LAST GAME: The D-backs won 3-2 @ Mariners yesterday. - Brandon Pfaadt tallied his second quality start of the season and set a career high with 11 strikeouts ( 6.0 IP , 5 H, 2 R-ER, 0 BB, 11 K).

- Christian Walker collected his fifth homer of the season to tie the game in the second inning.
- Ketel Marte delivered a two-out, eighth-inning RBI double (9) to make the difference.

VS. DODGERS: The D-backs face the Dodgers for the first time since sweeping them in the NLDS, with 4-2 wins in Games $1 \& 2$ at Dodger Stadium capped by an 11-2 win in Game 3 at Chase Field.

- The D-backs were 5-8 vs. Dodgers last season, going $5-3$ in the first 8 games before dropping the last 5 straight (August 8-30).
- The D-backs split 3-3 at home last season, their fourth season since 2017 with a winning or .500+ home record vs. Dodgers (also: 2017, '18, '19).

SNAKES AMONG NL LEADERS: Lourdes Gurriel Jr., among NL leaders, is tied for fourth with 22 RBI, Ketel Marte is tied for fifth with 9 doubles, sixth with 14 extra-base hits, seventh with 59 total bases and eighth with 35 hits, while Christian Walker is tied for sixth with 18 walks and tied for eighth with 21 runs

WALKER'S STREAKS: Christian Walker is currently riding a 6-game on-base streak (5-game hitting streak)...he is batting .318 (7-for-22)/1.021 OPS with 1 double, 2 hom ers, 5 RBI and 3 walks in the span.

- Defensively, Walker boasts a 29-game errorless streak this season, tied for the second-longest (also: 5 oth ers), behind Teoscar Hernández/LAD (30).

DEFENSE RULES: Christian Walker's 7 errors since 2022 in 331 games (2853.1 innings) are tied for the third fewest among all infielders (also: Freddie Freeman/LAD in 350 G), behind Paul Goldschmidt/STL (3) in 288 G and Ty France/SEA (5) in 313 G.

FIRST-INNING STRIKERS: The D-backs' 13 games this season with $1+$ runs scored in the first inning is third most in the Majors while the Dodgers have the most with 15. -The D-backs have scored $2+$ runs in the first inning in 8 games this season, the second most behind the Phillies (10 G).

- Moreno leads active catchers with a 41.0 caught-stealing pct. (34-for-83) and Tucker Barnhart is 11th with a 30.8 caught-stealing pct. (171-for-556).
bWAR RANKINGS: Ketel Marte's 2.0 bWAR makes him 1 of 3 players (pitcher or position) with a $2.0+$ bWAR along with Mookie Betts/LAD (2.9) and LHP Ranger Suárez/ PHI (2.1).
- Ketel Marte's 0.8 defensive bWAR is tied for second in the Majors with Bobby Witt/KC (0.8), behind Marcus Semien/TEX (1.0).
