The Rays are AL East champions for the fifth time in franchise history (2021, 2020, 2010, 2008) and are the No. 1 seed in the AL for the fourth time in team history (2021, 2020, 2010).

RAY REPORT—The Rays continue their final road trip of the regular season against the Yankees (1-2, one to play) and Phillies (three to play) tonight at Yankee Stadium...have won nine of 12, 13 of 18, and 20 of their last 29 games since Aug. 23...are an MLB-best 40-20 (.667) over their last 60 games (July 20-pres)...have secured the AL East division title for the fifth time in franchise history (2021, 2020, 2010, 2008) and the No. 1 seed in the AL for the fourth time in franchise history (2021, 2020, 2010)...have qualified for the postseason for the 10th time in 29 seasons and sixth time in the last eight years (2019-pres)...lead the second-place Yankees by 5.0 games in the AL East standings...have led the division for 89 consecutive days (June 27-pres.) and spent a total of 129 days at the helm overall as well as 128 days with the AL's best winning pct., both of which are franchise records.

- ★ The Rays dropped the third game of their series in New York, 9-2...it marked the 19th time this season they have allowed nine runs or more in a contest, their most since 2007 (33G).
- ★ **Jonny DeLuca** tied a career high with three hits (8x, last: Aug. 12 at ATH)...he also swiped multiple bases for the fifth time in his career...he became the second Ray this year to have three hits or more and multiple stolen bases (also: **Chandler Simpson**, May 11 at TOR - 3H, 2SB).
- ★ Including this season, the AL East winner has secured the No. 1 seed in the AL each of the last four seasons, one year after missing the postseason and finishing fourth or lower in the division...the AL East is the only division in the majors to have been won by all five teams since 2018 and to be won by each of its five members multiple times since 2014.
- ★ Tonight's probable starter, **Ian Seymour**, is seeking his 10th win of the season...he would join **Nick Martinez**, **Shane McClanahan**, and **Drew Rasmussen** as Rays with double-digit wins this season...the Rays would join the Brewers (**Aaron Ashby**, **Kyle Harrison**, **Logan Henderson**, **Jacob Misiorowski**) as the only teams in the majors to have four pitchers with 10 wins or more...Seymour (9W, 9HLD, 2SV) could become the first Rays pitcher with 10 wins or more, nine holds or more, and multiple saves and the first AL pitcher to do so since TOR **Adam Cimber** in 2022 (10W, 19HLD, 4SV).

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Today, the Rays selected RHP **Jake Woodford** from Triple-A Durham and optioned RHP **Mason Englert** to Durham.

- ★ A native of St. Petersburg, Fla., Woodford is one of 11 players born in the city to appear the major leagues, according to Baseball-Reference and would join **Casey Kotchman** (2011), **Doug Waechter** (2003-06), and **Ryan Weber** (2018) as the only St. Petersburg-born players to suit up for the Rays.
- ★ Woodford signed a minor league contract with the Rays on Nov. 25, 2025 before being traded to the Brewers for RHP **K.C. Hunt** and cash considerations on March 24...he was designated for assignment by the Brewers on June 5 and elected free agency on June 8...he re-signed with the Brewers on a minor league contract and was released and signed with the Cubs on July 4...he was designated for assignment on July 11 and elected free agency on July 15 before re-signing with the Cubs on a minor league deal on July 18...he had his contract selected on July 29 and was designated for assignment on Aug. 4 before signing with the Rays on a minor league deal on Aug. 11.

TIP TROP SHAPE—After securing the No. 1 seed in the AL, the Rays are slated to host Game 1 of the ALDS on Oct. 3 at Tropicana Field, their first postseason game at the ballpark since Oct. 4, 2023 and 724 days since the Trop sustained extensive damage during Hurricane Milton on Oct. 9, 2024.

