BIRD WATCHING: After an off-day yesterday, the Cardinals open their penultimate homestand (BAL-3, PIT-3) tonight with the opening game of a three-game interleague series against the Baltimore Orioles...the Cardinals concluded their longest road trip of the season (11 games in 10 days) on Sunday, going 5-6 on the trip, but had their string of five consecutive series wins ended last weekend in Philadelphia...including tonight's game, the Cardinals have 30 regular season games remaining with 15 at home & 15 on the road.

WELCOME TO THE JUNGLE: The Cardinals will play at home tonight for the first time since August 12...while the Redbirds were on their 11-game, 10-day road trip, Busch Stadium hosted a Guns & Roses concert featuring **Mark McGwire's** famous walk up song & two Savannah Bananas games with guest appearances by former Cardinals **Matt Adams**, **Matt Carpenter** and World Series MVPs **David Eckstein** (2006) and **David Freese** (2011).

FLIGHT PATTERN: St. Louis entered play today in 3rd place in the National League Central, 15.5 games behind 1st place Milwaukee; 2.5 games ahead of 4th place Pittsburgh and 5.0 games out of the final National League Wild Card position...the Cardinals are 5-5 in their last 10 games, 11-9 in last 20 and 14-16 in last 30...they are 33-40 vs. teams that are currently above .500 and 33-26 vs. the sub .500 teams.

WINN ON I.L./GORMAN RECALLED: The Cardinals today placed SS **Masyn Winn** on the 10-day Injured List (left thumb fracture), retro-active to August 22, and recalled INF **Nolan Gorman** from Memphis (AAA)...Gorman was optioned to Memphis on June 12 after appearing in 62 games for the Cardinals to begin the season (7 HR, 25 RBI) and has appeared in 45 games for Memphis (13 HR, 29 RBI). Seven of his 13 round-trippers at Memphis have come during the month of August.

YESTERDAYS: From 1920 to 1953 the Cardinals shared Sportsman's Park with the St. Louis Browns before they moved to Baltimore and became the Orioles in 1954...The Cardinals are 15-9 vs. Baltimore all-time and have won seven of the last eight, including a three-game sweep of the Orioles in their most recent meeting at Busch Stadium during the 2024 campaign.

TOP BANANAS: Teammates **Alec Burleson** & **Jordan Walker** find themselves locked in a tie for RBI (96), ranking T-2nd in MLB behind the Reds Sal Stewart (98)...the Duo has combined for the greatest pct. (33.7 pct.) of team RBI since 1989 when **Pedro Guerrero** (117) & **Tom Brunansky** (85) combined for 34.4 pct...**Joe Medwick** (154) & **Johnny Mize** (113) combined for a team record 36.5 pct. of RBI in 1937. (Orf)

AIN'T IT FUN?: The Cardinals have played an incredible 71 games (54 pct) that have been decided by two runs or fewer, going 22-20 in one-run decisions and 15-14 in two-run games...the team's 15 extra inning games (8-7) rank 4th most in MLB.

BALTIMORE CONNECTIONS

JJ Wetherholt was born in Baltimore...is an avid fan of the Baltimore Ravens despite moving to Mars, PA, at age 5.

Ramón Urias was claimed off waivers by Baltimore from St. Louis on Feb. 11, 2020...played in 506 games for the Orioles (2020-25)...signed with St. Louis as a free agent on Feb. 21, 2026.

George Soriano was claimed off waivers by Baltimore (Nov. 5, 2025), his 1st of three waiver claims during 2025-26 (also Atlanta & Washington).

Asst. Pitching Coach **Kyle Driscoll** resides in Md.

Andrew Kittredge pitched the 2024 season in St. Louis...set the Cardinals single-season holds record (37)...originally traded by Tampa Bay to St. Louis for OF **Richie Palacios** (Jan. 5, 2024).

Jackson Holliday's father, **Matt Holliday**, played parts of eight seasons in St. Louis (2009-16), where he was a three-time NL All-Star, member of the 2011 World Series Champions, and later elected to the Cardinals Hall of Fame in 2022.

