METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Reds, 2-1, at Great American Ball Park last night...The Mets are going for their sixth series win of the season and their fourth series win on the road...The win snapped a three-game losing streak...New York continues a seven-game road trip (1-1) to Cincinnati (1-1) and Washington D.C. (four games).

SENGA GENESIS: Kodai Senga has recorded 36 strikeouts through his first six major league games...That is tied with Nolan Ryan for the fourth-most in franchise history...Only Matt Harvey (43), Dwight Gooden (40) and Bill Pulsipher (39) have recorded more through their first six career games...His 36 strikeouts rank seventh by a Japanese-born pitcher through their first five career games.

23 AND ME: The Mets have used 23 pitchers so far this season... That is tied for the most in the National League with the Miami Marlins...Only the Oakland Athletics (23) have used more pitchers this season.

DOCTOR ROBERT-SON: David Robertson has appeared in 14 games and has allowed one run in 15.1 innings of work, good for a 0.59 ERA...He has allowed eight hits, five walks while striking out 20 in that span...He is holding left-handed hitters to a .148 (4-27) batting average this season...He has converted all eight save opportunities he's had this season...Overall, he has recorded 164 saves in his career...That is the seventh-most among active players.

IT'S GREEATTTI: Since the ballpark opened in 2003, the Mets have hit 98 home runs at Great American Ball Park...The Mets have homered in seven of the last eight contests at the stadium...Since 2018, the Mets have hit 30 home runs in 14 games in Cincy.

TRUE AMERICAN: The Mets play the Reds for the first time in 2023...Last season, the Mets took five out of six games with the club, outscoring them 36-13 in the process...New York went 2-1 at Great American Ball Park in 2023...Francisco Lindor has hit .314 (27-86) with 17 runs, three doubles, seven home runs, 12 RBI and seven walks in 19 contests in Cincy...Pete Alonso has played 11 games at the ballpark and has hit .304 (14-46) with eight runs, three doubles, five home runs, eight RBI and seven walks...Luis Guillorme is 8-18 with three runs, two doubles, a home run, three walks and three RBI in six career games at the ballpark.

YOU'RE THE LAST TEAM ON THE LIST: Justin Verlander has now earned at least one win against every major league team... Verlander became the 21st pitcher in major league history to have at least one win against all 30 current major league teams... He joined Gerrit Cole, Zack Greinke and teammate Max Scherzer as the only active pitchers to have at least one win against all 30 current major league teams...Courtesy of Elias.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso has homered in back-to-back games...He leads the major leagues with 13 home runs and is fifth with 31 RBI...He has hit 159 home runs in his career...That is the most in the majors since he entered the league in 2019...He has homered in three straight games five times in his career...His career-best is four straight games with a home run from August 5-9, 2019.

BRIGHAM UP, BRIGHAM UP: Jeff Brigham has not allowed a run in eight of his 10 appearances this season, posting a 3.27 ERA (4 ER/11.0 IP)...He has struck out 14 and allowed five hits and four walks in 11.0 innings this year.

REDS-METS NOTES: The Mets are 39-23 at Great American Ball Park since it opened in 2003.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: New York will play their 23rd road game today, tied for the second-most in the majors...New York is 11-11 on the road this season...They are 3-2-1 in road series in 2023.

INVADER NIM: Brandon Nimmo ranks eighth in the National League with a .311 batting average, is seventh with a .406 OBP and tied for ninth with 42 hits...Over the last 24 games, Nimmo is batting .337 (33-98) with 15 runs, six doubles, one triple, three home runs, 10 RBI, seven walks with a .905 OPS...He ranks 12th in the majors and sixth in the NL with a 1.7 fWAR.

GUESS WHO'S BACH?: Over his last 20 games, Daniel Vogelbach is 16-51 (.314) with four runs, three doubles, two home runs, 10 RBI, nine walks with a .417 OBP and a .490 SLG...He has posted a .407 OBP in 30 games this season, which leads the team.

AND THEY'RE OFF: Starling Marte is tied for 13th in the majors and tied for seventh in the NL with nine steals...He ranks third among active players with 323 career steals...Only Elvis Andrus (340) and Billy Hamilton (326) have more...The Mets are fifth in the National League with a 81.3% success rate in steals this season...The Mets are seventh the NL with 26 steals this season.

