TODAY'S GAME: Is Game 4 (1-2) of a 4-game series vs Kenny Ayres' Phillies and Game 4 (1-2) of a 7 -game homestand that includes this weekend's series vs the Diamondbacks (3g)...following Sun afternoon's game vs Ari, the Redlegs will fly to Seattle and spend Mon's off day there. Tue night will begin their second consecutive 3 -city road trip ( 3 g at Sea, 3 g at Ari, 3 g at Chi) and the fourth of their 4 scheduled visits to the West Coast (0-3 at LAD \& 3-1 at SD, 1-2 at Oak \& 2-1 at SF, 0-2 at LAA).

SERIES NOTES: Last season, from 4/9-4/11 at Citizens Bank Park the Reds were swept in a 3-game series in Philadelphia for the first time since 4/12-4/14, 1993, while from 7/26-7/29 at Great American Ball Park the Reds won a 4-game series vs Phi (3-1) for the first time since 9/12-9/14, 1997.

DIAMONDBACKS UP NEXT: From 8/10-8/12 of last season the Reds won a series vs the Diamondbacks at Great American Ball Park (2-1) for the first time since a $2-1$ series win here from 7/22-7/24, 2016...the Reds have won 6 of the last 11 games vs Ari...the Reds are 38-30 at Chase Field, including 21-13 there the last 10 seasons...are 32-18 with the roof closed and $\mathbf{6 - 1 2}$ with the roof open...Cin won its first 7 g at Bank One Ballpark until a 9-6 loss on 7/1/00.

FOLLOWED BY THE MARINERS: Next week the Reds and Mariners will meet for the first time since 2016 and for the first time in Seattle since 2010...the Redlegs are 2-13 all-time vs Sea, including 0-3 in 2016 at Great American Ball Park, 1-2 in 2013 at GABP, 0-3 in 2010 at Safeco Field, 1-2 in 2007 at Safeco and 0-3 in 2002 in the final season of Cinergy Field... the Reds won their first game at the ballpark then known as Safeco Field, $16-1$ on $6 / 22 / 07$, but since then have lost 5 straight games at what is now named T-Mobile Park

PLAYER \& ROOKIE OF THE MONTH: Aristides Aquino was the National League's Player of the Month and Rookie of the Month for August...led the Major Leagues in HR (14) and RBI (33) and led the National League in slugging percentage (.767)...established a new National League record for HR by a rookie in a calendar month and tied the franchise record for

 HR by any player in any calendar month (Frank Robinson, August 1962 \& Greg Vaughn, September 1999)...his 33 RBI are second-most ever by a Reds batter in August (Frank Robinson, 34 RBI, August 1962) and the most by a Reds batter in any month since Jay Bruce had 33 RBI in May 2011... is the first player to win both awards in the same month since NYY's Aaron Judge did it twice in 2017 and the first NL player to do it since LAD's Yasiel Puig in June 2013...Aquino is the second Reds player to win both awards but the first to win both in the same month...Adam Dunn was Co-Rookie of the Month in August 2001 (with Hou's Roy Oswalt) and Player of the Month in July 2005...Aquino is the second Red to win a monthly award this season (RHP Luis Castillo was March/April's Pitcher of the Month), the first to win the Player of the Month since Scooter Gennett in May 2018 and the first Red to win Rookie of the Month since Billy Hamilton in June 2014.

THE PUNISHER: Rookie Aristides Aquino has produced 15 HR in his first 35 career games and 133 plate apps, including a 3 -homer game on $8 / 10$ vs Cubs in which he homered in 3 consecutive innings (2nd, 3rd, 4th)...he played 1 game for the Reds last season.