Tyler O'Neill played 477 with the Cardinals (2018-23) and co-led the team with 34 HRs in 2021...won Rawlings Gold Glove awards in '20 & '21.

Ryan Helsley was selected by St. Louis in the 5th round of the 2015 MLB Draft and pitched in seven seasons for the Cardinals (2019-25) with 105 saves (6th in franchise history), including a franchise single-season record 49 in 2024...traded to NYM in exchange for 3 MiLB players in 2025.

Bryan Torres and **Rico Garcia** were teammates on Team Puerto Rico in the 2026 WBC.

Orioles Infield Coach **Miguel Cairo** played in 255 games for the Cardinals (2001-03, '07).

Yohel Pozo played in 85 games for St. Louis from 2025-26...was claimed off waivers by Baltimore from St. Louis on July 23, 2026.

Cardinals Principal Owner/Chairman **Bill DeWitt Jr.** has been a prior owner of the Baltimore Orioles...his father, **William O. DeWitt**, began his baseball career in 1916 as a 14-year-old office boy with the St. Louis Browns, and later rejoined the organization as an executive and team owner, in the early 1940s...was majority owner of the Browns (1949-51) when Bill, Jr. served as the team's bat boy...DeWitt Jr.'s uniform (#1/8) was worn by **Eddie Gaedel** during his famous pinch-hitting appearance on August 19, 1951.

Orioles EVP & GM **Mike Elias** spent five seasons as a scout with St. Louis, including over a year as the club's Manager of Amateur Scouting.

Orioles Assistant Pitching Coach **Mitch Plassmeyer** was born in St. Louis...graduated from nearby DeSmet Jesuit High School in 2014...worked as Mizzou Pitching Coach (2022) & Director of Baseball Player Development (2021-22).

The **St. Louis Browns** played 52 seasons in the AL (1902-53), playing at Sportsman's Park and shared the same ballpark with the Cardinals from 1920-53...Coinciding with the sale of the Cardinals and Sportsman's Park to Anheuser Busch, the Browns relocated to Baltimore as the Orioles in 1954.

Orioles Chief Strategy Officer **Rosina Lanson**, Pitching Director **Forrest Herrmann** & Chief Revenue Officer **Don Rovak** are St. Louis natives...Rovak served as VP of Marketing & Ticketing for Triple-A Memphis from 1998-2007.

Orioles VP & AGM, Analytics **Sig Mejdal** worked for St. Louis for seven seasons (2005-11), spending his final year as the team's Director, Amateur Draft Analysis...began pro baseball career as a Quantitative Analyst for the Cardinals in 2005.

Orioles Bench Coach **Donnie Ecker** was a hitting coach in the Cardinals' minor league system at Palm Beach (2015-16) and Peoria (2017).

Orioles VP, Intl. Scouting & Operations **Koby Perez** worked as the Northeast area scout for the Cardinals from 2006-08.

Orioles VP, Player & Staff Development **Matt Blood** worked for the Cardinals as an area scout from 2009-15.

The Baltimore Orioles of the National League went 72-30 against the St. Louis Browns/Perfectos from 1892-99 before being eliminated by the National League...Upon the foundation of the American League in 1901, a reorganized Baltimore Orioles franchise competed as a charter member, before relocating to New York City after two seasons, where they ultimately became known as the New York Yankees.

In the only all-St. Louis World Series, Sportsman's Park hosted the 1944 Fall Classic as the Cardinals defeated the Browns, 4-2, for their 5th World Series title...dubbed the "St. Louis Showdown," "Trolley Series," and "Streetcar Series" as many fans used that mode of travel to and from the ballpark...third World Series in which both teams had the same home field (1921 & 1922 at New York City's Polo Grounds)...remains one of four World Series to feature teams from the same city (1906 Chicago & 1921-22 in New York).

