NATIONALS HISTORY

APRIL 3 (4-6)
2005 – Washington faced off against the Philadelphia Phillies at Citizens Bank Park in the first game in Washington Nationals history. **Terrmel Sledge** hit the first home run in the history of Nationals, a two-run shot to right field in the sixth inning off **Jon Lieber**. Washington eventually fell to the Phillies, 8-4. The franchise, which played its initial 36 years in Montreal, became the first team to represent the nation's capital since the Senators left to become the Texas Rangers in 1971.

NATIONALS NEWS

MOVING ON

The Washington Nationals continue their home opening series this afternoon against the Los Angeles Dodgers...Following the three-game series against the Dodgers, the Nationals will welcome the St. Louis Cardinals to Nationals Park for a three-game set starting Monday.

- The Nationals rank among Major League clubs in batting average (1st, .283), on-base percentage (3rd, .350), runs scored (3rd, 44), slugging percentage (6th, .433),

DAYLEN'S DAYS

Daylen Lile has hit safely in each of his first seven games to start the 2026 season, going 12-for-32 (.375) with three doubles, three RBI, two walks and seven runs scored...He has multi-hit efforts in four straight games.

- His 12 hits are tied for the most in the National League and second-most in Major League Baseball.
- Since June 21, 2025, he ranks fourth among all hitters (min. 325 PA) with a .313 batting average.
- The reigning National League Player and Rookie of the Month, Lile paced National League in OPS (1.212), slugging percentage (.772), batting average (.391) and triples (7) during September 2025.

OUT OF THIS WORLD

CJ Abrams matched a career high with four RBI on Friday against the Dodgers... He connected on his second home run of the season, a three-run shot in the first inning to open the scoring

- His 10 RBI rank second in the National League are tied with **Danny Espinosa** (10, 2010) for the most in a player's first six games to begin a season in team history (2005-pres.).
- Abrams has homered in back-to-back games for the fifth time in his career and for the first time doing so since June 20-21, 2025...After not hitting a three-run homer since Aug. 6, 2024 vs. San Francisco, he did so for the second time in as many games.

WINNING WITH WIEMER

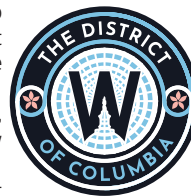
Joey Wiemer, who was acquired off waivers in the offseason after he was designated for assignment twice, leads Major League Baseball with a .588 batting average and a .682 on-base percentage...He is 10-for-17 (.588) with a triple, two homers, four RBI, five walks and seven runs through the first five games of the season...He's reached base safely in all five games.

- Wiemer reached base in each of his first 10 plate appearances to start the season to match **Carlos Delgado** in 2002 for reaching in the most consecutive plate appearances to start a season since 1920, per *Elias Sports Bureau*...He fell just two plate appearances shy of the Nationals record for most consecutive plate appearances reaching base safely overall: 12 by **Juan Soto** from Sept. 21-24, 2021.
- Wiemer was also the first player in Nationals history (2005-pres.) to homer in each of his first two games with the club.

OUR DIAMOND, OUR DISTRICT

In their second season, the Washington Nationals City Connect uniforms are an homage to the quadrants, grand avenues and even the traffic circles that connect us...More than just pathways through our nation's capital, these are the streets that bring us home, and we are proud to wear those streets on our hearts...This is the District Blueprint.

- The District Blueprint cap and jersey patch both feature a new stylized block W, which surrounds the outline of the Capitol Dome...The W is flanked on either side by the District's iconic cherry blossoms.
- On the patch, the W sits on a tile background, reminiscent of some of the city's most recognizable architectural features like the Capitol rotunda, Library of Congress and brutalist Metro stations.
- The interlocking DC on the chest, which was worn by the Nationals from 2006-10, receives a 3D treatment in a nod to the 1956 Washington Senators logo.
- A mosaic detail trims the white pants, representing the diverse makeup of Washington, D.C., and how its residents come together to form a work of art.



BLAKE BUTERA

Blake Butera was named Washington's eighth field manager on October 31, 2025 after spending the previous two seasons as the senior director of player development for the Tampa Bay Rays...He served as the Rays' Minor League field coordinator in 2023 following four seasons (2018-19, 2021-22) as a manager in their Minor League system.

- At Single-A Charleston, Butera was named Carolina League Manager of the Year in 2021 and 2022, won the Carolina League championship both seasons and the 2022 club was named Minor League Team of the Year by *Baseball America*.
- He began his coaching career with the Rays organization in 2017 as the bench coach for Single-A Hudson Valley and was promoted to manager in 2018, becoming the youngest manager in all of Minor League Baseball at the age of 25.
