TODAY'S GAME: Is **Game 3** (0-2) of a 3-game series vs **Jeff Risch's Cardinals** and **Game 3** (0-2) of a 6-game road trip that beginning tomorrow night will conclude with the Reds' second consecutive visit to the **West Coast**, this time for 3 games at **Dodger Stadium**...the Redlegs are coming off a **2-4 homestand** vs the **Indians** (2-1) and **Diamondbacks** (0-3) that included Ari's first series sweep of the Reds since a **4-game sweep** from **8/20-8/23, 2015**, also at **Great American Ball Park**.

SERIES NOTES: This afternoon the Cardinals are looking for their first series sweep of the Reds since **4/20-4/22, 2018**, also here at **Busch Stadium** (3g)...including this one, the Reds went **5-6-3** in their last **14 series** vs StL, including **2-0** this season...**Joey Votto** has **200 apps** and **214 career hits** vs the Cardinals, both the most among active players (214-700, .306)...in the live ball era, his **career .423 OBP** vs StL ranks third among all players with at least 500 plate apps (**Lefty O'Doul** 1st, .477; **Ralph Kiner** 2nd, .424)...in his **last 42 apps** at **Busch Stadium** beginning **8/9/16**, **Votto** is hitting .302 (49-162, 13 2b, 7hr, 20rbi).

RED HOTS: Including this one the Reds went **3-4** in their **7 series**, including **3-1** at **GABP** and **0-3** on the road...have **1 series sweep win** (3g vs Cle) and **1 series sweep loss** (3g vs Ari)...are **5-3** vs **NL Central** opponents and **2-7** vs **NL West** teams...are **0-7** when recording fewer hits than the opponent...are **9-7** when hitting at least 1 HR, **7-3** when hitting at least 2 HR and **0-4** when they don't homer.

DODGERS UP NEXT: Beginning tomorrow night in Los Angeles the Reds and Dodgers will meet for the first time since **2019**, when **LAD** won 5 of the 6 games...in their most recent appearance in **LA**, in **April 2019**, the Reds were swept by the Dodgers for the first time since **2017**...in **2018**, the Reds won the **first 6 games** of the 7-game season series vs LAD, including **all 4 games** at **Dodger Stadium**...was their **longest single-season winning streak** vs the Dodgers since a **7-game** winning streak from **5/30-8/8, 1976**.

OFFENSIVE: **Reds batters** lead the Major Leagues in HR, runs scored and RBI and slugging percentage...lead the National League in slugging percentage (2nd in ML)...while jumping out to a **6-2 record**, the **66 runs scored** by Reds batters led the Major Leagues and was the highest total in franchise history through the **first 8 games of a season** (8.25 r/g, .316ba, .388obp, .567slg)...the **1900 Reds** held the previous record, with **64 runs** through **8 games** (8.00 r/g)...since then, over the **last 12 games** the Reds have been **shut out 3 times** while scoring **49 runs total** (4.08 r/g, 85-402, .211), with 21 of the 49 runs scored in a 10-3 win vs the Indians and a 10-inning, 14-11 loss to the Diamondbacks.

SHOGO UPDATE: **OF Shogo Akiyama** last night in Louisville was scheduled to play in his first game action since March, but the scrimmage was rained out...he hopes to play against the Pirates' alternate training site squad tonight...**Akiyama** has been on the 10-day injured list all season with a left hamstring strain suffered while running out a ground ball on **3/13**, his last spring training appearance.

ROOKIE OF THE YEAR: **Jonathan India** ranks among National League rookies in most offensive categories and ranks among the NL's overall leaders in RBI...he has **14 RBI**, a new **Reds' rookie record** through April...**Josh Hamilton** (2007) and **Joey Votto** (2008) each produced **13 RBI** through April in their rookie seasons...in his **first 6 career apps** **India** produced **10 RBI**, tied for **fifth-most** in Major League history by a player in his **first 6 career apps** behind only **Dale Alexander** (13 RBI in 1939), **Trevor Story** (12 in 2016), **Nico Hoerner** (11 in 2019) and **Mandy Brooks** (11 in 1925)...the RBI became an official statistic in **1920**...courtesy @EliasSports.

LEADING OFF: **Tyler Naquin** ranks among the Major League leaders in **HR** and **RBI**...on 4/6 and 4/7 vs Pit, **Naquin** became the first Reds batter with a **leadoff HR** in consecutive apps since **Eddie Milner** did it on **6/24 vs SD** & **6/25 at SF, 1984**...**Pete Rose** (1976) and **Gary Redus** (1983) are the only other Reds batters with **leadoff HR** in consecutive apps...**Naquin's 7 RBI** on Tue vs Pit tie **Brandon Phillips** (7/30/15 vs Pit) for the most in a game by a **Reds leadoff batter** since the statistic became official in 1920...**Jesse Winker** hit the Reds' third **leadoff HR** of this season, and the fifth of his career, on 4/22 vs Ari (off **Taylor Widener**)...courtesy @EliasSports.

