AT A GLANCE: The Yankees begin a seven-game homestand tonight with the first game of a four-game wrap-around series vs. Baltimore (through Mon.)...will also face Texas in a three-game set from Tues.-Thurs....went 7-2 on their recent road trip after sweeping the Red Sox in a three-game set and winning two-of-three games against both the Astros and Rangers.

- ▶ **Their 20-11 (.645) record is the best in the American League and tied for the second-best in the Majors.**
- ▶ **Have won 10 of their last 12 games (since 4/17), 11 of their last 14 games (since 4/15) and 12 of their last 16 games (since 4/13).**
- ▶ Have won or split eight of their 10 series this season (7-2-1), including each of their last five (4-0-1).
- ▶ The Yankees' +47 run differential this season is the best in the AL and the third-best in the Majors.

WHERE WE LEFT OFF: The Yankees fell to the Rangers, 3-0, on Wednesday at Globe Life Field...**RHP Elmer Rodríguez** (4.0IP, 4H, 2R/ER, 4BB, 3K, 0HR, 1HP) made his Major League debut and took the loss...**Yankees batters** were shut out for the second time this season...**1B Ben Rice** (3-for-4) recorded three of the Yankees' 5H, tying his season high...**RF Cody Bellinger** (1-for-4) and **SS José Caballero** (1-for-3) were the only other Yankees to record a hit...**LF Jasson Dominguez** (0-for-1, 1HP) exited the game in the fourth inning with a left elbow contusion after being hit by a pitch...**LF Max Schuemann** (0-for-1, 1BB) made his Yankees debut...**LHP Brent Headrick** (1.1IP, 1K) tossed 1.1 scoreless innings of relief and stranded two inherited runners...**RHP Jake Bird** (1.0IP, 2H, 1R/ER) allowed a run in the seventh inning...**LHP Tim Hill** (0.2IP) retired his only batter faced and stranded a runner...**RHP Fernando Cruz** (1.0IP, 1H, 2K) tossed a scoreless eighth inning.

BLANK SPACE: Yankees batters were shut out for only the second time this season on Wednesday at Texas (also 4/9 vs. the Athletics)...have scored at least 4R in 12 of their last 14 games (since 4/15) and 15 of their last 18 games (since 4/11)...the Yankees are 17-5 this season when scoring at least 4R.

- ▶ Had their 13-game home run streak snapped on Wednesday (4/15-28)...had hit 29HR over that span...their 48HR this season lead the Majors.

PITCH PERFECT: Yankees pitchers have posted a Major League-best 3.11 ERA this season (see full rankings on left)...have allowed only 3R-or-fewer in eight of their last 10 games (since 4/19) and nine of their last 12 games (since 4/17)...have allowed only 1ER-or-fewer in seven of their last 12 games, posting a 2.21 ERA (106.0IP, 26ER) over that span.

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge's 12HR this season are tied with Houston's Jordan Alvarez and Chicago-AL's Munetaka Murakami for the most in the Majors...also ranks third in the Majors in pitches per PA (4.47, second in AL), fourth in SLG (.622, third in AL) and OPS (1.002, third in AL), tied for fifth in XBH (17, tied for third in AL) and WAR among position players (1.6, tied for fourth in AL - FanGraphs), sixth in total bases (69, fourth in AL) and tied for ninth in runs scored (25, tied for third in AL).

- ▶ **Has hit 9HR in his last 17 games (since 4/12).**
- ▶ In 120 career games vs. Baltimore, has hit .321/.456/.733 (135-for-420) with 114R, 20 doubles, 51HR, 109RBI, 99BB/7IBB, 7HP, 25F and 5SB...his 51HR against Baltimore are his most vs. any opponent...marks the most by any Major League player vs. a single opponent since 2017...also marks the most home runs among active players vs. Baltimore.
- ▶ Has reached base safely in each of his last 22 games vs. Baltimore (since 5/2/24), hitting .412/.568/.956 (28-for-68) with 20R, 1 double, 12HR, 24RBI, 23BB/3IBB, 3HP and 1SF over that span.
- ▶ Has 2HR in his last three games vs. the Orioles (since 9/26/25), 3HR in his last five games (since 9/20/25), 6HR in his last 12 games (since 4/29/25) and 12HR in his last 20 games (since 6/20/24).
- ▶ Has gone 2-for-3 with 2HR and 5BB in his career vs. Baltimore's LHP Cade Povich.
- ▶ 17 of his 28H this season have been XBH (12HR, 5 doubles).
- ▶ Has reached base multiple times in seven of his last nine games (since 4/21) and nine of his last 12 games (since 4/17)...has reached base in 23 of his last 25 games (since 4/3).

