METSCOLLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Marlins 6-0 yesterday...The Mets have won six of their last eight games...The Mets earned their third straight series victory and their 16th of the season...New York is 16-3-2 in 21 series this year...The Mets are coming off a seven-game homestand (5-2) against the Brewers (2-1) and Marlins (3-1)...Tonight, team begins a six-day, five-game road trip to Houston (two games) and Miami (three games)...The team then has an off day on Monday, June 27 before its next homestand.

NO MINOR THING!: Congrats to Daniel Palka who was named the International League Player of the Week for June 13-19...In six games last week, all against the Norfolk Tides, Palka hit .440 (11-25) with nine runs, four doubles, two home runs, five RBI, three walks with a .500 OBP, an .840 SLG and a 1.340 OPS...Overall in 58 games this season, Palka is batting .265/.354/.531 with 11 doubles, 15 home runs, 47 RBI with an .885 OPS...He was signed as a minor league free agent with an invitation to major league spring training this offseason...Palka has appeared in 154 major league games with the Chicago White Sox in 2018-19 and hit 29 home runs with 71 RBI.

BLANK STREET COFFEE: The Mets tossed their 11th shutout of the season yesterday...That places them tied with the Yankees for the most in the major leagues...Their 11 shutouts through their first 69 games of the year are tied for the second-most in team history with the 1968 squad...The 1988 Mets had 13 shutouts through their first 69 games...The 2021 Mets recorded eight shutouts all season.

40 OZ. TO FREEDOM: Brandon Nimmo (39 runs), Starling Marte (44 runs), Francisco Lindor (43 runs), Pete Alonso (42 runs) have combined to score 168 of the team's 348 runs this season...That accounts for 48.2% of all the team's runs this year...The Mets are one of two teams in the majors to have three players with 40 or more runs this year, joining the San Diego Padres.

FIFTY FIFTY: Pete Alonso leads the majors with 64 RBI, while Francisco Lindor is tied for fourth with 52 RBI this year...The Mets are the only team in the majors with two players who have recorded 50 or more RBI this year...Francisco Lindor set a franchise record with the most RBI by a shortstop before the All-Star break...José Reyes was the previous record holder, collecting 43 RBI before the 2008 Midsummer Classic.

1010 WINS: The Mets struck out 10 in yesterday's win...It was the 36th time this year that the Mets have recorded 10 or more strikeouts in a game, the most in the majors...Mets pitchers lead the majors with 648 strikeouts this season...The Mets have posted a 9.52 strikeout per 9 IP ratio, the second-best in the majors...Only the Braves (9.56) have a better ratio...New York owns a 3.19 strikeout per walk ratio this year...That is fifth in the majors and second in the Senior Circuit...Only the Dodgers (3.47) have a better ratio in the NL.

AVENGERS, ASSEMBLE: The Mets are 20-4 following a loss this season...New York has not lost more than two games in a row this season.

THEY'RE OUT OF OUR LEAGUE: The Mets continue Interleague play against the Astros tonight...The Mets are 3-3 this year against the American League...The Mets went 9-11 in Interleague play in 2021...The team's .511 winning percentage (229-219) is the second-best mark in the Senior Circuit vs. AL clubs since Interleague play began in 1997.

HOUSTON, WE HAVE A PROBLEM: The Mets head to the Houston for the first time since September 2-3, 2017...The Mets were swept in the three game series...The Mets have lost six straight in Houston...The last time the Mets earned a win at Minute Maid Park was on May 15, 2011...Chris Capuano earned the victory as the Mets defeated the Astros, 7-4.

ROAD TRIPPIN': New York is 21-14 on the road this year...Their .600 road winning percentage is the fifth-best in the majors and is the third-best in the NL...The Mets finished the first-half of the 2021 season going 19-26 on the road...They did not record their 20th road win until July 18 in 2021 (20-28)...New York is batting .260/.329/.402 away from Citi Field...Their .260 road average ranks third in the majors as does their .329 OBP.

