OPENING DAY NO. 29—Today marks the 29th Opening Day in franchise history as the Rays visit the Cardinals at Busch Stadium...the Rays are 15-13 all-time on Opening Day after walking off the Rockies, 3-2, on March 28, 2025 at Tampa's George M. Steinbrenner Field...this marks the eighth time the Rays have begun a season on the road, including the first since 2021 at Miami's loanDepot Park (W, 1-0), and the second time in the last 17 seasons (2010-26)...from 2010-20, they hosted Opening Day for 11 consecutive years...they went 3-4 in their previous seven openers on the road, also recording wins in 2008 at Baltimore (6-2) and 2000 at Minnesota (7-0).

- ✦ The Rays have won four of their last five Opening Day games since 2021, tied with five other clubs (BAL, LAD, NYY, SEA, TOR) for the best mark in the majors over that span...this, despite averaging 2.4 runs per game in those contests...the pitching staff's 2.00 ERA (45.0IP, 10ER) on Opening Day over that stretch is tied with the Astros for second in the majors to the Twins (1.43). Tampa Bay is also 6-3 on Opening Day since 2017, tied with the Orioles and Mariners for third in the AL to the Astros and Yankees (both 7-2).
- ✦ The Rays are 2-0 against NL opponents on Opening Day, recording wins over the Rockies (2025) and Marlins (2021)...this marks their third time in six seasons (2021-26) opening with an interleague series after their first 23 Opening Day games came vs. AL clubs.
- ✦ **Drew Rasmussen** is set to make his first career Opening Day start, becoming the 18th Opening Day starter in franchise history (12th right-hander), third in the last three seasons, and eighth in the last nine years on the heels of **Chris Archer**'s four consecutive starts from 2015-18...at 30 years, 260 days old, he is the third-oldest pitcher to start for the Rays on Opening Day, trailing **Charlie Morton** (36,255) in 2020 and **Tanyon Sturtze** (31,172) in 2002.
- ✦ The Rays nine-game, 11-day road trip through St. Louis, Milwaukee and Minnesota is their longest to open a season in franchise history, surpassing six-game trips at the onsets of the 2021, 2009 and 2006 campaigns...it ties a nine-game, 10-day trek through Colorado, Seattle and Sacramento (Athletics) from Aug. 3-12 for their longest trip this season.
- ✦ The Rays are scheduled for five games in March, most in franchise history...they played four games during the month in 2025, 2024 and 2019...today marks the earliest Opening Day game the Rays have played, surpassing March 28 starts in all three aforementioned seasons.

ROSTER BREAKDOWN—The Rays have placed five players on the injured list and recalled three others, finalizing their 26-man Opening Day roster...on the 10-day IL: **INF Gavin Lux** (right shoulder impingement, retro March 23) and **INF Taylor Walls** (right oblique strain, retro March 22)...on the 15-day IL: **RHP Edwin Uceta** (right shoulder impingement, retro March 22) and **RHP Ryan Pepiot** (right hip inflammation, retro March 22)...on the 60-day IL: **RHP Steven Wilson** (lumbar disc inflammation), joining **RHP Manuel Rodriguez** (recovery from right elbow surgery), who was placed on the 60-day IL Feb. 10...additionally, **LHP Cam Booser** was selected to the 40-man roster and optioned to Triple-A Durham while **RHP Joe Boyle**, **INF/OF Richie Palacios** and **INF Carson Williams** were recalled from Durham...only eight of the 26 players on this year's Opening Day roster were featured on the club's 2025 season-opening roster.

FAMILIAR FACE—The Rays will be opposed by Cardinals starter **Matthew Liberatore**, whom they selected in the first round (16th overall) of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft before trading him to the Cardinals on Jan. 9, 2020 in the four-player deal that landed them **Randy Arozarena**, per Elias, Liberatore will become the second pitcher drafted by the Rays to start against them on Opening Day, joining **BAL Jason Hammel** in 2013...Hammel was a 19th-round pick by Tampa Bay in 2001 and 10th-round selection in 2002...today's game will mark the first instance of a pitcher who was drafted by a club in the first round starting against that same club in a season opener since **CWS John Danks** on April 6, 2012 at TEX. This is the Rays second straight year and third time in the last four seasons facing a southpaw starter on Opening Day...**COL Kyle Freeland** started opposite them in 2025, **DET Eduardo Rodriguez** in 2023 and **BAL John Means** in 2022...they are 5-2 against LH starters in season openers.