JEFF McHITS: Jeff McNeil is batting .321 (25-78) with 10 runs, two doubles, a triple, two home runs, seven RBI, six walks with a .391 OBP and an .840 OPS over his last 22 games...Overall, he is batting .277/.377/.385 in 37 games this season.

MULTIPLICITY: McNeil has recorded 10 multi-hit games this season...He has 173 multi-hit games in his career, which places him 19th on the Mets all-time list...He has 63 multi-hit games since the start of last season, which is tied for the third-most during that span behind Bo Bichette (70) and Freddie Freeman (69).

A HIT'S A HIT: The Mets have collected 40 infield hits this season, which is the fifth-most in the majors...Last year, the Mets collected 186 infield hits, the fifth-most in franchise history and the third-most in MLB in 2022.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: The Mets have been outscored 30-9 in the first inning this year.

OUCH: The Mets have been plunked 23 times this season...That is tied for the second-most in the majors and the most in the National League...Since the start of last season, the Mets have been plunked 135 times, the most in the majors.

ATTABOY ÁLVAREZ: Over the last 15 games, Francisco Álvarez is hitting .286 (12-42) with seven runs, two doubles, three home runs, five RBI, four walks with a .348 OBP and a .548 SLG...He is now slashing .228/.279/.421 in 20 games this season.

D-FENCE: The Mets have committed 12 errors in 37 games this season...That is tied for the second-fewest in the major leagues... The Padres lead the big leagues, committing only 10 errors this year...New York's .991 fielding percentage is fifth in the majors and third in the National League.

SENGA NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his fourth win of the season on May 5 vs. Colorado...Threw 6.0 scoreless innings on two hits, four walks and four strikeouts...Became the fourth pitcher in franchise history to earn four wins through their first six career major league starts joining Steven Matz, David Peterson and Jason Jacome...Senga threw 101 pitches in the outing, the first Mets pitcher to throw 100 or pitches in a game this season.

STRIKE 'EM OUT: Senga has 36 strikeouts through his first six career major league games, the fifth-most in franchise history behind Matt Harvey (43), Nolan Ryan (42), Dwight Gooden (40) and Bill Pulsipher (39).

PUTTING THE K IN FORK: Senga's "ghost fork" has accounted for 23 of his 36 strikeouts through six starts...The pitch has a 55.8 percent whiff rate and a 27.4 percent putaway rate...Opponents have managed just four hits in 34 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .118 batting average.

ALL I DO IS WIN: Senga became the only Japanese-born pitchers to start their career 3-0 and is the fourth player in franchise history to earn the win in their first two career major league starts, joining Steven Matz, Mike Pelfrey and Gary Gentry...Additionally, he joins Kazuhisa Ishii, Hideki Irabu and Koji Uehara as the only Japanese-born pitchers to win each of their first two career major league starts...Senga fell just shy of becoming the second Mets starting pitcher ever to begin his career 4-0, a record held by Steven Matz.

MLB DEBUT NOTES: Senga became the 64th pitcher whose major league debut came in a start for the Mets...New York has had one pitcher make his MLB debut as a starter in each of the previous three seasons: José Butto in 2022, Tylor Megill in 2021 and David Peterson in 2020 (the Mets won each of those three games)...Senga allowed one run over 5.1 innings on three hits, three walks and eight strikeouts in his major league debut...His eight strikeouts were tied for the fourth-most by a Japanese-born

METS-JAPAN CONNECTION: Senga is the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...Prior to Senga, the last Japanese-born player to appear in a game for the Mets was OF Norichika Aoki in 2017.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Prior to joining the Mets, Senga spent 11 seasons in Japan's NPB with the Fukuoka Softbank Hawks...During his NPB career he posted a 87-44 record with a 2.59 ERA (313 ER/1,089.0 IP) and 1,252 strikeouts (10.3 K/9.0)...He was also a three-time NPB All-Star (2013, 2017 and 2019), a two-time Pacific League Best Nine Award winner (2019 and 2020) and a two-time Mitsui Golden Glove Award winner (2019 and 2020).

2022: Last season, Senga went 11-6 with a 1.94 ERA (31 ER/144.0 IP), 156 strikeouts, a 1.06 WHIP and a 0.4 HR/9 rate over 22 appearances.

INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION: Senga appeared in four games in the 2017 World Baseball Classic for Team Japan...He posted a 0.82 ERA, throwing 11.0 innings and allowing one run on seven hits with 16 strikeouts and one walk...He also pitched in two games during the Tokyo Summer Olympics, throwing a total of 3.0 scoreless innings
