Martinez struck out, Alex Bregman 4-3)...Castillo was joined by RHP Sonny Gray, who was added to the NL All-Star roster to replace Wsh's Max Scherzer but did not pitch...was Gray's second All-Star selection...he was an American League All-Star in 2015 but did not appear in the game at Cin's Great American Ball Park...Castillo and Gray are the first Reds starting pitchers named to the All-Star team since Johnny Cueto and Alfredo Simon in 2014.

TODAY'S GAME: Is Game 3 (1-1) of a 3-game series vs Brian Butterfield's first-place Cubs, Game 6 (2-3) of a 6-game road trip that included a 2-1 series loss at Col's Coors Field and Game 3 (1-1) in a stretch of 10 straight games vs NL Central Division rivals (1-1 at Chi, 4g vs StL, 3g at Mil)...beginning tomorrow night the Redlegs return to Great American Ball Park for a brief 4-game homestand vs the Cardinals before hitting the road again for a 3-game visit to Mil's Miller Park.

<u>SERIES NOTES</u>: The Reds have won the **first 3 series** of a season vs the Cubs for the first time since they won the **first 5 series** of **2013**...over the **previous 4 seasons** (2015-2018), the Cubs' **.671 winning percentage** vs the Reds (51-25) was the best by any team against any division opponent... **Joey Votto** ranks third among all active players with **34 HR** and **114 RBI** against the Cubs, trailing in both categories only **Albert Pujols** (57-146) and **Ryan Braun** (38-133).

THE FRIENDLY CONFINES: The Reds and Cubs are meeting at Wrigley Field for the second of this season's 3 meetings...the Reds are 3-2 here this season but have lost 23 of the last 33 games played in The Friendly Confines...since a 4-1 Reds win on 6/25/14 and beginning 9/15/14, the Cubs have won 22 of the last 26 night games at Wrigley Field between the teams...beginning 6/25/14, Joey Votto has reached base safely in 41 straight games at Wrigley Field, the longest streak by a visiting player since StL/LAD's Wally Moon reached in 47 consecutive apps here from 8/30/1957 - 9/15/1962...is the longest streak ever by a Reds player at Wrigley Field and the longest by any player since Chi's own Mark Grace reached safely in 45 straight games here from 9/28/1996 - 7/22/1997... during this current 41-game on-base streak at Wrigley, Votto is hitting .376 (56-149, 17 2b, 1 3b, 6hr, 20rbi)...his 119 career hits here are the most by any active opposing player (119-363, .328, 16hr, 57rbi).

<u>CARDINALS UP NEXT</u>: The Reds have won 10 of their last 17 games vs the Cardinals...are 3-1-2 in their last 6 series vs StL, including a 1-1 series split in April in Mexico at Estadio de Béisbol Monterrey, home of the Sultanes de Monterrey of the Mexican League...the Reds finished the 2018 season with 3 consecutive series wins vs StL, their first single-

the 2018 season with 3 consecutive series wins vs StL, their first singleseason 3-series winning streak vs the Cardinals since a 4-series winning streak from 4/20-7/19, 1979...the 12 runs scored in the 12-1 win on 4/26 was Cin's third-highest total ever at Busch and its most since a 15-2 win there on 9/26/16.

<u>LATE FOR DINNER</u>: Because the Reds' first 2 "home" games vs StL in April were in Mexico at Estadio de Béisbol Monterrey, tomorrow's game will be the teams' latest calendar first meeting in Cincinnati since 7/21/1999, when the Reds beat the Cardinals, 1-0, at Cinergy Field...it is their latest first meeting ever at Great American Ball Park...the Reds and Cardinals met in the Queen City in June or earlier every season beginning in 2000 except 2004, when they played there for the first time that season on 7/15.

# REDS vs CARDINALS:

- Joey Votto has 191 career hits vs the Cardinals (191-607, .315), trailing only Mil's Ryan Braun (194) for the most among active players...in 87 apps over the last 6 seasons vs StL, Votto has produced a 1.053 OPS (.339ba, .585slg, .468obp)... in his last 56 apps overall vs StL beginning 8/2/16 is hitting .345 (70-203, 15 2b, 1 3b, 9hr, 34rbi, .562slg, .467obp)...in the live ball era, his career .439 OBP vs StL ranks second among players with at least 500 plate apps (Lefty O'Doul 1st, .477; Ralph Kiner 3rd, .424).
- Yasiel Puig has 8 HR in his last 10 apps vs the Cardinals (7hr at Busch, 1hr in Monterrey).
- Beginning 8/5/17, Eugenio Suárez has reached base safely in each of his last 24 apps vs StL (24-91, .264, 5 2b, 8hr, 22rbi, .582slg, .3662obp).
- Jesse Winker has a 10-game hitting streak vs StL (15-37, .405, 3 2b, 3hr, 8rbi, .730slg, .476obp)...beginning 9/19/17 has reached base safely in each of his last 20 apps vs StL (29-77, .377, 6 2b, 4hr, 14rbi, .610slg, .442obp)...hit safely in 19 of those 20 apps.
- RHP Raisel Iglesias is 11-for-11 in save opps vs the Cardinals, joining Bill Landrum (10-for-10) and Jeff Brantley (12-for-12) as the only pitchers, since the save became an official statistic, with a minimum of at least 10 perfect save conversions vs StL...in his last 21 apps vs StL beginning 8/4/16, Raisel Iglesias has posted a 1.03 ERA (11sv, 26.1ip, 13h, 3er, 17bb, 29k)...in that span, Cardinals batters are hitting just .143 against him (13-91).