TONIGHT'S GAME:

- The 26-year-old Cardinals Opening Day starter makes his team-leading 26th start of the season. It marks his 146th career Major League appearance and his 79th career start.
- Fanned nine in his last start to reach a new single-season career high strikeout total (125), which also leads the Cardinals.
- Ranks 21st among left-handers in franchise history with his 79 starts.
- Is one of five Cardinals who have induced double-digit GDP this season (11).
- Tied for 3rd in the National League with four pick-offs, most by a Cardinal since **Lance Lynn** (4 in 2015) and by a southpaw since **Mark Mulder** (5 in 2005).
- Is the third Cardinals lefty with 21+ wins since 2000, joining **Jamie Garcia** (62-45) and **Mark Mulder** (22-18). His next win ties **Alex Jackson** (1966-67), **Jerry Reuss** (1969-71), **Ferdie Shupp** (1919-21), and **Mulder** (2005-08) for 34th all-time among Cardinals left-handed pitchers.
- Opponents are batting .189 (10-57) off his curveball this season. Boasts a 41.5% whiff rate and 52.9% K% (5th in MLB) on his curve.
- The Cardinals are 19-18 in his 37 career starts at Busch Stadium, where he has gone 13-13 with a 4.28 ERA (183.0 IP/87 ER) with 11 quality starts (all 11 starts with 6.0 IP or more).

LAST TIME OUT (Wednesday, August 19 at Great American Ball Park): L, 5-4: 6.0 IP, 4 H, 3 R, 3 ER, 0 BB, 0 SO - 100 pitches

- Suffered his 5th straight losing decision, last earning a win on July 11 vs. Atlanta at Busch Stadium.

2026 HIGHLIGHTS:

NOT MY DECISION: Did not factor in the decision, but the Cardinals won 5-1 at TOR (8/2) following 6.0 scoreless innings of one-hit ball including striking out the first three batters of the game.

AND THE AWARD FOR BEST SUPPORTING CAST MEMBER ...?: Supported with 3 runs or less (6 total) in each of his five starts since the All-Star Break.

JUST PEACHY: Fanned 9 batters, one shy of his career high, in a 5-3 win vs. ATL (6/30) at Truist Park to earn his 20th career win and the blanked the Braves over 6.0 IP two weeks later in a 4-1 win at Busch Stadium on 7/11.

SUNDAY FUNDAY: Had his deepest start (5.1 IP) since a 6.0 inning effort at SD (5/7) and led the Cardinals to a series win over the Cubs on NBC Sunday Night Baseball in his 5-1 win vs Chicago on 5/31.

K-CLUB: Libby notched single-game career highs for strikeouts in consecutive starts when he fanned 9 on 5/19 vs. PIT and then he bettered that with 10 K's on Memorial Day (5/25) at MIL; He and Brewers starter Jacob Misorowski (12) combined for 22 strikeouts in the 5/25 game.

LIBBY vs. LEFTY: Recorded 38 strikeouts in May, the most by a Cardinals lefty in the month of May since Hall of Famer **Steve "Lefty" Carlton** fanned 52 in May, 1970.

FRIAR FRYER: Earned his 2nd straight win holding the Padres (5/7) to one run over 6.0 innings in a 2-1 come-from-behind win at Petco Park. Recorded his 300th career strikeout fanning Nick Castellanos in the 5th inning.

HR DERBY: Surrendered a career-high 3 HR's in 3.1 IP vs. SEA (4/25) as the two teams combined for 33 hits and 8 HR's in 11-9 Mariners win. Also allowed 3 HR's in his 6/13 start vs. the Twins at Target Field.

LIBBY'S LID-LIFTER: Made his 1st career Opening Day start and received a no decision vs. TB (3/26) despite pitching 5.0 innings and allowing just one run. Cardinals rallied for a 9-7 win (he exited with game tied 1-1).

LEFTY LIFT-OFFS: Made his 1st career Opening Day start on 3/26 vs. TB, becoming the 1st Cardinals lefty to start on Opening Day since **Donovan Osborne** (4/5/99) vs. MIL - the same year that he was born. Became 1 of just 16 LHPs to make the Opening Day start for St. Louis since 1901 (MLB).

CAREER:

- Chose to switch to uniform No. 32 prior to 2026 season in honor of Hall of Fame left-handed pitcher **Sandy Koufax**, whom he grew up admiring.
- Is a career 18-32 with a 5.04 ERA (378.0 IP) in his 78 career starts opposed to 3-3 with a 3.89 ERA (81.0 IP) in 67 career relief appearances.
