The Mariners and Astros meet for their final series of the season...Seattle comes into the current series at Minute Maid Park having won each of its last 3 series at Houston since the start of 2023.

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue the final road trip of the 2024 regular season tonight with the second of 3 games against the Houston Astros (1-0)...Seattle is coming off a 3-game series victory at the Texas Rangers (2-1)...after an off day follows the current Houston series, Seattle welcomes the Athletics to T-Mobile Park for a 3-game set (Sept. 27-29) to cap off the 2024 season...tonight's game against Houston will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Angie Mentink** on the call, and broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzo** and **Dave Sims** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners won yesterday's game by a 6-1 score over the Astros, clinching the season series for the 2nd-consecutive season...Seattle is 4-1 over its last 5 games and 12-6 over its last 18 games (9/4-c)...with 5 regular season games remaining, Seattle is 4.0 games back of Houston for the AL West Division lead and 1.5 games back of Detroit and Kansas City for the 3rd and final AL Wild Card spot.

- **Not Done With One Run** - The Mariners have played in 53 one-run games this season, tied for most in the Majors with Detroit...Seattle is 26-27 in those contests.
- **Last 29 Games** - Seattle is 17-12 over its last 29 games (8/23-c) since **Dan Wilson** took over as manager and **Edgar Martinez** as hitting coach...Seattle owns a 5-2-2 series record during that span.
- **Small Ball** - The Mariners are tied for the American League lead with 21 bunt hits this season.
- **AL Player of the Week** - **Julio Rodríguez** yesterday was named **AL Player of the Week (Sept. 16-22)** for the 4th time in his career after batting .433 (13x30) with 5 runs, 1 double, 3 home runs, 9 RBI and a 1.218 OPS, tallying two 4-hit games and a multi-homer game during the week.

RUN-SCORING ENVIRONMENT...over its last 18 games (9/4-c), Seattle's offense **leads the Majors** in batting average (.286), on-base percentage (.369) and wRC+ (142) ranking 2nd in OPS (.827), 4th in slugging percentage (.458), 2nd in hits (180) and 3rd in runs (100)...during that span, the Mariners offense has recorded 10+ hits in 11 of 18 games and 4+ walks in 14 of 18 games, while striking out 10+ times in only 6 of those 18 contests.

FIRST 3 SEASONS OF THE J-ROD SHOW...center fielder **Julio Rodríguez** is batting .275 (150x545) with 71 runs, 17 doubles, 19 home runs, 65 RBI, 23 stolen bases and 38 walks in 138 games this season, toting a .328 on-base percentage, .411 slugging percentage and .739 OPS (118 OPS+)...with 1 more home run this season, Julio would join Bobby Witt Jr.-KC as the **only 2 players in MLB history** to record 20 HR and 20 SB in each of their first 3 MLB seasons.

- **75 HR / 75 SB** - With 79 career home runs and 85 career stolen bases, Rodríguez is **1 of 2 players in MLB history** with 75+ homers and 75+ steals through a player's first 3 career seasons (other: Bobby Witt Jr.-KC, also 2022-24).
- **Winning Player** - Julio has accumulated 15.7 Wins Above Replacement (*Baseball-Reference*), **4th most WAR by a center fielder** through a player's first 3 career seasons trailing only Mike Trout (2011-13), Joe DiMaggio (1936-38) and Oscar Charleston (1920-22).
- **Last 24 Games** - Over his last 24 contests (8/28-c), Julio is batting .374 (40x107) with 23 runs, 5 doubles, 8 homers, 25 RBI, 9 walks and 6 stolen bases, getting on base at a .415 clip, slugging .645 with a 1.060 OPS...Julio has hit safely in 20 of those 24 games.

CAL RALEIGH: DOING IT ALL...catcher **Cal Raleigh** has solidified himself as one of the best catchers in the Majors over several seasons...his 88 home runs over the last 3 seasons (2022-c) **lead MLB catchers**, while his 13.5 Wins Above Replacement (*FanGraphs*) since 2022 rank 2nd in the Majors to only Adley Rutschman-BAL (13.6)...Raleigh has firmly placed himself as the frontrunner for both the American League Silver Slugger and Gold Glove Awards this season:

