

FÉLIX HERNÁNDEZ: HALL OF FAME CANDIDATE



Félix Hernández was one of the greatest pitchers of his generation. A true workhorse, King Felix played his entire 15 year career in Seattle, where he was one of the most fearsome and reliable pitchers in the Major Leagues.

King Félix made his Major League debut on August 4, 2005 at the age of 19 years and 118 days, one of four teenagers since 1995 to pitch in a Major League game. From his first full season in 2006 until his last full season without injury in 2015, Felix was nothing short of dominant, amassing over 2,000 strikeouts and 2,000 innings pitched.

Hernández, born in Valencia, Venezuela finished his career as the all-time leader in virtually every major pitching statistic among players born in Venezuela.

He is one of just 5 pitchers with 2,500+ strikeouts and 2,500+ innings pitched for only one franchise, joined by Hall of Famers Walter Johnson-WSH, Bob Gibson-STL and Bob Feller-CLE, and future Hall of Famer Clayton Kershaw-LAD.

He accomplished numerous incredible feats throughout his career, including a 4 strikeout inning and an immaculate inning. He was a 6-time All-Star, including starting the game for the American League in 2014, a Cy Young Award winner in 2010 (and runner-up in 2009 and 2014) won the AL ERA title twice (2010 and 2014), and the Major League ERA title in 2010. But none of those feats were more impressive—or impactful—than his perfect game on August 15, 2012 against the Tampa Bay Rays.

There is no better example of King Félix's impact on Seattle, than the dedicated fans of the "Kings Court", who would fill the left field stands with gold shirts and "K" cards, their cheers reverberating around the stadium.

The face of the Mariners franchise for more than a decade, Hernández finished his career as the Mariners all-time leader in strikeouts (2,524), wins (169), starts (418) and innings pitched (2729.2), while his ERA (3.42) is tied for the franchise-best.

OPENING DAY ARTIST

King Félix was dynamic in each of his franchise record 11 Opening Day starts, including 10-consecutive from 2009-18, going a career 7-2 with a 1.53 ERA (13 ER, 76.2 IP) with 78 SO, 21 BB and 1 CG, while holding opponents to a .147 (38x259) batting average and having a 0.770 WHIP.

Among pitchers who have made at least 5 Opening Day starts since 1920, Félix's 1.53 ERA ranks 9th all-time.

FÉLIX FEATS

- ✦ Recalled from Triple-A Tacoma and made ML debut Aug. 4, 2005 at Comerica Park vs. Detroit, allowing just two runs, one earned, in 6.0 IP... allowed two hits and two walks to first four batters, but retired 14 of the final 16 batters faced...debut made him just the third 19-year-old to debut as a starting pitcher since 1984 (also: Dwight Gooden, 4/7/84, and Todd Van Poppel, 9/11/91)...only Julio Urías (5/27/16) has done it since.
- ✦ Recorded first ML win in second career start on Aug. 9, 2005 vs. Twins, tossing 8.0 scoreless innings, allowing only 5 hits and striking out 6...only 2 players had thrown 8.0+ innings within their first 2 career starts in Mariners history (John Cummings, 4/15/93 and Clint Zavaras, 6/3/89)...only Andrew Moore (7/3/17) has done it since.
- ✦ Struck out 11 batters on Aug. 15, 2005 vs. Kansas City, becoming the 12th teenager in MLB history to strikeout double digit batters in a game...he remains the most recent player in MLB history to accomplish the feat.
- ✦ Pitched first career shutout Aug. 28, 2006, blanking the Angels 2-0...at just 20 years, 142 days, Hernández, is the most recent player in MLB history to through a shutout before turning 21 (previous: Kerry Wood (5/6/98, 20 years, 324 days).
- ✦ Recorded then career-high 12 strikeouts April 2, 2007, Opening Day vs. Oakland...was the Majors' first Opening-Day pitcher to strike out at least 12 batters without allowing a run since Bob Gibson (STL) in 1967...only Shane Bieber-CLE (2020) has done it since...also became the 4th pitcher since 1900 to start and win an Opening Day game before his 21st birthday and remains the last pitcher to do it.

