TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners wrap up a 6-game road trip today with the last of 3 games against the Athletics (1-1)...Seattle began the trip with a 3-game series win over the Texas Rangers (2-1)...following the current series and an off day Thursday, Seattle welcomes the Toronto Blue Jays (3 G, 5/9-5/11) and New York Yankees (3 G, 5/12-5/14) to T-Mobile Park for a 6-game homestand...today's game will be televised live on ROOT SPORTS with Aaron Goldsmith and Angie Mentink on the call, with Brad Adam serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on Seattle Sports (710 AM) and Mariners.com with Rick Rizzo and Gary Hill Jr. on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners came from behind to win last night's game 5-3 over the Athletics...Seattle is 7-2 over its last 9 games, 9-3 over its last 12 games, 11-4 over its last 15 games, 13-5 over its last 18 games and 17-6 over its last 23 games...the Mariners 17-6 (.739) record is the best in the Majors since April 9.

- **Winning Ways** - The Mariners lead the American League West Division, and have the 2nd-best record in the AL trailing only Detroit (.629/22-13).
- **Brought Our 'A' Game** - Seattle owns a 7-0-2 series record over its last 9 series against the Athletics...also, since July 23, 2021, Seattle is 47-16 (.746) over its last 63 contests against the A's.
- **Happy Homers** - The Mariners are 20-8 (.714) in games when hitting a home run, and 1-6 (.143) when they do not homer...their lone win without homering came on April 24 at Boston (W 4-3).
- **Mariners Claim Leody Taveras** - Yesterday Seattle claimed OF Leody Taveras off waivers from the Texas Rangers...the 26-year-old switch-hitting outfielder has appeared in 6 Major League seasons, all with Texas.

GOING FOR NINE CONSECUTIVE SERIES...the Mariners have won 8 consecutive series for the first time since June 21-July 17, 2022...on their current run, they have series wins at home against the Astros (2-1), Rangers (3-0), Marlins (2-1) and Angels (2-0), and road series wins at the Reds (2-1), Blue Jays (2-1), Red Sox (2-1) and Rangers (2-1)...with a win in today's series finale, the Mariners would have their first 9+ series winning streak since they won a franchise record 15 consecutive series from July 27-Sept. 18, 2001.

WHAT WOULD WOO DO?...Bryan Woo has been outstanding to start the season, going 4-1 with a 2.58 ERA (11 ER, 38.1 IP), 7 walks and 38 strikeouts in 6 starts...he has gone at least 6.0 inning in each of his starts this season, including tossing 7.0 innings twice, while ranking 3rd in the Majors in WHIP (0.83)...Woo is also 6-0 with a 0.72 ERA (3 ER, 37.1 IP), 9 walks and 39 strikeouts in 7 career starts against the Athletics, the 2nd-lowest ERA against the A's since ER became official in 1913, trailing only Bob Lee (0.62).

A TOP RANKED OFFENSE...the Mariners offense has a .754 OPS and 125 OPS+ this season, ranking 6th and T-2nd in MLB in those categories, respectively...Mariners hitters also rank T-5th in runs-per-game (5.11), 4th in home runs (50), T-6th in stolen bases (40), 2nd in on-base percentage (.340), 9th in slugging percentage (.414), 1st in walks (153) and 1st in hit-by-pitches (22)...Seattle has 9 hitters with at least 40 plate appearances and an OPS+ of 100 or better (league average), most in the Majors and ranking ahead of 4 times tied with 8.

RANDY'S STREAK...outfielder Randy Arozarena has reached base safely in a career-high 29 games (3/31-c) via hit, walk, or hit-by-pitch...it marks the Mariners longest on-base streak since Teoscar Hernández's 30-game on-base streak from Aug. 15-Sept. 16, 2023...Arozarena's 29-game on-base streak is the 3rd-longest active streak in the Majors, trailing Kyle Schwarber-PHI (41 G), and Aaron Judge-NYY (32)...during the streak, Arozarena has gotten on-base at a .379 clip with an .801 OPS, hitting .234 (25x107) with 14 runs, 7 doubles, 4 homers, 17 RBI, 20 walks and is 8-for-8 in stolen bases.

J.P. PLAYS THE HITS...J.P. Crawford extended his career-high hitting streak to 14 games (4/19-c) in last night's game...J.P.'s streak is the longest active streak in the Majors, ahead of a pair of 11-game streaks by Freddie Freeman-LAD and Zach Neto-LAA...during the streak, J.P. is batting .375 (21x56) with 10 runs, 1 double, 3 home runs, 13 RBI, 9 walks and 1 stolen base with a .462 OBP and slugging .554 (1.016 OPS) during the streak...overall this season, he leads MLB shortstops in OBP (.416) and wRC+ (150) this season, ranking 4th in average (.292) and 5th in OPS (.814).

