RECENT REDBIRDS: The St. Louis Cardinals are coming to the end of a now eight-game homestand over 10 days with the third opponent of three, their National League Central Division rivals, the Chicago Cubs. The Cardinals are 5-1 on the current homestand after taking 2-of-3 from the Boston Red Sox (May 17-19) and sweeping the Baltimore Orioles in three games (May 20-22). The Cardinals have not played since Wednesday afternoon with an open date on Thursday and a rain out last night.

FLIGHT PATTERN: The Cardinals enter today in 3rd place in the National League Central, 3.0 games behind Chicago and 5.5 games behind first place Milwaukee. The 3rd place mark is the highest the Cardinals have started any day this season after Opening Day and the 5.5 games out of first place is their closest to the division lead since May 6 (5.5 GB). St. Louis is 8-2 since Mother's Day, the best record in the National League since May 12.

LET'S PLAY TWO!: Last night's game against the Chicago Cubs was postponed due to inclement weather. The game has been rescheduled as part of a split doubleheader on Saturday, July 13, at Busch Stadium with the originally scheduled game at 1:15 p.m., and the makeup game to be played at 7:15 p.m.

A WEEKEND TO REMEMBER: Tonight's Cardinals-Cubs game will be televised nationally on FOX with former pitcher **Adam Wainwright** on the call with **Adam Amin**. This will mark Wainwright's first return to Busch Stadium since his final day with the Cardinals on October 1, 2023. The Cardinals will also debut their City Connect jerseys for the first of 12 appearances during the 2024 season.

MIDDLETON ON THE MEND: Cardinals RHP **Keynan Middleton** (right forearm flexor strain) made two more relief appearances for his injury rehabilitation assignment to Springfield (AA), throwing back-to-back on Wednesday and Thursday versus Tulsa. Middleton has appeared in five minor league games with four scoreless outings (0-0, 2.25 ERA, 1.75 WHIP, 4.0 IP, 1 H, 1 R, 1 HR, 6 BB, 2 SO).

BIRDIE BOMBING ZONE: With a solo home run from rookie **Masyn Winn** on Wednesday afternoon, the Cardinals extended their season-best home run streak to 10 games, trailing only the Boston Red Sox for the longest active streak in MLB. The longest home run streak this season is held by the aforementioned Red Sox and Athletics, both ran off 11 games. This streak is the Cardinals longest since homering in 12 straight games from Aug. 23-Sept. 4, 2022.

THE ERROR OF OUR WAYS: During the Cardinals 8-2 run, they have committed an error in each of their last nine games, the longest streak with an error since 10 straight games with a miscue back in July 2002. The Cardinals are 14-16 in errorless games this season and 9-10 when committing an error, including 7-2 over their current error streak.

WINN...WINN, WINN, WINN: Cardinals rookie shortstop **Masyn Winn** extended his career-best hitting streak to 13 games (17-48, .354, 2 HR) on Wednesday. Winn leads all Cardinals qualifying batters with a .295 average (12th in the N.L.), has the 3rd-longest active hit streak in Major League Baseball and the 2nd-longest by a Cardinal behind **Willson Contreras** (14) this season. Cardinals rookies have posted four 10-game hitting streaks over the past two seasons with **Jordan Walker** running off streaks of 17, 12 & 12 in 2023. Winn has also doubled in three straight games

MY BISCUITS ARE BURNIN': Cardinals OF/1B **Alec Burleson** extended his hitting streak to eight games (14-33, .424, 2 HR) on Wednesday. Since May 14, Burleson ranks 2nd in the National League with a .424 batting average behind only **Luis Arraez** (SD, .476). Burleson's longest hitting streak is 10 from the start of last season (4/2-15/23).

THIS DATE IN CARDINALS HISTORY (MAY 25, 2014): Cardinals pitcher **Adam Wainwright** ties his career-high with 12 strikeouts over 8.0 scoreless innings of five-hit ball at Great American Ballpark in a 4-0 win over the Cincinnati Reds. It was the fifth game in Wainwright's career he matched his career-high with 12 strikeouts. The veteran right-hander would go five years until his next double-digit strikeout game (10) at Philadelphia almost five years later on May 28, 2019. He finished his career with 2,202 strikeouts over 18 playing seasons, 2nd only to **Bob Gibson** (3,117) in Cardinals history.

CHICAGO CUBS CONNECTIONS

Willson Contreras played parts of seven seasons with the Cubs (2016-22)...was a three-time All-Star and member of the 2016 World Series Champions...originally signed as an international free agent with Chicago (July 2, 2009).

Sonny Gray was originally selected by the Cubs in the 27th round of the 2008 MLB Draft, but did not sign to attend Vanderbilt University.

Matt Carpenter (June 4, 2011 at Busch III), **Tommy Edman** (June 8, 2019 at Wrigley), and **Stubby Clapp** (June 18, 2001 at Busch II) made MLB debuts vs. the Cubs.

Ryan Loutos was born in Elk Grove Village, Ill... graduated from Barrington (Ill.) High School... resides in Barrington.

Daniel Descalso played his final MLB season with the Cubs in 2019.

Cardinals VP/General Manager **Michael Girsch** is a Chicago native...graduated from the University of Notre Dame and the University of Chicago.

Nolan Gorman won the 2017 Under Armour High School All-America Game HR Derby at Wrigley Field.

As back-to-back compensation picks for the departures of **John Lackey** and **Jason Heyward** signing with Chicago in 2016, **Dylan Carlson** (No. 33) and **Dakota Hudson** (No. 34) were selected by St. Louis in Compensation Round A of the first round of the 2016 MLB draft.