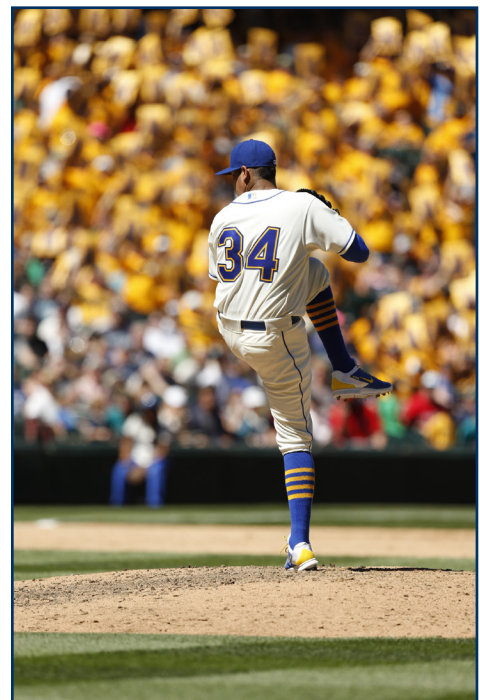


- ✦ Recorded 1,000th career strikeout Aug. 25, 2010 at Boston (6th inning, D. Ortiz)...at the time, became the 4th-youngest pitcher in MLB history to reach 1,000 career K's (24 years, 139 days old).
- ✦ Recorded 4 strikeouts in the top of the 8th inning June 3, 2010 vs. Minnesota...became 3rd Mariners pitcher (last: Kazuhiro Sasaki, 4/4/03 at TEX)...only James Paxton has done it since...at the time, was the 22nd in AL history and the 9th AL pitcher to strike out all 4 batters in consecutive order.
- ✦ Became the first, and only, Mariners pitcher to hit a home run on June 23, 2008 at Shea Stadium...Félix came to the plate with the bases loaded in the top of the 2nd inning, and hit the first pitch he saw from Johan Santana over the fence in right field for a grand slam...Félix remains the only American League pitcher after 1973 (the first year of the designated hitter in the AL) to hit a grand slam.

