TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners play the second of a 3-game set against the Minnesota Twins (0-1)... Seattle is also coming off a series sweep of the St. Louis Cardinals (3-0) on the trip...tonight's game against the Twins will be televised and streamed live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Angie Mentink** on the call, with **Brad Adam** serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Gary Hill Jr.** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners dropped last night's series opener underneath the rain to Minnesota by an 11-4 score...Seattle is now 4-6 in series openers this season.

- **Length** - Seattle is 9-7 when its starter goes at least 6.0 innings this season, and 4-2 when its starter goes at least 7.0 innings in a game.
- **Julio! Julio! Julio!** - Over his last 16 games (4/11-c), **Julio Rodríguez** is batting .323 (20x62) with 7 runs, 3 doubles, 2 home runs, 8 RBI, 6 walks, 3 stolen bases, a .391 OBP and slugging .468 for an .859 OPS...he has reached base safely in 21 of his last 23 games (4/3-c), including a 19-game on-base streak from April 3-24.

MARINERS TO RETIRE RANDY JOHNSON'S NUMBER 51...the Mariners are set to retire Randy Johnson's #51 this Saturday, May 2...he will join fellow Hall of Famers Ken Griffey Jr. (#24), Edgar Martinez (#11), Ichiro Suzuki (#51) and Jackie Robinson (#42) as the only numbers retired by the Mariners...Johnson will be the 14th player in MLB history to have his number retired by multiple teams, and his and Ichiro's #51 will be the 8th number to be retired by the same team for multiple players (in addition to #42 which is retired across Major League Baseball).

UPCOMING HOMESTAND...on Friday, the Mariners return to T-Mobile Park for a 6 game homestand against the Royals (3 G, 5/1-3) and Braves (3 G, 5/4-6)...headlining the homestand is Randy Johnson Number Retirement Night on Saturday...additionally, the Mariners will celebrate '80s Weekend (5/1-3) with Randy Johnson '80s Jersey Night (5/1) and '80s Pin Day (5/3)...fans can also enjoy Mariners Value Games during each game of the Braves series (5/4-6)...visit Mariners.com/Tickets for more information.

RALEIGH RIGHT WHERE HE NEEDS TO BE...**Cal Raleigh** hit his seventh home run of the season last night, his second in as many games and his fifth homer since April 20, tied for most in the Majors during that stretch with Seiya Suzuki-CHC and Spencer Torkelson-DET...in those 7 games (4/20-c), Cal is batting .345 (10x29) with 7 runs, 1 double, 5 homers, 6 RBI, and 3 walks, getting on base at a .406 clip, slugging .897 with a 1.303 OPS...Cal has reached base safely in 12 consecutive games (4/15-c), batting .292 (14x48) with 7 runs, 2 doubles, 5 home runs, 7 RBI and 6 walks with a 1.016 OPS in 54 plate appearances.

THE YOUNG MAN DELIVERS...over his last 11 games (4/16-c), **Cole Young** is batting .333 (13x39) with 6 runs, 1 double, 1 home run, 6 RBI, 3 walks, 1 stolen base and an .822 OPS...Young leads the Mariners with 1.6 Wins Above Replacement (*Baseball-Reference*) and ranks 2nd among MLB second basemen behind Nico Hoerner-CHC (1.9 bWAR)...Young also has 10 defensive runs saved which leads all players, regardless of defensive position.

MARINERS IN THE MEDIA...over 300 interviews and media sessions have taken place during the Mariners 2026 season so far, in a variety of local, national, and international outlets...national media this season have included MLB Network, Apple TV, ESPN, FOX, NBC/Peacock, and more.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE...since the start of the Astros series on April 10, the Mariners offense has come alive, averaging 4.82 runs per game while batting .268 (151x564) with 27 doubles, 1 triple, 21 home runs, 82 RBI and 69 walks, getting on base at a .354 clip and slugging .431...during that span, the Mariners rank 6th in MLB in batting average, 3rd in OBP, 8th in OPS (.785), 9th in slugging percentage and 4th in wRC+ (126).

