NEW YORK YANKEES NOTES

- The Yankees snapped their three-game losing streak...are now 1-2 on their six-game homestand.
- Are 7-4 in their last 11 games (since 9/10), 15-8 in their last 23 games (since 8/28) and 17-11 in their last 28 games (since 8/23).
- RHP Gerrit Cole (8.0IP, 2H, 1ER, 0BB, 9K, 0HR, 1WP) earned his 14th win of the year and his 50th as a Yankee after allowing just 1R/ER over 8.0IP...his only run scored on a wild pitch in the eighth inning...retired his first 16BF, 21 of his first 22BF faced and 24 of his 26BF.
 - Is now 14-4 with a 2.75 ERA (200.0IP, 61ER) and 217K in 32 starts this season...his 2.75 ERA is the lowest in the American League and the second-lowest in the Majors, trailing only San Diego's Blake Snell (2.33).
 - Has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 27-of-32 starts this season, 2R-or-fewer in 25 of those starts and 1R-or-fewer in 13 of those starts.
 - His 25 starts of 2R-or-fewer are the most such starts in the Majors...is one of just three pitchers in franchise history to record at least 25 starts of 2R-or-fewer in a single season, joining Jack Chesbro (28 in 1904) and Ron Guidry (26 in 1978).
 - According to Elias, his 2.75 ERA is the lowest by a Yankees starter through his first 32 starts of a season in the last 45 years (since 1979)...the last Yankee to record as low of an ERA through 32 starts was Ron Guidry in 1978 (1.80)...the last time a qualified Yankee finished a non-strike season with as low of an ERA was 1980 when Rudy May recorded a 2.46 ERA in 41 games/17 starts (Tommy John had a 2.63 ERA in 20 starts in 1981 and Ron Guidry posted a 2.76 ERA in 23 games/21 starts in 1981).
 - Has tossed at least 200.0 innings for a second straight season and for the sixth time in his career (2015, '17-19, '22)...has reached the 200.0IP mark for the fifth time in his last six 162-game seasons... is the only pitcher to throw at least 200.0 innings in five different seasons since 2017 (no other pitcher has recorded more than three such seasons in that span)...is also the only Major League pitcher to record six such seasons since 2015 (no other pitcher has more than four in that span)...is the only Yankee in the last 10 years (since 2014) to throw at least 200.0IP in a season and is the first to do so in back-to-back seasons since CC Sabathia (five straight from 2009-13) and Hiroki Kuroda (2012-13).
 - Tonight marked his fifth start this season where he tossed at least at least 7.0 innings and allowed three-or-fewer baserunners (via H/BB/HP), marking the most such starts by a Yankees pitcher in a single season in franchise history...surpassed Mike Mussina's four such starts in 2001.
 - His 8.0IP marked his second-longest start of the season, trailing only his CGSHO on 4/16 vs. Minnesota.
 - Has tossed at least 6.0 innings in 25 of his 32 starts, the most such starts in the AL and the second-most in the Majors, trailing only San Francisco's Logan Webb (26)...has tossed at least 6.0 innings in 13 of his last 15 starts (since 7/2) and in 18 of his last 21 starts (since 5/28).
 - Has tossed at least 7.0 innings in six of his last 11 starts (since 7/28), seven of his last 14 starts (since 7/8) and eight of his last 17 starts (since 6/20)...his 10 starts of at least 7.0IP are tied for the third-most in the AL and tied for the sixth-most in the Majors.
 - Tonight marked the 15th time this season Cole has started after a Yankees' loss...the Yankees are 12-3 in those games with Cole going 8-2 with a 2.59 ERA (97.1IP, 28ER) in those starts.
 - The Yankees are 22-10 in his starts this season...the Yankees' 22 wins in Cole's starts match the third-most by any team in the Majors in a pitcher's starts (tied for second-most in AL), trailing only Atlanta's 24 wins in Spencer Strider's starts and Baltimore's 23 wins in Dean Kremer's starts.
 - Has allowed 4H-or-fewer in 15 of his 32 starts.
 - His 2H allowed tonight matched his season low (also 2H in 9.0IP on 4/16 vs. Minnesota and 2H in 6.0IP on 7/16 at Colorado).
 - Has gone 4-0 with a 1.59 ERA (39.2IP, 7ER) and 47K over his last six starts (since 8/25)...has allowed 2R-or-fewer in each of those six starts...has walked just five of his 149BF over that span...the Yankees are 6-0 in those games.
 - Has not surrendered a walk in three of his last four starts (since 9/5) and four of his last six starts (since 8/25).
 - Recorded at least 9K for the eighth time this season.
 - In 107 starts with the Yankees (since 2020), is 50-23 with a 3.12 ERA (655.0IP, 227ER) and 811K...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 84-of-107 starts...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 73 starts as a Yankee, the most such starts in the Majors in that stretch.
 - Is 1-0 with a 0.46 ERA (19.2IP, 1ER) and 19K in three starts vs. the Blue Jays this year...as a Yankee, is 6-2 with a 2.79 ERA (80.2IP, 25ER) in 13 starts against Toronto.
- Yankees starters have posted a 3.00 ERA (162.0IP, 54ER) in their last 30 games (since 8/20)... have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 27 of those 30 starts and 2ER-or-fewer in 22 of those starts.
 - Yankees starters have recorded at least 9K with 0BB in back-to-back starts for just the second time in franchise history... Yankees starters also accomplished the feat from 9/7-8/98 at Boston when David Wells recorded 10K and 0BB on 9/7/98 and David Cone recorded 11K and 0BB on 9/8/98.

