THE TWINS: After completing their six-game roadtrip with a record of 2-4, the Twins began a six-game homestand with a victory over Washington last night...tonight, they will play the second of three games against the Nationals, with the series finale set for tomorrow afternoon... following this series, they will host the Red Sox for three games from Monday-Wednesday.

TWINS TAKE W FROM WASHINGTON: The Twins shut out the Nationals, 1-0, last night at Target Field...Zebby Matthews was the starter and winner, tossing 6.0 shutout innings with two hits allowed, no walks and seven strikeouts, for his first career quality start; retired 11-straight batters to start the game...the lone run of the night came on a Byron Buxton sacrifice fly in the fifth inning...the Twins had just three hits but reached base safely 10 times, walking six times and getting plunked once...marked Minnesota's eighth shutout win, 12th one-run victory and first 1-0 win since July 1, 2023 at Baltimore.

MONUMENT MEETS MINNEAPOLIS: The Twins and Nationals are playing each other for the 25th, 26th and 27th times in their history this weekend...the Twins are 13-12 all-time against the Montreal/Washington franchise...Twins are 3-4 at Target Field (2019 & '23), 3-6 at Nationals Park (2013, '16 & '24), 4-2 at the Metrodome (2007 & '08) and 3-0 in Montreal (2004).
✦ Byron Buxton has an .838 OPS in nine career games against the Nationals, including two doubles, three home runs and five RBI...he has hit safely in seven of those nine career games...one of Buck's 15 career multi-homer games was at Nationals Park last year in game two, homering twice off Patrick Corbin.

HISTORY LESSONS: For 60 years, the Washington Senators played baseball in our nation's capital, winning one World Championship (1924) and three AL pennants (1925, '33)...in 1961, owner Calvin Griffith moved the Senators from Washington, D.C. to Bloomington, Minnesota...the Senators played from 1901-1960, compiling a record of 4223-4864...the Senators beat the New York Giants in the 1924 World Series in seven games, marking the only World Series victory for the franchise during its first 60-year tenure in Washington.
✦ The Twins enter tonight's game with an all-time club record (since 1961) of 5086-5143-8 and an all-time franchise record (Senators and Twins) of 9310-10006.

THE EXPERIENCE: Joe Ryan earned his 10th win of the season and struck out a season-high-tying 11 batters in his last start on July 20 at Colorado...he enters today ranked among qualified American League pitchers in a number of categories, including: WHIP (0.90, 3rd), strikeout percent (29.2, 4th), walk percent (5.1, 4th), opponent batting average (.196, 5th), strikeouts-per-nine innings (10.21, 5th), fWAR (2.9, 7th) and ERA (2.63, 7th),

HE'S OUT OF THEIR LEAGUE: In his last 28 Interleague games, Byron Buxton is hitting .336 (37-for-110) with five doubles, three triples, 10 home runs, 16 RBI and a 1.086 OPS...below are Buck's rankings in a few categories among Twins all-time in Interleague Play (since 1997):

THE OTHER GUYS: Twins have gone 16-21 in Interleague Play this season, going 0-3 at St. Louis (March 27-30), 2-1 vs. New York-NL (April 14-16), 0-3 at Atlanta (April 18-20), 3-0 vs. San Francisco (May 9-11), 2-1 at Milwaukee (May 16-18), 1-2 at Cincinnati (June 17-19), 0-3 vs. Milwaukee (June 20-22), 1-2 at Miami (July 1-3), 2-1 vs. Chicago (July 8-10), 2-1 vs. Pittsburgh (July 11-13), 1-2 at Colorado (July 18-20), 1-2 at Los Angeles-NL (July 21-23) and 1-0 vs. Washington (July 25-27).

✦ Twins have three NL teams still to play (after the Nationals): Padres (August 29-31), D-Backs (September 12-14) and Phillies (September 26-28).

ROYCE MAKING NOISE: Royce Lewis had one of the Twins' three hits last night...below are his season comparisons in a few categories:

DAYS GONE BYRON: Over his last 35 games, Buxton is hitting .323 (43-for-133) with eight doubles, one triple, 13 home runs, 21 RBI, 31 runs scored, 12 walks, a .385 on-base percentage, a .692 slugging percentage and a 1.077 OPS.

✦ He has a 14.04 at-bat-per-home run ratio, third-best in the AL and sixth-best in baseball, trailing Cal Raleigh (9.64), Aaron Judge (10.19), Eugenio Suárez (10.36), Kyle Schwarber (10.58) and Shohei Ohtani (10.78).

FEELING MINNESOTA: The Twins have gone 29-20 at home this season, compared to 21-32 on the road...during their last homestand, they went 6-3, winning three-consecutive series vs. Tampa Bay (July 4-6), Chicago-NL (July 8-10) and Pittsburgh (July 11-13).

✦ A win tonight would give the Twins their fourth-straight series win at home.
✦ They are 9-3 in their last 12 in Minnesota, dating back to June 25.
✦ Byron Buxton has a 1.025 OPS in 41 home games this season, third best in baseball.

THE LEFTORIUM: Today marks the 20th time the Twins have faced a left-handed starter this season...Minnesota is 7-12 against lefty starters, including a win last night over southpaw Mackenzie Gore.

✦ Byron Buxton is hitting .328 (20-for-61) with four doubles, one triple, six home runs and a 1.116 OPS against left-handed pitching this season...over his last five games vs. lefties, he has five hits in 10 at-bats, including two home runs and four RBI.
✦ Over his last 28 games vs. lefties, Willi Castro is hitting .320 (16-for-50) with a 1.033 OPS.

NEW KIDS ON THE FARM: The Twins yesterday signed their two remaining unsigned selections from the 2025 MLB First-Year Player Draft, shortstop Bruin Agbayani (Round 6) and right-handed pitcher Jonathan Stevens (Round 16)...the Twins have now signed all 21 selections from this year's draft.

BAILEY DOSE: Right-handed pitcher Bailey Ober (left hip impingement) made his second rehab start for the Triple-A St. Paul Saints last night against Worcester at CHS Field...worked 5.0 innings, allowing one run on two hits (1 HR), with one walk and six strikeouts in 5.0 innings while throwing 65 pitches.

✦ Infielder Luke Keaschall (right forearm fracture) is also rehabbing with the Saints, going 5-for-22 (.227) with one RBI in 6 games.

RIP JEFF BITTIGER: Former Twins pitcher Jeff Bittiger passed away on July 19 after a private battle with cancer...a member of the 1987 World Series Champion Twins, Bittiger pitched in three games (1 start) for the Twins that season.
