The Mariners and Blue Jays meet for the first time since the M's won a 3-game series in Seattle from July 3-5...the clubs meet at Rogers Centre for the first time since last year's American League Championship Series.

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TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners begin a 6-game road trip tonight with the first of 3 games against the Toronto Blue Jays...the M's will also visit the Boston Red Sox (3 G, 8/31-9/2) on the road trip...Seattle is coming off a successful 4-2 homestand against the Chicago Cubs (2-1) and Philadelphia Phillies (2-1)...tonight's game will be televised exclusively on **Apple TV** with **Alex Faust** and **Ryan Spilborghs** on the call, with **Tricia Whitaker** serving as field reporter...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Gary Hill Jr.** and **Angie Mentink** on the call.

ODDS & ENDS...the Mariners dropped Wednesday's homestand finale to the Phillies by a 6-0 score, but won the series by taking 2-of-3 from Philadelphia...the Mariners are 4-2 over their last 6 games (8/21-c) and 7-4 over their last 11 games (8/15-c).

- **In The Mix With Six** - The Mariners are 41-27 (.603) when their starting pitcher goes 6.0+ innings, and 23-43 (.348) when they do not.

A VALUABLE PITCH...the four-seam fastball thrown by **Emerson Hancock** is rated as the 6th-best four-seam fastball across the Majors this season (*Baseball Savant*)...its run value (14) trails Parker Messick-CLE (25 run value), Jacob Misiorowski-MIL (24), Cam Schlittler-NYY (17), Eduardo Rodríguez-ARI (15) and Yoshinobu Yamamoto-LAD (15)...opposing hitters are batting .213 and slugging .379 against Hancock's heater, with a 23.3% whiff rate and 26.1% strikeout rate when the pitch is thrown with 2 strikes...right behind Emerson's four-seamer on that list is **Bryan Woo** (13 run value) ranking 7th in the Majors.

THE RANDY RUNDOWN...**Randy Arozarena** is batting .272 (127x467) with 85 runs, 26 doubles, 1 triple, 20 home runs, 58 RBI, 54 walks and 20 HBP, reaching base at a .369 clip and slugging .460 (.829 OPS) in 126 games...Randy recorded his 6th consecutive 20+ home run, 20+ stolen bases season, becoming the 11th player in MLB history with at least 6 such seasons and the 5th to do it in at least 6-consecutive seasons, joining Barry Bonds (9, 1990-98), Bobby Bonds (7, 1969-75), Bobby Abreu (7, 1999-2005) and Willie Mays (6, 1955-1960).

GRAB THE CLUTCH...over his last 15 games (8/11-c), Randy has recorded 8 XBH, including 6 HR, tied for the most home runs he has recorded over a 15-game span this season...each of his last 6 HR across the recent 15-game stretch (8/11-c) have been game-tying or go-ahead home runs, including a lead-off and walk-off home run on 8/22 vs. CHC...Randy's 6 game-tying or go-ahead home runs in August lead MLB, ranking ahead of Pete Crow-Armstrong-CHC (5 HR) and Pete Alonso-BAL (5 HR).

PUTTING IT TOGETHER...over his last 10 games (8/16-c), **Cal Raleigh** has reached base safely in 9 of those 10 games and has batted .296 (8x27) with 6 home runs, 9 RBI and 9 walks with a 1.435 OPS...over his last 32 games (7/20-c), Raleigh has posted a .774 OPS, batting .176 (18x102) with 9 homers and 23 RBI, with a .323 OBP and .451 slugging percentage.

CAL THE BIRD HUNTER...in 36 career games against Toronto, including the Postseason, **Cal Raleigh** is batting .273 (35x128) with 28 runs, 4 doubles, 16 homers, 31 RBI and 17 walks, with a .354 on-base percentage, .680 slugging percentage and 1.033 OPS...in 27 regular season games against the Blue Jays, Raleigh is batting .263 (25x95) with 18 runs, 2 doubles, 11 home runs, 24 RBI and 12 walks, with a .339 on-base percentage, .632 slugging percentage and .971 OPS...Cal's .632 slugging percentage ranks 3rd-highest all-time against the Jays (min. 100 PA), trailing only Russell Branyan (.783 SLG) and Shohei Ohtani (.699)...in 11 regular season games at Rogers Centre, Raleigh's .786 slugging percentage ranks 2nd-highest (min. 40 PA) to Jo Adell (.818 SLG).

