RECENT REDBIRDS: The St. Louis Cardinals conclude a two-city, six-game road trip to Houston (3-0) and Miami (1-1) with the final game of a three-game series with the Marlins at loanDepot Park. Entering today, the Cardinals are tied for 2nd place with Chicago in the National League Central, 1.5 games back of first place Cincinnati.

FLIGHT PATTERN: Following this afternoon's game, the Cardinals fly back to St. Louis for an open date on Thursday before welcoming the Seattle Mariners for a three-game series on Friday. After Sunday's game, the Cardinals fly to Pittsburgh to play a four-game series with the Pirates for their first divisional game, Game No. 28 on the schedule. The first Cardinals home division game is against Milwaukee on May 4.

RUBBER MEETS ROAD: St. Louis is looking to win their 4th rubber game of the season entering 3-1 in the matchups this season. The Cardinals have won 5-of-7 series this season and looking to improve to 6-of-8 for the first time since 2015, when they won 8-of-9 en route to a 100-win season.

MIDWEEK MONSTERS AND A CASE OF THE MONDAYS: The Cardinals are 8-0 during the middle of the week this season posting a 4-0 mark Tuesday, 3-0 on Wednesday and 1-0 on Thursday. However, to start the week, the 'Birds are 0-4 on Monday.

ROAD TRIP!: A win today would give the Cardinals their first 5-1 road trip since May 8-14, 2023 when they took 2-of-3 from Chicago (NL) at Wrigley Field and swept the Boston Red Sox at Fenway Park.

AFTER FURTHER REVIEW: Major League Baseball came back with a scoring change on an error charged to third baseman **Shay Whitcomb** on Saturday night in Houston. The scoring was changed from E-5 to a double for **Iván Herrera**. Herrera is currently on a five-game hitting streak due to the change.

WORKING OVERTIME: The Cardinals are 5-0 in extra inning affairs this year, the best mark in MLB and their best start since the 2004 Cardinals started the season 6-0 in extras.

EXTRA! EXTRA!: Cardinals shortstop **Masyn Winn** has an extra base hit in four straight games, tying his career-best and tied for the MLB active streak with **Alek Thomas** (ARI), **Colson Montgomery** (CWS) and **Munetaka Murakami** (CWS). Winn has 8 RBI over his last five games to lead the National League since April 17, after one RBI through his first 14 games.

THE BAZOOKA: Cardinals outfielder **Jordan Walker** had his 15-game hitting streak end last night, but has another streak going with an outfield assist in each of his last two games. Walker's four outfield assists lead MLB and is one shy of his single-season high of five in 2023. He boasts two throws of over 100 MPH this season, tied with **Oneil Cruz** (PIT) for the MLB lead. Only three other outfielders have a throw besting the century mark.

WE'RE GOING TO PLAY: This road trip is comprised of two opponents who have retractable roofs where weather cannot complicate the game being played. In Cardinals franchise history, they have a 461-471 record when playing in retractable roof or domed stadiums. Before this road trip, the last time the Cardinals posted a winning record (4-1) on a road trip of two cities or more with guaranteed playing conditions was May 4-9, 2012; playing at Houston (1-2) and then then at Arizona (3-0).

Pedro Pagés resides in Doral, Fla...graduated from Gulliver Prep High School in Miami...played college baseball at Florida Atlantic Univ...made MLB debut vs. Marlins (April 7, 2024 at Busch).

Iván Herrera caught his first MLB shutout against the Marlins, June 27, 2022 at Busch Stadium from **Adam Wainwright** (7 IP), **James Naile** (1 IP) and **Jake Woodford** (1 IP) in a 9-0 win...hit his first career MLB home run on April 4, 2024 vs. Miami.

Dustin May earned his first MLB win at Miami on Aug. 13, 2019 in a start for the Dodgers.

TODAY'S GAME:

- This afternoon marks his 5th start of the season (6th career) and 103rd career appearance.
- Both of wins this season have come on the road: April 5 at Detroit and April 17 at Houston.
- Limiting right-handed batters to slash .139/.205/.361 (5-36) with a .566 OPS.
- Opposing lineups are batting .188/.278/.344 (6-32) with a .622 OPS the first time facing Leahy in starts.
- Gained his first win on April 5 at Detroit, allowing 2 runs over 5.0 IP in the Cardinals 5-3 over the Tigers. He threw a career-high 97 pitches as he earned the winning decision as a starter for the 1st time - all while helping to prevent a series sweep by Detroit.
- His first 97 appearances were as a relief pitcher following his Major League debut on July 7, 2023. First start came at Chicago's Wrigley Field on Sept. 28, 2025.
- Previously started 72-of-89 games over his first four professional seasons (2018-19, 2021-22).
- **Kyle's 97 career relief appearances before his 1st career Major League start (Sept. 28, 2025 at CHI) were the most by a Cardinal since Jordan Hicks (April 21, 2022 at Miami) who made his 1st career start after having made 114 career relief appearances.**

LAST TIME OUT (Friday, April 17 at Houston's Daikin Park): W, 9-4: 5.0 IP, 5 H, 3 R, 3 ER, 3 HR, 0 BB, 6 SO; 83 pitches.

- Eaned his 2nd win of the season in the Cardinals series-opening win of a three-game sweep of the Astros in Houston.
- Yielded career high three home runs, all solo blasts by Jose Altuve, Yordan Alvarez, & Christian Vázquez.
- Exited the game with St. Louis leading 4-3 after the 5th inning.

2026 HIGHLIGHTS:

ALL EYES ON US: Drew back-to-back starting assignments in nationally televised games on Easter Sunday on NBC/Peacock Sunday Night Baseball in Detroit and April 11 vs. Boston on FOX.