Holds modern Major League records for fewest career apps to 14 HR ( 28 g ) and fewest career plate apps to 15 HR (122pa). Is the only player in modern Major League history with 13 HR in his first 100 career plate apps, the only player with 14 HR in his first $\mathbf{1 0 8}$ career plate apps and the only player with 15 HR in his first 122 career plate apps...Phi's Rhys Hoskins (98th PA) and LAD's Will Smith ( 100 th PA) are the only other players, since 1900, to produce as many as 12 HR in their first 100 career plate apps... Hoskins holds the record since 1900 for fewest plate apps to 16 HR (137).
Holds modern Major League records for home runs in a player's first 12 career games (8), first 14 career games (9), first 16 career games (10), first 17 career games (11), first 22 career games (12), first 27 career games (13) and first 28 career games (14)...Rhys Hoskins holds the Major League record since 1900 for fewest career games to 15 HR and 16 HR (32).

RUTHIAN: Per @EliasSports, in last night's $8-5$ win vs Phi Michael Lorenzen joined Babe Ruth ( $6 / 13 / 1921$ vs Det) as the only Major League players since 1900 to earn the win, hit a home run and play in the outfield in the same game...Lorenzen, who this afternoon in CF is making his first career start at a position other than pitcher, is a career . 267 hitter (27-101) with 2 doubles, 1 triple, $7 \mathrm{HR}, 22 \mathrm{RBI}$ and an 817 OPS....he has 3 career pinch-hit HR, on 4/6/17 off Phi's Adam Morgan, 6/24/18 off Chi's Mike Montgomery and 6/30/18 off Mil's Jacob Barnes (grand slam)...has appeared in 88 of the Reds' 140 games ( 68 g at $\mathrm{P}, 8 \mathrm{~g} / 9$ innings in $\mathrm{LF}, 7 \mathrm{~g} / 9.2$ innings in $\mathrm{CF}, 4 \mathrm{~g} / 4$ innings in RF)... 9 times in his career, including twice this season ( $4 / 9 \mathrm{vs}$ Mia, $4 / 15$ at LAD), he entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in that game to pitch... 6 times in his career came off the bench to produce a home run, including 3 times as a reliever and 3 times as a pinch hitter...Lorenzen this year became the first player in Reds history, whose primary position is pitcher, to appear in each of the first 6 games of a season (PR/CF, P, PR, P, PR, P)...is the first Reds player with as many as 401.1 career innings pitched to play center field since Hal Jeffcoat (474.1ip) in 1958.

150th CELEBRATION: During the 2019 season the Reds are celebrating the 150th anniversary of professional baseball, which began with the formation of the 1869 Red Stockings ...this season, the team will wear 15 uniforms from various periods throughout the team's history...Sun, 9/8 vs Ari will wear replica uniforms of the 1995 NL Central championship team....already wore uniforms from 1902, 1911, 1912, 1919, 1935, 1936, 1939, 1956, 1961, 1967, 1969, 1976 and 1990...as part of the season-long celebration, the 1869 Pavilion was dedicated on May 4, the 150th anniversary of the Red Stockings' $45-9$ win over the Cincinnati Great Westerns in the first professional baseball game.

In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in runs (117), HR (43), RBI (114), batting average (.302) and slugging percentage (.587) while ranking first in the NL and second in the Major Leagues in on-base erentage (.364, Hou .367)...have outs and are 33-12 (.733) when leading after the first inning... 6 times this season scored at least 4 runs in the first inning.

