STREAKING

The Reds have begun a season with a 7-3 record for the first time since 2017...haven't begun 8-3 since 2011.

REDS VS GIANTS

Beginning with the 2008 season, the Reds are 49-32 vs SF during the regular season, at .605 the best winning percentage of any Giants opponent since then (minimum 50 games)...beginning 6/29/12 and including that 2012 season's National League Division Series, the Redlegs have won 19 of the last 30 meetings at beautiful Oracle Park.

START ME UP

Since 1893, when the pitcher's mound was moved to its current distance from home plate, Anthony DeSclafani and Wade Miley are the only Reds pitchers to begin a season with consecutive scoreless starts of at least 5.0 innings...DeSclafani did it last season (5ip/3h, 6ip/2h) and Miley this year (6ip/2h, 5ip/2h)...courtesy @EliasSports.

FIRST-PLACE REDS

For the last 10 days the Reds have at least shared first place in the NL Central and for the seventh straight day are in first place alone...prior to this season hadn't held the top spot alone since 3/30/19, when following a rainout of that season's second game they had a 1-0 record and a lead in the NL Central of .033 percentage points over the Brewers.

For the fourth straight day and sixth day in the last 7 the Redlegs have a 1.0-game lead, their first division lead of at least 1.0g since 5/7/17 following Scott Feldman's 4-0 shutout vs Johnny Cueto and the Giants...haven't held a division lead of more than 1.0g since a season-high 1.5-game cushion on 4/18/17...haven't held a division lead of at least 2.0g since the 2015 team started 4-0 and built a season-high 2.5-game lead on 4/10.

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is Game 2 (1-0) of a 3-game series vs Mariana De Paula's Giants and Game 5 (2-2) of the Reds' first road trip of the season (1-2 at Ari, 1-0 at SF)...the Redlegs began the 2021 championship season with a 5-1 homestand vs the Cardinals (2-1) and Pirates (3-0)...following this series and beginning Friday return to Great American Ball Park for a 7-day, 6-game homestand vs the Indians (3g) and Diamondbacks (3g).

SERIES NOTES: Tonight and Wed afternoon, the Redlegs will face former teammates Kevin Gausman (2015, 15g, 1gs) and Johnny Cueto (2008-2015, 213gs, 92-63, 3.21)...beginning with the 2008 season the Reds are 49-32 vs SF (.605), the best winning percentage of any Giants opponent since then (minimum 50g)...beginning 6/29/12 and including that 2012 season's National League Division Series, the Redlegs have won 19 of the last 30 meetings at beautiful Oracle Park to even their all-time record here to 36-36.

INDIANS UP NEXT: The Reds won or tied 12 of the first 23 Ohio Cup season series, including 9 of the last 15 and 5 straight from 2006-2010, but lost 5 of the last 6 season series (1-5, 0-4, 2-2, 2-4, 1-3, 1-3)...the Reds lost 11 of the last 14 games vs Cle at Great American Ball Park, including a 6-game losing streak there snapped by a 3-2 win on 8/3/20...was the Reds' first and only win vs the Indians at GABP since 5/22/17 (5-1 win).

ROOKIE OF THE YEAR: Jonathan India leads all National League rookies in RBI and ranks second in hits...among all batters ranks T2nd in the National League in RBI and ninth in batting average...in his first 6 career apps produced 10 RBI, tied for fifth-most in Major League history by a player in his first 6 career apps behind only Dale Alexander (13 RBI in 1939), Trevor Story (12 in 2016), Nico Hoerner (11 in 2019) and Mandy Brooks (11 in 1925)...the RBI became an official statistic in 1920...courtesy @EliasSports.

LEADING OFF: Tyler Naquin is tied for the Major League lead in HR and leads the National League in RBI...Tue and Wed vs Pit, Naquin became the first Reds batter with a leadoff HR in consecutive apps since Eddie Milner did it on 6/24 vs SD & 6/25 at SF, 1984...Pete Rose (1976) and Gary Redus (1983) are the only other Reds batters with leadoff HR in consecutive apps...Naquin's 7 RBI on Tue vs Pit tie Brandon Phillips (7/30/15 vs Pit) for the most in a game by a Reds leadoff batter since the statistic became official in 1920...courtesy @EliasSports.

TAXI SQUAD: The Taxi Squad for the Reds' first road trip of the season includes RHP Heath Hembree, RHP Art Warren, C Beau Taylor, IF Max Schrock and OF Mark Payton...player information is available on Page 6.

HISTORIC: Entering Sun's game at Ari, a 7-0 loss after producing just 2 singles, the 66 runs scored by Reds batters was the highest total in franchise history through the first 8 games of a season...the 1900 Reds held the previous record, with 64 runs through 8 games...Reds batters lead the Major Leagues in runs scored, RBI and slugging percentage...are tied with the Astros for the Major League lead in HR...rank second in the majors to the defending World Series champion Dodgers in on-base percentage.

ALL-STAR GAME STATEMENT: The decision to move the All-Star Game was made by the Commissioner Rob Manfred and Major League Baseball...the Reds will support the All-Star Game wherever it is played because it is so important to baseball...we thank the Colorado Rockies and the city of Denver for agreeing to host the All-Star Game, to make sure this important jewel event takes place.

SHADES OF GRAY: RHP Sonny Gray threw simulated games on 4/6 and again Saturday without issue...he could join the rotation as early as the next homestand...has been on the injured list all season with a muscle strain in his back.