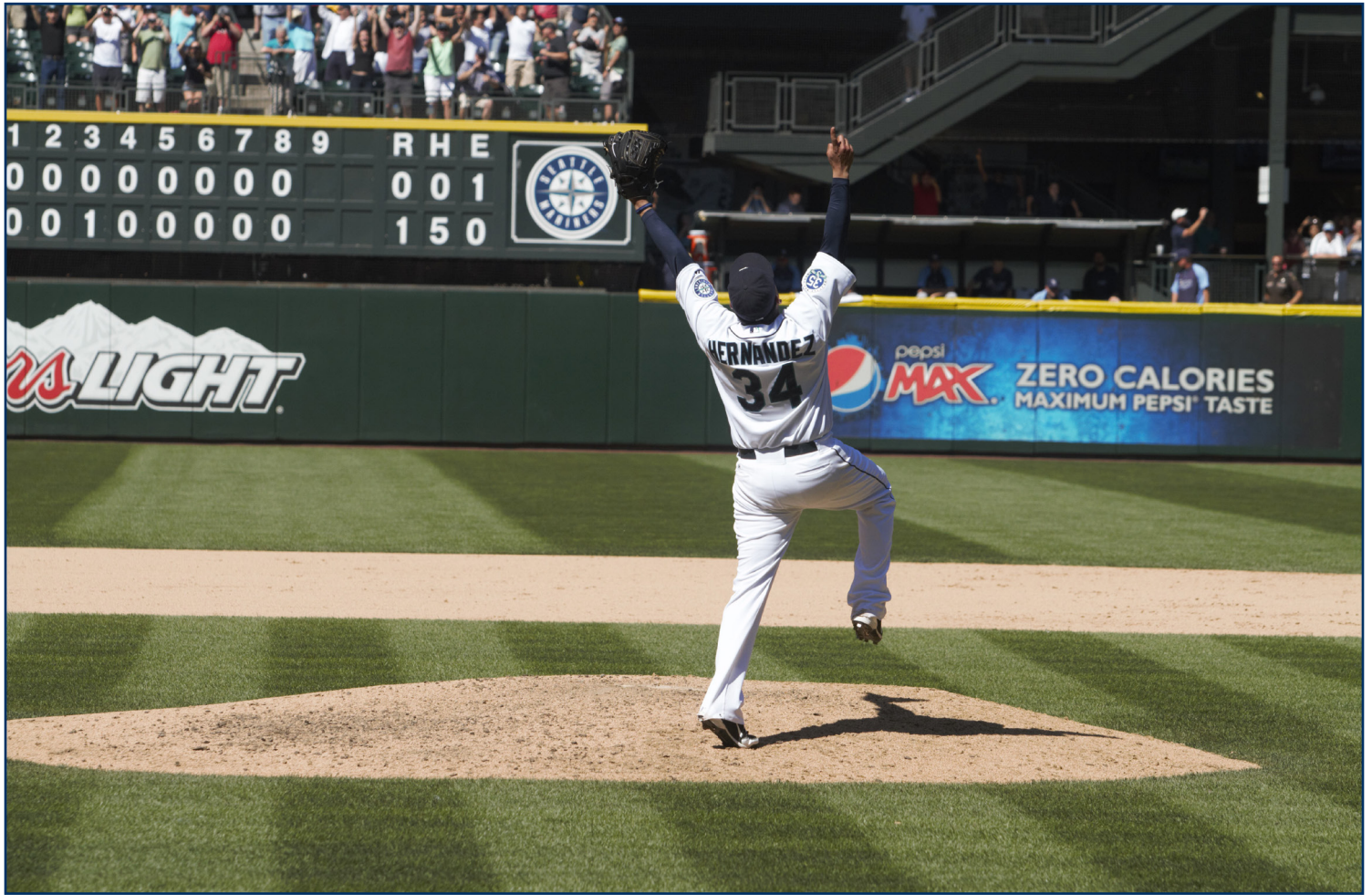


- ✦ Recorded three starts with 10+ strikeouts and zero walks (5/22/11 at SD - 13 K, 7/5/11 at OAK - 10 K, 8/7/11 at LAA - 12 K) to tie the single-season club record with Randy Johnson (1995)...he matched his franchise record again in 2014, striking out 10+ without a walk on 4/11/14 vs. OAK, 11 K, 6/18/14 at SD, 10 K and 7/25/14 vs. BAL - 10 K...remains the most recent Mariners pitcher to accomplish the feat 3 times in a season.
- ✦ Earned a CG victory on Opening Day, April 1, 2011 at Oakland (9.0,5,2,2,0,5,HR)...after allowing a HR in the first inning...retired 23 of last 26 batters faced...first 9.0 CG win by a Mariners starter on Opening Day.
- ✦ Led the Majors and set a Mariners record in 2012 with 5 shutouts (6/28 vs. BOS, 7/14 vs. TEX, 8/4 at NYY, 8/15 vs. TB, 8/27 at MIN)...became the first pitcher since Randy Johnson in 1998 to record 5+ shutouts over a 12-start span...joined Bert Blyleven (1989), Roger Clemens (1992) and David Wells (1998) as the only AL pitchers with 5 shutouts in a season (since 1989)...remains the last MLB pitcher to record 5+ shutouts in a single season.
- ✦ Recorded three shutouts in 2012 with 12 or more strikeouts, including 2 shutouts with 12+ strikeouts and zero walks (7/14 vs. TEX & 8/15 vs. TB)...only 3 pitchers have accomplished that feat in a single season in MLB history (also: Randy Johnson-SEA/HOU, 4 in 1998 and Pedro Martínez-BOS, 3 in 2000)
- ✦ Struck out 10 batters in 4.0 innings Sept. 22, 2013 at LAA, becoming the first pitcher in more than 100 years to post a double-digit strikeout total in a game in which he recorded no more than 12 outs...last pitcher to do this was Smoky Joe Wood (Boston-AL), 10 strikeouts in 4.0 innings of relief at Cleveland on July 17, 1909...10 pitchers have accomplished the feat since.
- ✦ Recorded his 100th career victory April 22, 2013 at Houston, at the time, becoming the 6th-youngest pitcher to earn 100th victory among players who began their career since divisional play began in 1969...only 5 have reached 100 wins at a younger age than Hernandez (27 years, 14 days old): Dwight Gooden (24.215), Bert Blyleven (25.076), Fernando Valenzuela (26.162), Don Gullett (26.199), Vida Blue (26.361).