HAPPY BIRTHDAY. SWEET LOU!...the winningest manager in Mariners history **Lou Piniella** celebrates his 83rd birthday today...Piniella led the Mariners for 10 seasons (1993-2002), leading the franchise to its first-ever Postseason berth in 1995 and making the playoffs a total of 4 times (1995, '97, 2000-01), which included leading the '01 team to an historic 116-46 regular season record...Lou's 1,835 managerial wins rank 17th in MLB history...Lou played for 18 seasons, batting .291 with 1,705 hits and 102 home runs, while winning 1969 AL Rookie of the Year and winning a pair of World Series titles for the Yankees in 1977-78...Piniella fell 1 vote shy of induction into the National Baseball Hall of Fame in 2023, and will be up for the Hall of Fame again this winter (December 2026) as part of the Contemporary Baseball Era/Managers-Executives-Umpires Ballot.

A FEW NAYLOR KNOCKS...since recording his seventh 3-hit game of the season on Aug. 8. vs. TB, **Josh Naylor** has recorded 2 more such games, tying for the 6th-most 3-hit games in MLB over that span while his 9 total 3-hit games this season are tied for 8th most in the AL...over his last 15 games (8/8-c), he is batting .367 (22x60) while reaching base at a .400 clip and slugging .500...his 22 hits over the span are the most he has recorded over a 15-game stretch since April 22 to May 10 of this season...in 34 games since the All-Star Break (7/17-c), he is batting .323 (42x130) with 13 runs, 6 doubles, 2 home runs, 11 RBI, 10 walks, 7 stolen bases, a .373 OBP and slugging .415 for a .789 OPS, reaching base in 31 of those games...his .325 average in the 2nd half ranks 6th among qualified AL hitters.

TWENTY WOULD BE PLENTY...**Cal Raleigh** is 2 home runs away from his fifth consecutive 20+ home run season...Cal, who has led his position in homers in each of the last 4 seasons (2022-25), would become the 18th catcher (min. 50% of games at catcher in a season) in MLB history to record five or more seasons with 20+ homers, and the ninth to do it before turning 30 years old.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...the Mariners enter play Friday evening 3.0 games back of the Houston Astros for the AL West Division lead...Seattle has 28 games remaining in the regular season, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...the Mariners entered play on Aug. 29, 2025 (one year ago tomorrow) 3.0 games back of the AL West Division lead?...the Mariners rattled off a 17-8 record (.680) in September last year to catapult themselves to the AL West Division title, eventually making it to the AL Championship Series against the Blue Jays...Seattle's 17-8 September mark was 3rd-best in the American League...Seattle is scheduled to play 24 regular season games in September this season.

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - AUGUST 28

- **1997** - **Omar Olivares** becomes the first Mariners pitcher to drive in a run in a 9-5 loss at Colorado.
- **1998** - The Mariners hit three home runs in a 10-3 loss to the Yankees, making them the first team in history to reach the 200-home run mark for a season in three consecutive years.
- **2001** - **Ichiro Suzuki** collected his 200th hit in the team's 132nd game of the year; matching Darin Erstad (2000) as fastest in the Majors to 200 hits since Joe Medwick in 1935 (131 games) and fastest in AL since Al Simmons in 1925 (125 games). He also becomes only the third American League rookie to reach 200 hits since 1964.

ABOUT EMERSON HANCOCK...

- The 27-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 25th start of the season and the 56th of his career...this will be his 62nd career appearance, including the 6 relief appearances he made throughout the 2025 regular season...it will mark his 2nd start of the season and 3rd career start against the Blue Jays.
- Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (6th overall) of the 2020 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Scott Hunter on June 25, 2020.
- Spent 3 seasons at the University of Georgia, 2018-20...in 2020, was named Vince Dooley Athlete of the Year as the top male student-athlete at the University of Georgia.
- Was named to CoSIDA Academic All-America First Team in 2020.

LAST TIME OUT...on Aug. 21 vs. Chicago, tossed 5.2 innings, allowing 3 runs (3 ER) on 8 hits (2 HR) and no walks while striking out 6 batters...threw 98 pitches and 68 strikes...his 98 pitches are tied for 2nd most he has thrown in an outing this season.

CANADA O CANADA...will be making his first career regular season start at Toronto...faced the Blue Jays once at the Rogers Centre on 10/13/25 in Game 2 of the ALCS, closing out the game with 2.0 innings of scoreless relief...allowed no hits, 3 walks and struck out 1 batter in th outing...in his last outing against the Blue Jays on 7/5, tossed 7.0 scoreless innings with 2 hits , 2 walks, and 5 strikeouts...marked his 2nd career scoreless outing over 7.0-innings.

