, 62 runs, 18 doubles, two triples, 54 RBI while slashing .212/.266/.324...In 70 games this season, Mark Vientos is batting .270 (68-252) with 35 runs, 16 doubles, 17 home runs, 44 RBI, 20 walks, a .324 OBP, a .536 SLG with an .859 OPS...Entering 2024, Vientos had played a total of 81 games and hit .205 (52-254) with six doubles, one triple, 10 home runs, 25 RBI, 15 walks with a .255 OBP, a .354 SLG and a .610 OPS.

**HIP, HIP JOSÉ:** In 10 appearances as a reliever this year, José Buttó is 4-0 with a 0.87 ERA (2 ER/20.2 IP) with six walks and 24 strikeouts...Overall, he is 5-3 with a 2.30 ERA (15 ER/58.2 IP) with 27 walks and 62 strikeouts...According to Elias, only one other Mets pitcher has earned 4+ wins and 2+ saves in his first 10 relief appearances of a season, Roger McDowell in 1985 (also 4 W, 2 SV).

**START ME OFF:** In 75 games batting in the leadoff spot this year, Lindor is hitting .294/.370/.508 with 51 runs, 21 doubles, 15 home runs, 47 RBI, 29 walks, 18 steals with an .878 OPS...The Mets are 42-33 when Lindor bats first this season...Among qualified hitters, Lindor's 15 home runs are tied for the fifth-most, while his .878 OPS is the eighth-best.

BLACKBURN NEWS & NOTES

**DAZZLING DEBUT:** On August 2 at Los Angeles-AL, Paul Blackburn earned the win his Mets debut after he allowed one run over 6.0 scoreless innings...The right-hander became the 10th pitcher in franchise history to allow one or zero runs over 6.0 or more innings and earn the win in his team debut.

**WELCOME TO NEW YORK:** Tonight Blackburn will make his Citi Field Mets debut. On July 30, the Mets acquired Blackburn from Oakland in exchange for minor league RHP Kade Morris...The 30-year-old has made nine starts this year, going 4-2 with a 4.41 ERA (25 ER/51.0 IP) with 14 walks and 38 strikeouts... Blackburn was on the Injured List from May 11-July 26 with a stress fracture of the fifth metatarsal of his right foot...He appeared in three rehab games between Single-A Stockton and Triple-A Las Vegas.

**SIZZLING START:** This season, Blackburn began the season with a scoreless streak of 22.1 innings...It was the longest scoreless streak to open the season by an A's starting pitcher in franchise history breaking the previous high of 16.0 scoreless innings by Matt Keough (1980)...It was the third-longest scoreless streak by an A's pitcher to start the season behind only Ryan Cook (3/28-5/27/2012) and Harry Krause (4/22-5/10/1910)...Blackburn began the season with three straight starts of 6.0 or more scoreless innings...He is the ninth starting pitcher in major league history since 1914 to begin the season with three straight scoreless starts of 6.0 or more innings and was the first starter since James Paxton (4/5-4/15/17) to accomplish the feat.

**ACROSS LEAGUE LINES:** In 16 career Interleague starts, Blackburn is 7-2 with a 2.73 ERA (28 ER/92.1 IP)...This season, Blackburn is 3-0 with a 1.80 ERA (5 ER/25.0 IP) in four Interleague starts...Three of those starts have been quality starts and on April 17 vs. St. Louis, he fell just 0.1 inning short of a quality start after he was pulled from the game with two outs in the sixth inning after he allowed three runs...Over his last nine Interleague starts dating back to June 10, 2023, Blackburn is 5-1 with a 1.78 ERA (11 ER/55.2 IP)...Seven of those starts during that span have been quality starts and the righty has allowed one or zero runs in six of those starts.

**HOME IS WHERE THE HEART IS:** In four home starts this season, Blackburn is 2-0 with a 1.38 ERA (4 ER/26.0 IP)...Three of those starts at home have been quality starts and Blackburn has pitched into the sixth inning in each of those starts...In seven road starts this season, Blackburn is 3-2 with a 5.59 ERA (23 ER/37.0 IP)...The right-hander has allowed four or more runs in four of those starts and has allowed eight of his nine home runs this season on the road...For his career, Blackburn owns a 4.49 ERA (115 ER/230.2 IP) in 46 career road outings compared to a 5.05 ERA (104 ER/185.1 IP) in 37 career home outings.

**CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:** Blackburn was originally drafted by the Cubs in the first round (56th overall) of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft out of Heritage High School in Brentwood, California...On July 20, 2016 Blackburn and INF Daniel Vogelbach were traded to the Mariners in exchange for RHP Jordan Pries and LHP Mike Montgomery...On November 12, Blackburn was traded to Oakland in exchange for INF Danny Valencia...At the age of 23, Blackburn made his major league debut with Oakland on July 1, 2017 vs. Atlanta and allowed one unearned run over 6.0 innings...Blackburn finished his rookie season with a record of 3-1 and a 3.22 ERA (21 ER/58.2 IP) over 10 career starts...From 2018-2021, Blackburn appeared in 20 games (17 Starts) and pitched to a 7.60 ERA (67 ER/79.1 IP)... In 2018, Blackburn was limited to six starts due to a right elbow injury...In 2022, Blackburn was named an American League All-Star and established career highs in starts (21) and innings (111.1) before suffering a season-ending right middle finger injury...Last season, the right-hander appeared in a career-high-tying 21 games (20 starts) and recorded a career-high 104 strikeouts...Blackburn began the 2023 season with a right middle finger injury.

**TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP DAVID PETERSON (6-1, 3.34)**

**LAST TIME OUT:** Picked up the win while allowing one run over 5.0 innings in the Mets 9-1 victory on August 8 at Colorado...Allowed four hits, issued three walks and struck out five batters.

**RETURN OF THE PETE:** Made his season debut on May 29 vs. Los Angeles-NL... Allowed three runs (two earned) on seven hits with one walk and struck out three over 5.0 innings of work...Was his first start of the season...The southpaw has started the season on the 60-Day IL after undergoing left hip surgery in the off-season.

- Has 26 doubles this season over 118 games...Had 21 doubles over 154 games in 2023.
- Launched a two-run homer in the 10th on July 2 at Washington...Has five career home runs in extra-innings tied with Kevin McReynolds for second-most in Mets history...Only Howard Johnson (Nine) has more.
- Has 561 RBI, sixth-most in franchise history...Ed Kranepool (614) is next...Has 217 home runs, fourth-most in franchise history...Mike Piazza (220) is next.
- Has 34 multi-hit games, tied for the 10th-most in the NL.
- Has 17 home runs and 22 doubles over his last 81 games dating to May 7...His 22 doubles during that span are tied for the 12th-most in the majors, while his 39 extra-base hits are tied for the 15th-most in the majors during that span.

- Is batting .179 (10-56) since the All-Star Break...Batted .333 (29-87) in his last 28 games prior to the All-Star Break.
- Went 1-4 with a solo homer on July 26 vs. Atlanta...Was his first home runs since June 26 vs. Yankees, ending a 68 at-bat homerless drought.
- Went 2-5 with a go-ahead double in the sixth and an RBI triple in the 10th on July 1 at Washington...Was his first career triple.
- Posted a 1123 OPS in June, the highest mark by a catcher younger than 23 in a month (Min. 50 Plate Appearances) since Johnny Bench in June 1970 (1208)...Courtesy of Mathew Brownstein.
- Went 3-3 with a home run, a double, a walk, three RBI and three runs on June 26 vs. Yankees...Was the third time in his career reaching base four times in a game.
