#### Darth Hader

Josh Hader has made 34 consecutive scoreless appearances, covering 32.2 innings, dating back to 2021....during this time, opponents have hit just .084 (9-for-107, 15bb, 55k)....his 34 games and 32.2 innings scoreless are both the longest active streaks of any MLB pitcher....he last allowed a regular-season run on 7/28/21 at Pittsburgh.

# <u>Lean On Me</u>

Josh Hader has converted 27 straight save opportunities dating back to last season, the longest active streak in the majors.....his last blown save came on 7/7/21 at New York-NL.

# Saving The Day

Josh Hader has set a MLB record with saves in each of his first 13 games in a season.....the previous mark of 12 was held by Lee Smith (BAL-1994) and José Mesa (PIT-2005).

IN THE STANDINGS (37 days): The Brewers have spent the following number of days alone or tied at each position in the NL Central standings: FIRST: 18, SECOND: 7, THIRD: 5, FOURTH: 6, FIFTH: 1.....the team is currently in first place, leading the second-place Cardinals by 3.5 games.

**AT HOME:** The Brewers are 10-4 at home, going 3-1-1 in series play.....the team went 45-36 at home last season, going 14-10-2 in series play.

<u>ON THE ROAD</u>: The Brewers are 11-8 on the road, going 3-3-0 in series play.....the team went 50-31 on the road last season, going 18-7-1 in series play.....their 50 road wins in 2021 broke the franchise record set by the 1982 team (47-33).

MANAGER: Craig Counsell - the longest-tenured active manager in the National League and third in the majors - is in his eighth season as Brewers manager (550-491) and seventh full season.....he is second in franchise history in managerial wins and games managed (1,041), trailing only Phil Garner (563 wins/1,180 games).....under Counsell, the Brewers made the postseason in four consecutive years (2018-21) for the first time in franchise history.....he was named the 19th manager in franchise history on 5/4/15, replacing Ron Roenicke....he is signed through 2023.....only the Guardians' Terry Francona (10/8/12) and Rays' Kevin Cash (12/5/14) have longer active tenures.

<u>COACHES</u>: First base coach **Quintin Berry** (2nd season), pitching coach **Chris Hook** (4th season), third base coach **Jason Lane** (7th season, 2nd as 3B coach), associate pitching, catching and strategy coach **Walker McKinven** (3rd season) and bench coach **Pat Murphy** (7th season) all returned from the 2021 staff.....new to the staff is hitting coach **Connor Dawson**, infield/assistant hitting coach **Matt Erickson**, bullpen coach **Jim Henderson** and hitting coach **Ozzie Timmons**.

**LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE**: The Brewers have made six replay challenges this season, going 4-2.....their last challenge (won) came on 5/9 at Cincinnati as an out call at second base involving Jace Peterson was overturned.

LAUER AT A GLANCE: Eric Lauer, 26, is making his sixth start....Lauer last started last Friday at Atlanta in a 6-3 win (6.1ip, 2h, 2r, 1er, 3bb, 8k, 1hr, 94 pitches).....the team is 5-0 in his starts.....he has 4 quality starts, all in his last 4 outings.....opponents are batting .189 (20-for-106, 4hr).....Lauer was acquired from San Diego with INF Luis Urías and a player to be named or cash in exchange for RHP Zach Davies and OF Trent Grisham on 11/27/19 (trade completed on 5/27/20 - cash).

MAN OF THE LAUER: Over his last 19 starts dating back to last June 27, Eric Lauer is 9-2 with a 2.10 ERA (107.1ip, 25er).....he has 33 walks compared to 114 strikeouts and is holding opponents to a .188 batting average (72-for-383, 9hr).....the Dodgers' Julio Urías (1.99) is the only MLB starter with a lower ERA during this stretch (min. 105ip).

ME AND MY TEDDY: Lauer joined Teddy Higuera (1988) as the only left-handed pitchers in franchise history to have consecutive 10+ strikeout games.....he produced 13 strikeouts on 4/24 at Philadelphia, tying Higuera (3x) for the most in a game in franchise history by a left-handed pitcher, and had 11 strikeouts on 4/30 vs. Chicago-NL.

LAST SEASON: Lauer went 7-5 with a 3.19 ERA in 24 games/20 starts.....he was 7-5 with a 3.04 ERA as a starter [106.2ip, 36er] and 0-0 with a 4.50 ERA in relief [12ip, 6er]..... the team went 10-10 in his starts.....he had 8 quality starts.....opponents batted .215.....he went 6-2 with a 2.23 ERA over his last 15 games/14 starts (80.2ip, 20er).....he had three stints with the team in 2021 [4/29-5/14, 5/26-8/3 and 8/15-end].....he was on the injured list [COVID-19] from 8/4-8/14.

CAREER: Is 24-24 with a 4.10 ERA in 86 games/79 starts (421ip, 192er).....is in his fifth Major League season with San Diego (2018-19) and Milwaukee (2020-22).....was the Padres' Opening Day starter in 2019....Lauer was selected by San Diego in the first round (25th overall) of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft out of Kent State University.

CAREER AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Is 7-5 with a 3.98 ERA in 17 games/16 starts (86ip, 38er).....is 2-0 with a 1.38 ERA in 2 starts this season (13ip, 2er).

CAREER ON THE ROAD: Is 10-11 with a 4.61 ERA in 42 games/37 starts [197.1ip, 101er].....is 1-0 with a 2.16 ERA in 3 starts this season [16.2ip, 4er].