- **RF Jake Bauers** (1-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 3RBI) hit his 12th home run of the season with a three-run HR in the first inning...his 12HR this year have tied his career high (also 12HR in 2019 with Cleveland).
- DH Aaron Judge (2-for-4, 1 double, 1RBI) hit an RBI double in the seventh inning...has multiple hits in two of his last three games.
 - Has reached base in 31-of-71 plate appearances over his last 16 games (since 9/5), posting a .437 OBP in that span (13H, 18BB).
- Has reached base multiple times in 51 of his 99 games this year, including 39 of his last 70 games (since 5/12).
- CF Estevan Florial (1-for-3, 1 double, 1RBI, 1BB) hit an RBI double in the sixth inning...has hit safely in six of his last eight games (since 9/12-G2).
- 2B Gleyber Torres (1-for-4, 1R) has reached base in each of his last 10 games (since 9/12-G1), batting .324/.432/.432 (12-for-37) with 4R, 4 doubles, 4RBI and 7BB over that span.
 - Is batting .314/.405/.550 (53-for-169) with 28R, 13 doubles, 9HR, 22RBI, 24BB, 2HP and 5SB in 45 games since 8/1...has hit safely in 32 of those games and has reached base safely in 38 of those contests.
- LF Oswaldo Cabrera (1-for-4) is batting .306 (11-for-36) with 4R, 2 doubles, 1HR, 3RBI, 5BB and 1SB in his last 10 games (since 9/10).

TORONTO BLUE JAYS NOTES

- The Blue Jays fell to the Yankees in the final game of a three-game set...are 2-1 on their six-game road trip.
- Have still won five of their last six games (since 9/15), 13 of their last 20 games (since 8/30), 18 of their last 30 games (since 8/19) and 31 of their last 54 games (since 7/23).
- Fall to 5-5 vs. the Yankees this season.
- Are 24-12 over their last 36 road games (since 6/20).
- RHP José Berríos (5.2IP, 7H, 4ER, 0BB, 6K, 1HR) took his 11th loss of the season after allowing 4ER in 5.2IP...surrendered a three-run HR to Jake Bauers in the first inning.
 - Has allowed 4ER-or-more in four of his last eight starts (since 8/11) after recording just five such starts in his first 23 outings this season (4/3-8/5).
 - Has allowed 7HR over his last six starts (since 8/24) after allowing just 4HR over his previous eight starts (7/6-8/18).
 - In two starts vs. the Yankees this season, is 0-2 with a 5.11 ERA (12.1IP, 7ER) and 14K.
 - In 11 career starts vs. the Yankees, is 3-6 with a 5.14 ERA (61.1IP, 35ER) and 70K...in seven career starts at Yankee Stadium, is 2-4 with a 5.65 ERA (36.2IP, 23ER) and 43K.
- CAlejandro Kirk (1-for-3, 1 double) recorded Toronto's first hit of the game with a double in the sixth inning.
- **3B Matt Chapman** (1-for-4, 1R, 1 double) hit a double and later scored a run in the eighth inning...marked his team-leading 39th double of the season.
 - Entered tonight's game tied for third in the AL and tied for fourth in the Majors in doubles.
 - **CF Kevin Kiermaier** (1-for-3, 1R) singled and later scored a run in the ninth inning.
 - Has recorded a hit in each of his last three games (since 9/19) after going hitless in his five previous games (9/12-17).
 - In seven games vs. the Yankees this season, is batting .375/.423/.625 (9-for-24) with 5R, 3 doubles, 1HR, 1RBI and 2BB...has hit safely in six of those seven games.
- **RF George Springer** (1-for-4) singled in the ninth inning.
 - Is hitting .294/.368/.475 (47-for-160) with 26R, 8 doubles, 7HR, 23RBI, 20BB, 2SF and 6SB over his last 41 games (since 8/4).
 - Since 2022, is batting .362/.406/.586 (21-for-58) with 10R, 4 doubles, 3HR, 8RBI, 4BB, 1HP, 1SF and 1SB in 14 games at Yankee Stadium.
- **2B Cavan Biggio** (0-for-3, 1BB) drew Toronto's only walk of the game in the ninth inning.
- PH Vladimir Guerrero Jr. (0-for-1, 1RBI) entered the game as a PH in the ninth inning (Davis Schneider) and drove in a run on a fielder's choice.
- LHP Tim Mayza (0.2IP, 1H, 1ER, 1BB, 1K) allowed 1ER in 0.2IP of relief.
- RHP Nate Pearson (1.2IP, 2H, 0R, 2BB, 1K, 2WP) tossed 1.2 scoreless innings of relief.
