METSCOLLANEOUS: The Mets enjoyed an off day yesterday...On Sunday, the team fell to the Rockies, 1-0, falling short of sweeping the Rockies in a four-game series...New York will play 13 of their next 19 games at home...The Mets are 65-12 when scoring first this season...New York is now 29-8-3 in 40 series this year...The Mets continue an 11-day, 10-game homestand (3-1), the second-longest of the year, against the Rockies (3-1), Dodgers (three games) and Nationals (three games).

YA GOTTA BELIEVE!: Tug McGraw was born on this day in 1944...McGraw spent nine years with the Mets and posted a 47-55 record with a 3.17 ERA with 350 walks and 618 strikeouts...He was an All-Star in 1972 and earned MVP votes in 1972 and in 1973... He was a member of the 1969 World Series Championship team and appeared tossed 18.2 innings in the 1973 playoffs...In addition, RHP Sean Reid-Foley celebrates his 27th birthday today.

NO MINOR THING: Congrats to Brooklyn Cyclones INF Shervyen Newton who was named MiLB Player of the Week for the South Atlantic League...Newton, 23, played in six games for the Cyclones last week and hit .391 (9-23) with eight runs, three doubles, three home runs, 10 RBI, three walks with a .482 OBP, a .913 SLG and a 1.395 OPS...The switch-hitting infielder has appeared in 109 games between St. Lucie and Brooklyn.

DON'T LOSE TWICE, IT'S ALRIGHT: The Mets are 35-11 in the game following a loss... Their 35-11 record is the best in the majors...Since 1920, only the 1929 Philadelphia Athletics (37-9, .804) and the 2005 St. Louis Cardinals (49-13, .790) had better records immediately following a loss...Courtesy of *Sportradar*.

ON THE DODGE: The Mets have won back-to-back games against the Dodgers since they won three straight on July 25-26, 2015 and May 9, 2016...They are seeking three straight wins in a single season since June 28-30, 2012.

TAKE THE TRAIN TO THE GAME!: With anticipated high attendance figures this week due to the U.S. Open, the Mets are encouraging fans to take mass transit and arrive early to enter the ballpark in order to avoid traffic delays.

CITI SLICKERS: New York has won 11 of their last 13 games and 15 of their last 18 at home...Overall, the Mets are 43-20 at Citi Field...They are second in the majors and in National League with a .683 winning percentage at home...The team's .83 winning percentage is currently the second-highest in team history...Only the 1988 (56-24, .700) had a better winning percentage at home...They are right above the 2000 and 1986 teams (both 55-26, .679)...The Mets have posted a 3.05 ERA with 173 walks and 622 strikeouts at Citi Field...The Mets own the second-best home ERA in the NL.

STARTING OFF: Since the start of July, Mets starters have posted a 2.80 ERA (95 earned runs/305.0 innings) in 53 games with 328 strikeouts and 71 walks...The Dodgers are the only team with a better ERA (2.50) in that time frame...New York's 328 strikeouts in that span lead the NL and are second in the majors...The team's starters ERA has dropped from 4.09 to 3.51 in that span...The Mets rank fourth in the majors and second in the National League with a 3.51 ERA from their starters.

WALKER THIS WAY: Taijuan Walker is set to make his 23rd start of the season tonight... He is 10-3 with a 3.38 ERA (44 earned runs/117.1 innings) with 35 walks and 88 strikeouts...He is set to make his 11th career start against the Dodgers...He is 3-3 with a 4.25 ERA (25 earned runs/53.0 innings) with 18 walks and 48 strikeouts...It will be his second start against LA this year...Walker allowed two runs on seven hits with a walk and two strikeouts in 5.2 innings of work in a 2-0 loss at LA on June 2.

RIGHT THE SHIP: The Mets own a 57-29 record when facing a right-handed starting pitcher this season...As a team, the Mets are batting .264/.333/.418 against righties... Their .264 average is the second-best in the majors, as is their .333 OBP...Their .418 SLG ranks sixth...Jeff McNeil is batting .323/.370/.478 against righties this year...His .323 average is fourth in MLB and third in the Senior Circuit.

AUGUSTUS BLOOM: The Mets are 18-10 in August...Their 18 wins this month are the third-most in the majors...The team's 18 wins this month are the most since they recorded 20 in 2015...The franchise record for wins in August is 21 accomplished by the 1969 and 1986 teams...Jeff McNeil has recorded 41 hits this month, which is the most in the majors...His 41 hits are the most in a calendar month for his career, passing his previous high set in June, 2019...Additionally, his 41 hits in August are tied for fifth in Mets history...John Olerud holds the franchise record with 45 hits in August of 1998.