MITCH GARVER STOPS BY "THE CAL RALEIGH SHOW"...Mariners catcher **Mitch Garver** joined **Cal Raleigh** and Mariners insider **Shannon Drayer** on this week's episode of "The Cal Raleigh Show"...all episodes of the show air on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** and **SeattleSports.com**.

THREE STARTS THRU 75 STARTS...only 11 pitchers in MLB history have recorded 400+ strikeouts while walking fewer than 100 batters through their first 75 career starts and the Mariners have 3 of them currently in their rotation: **Logan Gilbert**, **George Kirby**, and **Bryan Woo**.

NAYLZ HEATING UP...over his last 8 games (4/17-c), first baseman **Josh Naylor** is batting .429 (12x28) with 2 doubles, 1 home run, 4 RBI, 4 stolen bases and 4 walks, slugging .607 with a 1.107 OPS...Naylor is also batting .333 (15x45) with 5 runs, 2 doubles, 3 homers, 9 RBI and a .970 OPS over his past 12 games (4/13-c)...since Naylor made his Mariners debut on July 25, 2025, he is 23-for-23 in stolen base attempts, ranking T-5th in the Majors and 3rd in AL in stolen bases over that span.

THAT'S JUST BRASHTY...reliever **Matt Brash** is 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 10.1 IP), 6 strikeouts and 2 walks (1 intentional) in 12 appearances this season...he's posted a 0.48 WHIP and held opponents to a .100 batting average (3x30)...Brash is 1-of-3 players in Mariners history to have multiple season opening streaks of at least 10 games without an earned run (also: 19 G in 2025), joining teammates **Andrés Muñoz** (2023 and 2025) and **Gabe Speier** (2023 and 2025).

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Cal Raleigh** launched his seventh home run of the season last night, marking his 160th career home run, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...Cal is now tied with Alvin Davis for 7th on the Mariners all-time home runs list?...Cal and "Mr. Mariner" sit behind only Ken Griffey Jr. (417 home runs with Seattle), Edgar Martinez (309), Jay Buhner (307), Kyle Seager (242), Alex Rodriguez (189), and Nelson Cruz (163) in Mariners history.

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - APRIL 28

- **2001** - Two Major League records are set in a win over the White Sox. **Kazuhiro Sasaki** racks up his 13th save, breaking the Major League record for most saves in April. The win also marks the Mariners 20th victory of the month, surpassing the record for most wins in April.
- **2002** - A crowd of 46,115 set a new regular-season record for attendance at Safeco Field versus the Yankees.
- **2025** - **Jorge Polanco** was selected as the American League Player of the Week for April 21-27, the first weekly award of his career...Polanco, hit .471 (8x17) with 5 runs scored, 2 doubles, 4 home runs, 8 RBI and 2 walks in 5 games during the week, recording 22 total bases with a 1.844 OPS...the switch-hitter homered in 3 games, including a multi-homer game on April 26 vs. Miami...Polanco and Dylan Moore, who won AL Player of the Week for April 14-20, are the first Mariners to win back-to-back AL Player of the Week awards since Alex Rodriguez and Ken Griffey Jr. on June 27 and July 4, 1998.

ABOUT LOGAN GILBERT...

- Gilbert, 28, is making his 7th start of the season and 1st against the Twins...it is the 153rd start of his career and 6th career start against Minnesota.
• Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (14th overall) of the 2018 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Rob Mummau on June 16, 2018.
• Spent 3 seasons at Stetson (FL) University, 2016-18...in 2017, was ASUN Pitcher of the Year and ASUN 1st-Team All-Conference.
• Named the 2022 and the 2024 Mariners Most Valuable Pitcher by the Seattle Chapter of the BBWAA.
• Named to his 1st All-Star team in 2024.

LAST TIME OUT...threw 4.0 innings in his 2nd no decision outing of the season, allowing 3 runs (3 ER) on 6 hits and 2 walks while striking out 3 batters...he threw 89 pitches and 55 strikes.

THE ROAD SO FAR...will be making his 2nd road start of the season...has recorded quality starts in 5 of his last 7 road games...his 37 starts with 6+ strikeouts and 2-or-fewer walks in away games since 2021 ranks T-5th in MLB...owned a 10.34 K/9 in away games in 2025 to rank T-9th in MLB (min. 50.0 IP)...ranks 6th in Mariners history with 437 strikeouts while his 1.14 career WHIP on the road ranks 2nd (min. 30 GS), trailing only Bryan Woo (1.10).