- **Silver Slugger Candidate** - Cal **leads MLB catchers** with a career-high 31 home runs...after pacing the Majors with 27 home runs in 2022 and 30 in 2023, he is set to become the **first catcher to lead the Majors in homers in 3+ consecutive seasons** since Mike Piazza did it in 4 consecutive seasons (1999-2002)...Shea Langeliers-OAK (28 HR) and Salvador Perez-KC (27) rank closest to Cal in home runs.
- **Gold Glove Candidate** - Cal leads the Majors in catcher caught stealing (26), ranking ahead of Alejandro Kirk-TOR (25) and Will Smith-LAD (24)...after leading the Majors in CCS last season, Raleigh **could become the 3rd catcher to lead the Majors in consecutive seasons**, joining Jim Sundberg in 1975-76 (Sundberg tied for the Major League lead in '75) and Hall of Famer Gary Carter in 1982-83.

PITCH PERFECT...Seattle's overall pitching staff **leads the Major Leagues** in ERA (3.51), opponent batting average (.221), fewest runs allowed (592), WHIP (1.08), strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.80), fewest walks-per-9 innings (2.33), fewest hits-per-9 innings (7.40), opponent OBP (.276), opponent OPS (.651) and quality starts (91) this season...Seattle's starting rotation **leads MLB** in ERA (3.40), opponent batting average (.224), WHIP (1.03), strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.83), fewest walks-per-9 innings (1.75), fewest hits-per-9 innings (7.55) and opponent OPS (.643).

AGE IS BUT A NUMBER...**Justin Turner** has reached base safely (via hit, walk or HBP) in 18 consecutive games, the longest active streak in the Majors...during the streak (9/4-c), Turner is batting .302 (19x63) with 13 runs, 5 doubles, 2 home runs, 5 RBI and 12 walks with a .397 on-base percentage, .476 slugging percentage and .874 OPS...Turner's 18-game on-base streak is also the longest on-base streak by a Mariners player this season, surpassing **Randy Arozarena's** 14-game streak (Aug. 24-Sept. 8)...Turner's career-high on-base streak is 39 games, spanning from Aug. 4, 2020-April 10, 2021 with the Dodgers.

LUUUUUUUUKE...outfielder/first baseman **Luke Raley** is having a career year in 2024, tallying career-highs in hits (96), home runs (21) and RBI (55) in his 4th big-league season...over his last 40 games (8/2-c), Raley is batting .275 (33x120) with 20 runs, 7 doubles, 10 homers, 26 RBI and 15 walks with a .957 OPS...his OPS ranks 6th in the American League (min. 100 PA) since Aug. 2.

AS YOU KNOW...outfielder **Victor Robles** has been a spark-plug for the Mariners since he joined the club on June 5, batting .336 (71x211) with 37 runs, 17 doubles, 4 home runs, 23 RBI, 15 walks and 28-for-29 in stolen bases, with a .403 on-base percentage, .474 slugging percentage and .877 OPS, and...**YOU MAY ALSO KNOW**...Victor has reached base in 14-consecutive games (9/4-c) and is batting .435 (37x85) with 21 runs, 9 doubles, 1 home run, 15 RBI, 7 walks, 15 stolen bases and a 1.077 OPS over his last 26 games (8/17-c), leading the Majors in average during that span (min. 50 AB), ranking ahead of Luis Arraez-SD (.354), but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that Victor could become just the 4th hitter in Mariners history to bat .333 or better (min. 200 PA) in a season?...he is on pace to join Ichiro Suzuki (4x, 2001, '04, '07 and '09), **Edgar Martinez** (3x, 1992, '95 and '99) and Alex Rodriguez (1996).

ABOUT LOGAN GILBERT...

- The 27-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 32nd start of the season and 3rd against Houston...he will also make the 120th start of his MLB career and 12th career start against the Astros.

LAST TIME OUT...W on 9/19 vs. New York-AL...spun 5.1 innings and allowed 2 runs on 6 hits (1 home run), 2 walks, 9 strikeouts...he has thrown into the 5th inning in 8 straight appearances 8/4-c.

TOP OF HIS LEAGUE...among qualified AL pitchers this season, Gilbert ranks 1st in WHIP (0.90), T-1st in quality starts (22), 2nd in innings pitched (197.0), 2nd in Opp. AVG (.198), 3rd in strikeouts (207) and 8th in ERA (3.24).

LOOKS ARE DECEIVING...this season, despite a 8-11 record, Gilbert has produced a 0.90 WHIP over 197.0 innings...he is 1 of 3 pitchers in Major League history with a losing record, 162.0+ innings pitched and a sub-0.90 WHIP...the only other pitchers to do so are Ed Walsh (1910) and Cy Young (1905).