BOTTOM OF THE ORDER IS PRODUCING...the Mariners 7-9 hitters this season are batting .251 (92x367) with 55 runs, 13 doubles, 5 home runs, 36 RBI, 14 stolen bases, 46 walks and 3 HBP and getting on base at a .338 clip...Seattle's 7-9 hitters' .338 OBP this season is the 3rd best in the Majors, trailing only the Cubs (.343) and Reds (.341)...the Mariners .338 OBP from their 7-9 hitters is the highest in team history, ranking ahead of the 2000 (.336) and 2002 (.328) seasons.

D-MO IS BACK...INF/OF Dylan Moore was reinstated from the Injured List prior to yesterday's game, and went 1-for-4 with an RBI last night...in 23 games this season, Moore is batting .284 (21x74) with 16 runs, 1 double, 6 home runs, 10 RBI, 5 stolen bases and 7 walks, getting on base at a .337 clip, slugging .541 with a .878 OPS and 158 OPS+...he was named American League Player of the Week for April 14-20.

MUÑOZ MANIA...Andrés Muñoz leads the AL with 12 saves...on Monday, he allowed his first run of the season (unearned) via the automatic baserunner...in 17 appearances this season, the reigning American League Reliever of the Month is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 17.0 IP) with 6 hits allowed, 1 run allowed (unearned), 8 walks (2 intentional) and 23 strikeouts, sporting a 0.824 WHIP and 12.2 strikeouts-per-9 innings rate...Muñoz is tied for the AL-lead among pitchers in Baseball-Reference WAR (1.8) this season.

HIP, HIP, JORGE...Jorge Polanco is hitting .356 (31x87) with 16 runs, 5 doubles, 9 home runs, 27 RBI and 7 walks, with a .406 on-base percentage, .724 slugging percentage and 1.130 OPS in 27 games this season...among players with at least 80 plate appearances this season, Polanco's 1.130 OPS and .724 slugging percentage both rank 3rd in the Majors to Carson Kelly-CHC and Aaron Judge-NYY.

HOMESTAND HIGHLIGHTS...following an off-day Thursday, the Mariners return to T-Mobile Park for a 6-game homestand against the Toronto Blue Jays (3 G, 5/8-11) and New York Yankees (3 G, 5/12-14)...promotions on the homestand include College Night on May 9, Maple Grove Night on May 10, Mother's Day on May 11, Star Wars Night on May 12 and Asian American, Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander Heritage Night on May 13.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...Cal Raleigh hit the pinch-hit, go-ahead, 2-run single in last night's win, his second career pinch hit, go-ahead hit in the 9th inning or later (also: 9/30/22 vs. OAK, HR), and...**YOU MAY ALSO KNOW**...that Cal has had an incredible start to the season, batting .246 (32x130) with 23 runs, 7 doubles, 12 home runs (tied for MLB lead), 25 RBI with a .364 OBP, and slugging .577 (.941 OPS), but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that he has compiled 2.0 fWAR this season, 3rd-most in the American League and 8th-best in the Majors?...he trails only Aaron Judge-NYY (3.5 fWAR) and Bobby Witt Jr.-KC (2.1) in the AL...Cal leads all catchers in fWAR, ranking ahead of Carson Kelly-CHC (1.6).

ABOUT BRYAN WOO...

- The 25-year-old right-handed pitcher is set to make his 7th start of the season tonight and his 2nd against the Athletics...marks his 47th Major League start and 8th career start against the Athletics.
- Selected by Seattle in the 6th round (174th overall) of the 2021 MLB First-Year Player Draft out of Cal Poly University...signed by Mariners scout Chris Hom.
- Spent 3 seasons at Cal Poly before being drafted, making 31 appearances (6 GS) for the Mustangs.
- Did not pitch in 2021 while recovering from right elbow surgery.

LAST TIME OUT...W#4 on 5/2 at TEX, throwing 6.1 scoreless innings, allowing 1 hit, with no walks and 8 strikeouts...Woo has thrown at least 6.0+ innings pitched in all 6 starts this season.

WOO VS. ATHLETICS...in his 1st start of the season (3/30 vs. ATH), Woo threw 6.0 innings, allowing 3 hits (1 HR), 1 run, with 2 walks and 5 strikeouts to earn the win and move to a perfect 6-0 against the Athletics...his career 0.72 ERA (3 ER, 37.1 IP) against the Athletics is ranked 1st in franchise history (min. 30.0 IP).

INSTANT IMPACT...since his big league debut (6/3/23), ranks 3rd in hits allowed (196), 4th in runs allowed (96), WHIP (1.00), 5th in earned runs allowed (91), 6th in walks (51), 9th in BB/9 (1.86), 10th in BB% (5.2%), Opp. AVG (.211), and 11th in ERA (3.31), K/BB (4.55), among all pitchers with at least 240.0 IP during that span.