CAN'T TOUCH THIS...his last outing vs. Blue Jays on July 5 marked his 4th start with 2-or-fewer hits allowed over 6.0+ IP this season...is 1-of-8 AL pitchers in 2026 with 4+ such starts...is 1-of-14 Mariners pitchers to record 4+ such starts in a single season...has thrown 6.0+ innings with 1-or-fewer hits in 2 starts this season (5/26 at ATH and 3/29 vs. CLE)...is 1 of 12 AL pitchers with multiple such starts in 2026, joining teammates **Bryan Woo** (5/6 vs. ATL and 4/3 at LAA) and **Logan Gilbert** (5/10 at CWS and 7/4 vs. TOR)...the Mariners have combined for 7 such starts this season, tied for most in MLB.

THE STRETCH...extending back to June 28, has allowed 3-or-fewer earned runs over 5.0+ IP in 7 of his last 9 starts with 2-or-fewer runs allowed over 6.0+ IP in 3 games during that span...over his 9 starts since June 28, owns a 2.96 ERA (16 ER, 48.2 IP) with 44 strikeouts and 13 walks...his 2.96 ERA is tied for his 2nd best mark through an 9-game span in his career and his best since he owned a 2.94 ERA from 4/20-6/8.

THE ROAD SO FAR...in his last road start on Aug. 15 at HOU, recorded 7.0 innings of work with 2 runs (2 ER), 5 hits (1 HR), 2 walks, and 8 strikeouts, tying his career-high in IP (4x)...his 8 strikeouts are also the 3rd most he has recorded in a single-outing...allowed 3-or-fewer runs over 5.0+ IP in 3 of his last 4 road starts and in 8 of his 11 road starts on the season...5 of his road starts this season have been for 6.0+ IP with 2-or-fewer runs allowed, tied for 9th most such starts in the AL this season...over his last 4 road tarts since June 28, owns a 2.79 ERA (6 ER, 19.1 IP) with 21 strikeouts to 7 walks (3.00 K/BB).

THAT'S RIGHT...owns a 1.046 WHIP against right-handed batters, ranking 10th best in the AL (min. 50.0 IP) while ranking 4th in K/BB (5.78) this season...has thrown 230 sweepers against right-handed batters, owning a .096 (5x52) opponent batting average on the pitch to rank 5th lowest among pitchers with at least 100 sweepers thrown to righty batters...his K% (48.1) ranks 4th best (min. 100 sweepers)...his 45.5 K% on his sweeper against RHB also ranks 16th-highest among any pitch thrown by a starting pitcher against RHB (min. 150 pitches).

QUALITY CONTROL...in his last road start on Aug. 15 at Houston, recorded his 12th quality start of the season, tied for 12th most in the AL, and his 4th over his last 8 outings since the start of July...has recorded a quality start with 6+ strikeouts and 1-or-fewer walks in 5 starts this season, tied for 12th most in the AL...the Mariners are 11-6 when Hancock logs a quality start since the start of 2025.

TRAFFIC CONTROL...his 159 base runners allowed over 133.2 innings in his first 24 starts are tied for the 12th fewest among pitchers in 2026 through their first 24 games (min. 130.0 IP)...owns a baserunners-per-9 of 10.50, tied for 12th-lowest in the AL in 2026 (min. 130.0 IP)...is 1-of-11 AL pitchers, along with **Woo** (9 G) and **Gilbert** (10 G), to log 9+ starts with 6-or-fewer base runners allowed over 6.0+ IP this season (last: 7/22 vs. CIN).

SWITCHING UP THE MIX...over his 24 starts this season, Hancock has increased his 4-seam usage by 12.4 percentage points while increasing his avg. velo to 95.4 mph from 94.9 mph since 2025 and increased his sweeper usage by 13 points...his cutter usage increased 11.4 points from his 0.1% use last season...his 33.3 whiff rate on the cutter is 2nd highest of any of his pitches and ranks 9th best in the league (min. 150 cutters thrown)...he owns a 38.0 whiff rate, the highest of any of his pitches, and a .132 (9x68) opponent batting, the lowest of any of his pitches thrown, on his sweeper...his whiff rate on the sweeper, now his 3rd most used pitch, ranks 16th highest in MLB (min. 200 sweepers thrown)...owns a .265 opp. OBP on his 4-seam, ranking 12th-lowest in the AL (min. 200 4-seams).

NO FREE PASSES...has allowed 3-or-fewer walks over 5.0 IP in 21 of his 24 appearances this season, tied for 8th most in the AL...his 2.15 BB/9 is 8th best in the AL (min. 100.0 IP)...has contributed 12 starts with 6.0+ IP and 2-or-fewer walks (last: 8/15 at HOU) to a Mariners pitching staff that has the 2nd-most such games (64) in 2026.
