- **Lefty/Lefty** Yesterday's starting pitchers **Justus Sheffield** (ND, 6.0 IP, 3 H, 2 ER, 2 BB, 5 SO, 1 HR) and **Nick Margevicius** (ND, 3.0 IP, 6 H, 6 R, 2 ER, 1 BB, 4 SO) were the first pair of Seattle left-handed pitchers to start both games of a doubleheader since Ryan Feierabend and Jarrod Washburn started Lefty/Lefty

SILVER BULLETS...Kyle Seager continued his torrid pace in yesterday's game one win, reaching base 3 more times by going 2-for-3 with a double, walk and RBI...in 11 games this season, Seager is batting .317 (13x41) with 4 runs scored, 3 doubles, 2 home runs, 10 RBI, 5 walks and 1 stolen base, getting on-base at a .383 clip, slugging .537 with a .920 OPS...after Tuesday's matinee, Seager had reached base safely in 9 of 10 plate appearances.

THREE-HIT MITCH....Mariners right fielder Mitch Haniger went 3-for-4 in game two yesterday, his first 3-hit game of the season...it was Haniger's first 3-hit game since Sept. 22, 2018, going 3-for-5 at Texas in the season he made the American League All-Star team...Haniger is batting .311 (14x45) with 8 runs, 4 doubles, 2 home runs, 7 RBI and 2 walks, and has hit safely in 10 of 11 games this season, with an active 5-game hitting streak...Haniger has reached base safely in all 11 games, going 0-for-3 with a walk in his lone game without a hit on April 7 vs. Chicago-AL.

BROKE THE TY...infielder Ty France hit his 2nd home run of the season in the 1st inning of the game one victory yesterday...both of his homers (4/3 vs. SF) this season have broken scoreless ties...in 11 games this season, France is batting .293 (12x41) with 9 runs, 2 doubles, 2 home runs, 5 RBI and 5 walks...he has reached base safely in 10 of 11 games this season.

MARMO HOMER...first baseman José Marmolejos went 2-for-4 with a 3-run homer and double in yesterday's second game...Marmolejos is batting .263 (5x19) with 4 runs, 2 doubles, 2 home runs, 6 RBI and 2 walks in 8 games (4 starts) this season...he carries a .333 on-base percentage, .684 slugging percentage and 1.018 OPS.

IN THE PIPELINE...with the addition of infielder Noelvi Marte, the Mariners currently have 7 prospects in MLB Pipeline's updated top-100 Prospects List, tied with Tampa Bay for most of any club...outfielder Jarred Kelenic is #4, outfielder Julio Rodríguez is #5, right-handed pitcher Emerson Hancock is #28, right-handed pitcher Logan Gilbert is #30, right-handed pitcher George Kirby is #85, outfielder Taylor Trammell is #93 and Marte is #100...the Mariners are the only team with 2 players in the top 5 and 4 in the

COMEBACK KIDS...through 11 games this season, the Mariners have come back to win from a 5-run deficit (4/1 vs. SF), 3-run deficit (4/7 vs. CWS) and a 6-run deficit (4/11 at MIN)...the most recent comeback at Minnesota was the Mariners largest comeback since June 2, 2016 at San Diego, a 10-run comeback... Seattle has won games this season with in-game "Win Probabilities" as low as 1.6% (4/1 vs. SF), 13.1% (4/7 vs. CWS) and 1.9% (4/11 at MIN)...win probability data via fangraphs.com.

AS YOU KNOW...Sam Haggerty's game-tying 2-run homer came in the top of the 9th in the second game of yesterday's doubleheader...the blast was off Baltimore right-hander Adam Plutko and was Haggerty's 1st of the season, but...DID YOU KNOW?...that the home run reached Oriole Park at Camden Yards' famous Eutaw Street in right field?...Haggerty's homer was the 102nd recorded home run hit onto Eutaw Street (46 Orioles, 56 opponents), and the first this season...it was the first home run hit there by an opponent since Kansas City's Mike Moustakas did it on May 8, 2018...Haggerty also became just the 2nd Mariners player to do it all-time, joining Ken Griffey Jr., who homered onto Eutaw on April 24, 1994...Griffey's home run off Baltimore hurler Brad Pennington was just the 4th home run ever hit there since the park opened in 1992...Eutaw Street statistics found on orioles.com.