Dylan Carlson and **Nick Madrigal** were teammates at Elk Grove (Calif.) High School, coached by Dylan's father, Jeff.

Tommy Edman and **Nico Hoerner** were college teammates at Stanford University in 2016.

Cardinals broadcaster and Hall of Fame outfielder **Jim Edmonds** played part of 2008 with the Cubs.

Lars Nootbaar and **Shota Imanaga** were teammates on Gold Medal winning Team Japan in the 2023 World Baseball Classic.

Cubs Bullpen Coach **Darren Holmes** pitched in five games for the Cardinals in 2000.

Patrick Wisdom played in 32 games for St. Louis during 2018 debut season...originally selected by the Cardinals in the Supp. 1st round (No. 52) of the 2012 MLB Draft, as compensation for **Octavio Dotel** signing with Detroit...traded by St. Louis to Texas for **Drew Robinson** (Dec. 11, 2018).

Marquee Sports Network Analyst **Dexter Fowler** played four seasons in St. Louis (2017-20).

Chip Caray served as the Cubs play-by-play announcer for seven seasons (1998-2004) on WGN...his grandfather, **Harry Caray**, spent the final 16 years of his career broadcasting Cubs games (1982-97).

Cubs Scouting VP **Dan Kantrovitz** previously was Cardinals Scouting Director (2012-14)...2001 Cardinals 25th round draft pick from Brown Univ...took first job in MLB as the Cardinals Scouting Coord.

Cubs Special Assistant to the GM **Jaron Madison** previously served as the Cardinals Assistant Director of Scouting (2008-09).

- The Cardinals' Opening Day starter for 2024 makes his team-leading 11th start of the season and his 161st career (189th appearance).
- Sports the 2nd-lowest career ERA (2.58 ERA in 97.2 IP) vs. the Cubs among active Major League pitchers behind **Clayton Kershaw** at 2.55 (*min. 15 starts*).
- His 2.62 ERA (91.1 IP) vs. the Chicago Cubs as a Cardinal (2018-present) is the 5th-lowest in franchise history (*min. 15 starts*). **Slim Sallee** (1.48) leads.
- This season, has the 2nd-highest qualifying ERA (5.77) in the National League and 3rd-highest opponent BA (.294). **Patrick Corbin** (6.29 and .336) leads both categories.
- Shares the team with eight decisions (3-5) with Sonny Gray, but is still seeking his first home win of 2024.
- Has enjoyed career success in the month of May, posting an 12-8 mark with a 3.14 ERA (174.2 IP), his lowest monthly ERA. Went 3-0 with a 1.89 ERA in six starts last May.
- In his 150 starts as a member of the Cardinals, St. Louis is 60-30 when Miles throws 6.0 or more innings, while the Cardinals are 23-37 when he works 5.2 innings or fewer.
- Is 23-25 in his 73 starts at Busch Stadium as a Cardinal, with 41 Quality Starts. The Cardinals are 41-32 in those games.
- Mikolas is an amazing 45-5 (.900 win pct) as a Cardinal when receiving 3 or more runs in support (Cardinals 59-14 in those 73 games). He's just 8-47 (.145) when receiving 2 runs or fewer (Cardinals 24-54).
- His loss vs. MIL (4/20/24) was his 1st ever as a Cardinal when receiving 4+ runs of support in 70 such starts dating to 2018.
- Hasn't committed an error since August 2, 2018 vs. COL. Is the only MLB pitcher with 100+ total chances and zero errors since Aug 3, 2018. Ranks 5th among MLB pitchers in fielding pct. (.989) since 2018 (*min. 100 TC*).

LAST TIME OUT

- Allowed a pair of hits for one run over 5.0 innings in last Saturday's 7-2 win over the Red Sox at Busch Stadium. Allowed a game-tying Rafael Devers solo HR in the 4th inning.
- Marked his 150th career start with the Cardinals, becoming only the 32nd pitcher in Cardinals history (since 1892) and one of six Cardinals since 2000 to make 150+ starts with **Adam Wainwright** (411), **Chris Carpenter** (197), **Lance Lynn** (171), **Matt Morris** (156) and **Michael Wacha** (151).

CAREER

- St. Louis is 83-68 (.553) in his 148 career outings (147 starts) since joining the organization (2018-present).
- Has entered his 7th season (was injured in 2020) with the Cardinals in 2024. Is currently ranked 2nd among active Cardinals pitchers in career innings pitched (886.0), wins (53), strikeouts (650) and games started (150) for St. Louis; trailing only **Lance Lynn** in all categories.
- Two-time NL All-Star (2018 & 2022). Did not appear in 2022 at Dodger Stadium and chose to miss the 2018 game in Washington D.C. to be with his wife as they welcomed twins.
- Led Major League Baseball with 35 starts in 2023, becoming the first pitcher to record 35 starts in a season since **Jhoulys Chacin** (35) in 2018 with Milwaukee. Was the first Cardinals pitcher since **Chris Carpenter** (35 in 2009) to do so.
- Has registered 32 or more starts in every season in which he was not injured or sidelined by COVID-19 protocols.
- Since joining St. Louis in 2018, Mikolas trails only **Clayton Kershaw** (67.6%) with the 2nd-highest percentage of first pitch strikes in MLB with 67.3%.

2024

- Did not walk a batter for four consecutive starts 4/20-5/7, a new career-high. Tied with **Zack Littell** for most consecutive starts without a walk in the 2024 season. The previous Cardinals pitcher to pitch five starts without a walk was **Mike Leake** in 2016.