KING OF THE HILL: LHP Tim Hill retired his only batter faced and stranded an inherited runner on Wednesday at Texas...**has stranded each of his nine inherited runners this season**...has not allowed a run in 11 of his 13 relief appearances this year, posting a 1.42 ERA (12.2IP, 2ER).

PEN PAL: LHP Brent Headrick tossed 1.1 scoreless innings of relief and stranded two inherited runners on Wednesday at Texas...has not allowed a run in 14 of his 17 relief appearances this season, going 1-0 with a 1.76 ERA (15.1IP, 3ER) and 16K.

RICE RICE BABY: C/INF Ben Rice recorded three of the Yankees' five hits on Wednesday at Texas, tying his season high (also 4/25 at Houston)...**has hit .327/.443/.714 (32-for-98) with 26R, 8 doubles, 10HR, 23RBI, 21BB/2IBB, 1HP, 2SF and 15B in 30 games this season...has reached base safely in 23-of-26 starts.**

- ▶ **Has hit 6HR in his last 13 games (since 4/16).**
- ▶ 18 of his 32H this season have gone for extra bases (8 doubles, 10HR).
- ▶ **Has hit 7HR in his last 10 games vs. Baltimore (since 7/14/24)**...has hit .375/.419/1.000 (15-for-40) with 11R, 2 doubles, 1 triple, 7HR, 14RBI, 2BB and 1HP during those games.
- ▶ **Ranks second in the Majors in OBP (.443, second in AL), SLG (.714, second in AL) and OPS (1.157, second in AL),** is tied for second in go-ahead RBI (seven, tied for second in AL) and WAR among position players (1.7, tied for second in AL - FanGraphs), tied for third in XBH (18, second in AL), tied for fourth in game-winning RBI (five, second in AL) and total bases (70, third in AL), tied for fifth in HR (10, tied for fourth in AL), tied for sixth in runs scored (26, second in AL) and eighth in BA (.327, sixth in AL)...is tied for fifth in the AL in RBI (23), tied for seventh in walks (21), ranks eighth in times on base (54) and ninth in PA/BB (5.81).

GOOD WILL WARREN: RHP Will Warren will make his seventh start of the season tonight vs. Baltimore...**has gone 3-0 with a 2.59 ERA (31.1IP, 9ER) and 37K in six starts this season**...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in each of those starts...the Yankees are 5-1 in his starts this year.

- ▶ Since 2025, has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 28 of his 39 starts, tied for the most in the AL and tied for the third-most in the Majors over that span.

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starters have posted a Major League-best 2.74 ERA (177.1IP, 54ER) and 175K in 31 starts this season...have allowed 2R-or-fewer in 11 of their last 12 starts (since 4/17), posting a 1.82 ERA (74.0IP, 15ER) over that span...have not allowed an ER in six of their last 12 starts.

- ▶ Have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 27 of their 31 starts this season.
- ▶ **Have allowed 2R-or-fewer in 20 of their 31 starts, their second-most through their first 31 games of a season in franchise history,** trailing only their 24 starts in 2022.
- ▶ The Yankees have three of the AL's top-eight lowest ERAs: RHP Cam Schlichtler (1.51, second in AL), LHP Max Fried (2.09, seventh in AL) and RHP Will Warren (2.59, eighth in AL).
- ▶ **Lead the Majors in ERA (2.74), opponents' OBP (.267), opponents' SLG (.321), opponents' OPS (.588) and WHIP (1.02),** rank second in opponents' BA (.205, first in AL), K/BB (3.65, second in AL) and BB/9.0IP (2.44, second in AL), third in innings pitched (177.1, second in AL), fourth in strikeouts (175, third in AL), strikeout rate (24.9%, third in AL) and HR/9.0IP (0.81, third in AL), and ninth in K/9.0IP (8.88, fifth in AL).

DYNAMIC DUO: OF Aaron Judge (12HR) and C/INF Ben Rice (10HR) are only the third pair of Yankees teammates in franchise history to each hit at least 10HR in the club's first 31 games of a season, joining Babe Ruth (13HR) and Lou Gehrig (10HR) in 1930 and Yogi Berra (12HR) and Mickey Mantle (15HR) in 1956...are only the third set of teammates in Major League history to each hit at least 10HR before May 1, joining Los Angeles-NL's Cody Bellinger and Joc Pederson in 2019 and Colorado's Trevor Story and Nolan Arenado in 2016...are the only set to hit at least 10HR and record 20BB before May 1.