THE WOO...this season, Woo ranks 3rd among qualifying pitchers with a 0.83 WHIP and is 1 of 13 qualifying pitchers in the MLB with a WHIP under 1.00... among pitchers with at least 150.0 IP since the start of last season, ranks among the leaders in walks allowed (1st, 20), BB/9 (2nd, 1.13), K/BB (6.95), runs allowed (2nd, 52), WHIP (2nd, 0.88), hits allowed (3rd, 121), ERA (8th, 2.82), AVG against (9th, .203).

HOT START...In his first career 46 games (min. 240.0 IP) Woo ranks 1st in 3.31 ERA (91ER, 247.1 IP), fewest in hits allowed (196), and runs allowed (96) in franchise history...Woo also joins teammates George Kirby and Bryce Miller as 1 of 3 pitchers in franchise history in their first 46 games to record more than 225 strikeouts and 55 or less walks.

KEEPING HIS STEP... since the start of last season, in 28 starts Woo is 13-4 with a 2.81 ERA (50 ER, 159.2 IP), 20 walks, 139 strikeouts, with 18 of those starts throwing at least 6.0 innings...Woo is the 1 of 3 pitchers (Hisashi Iwakuma and teammate George Kirby) in franchise history to record at least 130 strikeouts and 20 or less walks in a 28-game span...he also has thrown at least 6.0 innings pitched in 15 of his last 18 starts (8/2/24-c).

AGAINST THE AL WEST...in 21 career starts against an AL-West opponent, Woo is 10-2 with a 2.97 ERA (35 ER, 109.2 IP), with the Mariners going 16-6 in his starts...in 12 road starts against the AL-West, Woo is 4-2 and holds a 4.65 ERA (31 ER, 60.0 IP), with 61 strikeouts and 13 walks...he has at least 6 strikeouts in 7 of those starts, and has 1-or-less walks in 8 of 12 road starts.

DOMINATING THE DAY...since May 15, 2024, in his last 10 day games Woo is 7-0 with a 3.05 ERA (20 ER, 59.0 IP) and a 0.780 WHIP, throwing at least 5.0 innings in each start...in those starts Woo has struck out 53 batters to just 6 walks with the Mariners holding a 8-2 record.

FROM EDGAR & DAVE...since 2024, in 12 starts at T-Mobile Park, he is 8-1 with a 2.27 ERA (18 ER, 71.1 IP) and 67 strikeouts to 9 walks...he has allowed 3-or-less runs and 5-or-less hits in 10 of the 12 starts...the Mariners have gone 11-1 in his 11 home starts.

WOO-DERFUL ROAD STRETCH...in his last 9 road starts dating back to last season (8/14/24-c), Woo has thrown at least 5.0+ innings pitched in all 9 contests, and 6.0+ in 8 of his last 9 road starts...in 27 career starts on the road, he has 18 games with 5.0+ innings pitched, and in 14 of those 27 starts he has thrown at least 6.0+ innings pitched...Woo ranks 1st in fewest hits allowed (118), baserunners allowed (161), 2nd in fewest runs allowed (62), and walks (33) for a pitcher in their first 27 road appearances in franchise history (min. 140.0 IP).

LOOK AT YOU WOO...in 36 career starts against American League teams, Woo is 14-7 with a 3.26 ERA (68 ER, 187.1 IP), 188 strikeouts and 39 walks, a .219 AVG against, and a 1.02 WHIP.

WOO TEN...his last 10 games (9/11/24-c), Woo is 6-2, throwing at least 5.0+ innings pitched in 9 starts, and 6.0+ in 7 of them, earning a 3.56 ERA (24 ER, 60.2 IP), with 62 SO and 11 BB...during that stretch among active pitchers, Woo is 3rd in wins (6), 4th in WHIP (0.94), 5th in K/BB (5.64), 7th in BB (11), BB/9 (1.63).

LOW, LOW, LOW...In his first 3 seasons in the Majors, he holds a 0.99 WHIP, lowest in franchise history by a starting pitcher through 3 seasons...his 3.31 ERA is T-1st with Erik Bédard by a starting pitcher in franchise history (min. 220.0 IP)...since the 2023 season, Woo ranks 1st in H allowed (121), BB/9 (1.13), runs allowed (52), walks allowed (20), 2nd in Wins (13), 3rd in ERA (2.82), among starting pitchers who were 25-or-younger (min. 150.0 IP).

RARE COMPANY...has limited opponents to a .505 OPS so far this season...last season, he limited opponents to a .574 OPS, 3rd-lowest in franchise history for a single-season (min. 120.0 IP) behind Félix Hernández (.546, 2014) and Randy Johnson (.569, 1995)...his .574 mark ranked 3rd-lowest among all pitchers in 2024 behind Paul Skenes-PIT (.552) and Tarik Skubal-DET (.558).