EASTER DELIGHT: Gained his 1st win of the season on April 5, allowing 2 runs over 5.0 IP in the Cardinals 5-3 Easter win over the Tigers. He threw a career-high 97 pitches as he earned the winning decision as a starter for the 1st time - all while helping to prevent a series sweep by Detroit.

IT'S COLDER IN BOULDER: The Colorado native worked in game time temps of 42 degrees on Easter Sunday in Detroit, his third career MLB appearance in temperatures 45 degrees and below, two shy of matching Cardinals announcer **Brad Thompson** (5) for T-3rd among Cardinals in the frosty temps.

IF AT FIRST YOU DON'T SUCCEED...: Took the loss in his first career home start vs. NYM (3/30) allowing four runs over a then career-high 5.0 innings and 79 pitches.

2025 HIGHLIGHTS:

NL Reliever Ranks: Innings Pitched (85.0, 1st), Batters Faced (354, 1st), Strikeouts (79, 8th).

MULTI-INNING MAGIC: Spent the entire season with St. Louis and led MLB with 32 relief appearances of at least 1.1 innings, the most by a Cardinals reliever since **John Frascatore** had 32 such appearances in 1998.

INNINGS EATER: Pitched an NL-high 85.0 innings as a reliever, the most by a Cardinals relief pitcher since **Manny Aybar** tossed 93.1 innings of relief in 1999. His 61 relief appearances were also the most among Cardinals right-handed pitchers.

TAKE A WHIFF: Became the first Cardinals reliever since **Tyler Lyons** (2017) to strike out at least seven batters in 3.2 IP or fewer on 7/22 at Colorado and the 6th to do so in franchise history, along with **Dave LaPoint** (1983), **Doug Bair** (1982), **Bobby Shantz** (1963) and **Dizzy Dean** (1934). His seven K's were tied for the third most among NL relievers in 2025, behind only CHC's Ben Brown and ATL's Chris Sale, who both had nine.

SPECIAL TRIBUTE: His career-high 7 strikeout performance on 7/22 at Coors Field came on the same day he learned of the passing of his grandmother. Kyle often-times attended Rockies games as a child with his grandparents.

LET'S GET STARTED: Made his first career MLB start in the season finale on 9/28 at CHC, working 3.0 scoreless innings with one hit allowed, no walks and one strikeout, his first start since 7/29/23 with Triple-A Memphis vs. Iowa (Cubs).

VERSATILITY: Became the first Cardinals pitcher to make at least 62 appearances and at least one start since **Jeff Fassero** (62 G, 6 GS) in 2003 and the first Cardinals right-hander to do so since **Manny Aybar** (65 G, 1 GS) in 1999.

OUT OF THE GATE: Allowed a combined three runs through his first 15 appearances across March/April for a 1.47 ERA (3 ER/18.1 IP) that led the team (min. 10.0 IP) and led all NL relievers with a .086 opp. batting average (5-58) in March/April that was the lowest by a Cardinals pitcher since **Todd Worrell** posted a .059 mark (2-34) in 1992.

DOUBLE THE PLEASURE: Generated eight double plays as a relief pitcher (9 total) to lead the St. Louis relief corps. and T-8th among NL relievers.

UNDER THE HOOD: Ranked in the 96th percentile in extension at 7.2 ft., and in the 93rd percentile with 9 runs prevented via breaking ball run value, which measures the effectiveness of a pitch by calculating the run impact of every event, factoring in count, runners on base, and outs.

CAREER:

- Graduated from Erie (Colo.) High School. Named Boulder County Player of the Year and was selected to play at the High School Futures Game at Coors Field.

- Played college baseball at Colorado Mesa University in Grand Junction, Colo., going 22-2 with a 3.13 ERA (204.1 IP), 188 strikeouts and six complete games.
- Allowed nine home runs to 852 total batters faced while pitching in high altitude (Grand Junction is 4,583 ft above sea level).
- Posted a 13-0 record with a 1.41 ERA during his sophomore season, earning First Team All-American, First Team Academic All-American, and was the South Central Regional Tournament MVP.
- Pitched two summers for the Waterloo Bucks of the collegiate summer Northwoods League (2016-17).
- His father, Tim Leahy, played college basketball at Kansas State University.
- His uncle, Thomas Leahy, pitched in the Braves organization (1991-93) advancing to Durham (High-A).

LEAHY VS. MIAMI:

- Makes his first career Major League start and 5th appearance against Miami today.
- Previously faced the Marlins in four relief outings (2024-25), hurling 4.2 scoreless innings of one-hit ball with four strikeouts in four St. Louis defeats.
- Recorded back-to-back one-out appearances in June 2025 at Busch.
- Last pitched at Marlins Park on back-to-back days in June 2024.
- Has made four career Grapefruit League appearances vs. the Marlins since 2023, throwing 4.2 shutout innings with eight strikeouts.

LAST APPEARANCE VS. MARLINS (July 30, 2025 at Busch Stadium): in relief - 0.1 IP, 0 H, 0 R, 0 BB, 0 K, 2 pitches

LEAHY VS. HOUSTON:

- Makes his first career Major League start and 4th appearance against Houston tonight.
- Previously faced the Astros in three relief outings (2024-25), going 0-0 with a 3.18 ERA (5.2 IP) and five strikeouts.
- Made three Grapefruit League starts vs. Houston in 2026, going 1-0 with a 4.09 ERA (11.0ip) and 14 strikeouts.
- Tonight marks Leahy's 3rd consecutive Interleague start following April 5 at Detroit and April 11 vs. Boston.