- ▶ Judge and Rice have combined to hit 22HR this year, more than two Major League teams (San Francisco-19HR and Boston-21HR).

FAST AND FURIOUS: Yankees baserunners have recorded 32SB this season, the second-most in the AL and tied for the fourth-most in the Majors...marks the Yankees' most stolen bases through their first 31 games of a season in the last 25 years (since 2002)...the last time they recorded more was 2001 (40SB).

- ▶ **INF/OF José Caballero** (12SB) is tied for first in the AL and tied for second in the Majors in stolen bases...**INF Jazz Chisholm Jr.** (9SB) ranks fifth in the AL and eighth in the Majors in stolen bases.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: Yankees batters have scored 26R in the first inning this season, tied for the most in the AL and tied for the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Washington (32R)...their 7HR in the first inning are the fourth-most in the AL and tied for the sixth-most in the Majors...the Yankees have gone 9-4 when scoring in the first inning this year.

- ▶ **The Yankees are 16-3 this season when scoring first.**

MATCHING UP: The Yankees are 8-1 in their last nine games vs. Baltimore (since 6/21/25).

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP WILL WARREN (3-0, 2.59 ERA)

RHP Will Warren will make his seventh start of the season in tonight's series opener vs. Baltimore...the 26-year-old will pitch on extended six days' rest...made his sixth start of the season on 4/24 at Houston and recorded his third win of the year after allowing just 2R/ER over 6.0IP (7H, 1BB, 6K, 0HR, 1BK, 1PO)...**is 3-0 with a 2.59 ERA (31.1IP, 29H, 13R/9ER, 7BB, 37K, 3HR) in six starts this season...his 28 starts of 2ER-or-fewer are tied for the most in the AL and tied for the third-most in the Majors since 2025...the Yankees' 22 wins in his starts since 2025 are tied for the fifth-most in the AL and the 10th-most in the Majors...**last season, went 9-8 with a 4.44 ERA (162.1IP, 158H, 90R/80ER, 65BB, 171K, 22HR) in 33 starts, allowing 2ER-or-fewer in 22 of those starts...**according to Elias, his 22 starts of 2ER-or-fewer were the second-most by a Yankees rookie in a single season**, trailing only Stan Bahnsen (25GS in 1968)...saw his first Major League action with the Yankees in 2024, going 0-3 with a 10.32 ERA (22.2IP, 33H, 27R/26ER, 10BB, 29K, 5HR) in six games (five starts) over five stints with the club (7/30, 8/7, 8/14, 8/21-31, 9/28)...was selected by the Yankees in the eighth round of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft out of Southeastern Louisiana University.

LAST TIME OUT: Made his sixth start of the season on 4/24 at Houston and recorded his third win of the year after allowing just 2R/ER over 6.0IP (7H, 1BB, 6K, 0HR 1BK, 1PO).

2026: Is 3-0 with a 2.59 ERA (31.1IP, 29H, 13R/9ER, 7BB, 37K, 3HR) in six starts this season...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in each of his six starts.

- ✦ Has allowed 2BB-or-fewer in five of his six starts this season, including 1BB-or-fewer in four of those starts...has issued just 7BB to 129 batters faced.
- ✦ Among Major League starters, ranks eighth in K/BB (5.29, sixth in AL)...ranks eighth in K/9.0IP (10.63), tied for eighth in wins, ninth in strikeout rate (28.7%) and 10th in walk rate (5.4%) among AL starters.
- ✦ Has recorded at least 6K in four of his six starts.
- ✦ Allowed one-or-zero HR in five of his six starts this season, including four starts without allowing a HR.
- ✦ The Yankees are 5-1 in his starts.
- ✦ Made his fifth start of the season and earned his second win of the year on 4/18 vs. Kansas City after allowing only 2R/ER over 7.0 innings (5H, 0BB, 11K, 1HR, 1PO)...**his 11K tied his career high (also 11K on 6/17/25 vs. Los Angeles-AL)**...marked his third career double-digit strikeout game (also 11K on 6/17/25 vs. Los Angeles-AL and 10K on 5/20/25 vs. Texas)... marked the second time in his career he has recorded at least 10K without surrendering a walk (also 11K and 0BB 6/17/25 vs. Los Angeles-AL)...no other Yankee had done so since Warren last accomplished the feat on 6/17/25...his 7.0 innings marked the second-longest start of his career (7.1IP on 5/9/25 at the Athletics)...also marked his sixth career start with 0BB and his second this season (last on 4/3 vs. Miami).
- ✦ Recorded his first win of the season on 4/3 vs. Miami, allowing 2R/ER in 5.2IP (4H, 0BB, 6K, 2HR).
- ✦ Made his season debut on 3/28 at San Francisco, tossing 4.1IP (5H, 1R/ER, 2BB, 3K, 0HR) without recording a decision.

