# LOS ANGELES ANGELS (12-22) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (16-19) <br> May 6, 2024 at PNC Park, Pittsburgh, PA - 6:40 EDT - GAME \#36/HOME \#16 LHP TYLER ANDERSON ( $2-3,2.23$ ERA) vs. RHP MITCH KELIER ( $2-3,5.18$ ERA) 

THE PIRATES:...came back to beat the Rockies 5-3 yesterday to win their three-game series...Have won back-to-back games for the first time since 4/22-23 (will look to win three straight games tonight for the first time since 4/6-8)...Began the year $9-2$ before losing 17 of 22 games between 4/9 and $5 / 3$... Have gone 13-1 when scoring at least four runs in a game this season (their only loss came on April 25 against Milwaukee)...Have gone $4-0$ in extra innings this season, which is tied for the second-wins in extra frames in MLB (Cleveland leads with five)...It is Pittsburgh's longest win streak in extra-innings games to begin a season since 2012 (also 4-0)...The last start to a season with a longer streak was 1960 (7-0).

ABOUT TONIGHT'S STARTER: Mitch Keller gets the start in the opener of this three-game series against the Angels...This is Keller's third career start against Los Angeles...He earned the first win of his big league career in Anaheim after allowing two runs (1er) in 5.0 innings as the Pirates beat the Angels 10-2 on August 12, 2019...Since the start of 2023, Keller also has a 5.30 ERA on the road and a 3.28 ERA at home...According to StatsPerform, he is one of five pitchers in that span to have an ERA at least 2.00 lower at home than on the road (minimum 75.0 innings each split).

GIMME FIVE: Mitch Keller tossed 5.0 innings on Tuesday at Oakland, giving him 38 straight starts of working at least 5.0 innings in a game...It's the longest active streak in all of MLB coming into today...It's also the longest streak by a Pirate since A.J. Burnett made 49 straight starts of at least 5.0 innings from May 8, 2012, to August 10, 2013.
L.A. TIMES: Pittsburgh's nine-game homestand continues tonight with the beginning of a three-game series against the Angels... It's just the third time the Pirates will host the Angels at PNC Park along with 2004 and 2016...The Pirates dropped two of three games last year in Anaheim from July 21-23 and are 10-11 all-time against the Angels since the teams first met in 2002..It's the Pirates' fewest home series against any American League opponent and the Angels' fewest road series against any National League team according to StatsPerform.

FOUR YOUR INFORMATION: The Pirates took two of three from the Rockies this past weekend for their first series win since April 5-7 against the Orioles...Pittsburgh's 5-3 win on Sunday improved their 2024 record to 13-1 (.929) when scoring four or more runs, which is the best such record in MLB according to StatsPerform.
PLAYING THE FIELD: The Pirates have been charged with two errors in their last 10 games ( 327 total chances) dating back to April 25...Pittsburgh's .994 fielding percentage in that time ranks sixth in all of MLB behind the Orioles (.997), Rockies (.997), Padres (.994), Braves (.994) and Cardinals (.994).

HISTORICALLY SPEAKING: Yasmani Grandal caught Aroldis Chapman in the eighth inning of Pittsburgh's win on

Sunday...It was the first time the Pirates have ever played a battery combo of Cuban-born players...Special thanks to StatsPerform.

Pittsburgh's bullpen has recorded a 1.98 ERA (50.0ip/11er), 56 nd . 190 batting average against dating back to April 20...The bullpen's 1.98 ERA in that time is the third-lowest in all of MLB behind the Dodgers (1.49) and Yankees (1.58)...Pittsburgh's . 192 batting average against in that time is also the fifth-lowest in MLB among all bullpens.

LIKING LUIS OF LATE: Luis Ortiz earned his second win of the season on Sunday after tossing 1.2 scoreless innings while also stranding each of his two inherited runners...Ortiz has allowed one run in 9.1 innings in his last five appearances while recording a .143 batting average against ( 5 -for-35) in that time...Ortiz comes into today tied for the ninth-best batting average against (.154) among all National League relievers.

MOSt CAREER SAVES IN PIRATES HISTORY

KNOW WHEN TO HOLDERMAN: Colin Holderman threw a total of nine pitches (six strikes) on
Saturday while extending his scoreless streak to 8.0 innings...Since allowing two runs in his season debut on April 11, Holderman has allowed just four hits in 28 at-bats (. 143 average)...Holderman's .156 batting average against this season is tied for the 11th-lowest among all National League relievers.

CLOSING IN ON OROSCO: Aroldis Chapman comes into today with 1168 career strikeouts, which is just one shy of tying Jesse Orosco for the second-most alltime among left-handed relievers (Billy Wagner leads with 1196)...Chapman's 1168 career punchouts are also the 10th-most overall among relief pitchers (Hoyt Wilhelm has the most with 1363).
ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY
May 6, 2001: Aramis Ramirez hit the second walkoff in PNC Park history with a single in the 11th, as the Pirates defeated the Rockies by
a score of 4-3. Ramirez, Jason Kendall, Brian Giles and Pat Meares each had two hits. Kendall also had three RBI and scored two runs,