- ★ They finished the year with the third-best home winning pct. in franchise history (2020; .690/20-9 & 2008; 704/57-24) and are on pace to have the best home record in the majors this season...because the 2008 Rays played three home games (3-0) in Champion Stadium at the ESPN Wide World of Sports, the 2026 Rays 55 wins at Tropicana Field marked their most in a single season at the ballpark. The Rays five division titles since 2008 are tied for the ninth most in the majors and tied for the fourth most in the AL (also: MIN), behind the Astros (7), Guardians (6), and Yankees (6)...their three division titles since 2020 are the most among AL East clubs.
- ★ When competing in the postseason as the AL East champions, the Rays are 22-23 compared to 6-13 as a Wild Card...they have qualified for the ALDS for the eighth time, first since 2021.

NO DAYS OFF—In his age-22 season, **Junior Caminero** has started at third base every game this season and is four games from becoming the fourth Rays player to play in 162 games in a season, joining **Evan Longoria** (2014), **Delmon Young** (2007), and **Aubrey Huff** (2003)...in reaching 162 games, he would become the first player in an age-24-or-younger season to hit 40 home runs or more and play in 162 games in a single season in the modern era (since 1900).

- ★ Only 11 players in the modern era have played 162 games in an age-22-or-younger season, with only six of them playing in 162 contests without appearing as a DH, PH, or PR...the last player to accomplish the feat was BAL **Manny Machado** in 2015.
- ★ There have been only seven players in the modern era to start 162 games or more at third base in a single season: COL **Vinny Castilla** (1998), BAL **Cal Ripken Jr.** (1997), OAK **Sal Bando** (1969), CHC **Ron Santo** (1968, 1965, 1963), STL **Ken Boyer** (1964), PHI **Dick Allen** (1964), and BAL **Brooks Robinson** (1964, 1961-62).
- ★ Caminero has registered a hit in 116 of 158 games, tied for the most games with a hit in the majors (also: MIA **Otto Lopez**)...he has reached base safely 247 times this season, tied for seventh most in a single season by a Ray...if he were to reach three more times, he would become the fifth player in team history to reach 250 times in a season...Caminero and DET **Kevin McGonigle** (262) would be the first players in age-22-or-younger seasons to reach base 250 times or more in a season since WSH **Juan Soto** (304) and TOR **Vladimir Guerrero Jr.** (280) in 2021.
- ★ He paces the AL with 1,374.2 innings played in the field...he is 7.0 innings behind Longoria's franchise record with 1,381.2 innings played in 2014...at third base, he has produced five defensive runs saved (DRS), more than 11 clubs have produced at all positions as a team thus far in 2026.

FINAL FOUR—Several Rays are within reach of notable accomplishments:

- ★ **Chandler Simpson** (.309) trails HOU **Yordan Alvarez** (.316) by seven points for the AL batting title...**Yandy Diaz** (2023) is the only Ray to pace the AL in average in team history...Simpson could become the sixth player in AL/NL history to win a batting title within their first two major league seasons and the third since 1942 alongside SEA **Ichiro Suzuki** (.350, 1st season - 2001) and Rays Hall of Famer BOS **Wade Boggs** (.361, 2nd season - 1983).
- ★ Simpson leads the AL in singles (152) and stolen bases (46) and is T2nd in triples (6)—only four players (5x) in the modern era (since 1900) have paced the AL or NL in all three categories over a full season: LAD **Maury Wills** in 1962, NYY **Snuffy Stirnweiss** in 1944, SLB **George Sisler** in 1922, and DET **Ty Cobb** in both 1917 and 1911 (Elias)...no Ray has ever paced the AL in singles, and only **Carl Crawford** (4x, last: 2010) and **Mallek Smith** (2018) have had the most three-baggers...Crawford (4x, last: 2007) and **José Caballero** (2024) are the only Rays to lead the league in steals.
- ★ Caminero is tied for the AL lead with Alvarez, BAL **Pete Alonso**, and NYY **Ben Rice** at 41 home runs...he is attempting to join **Carlos Peña** (2009, 39HR) as the only Rays to earn at least a share of the AL home run crown...Peña's 39 bombs that season matched NYY **Mark Teixeira** for the Junior Circuit lead.
- ★ **Bryan Baker** is tied for the major league lead with CLE **Cade Smith** with 40 saves...he is attempting to join **Alex Colomé** (2017, 47SV) as the only Ray to pace the majors in saves over a full season...he has converted 29 straight save opportunities and could become the 12th AL pitcher (13x) since saves became an official statistic in 1969 to record a streak of 30 consecutive saves or more within a single season and the second since 2017 along with CLE **Emmanuel Clase** (34) in 2024.
- ★ Between **Junior Caminero** (HR), **Simpson** (SB), and **Baker** (SV), the Rays could become the third club since 1969 to have the league leaders (AL or NL) in homers, stolen bases, and saves on the same team, joining Cleveland in 1995 (HR - **Albert Belle**; SB - **Kenny Lofton**; SV - **Jose Mesa**) and Cincinnati in 1970 (HR - **Johnny Bench**; SB - **Bobby Tolan**; SV - **Wayne Granger**), according to Elias.
- ★ The pitching staff leads the majors with a 1.13 WHIP, which would surpass the club record established in 2022 (1.15) and signal the lowest mark since the 2024 Mariners (1.08)...the Rays are attempting to post the majors' best WHIP for the third time, joining 2023 (1.18) and 2012 (1.17).