GOOD WILL WARREN: His 28 starts of 2ER-or-fewer are tied for the most in the AL and tied for the third-most in the Majors since 2025...the Yankees' 22 wins in his starts since 2025 are tied for the fifth-most in the AL and the 10th-most in the Majors.

- ✦ Is 6-3 with a 3.34 ERA (89.0IP, 86H, 45R/33ER, 22BB, 84K, 13HR) over his last 17 starts (since 7/30/25)...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 14 of those 17 starts.
- ✦ Has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 29 of his first career 44 starts...among pitchers to debut since 1913 (when ER was first tracked), his 29 such starts are tied with Luis Gil, Stan Bahnsen and Bill Stafford for the second-most by a Yankee in their first 44 career starts, trailing only Steve Kline (30GS).
- ✦ His 39 starts since the start of 2025 are tied for the fourth-most in the Majors and tied for the second-most in AL.

HOME SWEET HOME: Is 2-0 with a 2.57 ERA (21.0IP, 6ER) and 28K in four home starts this year.

- ✦ Since the start of last season, is 9-4 with a 3.32 ERA (108.1IP, 88H, 46R/40ER, 38BB, 124K, 15HR) in 20 starts at Yankee Stadium...his nine win at home since 2025 are tied for the ninth-most in the Majors and the fifth-most in the AL over that span.
- ✦ Made his first home start of the season on 4/3 vs. Miami, recording the win after allowing 2R/ER in 5.2IP (4H, 0BB, 6K, 2HR).

VS. BALTIMORE: Is making his fifth career start against the Orioles tonight...has gone 1-2 with a 4.95 ERA (20.0IP, 11ER) and 22K in four starts vs. Baltimore.

- ✦ Is 1-0 with a 4.76 ERA (11.1IP, 6ER) in two starts vs. Baltimore at Yankee Stadium.

2025: In his first full Major League season, went 9-8 with a 4.44 ERA (162.1IP, 158H, 90R/80ER, 65BB, 171K, 22HR)...opponents batted .250/.320/.418 (158-for-631, 22HR); LH .266/.350/.436 (91-for-342, 12HR); RH .232/.283/.398 (67-for-289, 10HR).

- ✦ Was tied for second in the Majors in starts (33, tied for first in AL)...also ranked eighth in the AL in K/9.0IP (9.48).
- ✦ Was just the third Yankees rookie to make at least 33 starts in a season, joining Stan Bahnsen (34GS in 1968), and Russ Ford (33GS in 1910)...was also the first Major League rookie to make at least 33 starts in a single season since 2009 (Nick Blackburn, 33GS with Minnesota in 2008).
- ✦ Among Major League rookies, ranked first in strikeouts, starts and innings pitched, and was tied for fourth in wins (tied for third in AL).
- ✦ Went 5-5 with a 3.94 ERA (105.0IP, 46ER) over his final 20 starts (6/12-9/26) after going 4-3 with a 5.34 ERA (57.1IP, 34ER) over his first 13 starts of the season (4/1-6/6)...allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 14 of his final 20 starts and one-or-zero ER in eight of those starts.
- ✦ Surrendered one-or-zero home runs in 29 of his 33 starts and did not allow a home run in 15 of those starts...his 29 starts of one-or-zero home runs allowed were tied for the fourth-most in the Majors (tied for first in AL).
- ✦ Allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 24 of his 33 starts, including 2ER-or-fewer in 22 of those starts...according to *Elias*, his 22 starts of 2ER-or-fewer were the second-most by a Yankees rookie in a single season, trailing only Stan Bahnsen (25GS in 1968).
- ✦ According to *Elias*, his 171K were tied with Luis Gil (171K in 2024) for the second-most by a Yankees rookie in a single season in franchise history, trailing only Russ Ford (209K in 1910).
- ✦ Tossed five scoreless starts: 5.2IP on 5/20 vs. Texas, 6/12 at Kansas City and 7/8 vs. Seattle, and 5.0IP on 6/27 vs. the Athletics and 8/5 at Texas...according to *Elias*, his five scoreless starts were tied for the third-most by a Yankees rookie in a single season in franchise history, trailing only Russ Ford's eight such starts in 1910 and Luis Gil's six such starts in 2024 (Hippo Vaughn also had five such starts in 1910).