ON THE RECORD: New York has won 45 games this season, the most in the National League...Their .652 winning percentage is second in the majors and is the best in the NL...The team has posted a 45-24 record through the team's first 69 games...Only the 1986 (48-21) team posted a better record through the first 69 games of the season...The 1988 team also went 45-24.

LEGAL WINNING AGE: The Mets are once again a season-high 21 games over .500...Prior to Saturday (44-23), the last time the team was 21 games above .500 was on September 29, 2015 when they were 89-68...The last time the Mets were 22 games over .500 was on September 27, 2015, when team was 89-67, their highwater mark for the year.

THE GAME OF RISP: The Mets lead the majors with a .286 average with runners in scoring position...They rank second in MLB with a .356 OBP and seventh with a .445 SLG in those situations...Jeff McNeil - .404 (23-57), Tomás Nido - .353 (12-34), Pete Alonso - .349 (22-63), Mark Canha - .333 (17-51), J.D. Davis - .321 (9-28) and Dominic Smith .308 (8-26) are all hitting .300 or better with RISP...Alonso leads the major leagues with 49 RBI in RISP situations...He has 10 home runs with runner(s) in scoring position this year, three more than any other hitter in the majors...Jeff McNeil's .404 average with RISP is eighth in the majors and fourth in the NL.

ASTROS-METS NOTES: The Mets have only played the Astros twice since Houston switched to the American League in 2013...New York is 2-4 against Houston since 2013...Went 2-1 from September 26-28, 2014 in New York and were swept in their last appearance in Texas from September 2-3, 2017.

MARTE PARTAY: Starling Marte has reached base safely in 10 of his last 11 starts, posting a .383 OBP in that span...In 38 games since May 1, Marte is batting .314 (48-153) with 32 runs, 10 doubles, three triples, five home runs, 20 RBI, eight walks, four steals with a .352 OBP, a .516 SLG and an .868 OPS.

DOMINATING DÍAZ: Edwin Díaz has recorded 14 saves this season, tied for the seventh-most in the majors...He leads the major leagues among relievers with 53 strikeouts...His 17.45 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...He has struck out 53 of the 109 batters he faced, good for 48.6%...He is 2-1 with 14 saves, a 2.30 ERA (seven earned runs/27.1 innings), allowing 20 hits and 11 walks...The Mets are 26-1 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

THE HATEFUL EIGHT: Jeff McNeil is on an eight-game hitting streak, batting .458 (11-24) with five runs, three doubles, a home run, five RBI, four walks with a .552 OBP and a .708 SLG in that span...He ranks eighth in the majors and third in the National League with a .327 batting average...His batting average has not dropped below .300 since it was .280 on April 22.

MULTIPLICITY: Mets batters have recorded a total of 160 multi-hit games in 2022, just one behind Washington (161) for most in the majors...Jeff McNeil has 23 multi-hit games this year, tied for the fifth-most in the majors...He has collected 133 multi-hit games in his career...That places him 34th in franchise history...Jeff Kent is next with 136 multi-hit games...McNeil has collected 32 games with three or more hits...That is tied for 28th in team history...Pete Alonso and Starling Marte are tied for 18th in the majors with 20 multi-hit games...Alonso has recorded 109 career multi-hit games, placing him 51st in team history...Cliff Floyd is 50th with 114 multi-hit games.

CANHA GET AN AMEN?: Mark Canha has safely reached base in 11 of his last 13 games...He is batting .293 (12-41) in that span with eight runs, three doubles, a home run, seven RBI, 10 walks, a steal with a .463 OBP and a .439 SLG in that span...He is batting .292/.383/.396 with 32 runs, five doubles, five home runs, 27 RBI and 22 walks this year...He ranks seventh in the National League in OBP and 11th in average.

MV-PETE: Pete Alonso leads the majors with 64 RBI...He is tied for third in the majors and leads the National League with 19 home runs...He became the third Mets player in team history to record 60 or more RBI before the All-Star break in multiple seasons...He joins Carlos Beltran (2006 and 2008) and David Wright (2006, 2008 and 2010)...The Mets record for most RBI in the first half is 74, accomplished by David Wright in 2006.