2025 REWIND—Last season, the Rays finished fourth in the AL East at 77-85, falling short of a postseason berth in back-to-back seasons for the first time since a three-year drought from 2014-16...they remained in the hunt until being eliminated with an 11-7 loss on Sept. 19 vs. BOS, the earliest they have bowed out since 2016 (Sept. 15)...they have played only 12 games after being eliminated from postseason contention since 2019, third fewest in the AL behind the Astros (1) and Yankees (6)...the Rays 77 wins were their fewest since going 68-94 in 2016 and tied 2014 for their second fewest over a 162-game season since becoming the Rays in 2008...the club's plus-31 run differential was the best in a losing season in franchise history.

- ✦ They were a season-high-tying 11 games over .500 (47-36) on June 26 after an 11-3 win at Oriole Park capped an MLB-best 25-9 run (May 20-June 26), boosting their postseason odds to 78.7 pct., according to FanGraphs...the Rays went 31-50 (.383) the rest of the way, tied with the Twins for the AL's worst record in that span, finishing below .500 after being at least 10 games above the mark for the second time, joining 2015 (10G above, finished 80-82).
- ✦ The Rays led the majors with 194 SB, tying their team record from 2009, and finished with 182 HR, becoming the sixth team in MLB history to eclipse 180 HR and 180 SB in a season.

CASH CONSIDERATIONS—Entering his 12th season, Rays manager **Kevin Cash** is the longest-tenured skipper in the majors with his current club...in 2024, he surpassed his predecessor, **Joe Maddon** (2006-14), as the longest-tenured manager in Rays history...Cash is 896-784 (.533) with the Rays, the most wins and highest winning pct. of any Rays skipper...the 896 career victories are fourth most among active managers, trailing **CIN Terry Francona** (2,033), **DET A.J. Hinch** (964), and **LAD Dave Roberts** (944).

- ✦ Upon earning his 900th win, he will become the ninth manager in major league history to reach that mark while managing a single club in his career...the current list: **LAD Walter Alston**, **LAA Mike Scioscia**, **LAD Tommy Lasorda**, **BAL Earl Weaver**, **MIN Tom Kelly**, **DET Hughie Jennings**, **PIT Danny Murtaugh**, and **STL Red Schoendienst**.
- ✦ Cash, who joined the Rays on Dec. 5, 2014, is the fifth-longest-tenured manager/head coach in the big four North American professional sports leagues (MLB, NBA, NFL, NHL) by hiring date...he trails only **Erik Spoelstra** (NBA's Miami Heat, April 2008), **Andy Reid** (NFL's Kansas City Chiefs, Jan. 2013), **Jon Cooper** (NHL's Tampa Bay Lightning, March 2013), and **Steve Kerr** (NBA's Golden State Warriors, May 2014).

THE RAY WAY—Since 2008, the Rays .541 (1,523-1,292) winning pct. ranks third in the majors behind the Dodgers (.586) and Yankees (.571)...this success comes after the Devil Rays amassed the majors' worst record at 645-972 (.404) over the club's first decade of existence...they have recorded a winning record in 12 of 18 seasons since 2008—only the Yankees (18), Dodgers (17), and Cardinals (16) have more.

HOUSE OF CARDS—The Rays and Cardinals complete a three-game season series this week at Busch Stadium, the 11th set between the clubs since Tampa Bay's inaugural 1998 campaign...the Rays are 5-4-1 in the previous 10 series, taking two of three games in the most recent meeting from Aug. 21-23, 2025 at Steinbrenner Field...they lost the opener, 7-4, before outscoring the Cardinals, 17-8, over the next two games...that series featured the Aug. 22 major league debut of Rays No. 1 prospect (MLB.com) **Carson Williams**, who matched a club record for a player's first big-league game with 3 RBI...the Rays are seeking their first series win at Busch Stadium since Aug. 25-27, 2017.