8-INNING GAMES—The Rays remain undefeated (83-0) when leading after the 8th inning...they are on pace to be the 16th team in the modern era (since 1900) to finish a season 83-0 or better when leading after eight innings...the last team to go 83-0 or better was the 2022 Mets (89-0) and the last AL club to turn the trick was the 2011 Tigers (83-0)...the last AL club to go 84-0 or better was the 2007 Angels (86-0)...dating back to 2025, the Rays have won a franchise-record 95 straight games when leading after the 8th frame and have not suffered a loss after entering the 9th with the lead since Aug. 27, 2025 at CLE...prior to this season, the longest streak in franchise history was 81 games between July 21, 2010–July 21, 2011.

TONIGHT'S START—Ian Seymour is slated to make his 16th start of the season and his 45th appearance...marks his 65th career appearance and 21st career start...owns the most strikeouts (103) among AL LHP over his last 15 outings (12 starts) since July 1, ahead of second-place BOS Payton Tolle (102), ranking second among all MLB southpaws over that span behind PHI Jesús Luzardo (105)...was selected in the second round (57th overall) of the 2020 First-Year Player Draft out of Virginia Tech.

- With a win tonight, Seymour would become the fourth Rays pitcher with double-digit wins this season (also: Nick Martinez - 18, Drew Rasmussen - 13, Shane McClanahan - 10)...the Rays would be the only AL club with four pitchers or more to earn double digit wins this season, joining Milwaukee as the second team in the majors to do so (Jacob Misiorowski - 15, Aaron Ashby - 13, Logan Henderson - 11, and Kyle Harrison - 10)...would be the ninth time in franchise history they turn the trick, and the third time in the last four years.
- Among AL pitchers with 100.0 IP or more this season, his 4.31 strikeout-to-walk ratio ranks third behind BOS Jake Bennett (4.50) and LAA Reid Detmers (4.43).
- When pitching in the 4th inning this year, he has recorded 23 strikeouts in 17.1 IP, limiting the opposition to a .161 (10-for-62) clip...his opp. average in the frame is the third lowest among AL arms (min. 15.0IP in 4th inn.), behind NYY Cam Schlitler (.123) and rotation-mate Shane McClanahan (.158).
- Since transitioning to a starting/bulk relief role on June 8, Seymour has turned in a 4.11 ERA (96.1IP, 44ER), a 1.11 WHIP, and a .231 (86-for-373) opp. average (19G/14GS) compared to a 5.23 ERA (31.0IP, 18ER), 1.35 WHIP, and .239 (27-for-113) across his first 26 appearances of the year (March 26–June 2).

LAST TIME OUT—Allowed a season-high-tying seven hits (4x, last: Aug. 25 at DET) and was dealt his seventh loss of the season on Sept. 18 vs. BOS (L, 5.0IP, 7H, 4ER, 2BB, 5SO, 2HR)...surrendered a leadoff home run to Roman Anthony, the second time in his career he has allowed a home run to his first batter faced in an outing (also: July 2 at KC - Carter Jensen)...gave up back-to-back singles to Trevor Story and Caleb Durbin to begin the 2nd inning before Anthony laced a two-run single to left field, extending the Red Sox lead to 3-1...allowed a solo home run to Jahmai Jones to start the 3rd frame, marking his fifth outing this year where he has given up multiple homers (last: Sept. 6 at TEX - 2HR)...retired nine of his final 13 batters faced before handing the ball to Ty Johnson in the 6th inning.