HURTS DONUT: The Mets have been plunked a major league leading 50 times this year...The Mets have been hit 284 times since the start of the 2019 season...That is first in the majors in that span...Since 2019, Mark Canha has been plunked 62 times, which is the second-most in the majors...Pete Alonso ranks sixth with 46 HBP, while Starling Marte is seventh with 43 HBP and Jeff McNeil is ninth at 37 HBP.

OUCH: Brandon Nimmo has been hit by 49 pitches in his career...That is the second-most HBP in team history...Pete Alonso is fourth with 46 HBP...Michael Conforto is the franchise leader having been hit by 50 pitches in his career.

WILLIAMS NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Allowed one earned run in 2.1 innings out of the bullpen in the Mets 10-2 loss on June 15 against the Brewers...Struck out four batters and issued two walks.

VS. HOUSTON: Has faced the Astros one time in his career...Suffered the loss at Minute Maid Park on June 25, 2019 as a member of the Pirates...Allowed four earned runs on eight hits in 6.2 innings and struck out four batters without issuing a walk.

INTER-LEAGUE PLAY: Williams has made 20 career outings (18 starts) in inter-league play and is 6-6 with a 4.61 ERA (55 earned runs/107.1 innings)...As a Met, Williams has made two relief appearances in inter-league play and has allowed six runs (four earned) over 4.2 innings...Williams has lost his last four decisions in inter-league games and has not earned a victory against an inter-league opponent since August 13, 2019 against the Angels as a member of the Pirates... His teams have lost the last seven Interleague games in which he's appeared after winning 10 of his first 13 Interleague appearances.

LAST EIGHT: Williams' last eight appearances have included four starts and four relief outings...He has thrown 28.1 total innings in that span and has allowed seven runs on 23 hits with seven walks and 26 strikeouts...Five of those eight outings have been scoreless.

HOME/ROAD: This season, Williams has made five appearances (two starts) at Citi Field and is 1-0 with a 2.30 ERA (four earned runs/15.2 innings)...By contrast, Williams is 0-3 with a 4.50 ERA (10 earned runs/20.0 innings) in seven appearances (three starts) on the road.

WITH THE METS: Since being acquired from the Mets on July 30, 2021, Williams has made 22 appearances (eight starts) with the Amazin's...Williams has a 3.31 ERA (25 earned runs/68.0 innings) with 17 walks and 62 strikeouts.

STARTS/RELIEF: With New York, Williams is 1-2 and has a 3.48 ERA (13 earned runs/33.2 innings) with six walks and 23 strikeouts in eight starts...In 14 relief outings, he is 0-1 with a 3.15 ERA (12 earned runs/34.1 innings).

MEET THE MET: Was acquired from Chicago-NL on July 30, 2021 with INF Javier Báez for minor league OF Pete Crow-Armstrong...Aside from baseball, Williams co-hosts a podcast with former teammate Steven Brault (@podcastIMHO)...He is the co-founder of Project 34; a non-profit that assists with the purchasing of medical equipment and assisting devices that may not be otherwise accessible to a patient, as well as providing grants to individuals to afford physical therapy for optimal function (projectthirtyfour.com)...Wore #34 in Pittsburgh to honor former ASU teammate Cory Hahn, who suffered a career-ending injury in 2011... He has four kids, including the newest addition to the family, a girl in the 2021-22 offseason...Is an avid reader, especially science fiction...Is a big Star Wars fan.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP CARLOS CARRASCO [8-2, 3.96]

LAST OUTING: Picked up his league-leading eighth win of the season on June 17 against the Marlins at Citi Field...Allowed three earned runs in 6.1 innings and struck out seven batters while issuing two walks.

VENEZUELAN BORN: Carrasco needs three wins to become the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach the 100-win milestone, while he ranks sixth all-time in strikeouts by a Venezuelan-born pitcher...Struck out the 1,400th batter of his career on May 27 vs. Philadelphia, the fourth-highest strikeout total among active pitchers who have not been selected to an All-Star roster...Became one of nine Venezuelan-born pitchers to eclipse 1,300 career innings pitched on April 10 at Washington.