- ✦ Was the starting pitcher for the AL in the 2014 All-Star game in Minneapolis (scoreless inning, 2 K)... second pitcher in club history to be named the AL starting pitcher, joining Randy Johnson (1995 & 1997)...first Venezuelan pitcher to start an All-Star game.
- ✦ Struck out a career-high 15 batters June 8, 2014 at Tampa Bay...12th time in club history that a pitcher had at least 15 strikeouts in a game, first since Randy Johnson had 15 on July 11, 1998 vs. Angels... Johnson (17), Mark Langston (2x) and Mike Moore (1)...only James Paxton (5/2/18 vs. OAK) has done it for Seattle since.
- ✦ Recorded 2,000th career strikeout May 10, 2014 vs. Oakland, at the time, was the 4th-youngest to reach milestone.
- ✦ Set Mariners career record for innings pitched April 29, 2015 at Texas, passing Jamie Moyer (who finished with 2,093 innings with Seattle).
- ✦ Became Venezuelan "K" king, passed Johan Santana (1,988), May 4, 2015 at LAA
- ✦ Became the Mariners all-time leader in strikeouts (4/23/16 at LAA) and wins (5/9/16 vs. TB)
- ✦ Tossed 6.0 innings on Opening Day on April 4 at Texas to give him 2,268.1 IP in his MLB career, the most by a Venezuelan-born pitcher, passing Freddy Garcia (2,264.0)
- ✦ Recorded 157th career win on June 23, 2017 vs. Houston, surpassing Freddy Garcia for the most career wins by a Venezuelan-born pitcher
- ✦ Recorded his 2,500th career strikeout on May 11 at Boston...became the 36th pitcher in Major League history to reach that milestone...at the time, was the 6th-youngest pitcher in Major League history to reach 2,500 strikeouts (33 years, 33 days of age)...he was behind only Nolan Ryan (31.101), Walter Johnson (31.197), Pedro Martinez (32.221), Tom Seaver (32.287) and Bert Blyleven (33.000).
- ✦ 1 of 13 pitchers in Major League history to record at least 2,500 strikeouts with one club...joined Walter Johnson-WSH (3,515), Bob Gibson-STL (3,117), Steve Carlton-PHI (3,031), John Smoltz-ATL (3,011), Phil Niekro-ATL (2,912), Clayton Kershaw-LAD (2,905), Don Sutton-LAD (2,696), Mickey Lolich-DET (2,679), Roger Clemens-BOS (2,590), Bob Feller-CLE (2,583), Tom Seaver-NYM (2,541) and Christy Mathewson-NYG (2,504).
- ✦ 1 of 5 pitchers to pitch entire career for 1 franchise and record at least 2,500 strikeouts and 2,500 innings pitched...he is joined by Clayton Kershaw-LAD, Bob Gibson-STL, Bob Feller-CLE and Walter Johnson-WSH.



THE PERFECT GAME



King Félix did something special, so often, it started to become ordinary. But on August 15, 2012, he did something that was extraordinary, even by his standards. And it wasn't just extraordinary, it was perfect.

For 9 innings, Félix walked to the mound as he left it, without a base runner ever reaching first base safely. The 23rd perfect game in Major League history against the Tampa Bay Rays at T-Mobile Park (then Safeco Field).

Félix was untouchable that day, striking out 12, including striking out the side in the 6th and 8th innings. Rays hitters only reached 3-ball counts 3 times in the game.

His 12 strikeouts were the 4th-most in a perfect game in MLB history, trailing Sandy Koufax's 14 on Sept. 9, 1965 vs. Chicago-NL, Matt Cain's 14 on June 13, 2012 vs. Houston and Randy Johnson's 13 on May 18, 2004 at Atlanta.