- ✦ The Rays are 15-13 against the Cardinals all time, including 12-6 in the last 18 matchups dating back to June 11, 2014, tied with the Tigers (14-7), Mariners (10-5), and Rangers (10-5) for the best winning pct. vs. St. Louis among all major league clubs over that span.
- ✦ Last season, the Rays went 28-20 (.583) in Interleague play, third in the AL behind the Astros (31-17/.646) and Blue Jays (30-18/.625) and tied for fifth in the majors...it surpassed 2023 (27-19) for their most wins over NL clubs in franchise history...they won 11 of 16 Interleague series.
- ✦ **Cedric Mullins** is 7-for-19 (.368) with 1 HR in six career games at Busch Stadium...**Chandler Simpson** tallied multiple hits in all three games vs. the Cardinals last season, going 6-for-12 (.500) with 1 2B, 1 3B, 2 RBI, 2 BB and 1 SO.

TODAY'S START—Drew Rasmussen takes the mound for his first career Opening Day start this afternoon against the Cardinals...marks his 131st career appearance (82nd start) and seventh career outing (first start) opposite the Cardinals...has a four-decision winning streak dating back to June 25, 2025...allowed three runs or fewer in 28 of 31 starts last season and was named an All-Star for the first time in his career...established career highs in 2025 in starts (31), innings pitched (150.0), strikeouts (127), and bWAR (4.5)...ranked among AL leaders in WHIP (4th, 1.02), opp. slugging pct. (5th, .340), ground ball rate (5th, 49.0%), opp. OPS (6th, .611), opp. on-base pct. (6th, .271), fewest pitches per IP (6th, 15.4), opp. average (7th, .221), walks per 9.0 IP (8th, 2.22), and strikeout-to-walk ratio (10th, 3.43).

★ Became the fourth Rays pitcher (5x) to record a sub-3.00 ERA while making 30 starts or more, joining Cy Young winners **Blake Snell** (1.89) in 2018 and **David Price** (2.56) in 2012, **James Shields** (2.82) in 2011 and **Price** (2.72) in 2010.

LAST TIME OUT—In his final spring training start on March 19 at PHI, he took the loss after allowing 8 R (7ER) on 11 H, 3 HR, and 2 BB over 5.2 IP...over four Grapefruit League starts, he finished 0-1 with a 4.91 ERA (14.2IP, 8ER) and 11 SO, with 7 of his 8 ER allowed coming in his final start...last season, he posted a 2.61 ERA (58.2IP, 17ER) with 50 SO and in his 12 starts after the All-Star break.

★ Rasmussen has gone 38 straight regular season starts (April 30, 2023-pres.) with four runs or fewer allowed, the longest active streak in the major leagues...it is the second longest in franchise history by a traditional starter behind **Shane Bieber** (44G, April 29, 2021-July 26, 2022)...his 31 starts with four runs or fewer tied him for the most in the majors with **MIL Freddy Peralta**, **PHI Christopher Sánchez**, and **PIT Paul Skenes**.

LET'S GET IT STARTED—Rasmussen is set to make his first career Opening Day start, becoming the 18th Opening Day starter in franchise history (12th right-hander), third in the last three seasons, and eighth in the last nine years on the heels of **Chris Archer's** four consecutive starts from 2015-18...at 30 years, 260 days old, he is the third-oldest pitcher to start for the Rays on Opening Day, trailing **Charlie Morton** (36.255) in 2020 and **Tanyon Sturtze** (31.172) in 2002.

★ Rasmussen is looking to become the fifth starter to earn an Opening Day win since the club became the Rays in 2008...he would join **McClanahan** (2023 vs. DET), **Archer** (2017 vs. NYY), **David Price** (2014 vs. TOR), and **Shields** (2008 at BAL).