## RED HOTS

Sonny Gray is a 2019 National League All-Star...ranks among the National League leaders in ERA ( 2.80 , 5th), wins (10, T17th) and strikeouts (174, 13th)... in his last 12 starts beginning $\mathbf{6 / 2 8}$ is $7-1,1.55$ ( 75.1 ip , 13er) with 10 quality starts, 4 times was the victim of blown saves and since then ranks second among all Major League starting pitchers in ERA (Jack Flaherty, 1.32)...in his last 7 starts at Great American Ball Park is 7-0, 2.16...is only the second pitcher ever to win 7 consecutive starts at GABP...Johnny Cueto won 7 straight starts from 6/6-8/18, 2012...in his $3-2$ win on $8 / 20$ vs SD, Josh Naylor's solo HR with 2 outs in the top of the sixth inning snapped his career-high scoreless streak at 23 innings...ties for the second-longest scoreless streak in the Major Leagues this season (Hyun-Jin Ryu, 32.0, $5 / 1-5 / 25$ )...is the longest by a Reds pitcher since reliever J.J. Hoover's 26.1 -inning streak from 6/13-8/19, 2013...is the longest by a Reds starter since Tom Browning's 23 -inning streak from $5 / 29-6 / 8,1990 \ldots$. is the longest by a Reds righthanded starter since Tom Seaver's 27 -inning streak from 9/15-9/30, 1977...the longest scoreless streak of Gray's career had been 14.2 innings ( $4 / 28-5 / 8,2015$ )...in his $3-0$ win on $7 / 3$ vs Mil, threw 8.0 shutout innings and tied his career high with 12 strikeouts...the 8.0 innings are the most by a Reds pitcher in a game this season, and his 12 strikeouts were the most by a Reds pitcher this season until Luis Castillo had a career-high 13 strikeouts on $8 / 5$ vs LAA....has 10 wins and 5 times was the victim of blown saves...began the season with 9 starts without a win, the longest such streak of his career to begin a season...was bothered in spring training by stiffness in his right elbow and made just 3 exhibition starts, but he started the Reds' second game of the season...hasn't missed a turn since.

## Tomorrow vs Diamondbacks - \#30 Tyler Mahle, RHP

## RED HOTS

Tyler Mahle's last name rhymes with RALLY...at just 24 years old already is in his third Major League season...tomorrow will make his second start for the Reds since he was promoted on $9 / 1$ as 1 of 5 September callups...will be his first career appearance vs the Diamondbacks...this season has left 9 runners on base, and all 9 scored...started the day game of Sun's doubleheader at StL...left leading, 3-1, but was charged with an inherited runner scored off Robert Stephenson and became the victim of a blown save when the Cardinals tied it at $3-3$ in the eighth inning with a run off Amir Garrett and Michael Lorenzen...from 7/22-8/21 was on the 10 -day injured list with a left hamstring strain...on $8 / 16$ and $8 / 21$ made rehab starts for Louisville before he was reinstated from the IL and optioned to Louisville on $8 / 22 \ldots$ made 1 more start for the Bats, a $9-0$ Bats win on $8 / 26$ vs Columbus ( $5 \mathrm{ip}, 3 \mathrm{~h}, 1 \mathrm{bb}, 6 \mathrm{k}, 75$ pitches), before he was promoted on Sunday to start the day game of the doubleheader at StL...in consecutive starts on $5 / \mathbf{2}$ and $\mathbf{5 / 7}$, suffered the $1-0$ loss at NYM in which Noah Syndergaard became just the seventh pitcher in Major League history to homer in a 1-0 complete game and then a 2-0 loss at Oak in which Mike Fiers threw his second career no-hitter... in those 2 games, Reds batters combined to go 4-for-57 (.070)...made his second straight Opening Day roster...started the Reds' sixth game of the season.

- Was the National League Player of the Month and Rookie of the Month for August. - Was National League Player of the Week for 8/5-8/11.

Since his $8 / 1$ promotion leads all Major League batters in RBI (37), is tied with Col's Nolan Arenado for the lead in HR (15) and sixth in the majors in slugging (.725).
Produced a home run in 13 of his 34 apps and an RBI in 20 of his 34 apps...since his $8 / 1$ promotion, he hit 15 of the team's 55 HR...is hitting .485 with RISP (16-33). Is a 2019 International League All-Star and its Rookie of the Year (78g, .299, 28hr, 53rbi, 5sb)...since the Reds became an affiliate in 2000, he is only the second Louisville player ever to win the IL's Rookie of the Year award (Joey Votto, 2007). His 2-run HR on 8/8 off Chi's Cole Hamels traveled 118.3 miles per hour, the hardest hit ball by a Reds batter in the Statcast Era and tied for the hardest hit home run in the Major Leagues this season (Gary Sánchez, Pete Alonso).
On $8 / 3$ at Atl, in his third Major League appearance, produced his first career hit (single off Dallas Keuchel), first career HR (3-run off Keuchel) and first career RBI.