SHIFTED: During spring training, **Eugenio Suárez** switched from **third base** to **shortstop** and **Mike Moustakas** switched from **second base** to **third base**...rookie **Jonathan India** led the team with 16 spring training starts at **second base**...in 2015, **Suárez** led the Reds in starts **SS** but in each of the last 5 seasons led the team in starts at **3B**...he holds the National League record for **home runs** by a **third baseman** (49hr in 2019)...in the first 9 seasons of his Major League career through 2019, **Moustakas** made **1,042 apps** at **3B** and **47 apps** at **2B**...he received **Rawlings Gold Glove Award** votes for defensive excellence at **third base** in 2012, 2015, 2018 and 2019, finishing second in the balloting in 2012...last season he played **second base** full-time for the first time in his career and led the Reds in games at that position.

EXPANSION: Following new public health orders regarding outside events from the **Ohio Department of Health** and Governor **Mike DeWine**, capacity at **Great American Ball Park** will increase from **30** to **40 percent** beginning **April 30**...the new protocols are in response to the Ohio Department of Health's recent announcement for attendance at outdoor sporting events, which includes Reds games...this allows for "mixed pods" consisting of multiple groups from separate parties capped at 10 individuals spaced 6 feet from another "mixed pod"...information on ballpark safety protocols can be found at reds.com/safe.

Today's Pitcher - #58 Luis Castillo, RHP

RED HOTS

- This afternoon is making his team-high fifth start of the season and the 95th start of his Major League career.
- Is approaching 600 career strikeouts (594).
- His no-decision in the 5-4 loss on Tue vs Ari was his first start in a week because of a pair of off days 4 days apart...allowed all 3 of his runs in the first inning on 4 hits and a throwing error by 2B Jonathan India.
- This season has posted ERAs of 22.50 in the first inning (4ip, 13r, 10er) and 1.76 after the first inning (15.1, 4r, 3er)...his 13 runs allowed in the first inning are the most in the Major Leagues...allowed 6 runs in the first inning all last season (12gs).
- Suffered an 11-6 loss vs StL in the second Opening Day start of his career...was the coldest Opening Day in Reds history (37 degrees).
- In that Opening Day loss failed to record a strikeout for the first time since 4/28/18 at Min (1ip)...prior to Opening Day recorded at least 1 strikeout in 69 consecutive starts (5/2/18 - 9/26/20)...allowed a career-high 10 runs, including 6 runs in the top of the first inning, and tied his career high by allowing 8 earned runs...the Reds allowed 6 runs in the top of the first inning of an Opening Day game for the first time in their history.
- Since his Major League debut in 2017 leads the Reds' pitching staff in wins (33), starts (94), IP (539.0) and strikeouts (594).
- Led the Reds in starts in each of the previous 3 seasons, in wins and strikeouts in 2 of the last 3 seasons and in ERA and innings pitched in 2 of the previous 4 seasons.
- In 2019 was the Reds' Opening Day starting pitcher, a National League All-Star and the NL's Pitcher of the Month for March/April...averaged 10.57 strikeouts per 9 innings, the highest ratio in Reds history for pitchers with a minimum of 125 innings...in the shortened 2020 season averaged 11.44 strikeouts per 9 innings over 70 innings pitched.

- Leads the team and ranks among the National League leaders in hitting and on-base percentage while ranking second on the club to Nick Castellanos in slugging percentage.
- Has a season-high 9-game hitting streak (14-40, .350, 2 2b, 1 3b, 2hr, 7rbi), including 4 multi-hit games...is the longest hitting streak by a Reds player this season...the longest hitting streak of his career is 12 games (7/3-7/21, 2018).
- Hit safely in 13 of his 14 starts and reached base safely in all 14 starts.
- Hit safely in 13 of his 15 apps overall and reached base safely in 14 apps.
- In Thu's 10-inning, 14-11 loss vs Ari produced his fifth career leadoff HR (off Taylor Widener) and third career 2-homer game (Widener, Riley Smith).
- Was fined for his role in the bench-clearing incident with the Cardinals on 4/3... Nick Castellanos was ejected, suspended for 2 games and fined, while Eugenio Suárez also was fined along with Nolan Arenado, Jordan Hicks and Yadier Molina of the Cardinals.
- Early in spring training camp was bothered by a sore right hip and didn't play until the Reds' fifth exhibition game.
- In 2020 was a finalist at designated hitter for the All-MLB Team...led the team with 35 starts as the designated hitter...made 12 starts in LF and 1 start in RF (9/26 at Min).