- The four runs Seymour allowed snapped a streak of nine straight games (Sept. 8-17) by Rays starters with two runs or fewer allowed...it was tied for the second-longest streak in team history (also: April 27–May 10, 2010), behind a 10-game streak from Aug. 6-16, 2014.
- He allowed 10 baserunners in the outing, the second most he has yielded in a game during his career (most: 11BR, July 12 vs. SEA).
- He has given up a home run in seven straight games since Aug. 15 (12HR), the longest streak of his career...is the longest run by a Ray this season, surpassing Jesse Scholtens' six-game run from May 8–Aug. 18 (8HR).

MORE ACTION IN THE EAST—Seymour is set to take the mound for his seventh career appearance and second start against the Yankees tonight...owns a 2-0 record with a 6.59 ERA (13.2IP, 10ER), 23 strikeouts, a 1.10 WHIP, and a .245 (13-for-53) opp. average in those six appearances against the club...in 25 career appearances (eight starts) against AL East competition, he is 5-4 with a 4.67 ERA (71.1IP, 37ER), 87 strikeouts, a 1.19 WHIP, and a .235 (64-for-272) opp. average.

- With a win tonight, Seymour would become the 10th pitcher in franchise history to earn three wins or more against the Yankees in a single season, and the first since Rich Hill in 2021 (3-0)...would be the third pitcher to turn the trick within his first two seasons (also: Chris Archer & Ryan Yarbrough).
- New York-AL is one of two clubs that Seymour has multiple wins and zero losses against in his career (also: KC, 2-0).
- In his most recent outing and lone start against the club, he came two outs shy of a quality start and fired a career-high 12 strikeouts on July 7 vs. NYY (W, 5.1IP, 5H, 3ER, 12SO)...the Rays pitching staff recorded a season-high-tying 17 strikeouts in the contest (also: July 6 vs. NYY).
- The southpaw is 10-8 with a 4.06 ERA (142.0IP, 64ER), 165 strikeouts, a 1.17 WHIP, and a .216 (115-for-533) opp. average against the AL over 45 career outings (15 starts)...the Rays are 23-22 when he pitches against an AL foe in his career.

ROADS UNTRAVELED—Seymour has appeared in 20 games (five starts) on the road this season...over his last 16 road appearances (five starts) dating back to April 18 at PIT, he has gone 5-2 with a 3.86 ERA (49.0IP, 21ER), 59 strikeouts, and a .238 (46-for-193) opp. average, allowing three earned runs or fewer in each outing...the Rays have gone 10-6 in those games.

SWING-AND-MISS STUFF—He boasts a 29.4 pct. whiff rate this season, ranking sixth among active AL southpaws (min. 1,000 pitches) to BOS Jovani Morán (32.2%), NYY Brent Headrick (31.9%), TEX Jacob Latz (31.5%), HOU Steven Okert (30.9%), and NYY Carlos Rodón (30.0%)...131 of his 155 strikeouts this season have come on swings-and-misses, second most on the Rays behind Drew Rasmussen (140)...Seymour's 131 swinging strikeouts are the fifth most among AL southpaws this season, trailing leader LAA Reid Detmers (164).

- His out-of-zone swing pct. (35.3%) has increased 8.9 points from his mark last season (26.4%).

CHANGING IT UP—Seymour has utilized his changeup 29.0 pct. of the time this season, down from his 31.4 pct. usage rate in 2025...his 29.0 pct. usage rate in 2026 ranks fifth in the majors (min. 2,000 pitches) and third among southpaws behind PHI Cristopher Sánchez's MLB-leading 36.9 pct. clip and ATL Martín Pérez (31.1%)...min. 500 changeups thrown this year, Seymour's 38.9 pct. whiff rate on the pitch is the fourth-highest mark in the majors behind DET/LAD Tarik Skubal (46.8%), Sánchez (45.7%), and CLE Joey Cantillo (39.0%).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTER: RHP FREDDY PERALTA [9-11, 4.56]