EL JEFF-E: McNeil is fourth in the majors in batting average with a .402 (41-102) mark in the month of August...In 27 games this month, he is batting .402/.431/.588 with 14 runs, 13 doubles, two triples, 11 RBI and four walks...It's his highest average in any month of his career...In 34 games following the All-Star break, McNeil is batting .366 (48-131) with 17 runs, 15 doubles, three home runs, 14 RBI, five walks, a .396 OBP and a .550 SLG...His .366 batting average is fifth in the majors and third in the NL...He is batting .316 (36-114) batting average against left-handed pitchers this year...That is the fourth-best mark by a lefty this year in the majors.

ON THE RECORD: New York has won 82 games this season, second-most in the NL and tied for the second-most in the majors...Their .636 winning percentage is second in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 82-47 record through the team's first 129 games...Only the 1986 (87-42) team posted a better record through the first 129 games of the season.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: The Mets have been in first place since April 12, a streak of 140 consecutive days...According to Elias, it's the fourth longest-streak in franchise history.

DODGERS-METS NOTES: The Mets have dropped the season series to the Dodgers in each of the last five seasons...The Mets are 1-13 against the Dodgers in their last 14 games at Citi Field.

GIVE ME A BREAK: The Mets are 24-12 in the second-half...The team's 24 wins are the third-most in the majors as is their .667 winning percentage...The team is batting .269/.340/.432 following the All-Star break...They are third in the majors in OBP and fifth in average and in SLG following the All-Star Game...The Mets are outscoring opponents 170-126 following the break.

PUTTING UP LUG-O'S: Seth Lugo has not allowed a run in eight of his last nine appearances...He has tossed 9.1 innings in that span, allowed seven hits, two walks, struck out 13 and posted a 0.96 ERA (one earned run/9.1 innings)...In 15 games following the All-Star break, Lugo has posted a 1.72 ERA (three earned runs/15.2 innings) with five walks and 18 strikeouts.

HURTS DONUT: The Mets have been plunked a MLB-leading 87 times this year...The team's 87 HBP is the third-highest total in franchise history...The 2019 Mets set the record with 95 HBP...The Mets were plunked 94 times last year...Mark Canha has been plunked 17 times this year, the fourth-highest single-season total in franchise history... Brandon Nimmo's, 15, HBP, place him fifth in Mets history...Canha ranks tied for third in the majors in HBP, while Nimmo is tied for sixth.

ONE AWAY: Edwin Díaz leads the major leagues among relievers with 99 strikeouts...That is 17 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He has done so in 51.1 innings... He is seeking to become the fastest player to record 100 strikeouts in Mets history... Armando Benitez owns the franchise record, recording his 100th strikeout on August 21, 1999 in 60.0 innings...Courtesy of Elias...Díaz has posted a 0.59 ERA (two earned runs/30.2 innings) with 15 hits, six walks and 61 strikeouts in 30 appearances since the start of June.

BRING OUT THE TRUMPETS: Díaz has struck out 50.0% of batters faced (99/198), the highest strikeout rate by a relief pitcher through 51 appearances of a season in MLB history...His 17.36 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 16.00...Overall, he is 3-1 with 28 saves, a 1.40 ERA (8 ER/51.1 IP), allowing 31 hits and 16 walks...The Mets are 45-6 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

HERE'S MY SOUTHERN SLANG: Díaz has only two runs in his last 32 outings dating back to June 22...He is 2-0 with 18 saves with a 0.55 ERA (two earned runs/32.2 innings) in that span, allowing 16 hits, seven walks and striking out 65...He was won back-to-back NL Reliever of the Month awards.

HOW STRIKING: The Mets have struck out 1,218 batters this season, which places them second in the majors...The team's 1,216 strikeouts are already the ninth-most in a single-season in franchise history...The franchise record is 1,520 set in 2019... Mets pitchers are averaging 9.55 K/9, a rate that if kept up or improved upon would have them eclipse the franchise record before the end of the season...More than one of every four batters to face Mets pitching has struck out this season (25.6 percent), the second-highest rate in the majors...The Mets have struck out 15 or more batters in a game eight times this year, which is the tied for the second-most in the majors...The team has struck out 10 or more in a game 66 times this year, the most in MLB...On the other side of the ball, the Mets have struck out 977 times this season...That is tied for the fourth-fewest times in the majors and the second-fewest times in the Senior Circuit.

M-V-PETE: Pete Alonso has collected 25 game-winning RBI this year, setting a Mets single-season record...It was previously held by Keith Hernandez (1985)...According to STATS LLC, Joe Torre (1971 Cardinals) and Willie Mays (1962 Giants) share the MLB record with 27 game-winning RBI...Alonso has 11 more game-winning RBI than any other player in the majors this year...He has driven in the game-winning run in 11 of the Mets' 24 second-half wins.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso has recorded 137 home runs in his career in 498 career games...Only Ryan Howard (153) and Aaron Judge (138) have hit more home runs through their first 500 career games...He is tied for fifth in MLB history in home runs through a player's first four career seasons...This includes the 60-game COVID-19 shortened 2020 season.