DISCIPLINED: Reds RF Nick Castellanos received a 2-game suspension and an undisclosed fine for his aggressive actions and for instigating a benches-clearing incident in the bottom of the fourth inning of the 9-6 win on 4/3 vs StL...he will continue to play while he appeals the suspension...teammates Eugenio Suárez and Jesse Winker also were fined undisclosed amounts, as were Nolan Arenado, Jordan Hicks and Yadier Molina of the Cardinals...in the fourth inning, Castellanos was ejected for the first time in his career after play was halted for 10 minutes when benches cleared...he reached base that inning when he was hit in the ribs by a Jake Woodford pitch and later scored on a wild pitch.

SHIFTING: Beginning with an exhibition game on 3/16, Eugenio Suárez made his last 10 starts of the spring at shortstop and Mike Moustakas made his last 9 starts at third base...Jonathan India led the team with 16 spring training starts at second base...in 2015, Suárez led the Reds in starts SS but in each of the last 5 seasons led the team in starts at 3B...he holds the National League record for home runs by a third baseman (49hr in 2019)...in the first 9 seasons of his Major League career through 2019, Moustakas made 1,042 apps at 3B and 47 apps at 2B...he received Rawlings Gold Glove Award votes for defensive excellence at third base in 2012, 2015, 2018 and 2019, finishing second in the balloting in 2012...last season he played second base full-time for the first time in his career and led the Reds in games at that position.

2020 RED HOTS

• With 7-2 win at Min in the 58th game of the season, the Reds clinched their first Postseason berth since 2013.

• Reds won their last 5 series of the regular season, including 4 series wins vs Postseason teams (StL, Mil, WSox, Min).

• The Reds were the only road team to win a series at Min's Target Field, where the Twins finished with the best home record in the Major Leagues at 24-7.

• The Reds joined the 1906 White Sox and 2007 Diamondbacks as the only teams ever to finish last in the league in batting average and still earn a Postseason berth.

• Became the first Reds team, since 1900, with more walks (239) than singles (221).

Tonight's Pitcher - #58 Luis Castillo, RHP

RED HOTS

- Is making his third start of the season and the 93rd of his Major League career...is his fourth career start vs the Giants and second appearance at Oracle Park.
- Rebounded from an 11-6 loss vs StL in the second Opening Day start of his career to throw 7.0 scoreless innings in his second start, Wed's 11-4 win vs the Pirates.
- In that Opening Day loss failed to record a strikeout for the first time since 4/28/18 at Min (1ip)...since then had recorded at least 1 strikeout in 69 consecutive starts (5/2/18 - 9/26/20)...allowed a career-high 10 runs, including 6 runs in the top of the first inning, and tied his career high by allowing 8 earned runs...the Reds allowed 6 runs in the top of the first inning of an Opening Day game for the first time in their history.
- Since his Major League debut in 2017 leads the Reds' pitching staff in wins (33), starts (92), IP (530) and strikeouts (583).
- Is the first pitcher with an ERA of 3.62 or lower through his first 4 seasons for the Reds, with a minimum of 90 starts, since Gary Nolan (2.92, 1967-1970).
- Led the Reds in starts in each of the previous 3 seasons, in wins and strikeouts in 2 of the last 3 seasons and in ERA and innings pitched in 2 of the previous 4 seasons.
- In 2020 ranked among the National League leaders in strikeouts per 9 innings (11.44, 6th), strikeouts (8th) and ERA (11th).
- In September 2020, led the National League in wins (4) while ranking fifth in ERA (2.20) as the Reds battled for their first Postseason berth since 2013.
- Started and suffered the 5-0 loss at Atl in the deciding Game 2 of the National League Wild Card Series...allowed only an RBI-double to Ronald Acuña Jr. with 2 outs in the bottom of the fifth inning...became just the second Reds pitcher ever to record at least 7 strikeouts while only allowing 1 run or less in a Postseason debut, joining Hod Eller (9k, 1919 World Series Game 5 at White Sox).
- In 2019 was the Reds' Opening Day starting pitcher, a National League All-Star and the NL's Pitcher of the Month for March/April.
- In 2019 averaged 10.57 strikeouts per 9 innings, the highest ratio in Reds history for pitchers with a minimum of 125 innings...in the shortened 2020 season averaged 11.44 strikeouts per 9 innings over 70 innings pitched.

RED HOTS

- Last name rhymes with rally.
- In Fri's 10-inning, 6-5 win at Ari threw 92 pitches in 4.0 hitless innings.
- Doesn't turn 27 years old until 9/29 but already has completed 4 Major League seasons.
- Made his fourth consecutive Opening Day roster.
- Has made 63 of his 64 Major League apps as a starting pitcher...made his only relief appearance, following 54 career starts, on 8/12/20 vs KC...entered that 5-4 loss in the second inning to replace starter Wade Miley...is his only professional relief appearance since 2015, when he made 26 starts and 1 relief appearance.
- During the 2020 season, opponents hit just .198.
- Was on the Reds' 2020 Wild Card Series roster but didn't pitch in the 2-game series sweep loss at Atl.
- In 2020 pitched out of the starting rotation in each of his first 2 apps (0-0, 1.80, .194oba) and in each of his last 7 apps (2-2, 3.67, .198oba).
- From 8/28-9/8 produced 3 consecutive quality starts, tying his career high (1-1, 3.48).
- In the minor leagues threw a no-hitter on 6/13/16 for Class A Daytona at Jupiter in which he faced the minimum 27 batters (4-0 win, 6k, 1hbp, 105 pitches) and a 9-inning perfect game on 4/22/17 for Class AA Pensacola at Mobile (1-0 win, 8k, 88 pitches, 68 strikes).