<u>REHABBING</u>: LHP Alex Wood tonight in Pawtucket is scheduled to make his third rehabilitation start for Louisville (4ip, 60-65 pitches)...made his first 2 rehab apps for the Bats on **7/6 at Columbus** (1.1ip, 2h, 1er, 1bb, 2k, 31 pitches) and **Fri vs Toledo** (2ip, 4h, 3r, 2er, 0bb, 2k, 51 pitches)...has been on the Reds' injured list all season with a **lower back injury**...has been on the 60-day IL since **5/31**...made 1 start for the Reds in spring training, on **2/25 at Sea** (1ip, 2h, 3er, 1bb, 0k, 1hr)... rehabbing **LHP Amir Garrett** (left lat strain) has joined the team here in Chicago and this morning was scheduled to throw live batting practice...**C Tucker Barnhart** (right oblique strain) is rehabbing in Cincinnati.

2-WAY PLAYER: RHP Michael Lorenzen has appeared in 59 of the Reds' 92 games so far this season, including 40 times solely as a pitcher, twice as a pinch hitter/pitcher, once as a pitcher/ LF (6/2 vs Wsh), 3 times as a CF, 3 times as a LF, 7 times solely as a pinch runner, once as a pinch runner/CF (3/28 vs Pit, CF), once as a pinch runner/LF (5/9 at Oak) and once as a pinch runner/RF (5/24 at Chi)...9 times in his career, including twice this season (4/9 vs Mia, 4/15 at LAD), he entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in that game to pitch...5 times in his career came off the bench to produce a home run, including twice as a reliever and 3 times as a pinch hitter...Lorenzen this year became the first player in Reds history, whose primary position is pitcher, to appear in each of the first 6 games of a season (PR/CF, P, PR, P, PR, P)...is the first Reds player with more than 300 career innings pitched (375.2) to play center field since Hal Jeffcoat in 1958.

# **RED HOTS**

Sonny Gray is a 2019 National League All-Star...when he completes today's second inning will reach 1,000 career innings pitched...this afternoon is making the fourth start of his career and third of the season vs the Cubs...will be his first career appearance at Wrigley Field...in his last 3 starts is 2-0, 1.27...in Fri's 3-2 loss at Col, left the game with a 2-1 lead but David Hernandez allowed solo HR in the eighth inning to David Dahl and Daniel Murphy...his strikeout of Charlie Blackmon to end the fifth inning was the 900th strikeout of his career...in his 3-0 win on 7/3 vs Mil, threw 8.0 shutout innings and tied his career high with 12 strikeouts...the 8.0 innings and 12 strikeouts are the most by a Reds pitcher in a game this season...was added to the National League All-Star roster to replace Wsh's Max Scherzer...was Gray's second All-Star selection...he was an American League All-Star in 2015 but did not pitch in the game at Cin's Great American Ball Park...he joined RHP Luis Castillo, selected by his peers, as the first pair of Reds starting pitchers named to the All-Star team since Johnny Cueto and Alfredo Simon in 2014...Gray did not pitch in the NL's 4-3 loss at Cle's Progressive Field, but Castillo threw a perfect fourth inning...began the season with 9 starts without a win, the longest such streak of his career to begin a season...was bothered in spring training by stiffness in his right elbow and made just 3 exhibition starts, but he started the Reds' second game of the season...hasn't missed a turn since.

# **RED HOTS**

Tanner Roark's last name is pronounced RO-arc...tomorrow at GABP will make his ninth career appearance vs the Cardinals, his second start of the season... in Sat's 17-9 win at Col allowed a career-high 13 hits while tying his career high with 3 HR...the start of the game was delayed 3 hours, 8 minutes by inclement weather...was the 200th appearance of his career...over 4 apps from 6/8-6/26 didn't issue a walk over 22 innings...from 4/24-6/1 didn't allow a home run in 36.1 innings, the second-longest homerless streak of his career (45.2ip, 8/7-9/23, 2013)...on 6/8 at Phi, in the third inning reached 1,000 career innings pitched (Rhys Hoskins' GIDP) and in the fourth inning recorded his 800th career strikeout (Scott Kingery)...in the 5-2 loss on 6/1 vs Wsh drove in both Reds runs on a suicide squeeze bunt and the first home run of his career (solo off Eric Fedde)...made his Reds debut in the third game of the season.