WALKER NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Allowed two runs over 5.0 innings of work on August 23 against the Yankees at Yankee Stadium...Allowed four hits, two walks and struck out three batters...Retired the first nine batters of the game, before allowing two runs in the fourth inning.

FEW Ks, THAT'S OK: Through 22 starts this season, Walker has a K/9 rate of 6.75 and an ERA of 3.38...Cole Irvin (3.16 ERA, 6.20 K/9) and Miles Mikolas (3.48 ERA, 6.63 K/9) are the only other pitchers with an ERA under 3.50 with a lower strikeout rate (min. 20 starts)...His seven starts of 5.0 or more innings with three or fewer runs allowed and three or fewer strikeouts are tied the third-most in the majors...Walker's 88 strikeouts through his first 22 outings are the second-fewest only behind Cole Irvin (87 strikeouts) through a pitcher's first 22 starts this season with a sub-3.50 ERA and the ninth-fewest overall this season (Min. 90.0 IP)...Since 2015, Walker's 88 strikeouts are the ninth-fewest by a pitcher with a sub-3.50 ERA through their first 22 outings of the season (Min. 90.0 IP).

VS. DODGERS: In 10 career starts against the Dodgers, Walker is 3-3 with a 4.25 ERA (25 earned runs/53.0 innings)...As a Met, Walker has faced the Dodgers twice and is 0-2 with a 3.44 ERA (seven earned runs/18.1 innings) and a 1.09 WHIP...In his lone start against the Dodgers as a Met, August 14, 2021, Walker took a no-hitter into the seventh inning before surrendering a solo home run to Will Smith with one out...His 6.1-inning no-hit bid was the longest by a Met since Steven Matz had a no-hitter through 7.1 frames on the same date in 2016.

CITI SLICKER: In nine starts at Citi Field this season, Walker is 4-1 with a 3.49 ERA (19 ER/49.0 IP)... Prior to allowing eight earned runs over 1.0+ inning at Citi Field on August 5 vs. ATL, Walker had the ninth-lowest ERA at home this season among starting pitchers that have made at least seven home starts in the majors (1.93)...Since joining the Mets in 2021, Walker is 8-5 with a 3.47 ERA (44 earned runs/140.0 innings), a 1.07 WHIP and has held opposing batters to a .633 OPS in 25 games (24 starts).

FLOURISHED IN THE FIRST HALF: In 16 first half starts, Walker went 7-2 with a 2.55 ERA (26 ER/91.2 IP)...His 2.55 ERA is the lowest first half mark in his career and his seven wins are tied with 2021 season for the most in Walker's career during the first half of the season...Walker is the eighth Mets starting pitcher to allow four or fewer first half home runs (Min. 12 first half starts).

SPLIT FINGER SUCCESS: In 22 starts this season, Walker has used his splitter just under 28 percent of the time and has held opposing hitters a .188 (30-160) batting average in at-bats ending in the pitch...42 of Walker's 88 strikeouts this season have come via the splitter.

LIMITING LEFTIES: Since 2021, Walker has held left-handed batters to .213 (87-406) average, the 18th-best mark among right-handed pitchers in that span (min. 400 LHB faced)...Since his debut year, 2013, Walker has limited left-handed batters to a .232 (354-1523) average, 14th-best among right-handed arms during that span (min. 1,500 LHB faced).

NICE TRY: Walker is tied for second in the majors with Merill Kelly with four pickoffs this season...Since 2021, Walker has eight pickoffs, the most by a right-handed pitcher during that span and tied for the second-most overall with Max Fried in that span...His 17 pickoffs since his debut year of 2013 are the fourth-most by a right-handed pitcher.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP JACOB DEGROM (3-1, 2.15)

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his third win of the season after throwing 6.0 innings of one-run ball against the Rockies on August 25 at Citi Field...Allowed three hits, issued one walk and struck out nine batters...Posted his 150th career quality start, sixth-most in Mets history.

THE EXCELLENCE IS SUSTAINABLE: Since 2018, deGrom owns a 1.95 ERA in 96 starts...That is the best mark in the major leagues in that span (min. 400.0 IP)...Justin Verlander is second with a 2.37 ERA, while teammate Max Scherzer has posted a 2.67 ERA since 2018...Since 1920, only three other starting pitchers have held an ERA of 1.95 or lower over a span this long: Sandy Koufax, Greg Maddux and Clayton Kershaw.

- Leads the majors with a Mets-record 25 game-winning RBI this season...Since 1954, only three players have had more in a season: Willie Mays (27, 1962), Joe Torre (27, 1971) and Jim Gentile (26, 1961)...Has 12 go-ahead RBI and 11 game-winning RBI in 35 games since the break...Has 33 go-ahead RBI.
- Tied for fourth in MLB and tied for third in the NL with 31 homers...Tied for the NL lead and tied for third in MLB with 105 RBI...Tied for 16th in the NL with 72 runs.