31 TIMES AROUND...through his 31 starts this season, opposing hitters are batting .198 (142x716) against Gilbert...Randy Johnson is the only pitcher in franchise history that has ever finished a season with a sub-.200 opponent average against (1997, .194)...so far this season he has allowed 189 baserunners, 2nd-fewest in franchise history (min. 162.0 IP)...trailing only Bryce Miller from this season with 175 baserunners allowed and is currently ahead of Hisashi Iwakuma's franchise record 193 baserunners in 2014.

SPLIT SECOND DECISION...hitters this season are batting .096 (9x94) against Gilbert's splitter with 3 doubles and 1 home run...the .094 average is the 2nd-lowest in the Majors against a splitter (min. 90 PA)...his 50.6 Whiff % is the highest of any starter and 3rd in the Majors (min. 90 PA).

WHIPPING IT UP...his 0.90 WHIP is the lowest qualified WHIP in franchise history, on pace to be 1 of 4 pitchers to post a sub-1.00 WHIP in a single season, joined by teammate Bryce Miller (0.98)...since making his MLB debut, Gilbert trails only Tarik Skubal (1.04) for the lowest WHIP in the American League (1.07) (min. 500 IP).

FEELING SUPPORTED...is 37-0 in his career when the Mariners score 3 or more runs while he is in the game...in those games the Mariners are 45-10.

QUALITY MINDSET...22 of his 31 starts have been quality start, tied for most in the American League and 2nd-most in the Majors...he has gone 6.0+ innings in 25 of his 31 starts...the Mariners are 13-12 when he pitches in 6.0+ innings.

COMPLETE PACKAGE...he tossed his 2nd career complete game on 9/7 at STL (also: 7/4/23 at SF) and a had career-low for hits allowed in a complete game (2)...it was the first complete game loss with 2-or-less hits allowed in franchise history since Félix Hernández did so on 9/23/10 at Toronto.

30 FOR 30 FOR 30...made his 30th start of the season in his start on 9/14 vs. TEX, his 3rd consecutive season with 30+ starts...he is now the 9th different pitcher (10th time) in franchise history to accomplish this feat...the last to do so was Félix Hernández who put together 10 straight seasons from 2006-2015.

ALL-STAR CALIBER...on July 7, was named to the 2024 American League All-Star team, his 1st All-Star selection...in 20 starts through the All-star break led AL starters with 132.1 IP, 2nd in ERA (2.79), 3rd in strikeouts (124), and gave up the 3rd fewest hits (88).

LUCKY 7...tied for the most starts of 7.0+ scoreless IP in MLB...has totaled 5 of those outings (38.0 IP) this season (8/10 vs. NYM, 7/14 at LAA, 6/22 at MIA, 6/16 vs. TEX and 5/4 at HOU) tied with Framber Valdez-HOU, Dylan Cease-SD and teammate Bryce Miller.

SHUTDOWN STARTER...made back-to-back starts with 8.0 scoreless innings pitched from 6/16-6/22...since the beginning of the 2020 season, only Nathan Eovaldi-TEX (3 G, 4/29-5/11/23) has gone 8.0+ scoreless innings in consecutive starts...he became the first Seattle pitcher since Mike Montgomery (6/23-6/30/15) to do so.

FAR FROM HOME...has gone 6.0+ innings in 12 of his 16 away starts this season...in those 16 starts, he has a 3.82 ERA (43 ER, 101.1 IP) with 11 quality starts and 99 strikeouts...11 quality starts on the road is tied for the 3rd-most on the road this season in MLB behind Zack Wheeler-PHI (12) and Seth Lugo-KC (12).

GET AHEAD, STAY AHEAD...he is posting a 67.8% 1st pitch strike rate, the highest of his career...among pitchers with 160.0+ IP, this is the 2nd-highest in the AL (Tarik Skubal-DET, 68.5%).

MID-SEASON FORM...over 5 starts in June, he posted a 2-1 record with a 1.51 ERA (6 ER, 35.2 IP) and 31 strikeouts to 1 walk...his ERA marked the 2nd-lowest of his career during a single month (March/April 2022, 0.40 ERA)...Gilbert's 0.62 WHIP was the best mark in the Majors during June...his WHIP was also the lowest during a single month in his career.