MEET ME IN ST. LOUIS—Rasmussen is 0-1 with a 5.63 ERA (8.0IP, 5ER) over six career appearances against St. Louis, with the Rays going 1-5 in those games...his last outing opposite St. Louis came on Aug. 7, 2024, when he tossed 2.0 scoreless innings with 3 SO in a 5-2 defeat at Busch Stadium.

★ He is 2-2 with a 4.37 ERA (45.1IP, 22ER) in 21 career outings (6GS) vs. NL Central opponents in his career, going 1-1 with a 3.60 ERA (15.0IP, 6ER) with 12 SO across three starts in 2025.

ROAD RAS—Rasmussen did not take a loss in 13 road starts last season and has gone 18 starts since his last road defeat as a starter on April 14, 2023 at TOR...he was the only pitcher in the majors to make 10 starts or more away from home in 2025 without taking a loss...min. 50.0 IP, his 2.83 road ERA (60.1IP, 19ER) last season ranked 8th in the AL...Rasmussen has an active seven-decision winning streak on the road as a starter, tied with **David Price** (May 15-Aug. 16, 2012) for the second longest on the road by a Rays starting pitcher, trailing **Tyler Glasnow's** nine-decision streak from April 5, 2019-May 3, 2021.

LEADING THE WAY—Rasmussen paced the Rays rotation and ranked fourth in the AL (min. 150.0IP) with a 2.76 ERA (150.0IP, 46ER) last season, trailing only **DET Tarik Skubal** (2.21), **HOU Hunter Brown** (2.43), and **BOS Garrett Crochet** (2.59)...under the same parameter, he also ranked among AL leaders in WHIP (4th, 1.02), opp. slugging pct. (5th, .340), ground ball rate (5th, 49.0%), opp. OPS (6th, .611), opp. on-base pct. (6th, .271), fewest pitches per IP (6th, 15.4), opp. average (7th, .221), walks per 9.0 IP (8th, 2.22) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (10th, 3.43).

GOOSE EGGS—Rasmussen has made 10 scoreless starts of 5.0 IP or more, the most in a single season in franchise history and tied with **LAD Yoshinobu Yamamoto** for third most in the majors behind **DET Tarik Skubal** (12) and **PIT Paul Skenes** (12)...his 21 such career starts are tied with **Blake Snell**, **Scott Kazmir**, and **James Shields** for second most in Rays history behind **Chris Archer** (24).

RIGHT ON TIME—Right-handed batters hit .198 (49-for-247) against him, sixth lowest in the AL and the sixth lowest mark in franchise history (min. 200AB)...under the same qualifier, his .551 opp. OPS vs. right-handed hitters was third in the AL, trailing only **TEX Nathan Eovaldi** (.512) and **BAL Trevor Rogers** (.519), and ranked second in club history to **Tyler Glasnow** (.492) in 2023.

PLEASE TAKE ONE—Rasmussen recorded an MLB-leading 13 starts of 5.0 IP or more without allowing an extra-base hit, most in a season in Rays history, ahead of **David Price** in his 2012 Cy Young-winning campaign (9)...it marked the most such starts by an AL pitcher over an entire season since **CAL Nolan Ryan** (13GS) in 1977.

★ Rasmussen yielded five hits or fewer in 17 consecutive starts to end the season, the longest single-season streak in franchise history (excluding openers) and the longest season-ending streak by a traditional starter in AL history...only **CIN Tony Cingrani** (18) in 2013 has recorded a longer season-ending streak.

FROZE HIM—Rasmussen's 47 called strikeouts in 2025 ranked sixth in the AL, trailing **CLE Tanner Bibee** (58), **NYY Will Warren** (58), **BOS Garrett Crochet** (56), **HOU Hunter Brown** (54), and **DET Jack Flaherty** (51)...in all of MLB, only **CIN Brady Singer** (49), **Warren** (49), and **PHI Ranger Suárez** (47) had more called strikeouts on fastballs than Rasmussen (44), who tied **Crochet** (44).
