LAST GAME: The D-backs lost, 4-3, yesterday @ Nationals.
• **Eduardo Rodriguez** recorded 12 strikeouts over 5.0 innings and came 1 strikeout shy of matching his career high (Sept. 25, 2016 @ Rays).
• **Tim Tawa** (1-for-3, RBI, R, BB) recorded a hit in his first at-bat in the Majors after being recalled from Triple-A Reno prior to the game.
• **Alek Thomas** (2-for-4, RBI) pulled the D-backs within a run in the ninth with a RBI-single.
• **Bryce Jarvis** and **Joe Mantipty** combined to toss 3.0 scoreless innings with 2 strikeouts apiece.

TAWA TACKS ON HISTORY: **Tim Tawa** became the first D-back in franchise history to record a hit, RBI, run and walk in his first Major League game...is the first to do so in the Majors since Nick Sogard/BOS (1-for-4, 2 RBI, R, BB) on Aug. 2, 2024.

TEAM OFFENSE: Among all teams, the D-backs rank third with 54 runs (72 Yankees, 70 Cubs), fourth with a .798 OPS (1.011 Yankees, .879 Cardinals, .823 Tigers), .353 OBP (.382 Yankees, .377 Cardinals, .357 Phillies), 33 extra-base hits (43 Yankees, 39 Cubs, 34 Dodgers) and fifth with a .445 SLG (.630 Yankees, .502 Cardinals, .470 Tigers, .467 Dodgers).

LATE-INNING PRODUCTION: The D-backs’ 27 runs in the seventh-ninth innings lead the Majors, ahead of the Phillies (21), Cardinals (17), Royals (17) and Yankees (17).
• In addition, Arizona leads the Majors in hits (36) and walks (17).

VS. PENS: The D-backs, among all teams against opposing bullpens, rank first with a .309 AVG (.309 Phillies), second with a .409 OBP (.454 Phillies), third with an .889 OPS (1.113 Phillies, .896 Yankees) 31 runs (37 Cubs, 35 Yankees) and 38 hits (50 Cubs, 39 Yankees).

THE PEN IS PICKING UP: In the last 3 games, the D-backs' bullpen has combined to toss 10.1 scoreless innings (39 BF) and owns a 0.87 WHIP and opponent .167 AVG., with 3 walks and 11 strikeouts.

PERDOMO PERFORMING: **Geraldo Perdomo** ranks among top qualified shortstops in AVG (2nd, .344), RBI (2nd, 11), hits (3rd, 11), OPS (5th, .861), OBP (5th, .361) and SLG (6th, .500).

- Among NL leaders, is tied for second in RBI, tied for sixth in hits and ninth in AVG.

GENO TIME: **Eugenio Suárez** ranks among MLB leaders in homers (T-2nd, 5), RBI (T-4th, 11), extra-base hits (T-5th, 6), total bases (T-9th, 22) and SLG (8th, .733).

TRENDING BATS:

- **Alek Thomas**, in 5 games, is hitting .412 (7-for-17)/.950 OPS with 2 doubles and 6 RBI, including 3 multi-hit efforts.
- **Randal Grichuk**, in 7 games, is hitting .313 (5-for-16)/.951 OPS with 4 doubles, 3 RBI and 2 walks.
- **Geraldo Perdomo**, in 9 games, is hitting .344 (11-for-32)/.861 OPS with 2 doubles, 1 homer and 11 RBI... has hit in 7 of his 9 games.

VS. THE NATS: Since 2022, the D-backs have gone 15-6 vs. Nationals (8-4 on the road), including 9-2 in their last 11 meetings.

- The D-backs have won 8 of their last 10 games @ Nationals Park since April 20, 2022...as a team, Arizona is hitting .291 (101-for-347)/.357 OBP and owns a 5.60 run/game AVG in that span.
- **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** has hit in 11 of his last 12 games vs. Nationals dating back to August 18, 2021... is batting .435 (20-for-46)/1.154 OPS with 2 doubles, 3 homers, 6 RBI and 3 walks in that span.
- **Corbin Carroll**, in 14 career games, is hitting .386 (17-for-44)/1.318 OPS with 2 doubles, 1 triple, 5 homers, 11 RBI and 9 walks.
- **Alek Thomas**, in 10 career games, is hitting .367 (11-for-30)/.973 OPS with 2 doubles, 2 triples, 6 RBI and 1 walk.

ON DECK - BALTIMORE ORIOLES: Following today's game, the D-backs return home to face the Orioles for 3 games to kick off a 6-game homestand.

- The D-backs are 16-11 all-time against the Orioles (10-5 at home).
- Arizona took 1-of-3 in its last series on May 10-12, 2024 @ Baltimore.
- The D-backs took 1-of-3 in their last series @ Chase on Sept. 1-3, 2023.

NEXT STARTER: RHP ZAC GALLEN (1-1, 3.38)

- Tied his career high with 13 strikeouts while tossing 6.2 scoreless innings to earn the win in his last start @ Yankees on April 2 (W; 0 ER in 6.2 IP, 3 H, 0 BB, 13 K).
- Will make his third career start vs. Orioles...won his last start on May 12, 2024 @ Orioles (2 ER in 6.0 IP, 4 K).