Félix was 26 years, 129 days old, the 5th-youngest player to throw a perfect game in MLB history.

It was the 7th perfect game to end with a 1-0 score.

The perfect game produced a game score of 99, the 4th-highest in any perfect game. Only 7 pitchers have reached a game score of at least 99 in any game since Félix did it in his perfecto.



10 years, 10 months and 12 days separated Félix's perfect game from Domingo Germán's on June 28, 2023, the longest span between perfect games since Len Barker broke a 13-year, 6-day streak on May 15, 1981 vs. Toronto, the first since Catfish Hunter on May 8, 1968 vs. Minnesota.

Hernández became just the 2nd latin-born player to throw a perfect game, joining Dennis Martínez on July 28, 1991 at Los Angeles-NL. Germán became the 3rd latin-born player when we completed his perfecto. Félix remains the only Venezuelan pitcher to throw a perfect game.

Felix's is one of 15 American League pitchers to throw a perfect game, and only 10 were after 1973, the first year of the designated hitter in the AL.

He became the 11th member of the Mariners Hall of Fame, joining **Alvin Davis**, **Dave Niehaus**, **Jay Buhner**, **Edgar Martinez**, **Randy Johnson**, **Dan Wilson**, **Ken Griffey Jr.**, **Lou Piniella**, **Jamie Moyer** and **Ichiro Suzuki**.

His plaque reads:

Nicknamed “King Félix.” One of the most popular Mariners of all time, the right-hander spent his entire 15-year ML career in Seattle beginning as a 19-year-old graduate of the Mariners farm system. Finished his career as the franchise leader in wins (169), ERA (tied-3.42), starts (418), innings (2,729.2) and strikeouts (2,524). Voted AL Cy Young Award in 2010 and a 2-time runner-up (2009 and 2014). A 6-time All-Star and 2-time AL ERA leader (2010 and 2014). Fired the first perfect game in Mariners history vs. Tampa Bay on August 15, 2012, only the 23rd in ML history. Beginning in 2011, the popular “King’s Court” was in session for all his starts at home. Fans with gold t-shirts and “K cards” filled sections in left field to cheer him and every strikeout. Inducted into the Mariners Hall of Fame (August 12, 2023). Born April 8, 1986, in Valencia, Venezuela.

LOCAL IMPACT



During his time in Seattle, **Félix Hernández** reached out to numerous kids with life-threatening medical conditions to help bring hope and joy to each child. He visited hundreds of kids at local hospitals and granted numerous wishes for kids from the Make-A-Wish Foundation.

He served as a spokesman for numerous community campaigns, including the “Refuse To Abuse” campaign to encourage a commitment to prevent violence in intimate relationships. He also teamed up with Macklemore in 2014 for #ChangeTheGame, an anti-bullying campaign.

In 2012, Félix helped promote the Run of Hope Seattle 5K Run & 3K Walk to benefit Seattle Children’s Hospital and the Pediatric Brain Tumor Research Fund. Through television public service announcements, Felix encouraged people to participate in the fourth annual event and help raise funds and awareness for pediatric brain tumor research at Seattle Children’s Hospital.

Hernández, a 3-time Roberto Clemente Award Nominee (2011-12, 2014) has supported a number of local charities and non-profit organizations in the Pacific Northwest, including: The Martinez Foundation, Esperanza, South Park Community Center, Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center, Special Olympics of Washington, Boys & Girls Clubs, Humane Society of Seattle/King County and JDRF.

During his career, Félix was involved with Mariners Care, the Seattle Mariners non-profit foundation, and its programs including: Mariners Get Well Tour, Mariners DREAM Team school assembly program, and Mariners HOME Project.

In addition to his accomplishments on the field, he has also played a large role off the field and he continues to have a positive impact on the lives of youth and families in our communities.

KING’S COURT

Beginning on May 28, 2011, section 150 in left field became the “King’s Court” every time King **Félix Hernández** took the mound in Seattle. Decked out in gold t-shirts and waving “K” cards, fans filled the stands and made their voices heard, chanting for a “K” every time Félix reached 2 strikes. The King’s Court became a fixture in Seattle from its inception in 2011 until Félix’s last year in 2019.