TAKING ON THE TWINS ORDER...owns a .127 opponent batting average (7x55) and a 5.33 K/BB against the current Twins batters he has faced... has allowed a combined 2 extra base hits, both home runs, to current Twins players...in 5 starts against Minnesota, Gilbert has allowed 2-or-fewer runs over 5.0+ IP in 4 outings...The Mariners are 4-5 when he starts against Minnesota.

A LITTLE R&R...with the off day on April 23, Gilbert will be entering today's game on 5 days of rest...he owns a 3.21 ERA (151 ER, 423.1 IP), 5.43 K/BB, 1.016 WHIP, and .220 opponent batting average (349x1585) when pitching after 5 days compared to 4 days of rest where he has a 4.51 ERA, 4.04 K/BB, 1.016 WHIP and a .247 opponent batting average...in 2 games on 5 days of rest in 2026, Gilbert owns a 2.08 ERA with 1 walk and 12 strikeouts.

QUALITY TIME...has thrown a quality start with 1-or-fewer walks issued in 57 career games (last: 4/12 vs. HOU), tied for the 4th-most such games in MLB since 2021, matching rotation-mate George Kirby...his 26 quality starts without a walk are 6th-most in MLB since 2021.

IN COMMAND...his 3 outings with 7+ strikeouts and 1-or-fewer walks are the 2nd most in 2026, trailing Cam Schlichter-NYY...among pitchers with 35+ strikeouts this season, Gilbert is tied for the 4th fewest walks, just behind Kevin Gausman-TOR (6 BB), Tarik Skubal-DET (6 BB), and Cam Schlichter (4 BB).

K MORE WALK LESS...among all-time starting pitchers with over 900 strikeouts, he ranks 5th in K/BB (4.89)...ranks T-6th in the AL in 2026 with a 5.00 K/BB...is 1-of-3 pitchers to have finished the season in the top-10 in the AL in K/BB multiple times in the last 3 seasons (23,25) alongside Bryan Woo (24,25) and Tarik Skubal (24,25).

AMONG THE LEAGUE...his 919 strikeouts since 2021 lead the American League while his 868.1 innings pitched are 3rd most and his 152 starts are T-2nd in the AL across that span.

KEEPING COOPERSTOWN COMPANY...ranks T-16th in WHIP all-time among starting pitchers in MLB that have recorded over 900 strikeouts, matching Hall of Famer Moredcai Brown's 1.07 WHIP and just trailing Trevor Hoffman, Christy Mathewson, and Walter Johnson's 1.06 WHIP...his base runners allowed per 9 innings (9.88) ranks 15th among all-time starting pitchers with 900+ strikeouts, behind Walter Johnson (9.84) and just ahead of Pedro Martinez (9.94).

WHERE IT RANKS...his 11.9 K/9 last season is the 4th-best mark among starters in a single season in Mariners history (trailing Randy Johnson's 1995, '97, '98 seasons) while his 9.525 career K/9 ratio is 3rd-best in franchise history (min. 500 IP), trailing James Paxton's 9.545 and Randy Johnson's 10.585 career K/9 mark and 4.888 K/BB ranks 2nd in franchise history only behind George Kirby (6.373).

AMONG THE GREATS...his 3.61 career ERA (348 ER, 868.1 IP) is 7th-best among starters in Mariners history (min. 500 IP), trailing Randy Johnson, Félix Hernández, Hisashi Iwakuma, and James Paxton who each hold a 3.42 career ERA, Luis Castillo (3.59), and George Kirby (3.55)...his 916 career strikeouts are 6th-most in Mariners history, behind Mike Moore's 937 strikeouts...he also ranks 1st in WHIP (1.062).

150 FOR THE M'S...made his 150th career start with the Mariners on April 12 vs. Houston Astros...he is the 7th pitcher to make 150 starts in a Mariners uniform...his 909 strikeouts rank second among Mariners pitchers' first 150 career starts, only behind Mark Langston (916 K)...ranks 9th in wins with 48 over a players' first 150 games pitched with the Mariners.