- Acquired by the Mariners from New York-NL along with Jarred Kelenic, Gerson Bautista, Anthony Swarzak and Jay Bruce in exchange for Robinson Canó, Edwin Díaz and cash considerations on Dec. 3, 2018.
- Selected by Los Angeles-NL in the 37th round of the 2013 MLB-First Year Player Draft but did not sign... played 3 seasons at Boston College, where he was named third-team All-America (Baseball America) following his junior season... selected by New York-NL in the 1st round (19th overall) in the 2016 MLB First-Year Player Draft out of Boston College.
- Made MLB debut Sept. 12, 2019 with Seattle...is in his second full big league season.
- Appeared in 4 minor league seasons with New York-NL (2016-18) and Seattle (2019); was 23-20 with a 3.76 ERA (164 ER, 392.1 IP) with 149 walks and 424 strikeouts in 80 career minor league games (73 starts).

LAST OUTING...ND in Mariners 8-4 win vs. Chicago-AL at T-Mobile Park on April 7...allowed 3 runs on 1 hits while walking a career-high 8 and striking out 3 ovr 4.2 innings...tossed 4.0 scoreless innings before before allowing 3 runs in the 5th inning and 1 more in the 6th inning...Mariners scored 7 runs in the bottom of the 6th inning to take an 8-4 lead.

A WIN TO REMEMBER...earned first Major League win on Aug. 10 at Texas, allowing 2 runs on 7 hits while walking 3 and striking out 2 in 6.0 innings.

INNINGS EATER...tossed at least 5.0 innings in 6 of his 10 starts, including 5 of his final 6 starts of the season (8/23-9/26)...tossed a season-high 6.0 innings in 4 times: Aug. 10 at TEX (6.0,7,2,2,3,2), Aug. 23 vs. TEX (6.0,1,0,0,1,6), Aug. 30 at LAA (6.0,1,0,0,4,6) and Sept. 6 vs. TEX (6.0,4,2,2,4,4,2HR).

ONE-HIT WONDER...Dunn became the first Mariners pitcher in club history to record back-to-back outings of at least 6.0 innings pitched and 1 hit or fewer allowed...among pitchers age 24 or younger, this feat has only been accomplished three other times in a single season since the inception of the franchise in 1977: Dennis Eckersley (5/30 – 6/3/1977), Marvin Freeman (9/21 – 9/26/1986) and Barry Zito (7/29 – 8 /4/2001)...the last pitcher of any age to accomplish this feat was Trevor Bauer (3/30 – 4/4/2019)...Dunn worked 6.0 innings and allowed 1 hit on Aug. 23 vs. the Rangers before tossing 6.0 innings of 1-hit ball on Aug. 30 at the Angels.

NO HITS FOR YOU...limited opponents to a .189 (31x164) average against...among pitchers with at least 45.0 innings pitched this season, his .189 average against is 5th-best in the American League, trailing only Shane Bieber-CLE (.167), Kenta Maeda-MIN (.168), Lucas Giolito-CWS (.184) and Cristian Javier-HOU (.188).

FOR STARTERS...logged 4 starts this season in which he has worked at least 6.0 innings while allowing 2 runs or fewer: Aug. 10 at Texas, Aug. 23 vs. Texas, Aug. 30 at Los Angeles-AL and Sept. 6 vs. TEX.

GOOD NEW, BAD NEWS...his 31 walks were 3rd-most in the Major Leagues...of his 31 free passes, 12 came in the 1st inning...only 7 of his 31 walks came

NOW THAT'S WHAT I CALL QUALITY...recorded 4 quality starts, ranking T2nd in the Majors among rookie pitchers (also: Jesús Luzardo-OAK, Sixto Sánchez-MIA and José Urquidy-HOU)...he trailed only teammate Justus Sheffield (6) in quality starts by a rookie starter in 2020.

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE....went 2-1 with a 2.81 ERA (5 ER, 16.0 IP) in 3 starts at T-Mobile Park...was 2-0 with a 5.16 ERA (17 ER, 29.2 IP) in 7 road starts.

<u>W#1</u>...earned his first career win with 6.0 innings of 2-run ball at Texas on Aug. 10, scattering 7 hits and 3 walks with 2 strikeouts...he joined Justus Sheffield, who earned his first MLB win the day prior vs. Colorado, as the first pair of Mariners starting pitchers to ever earn their first MLB wins in consecutive starts.

2020 DEBUT...made his debut on July 29 at Los Angeles-AL, working 3.0 innings and allowing 3 runs (2 earned) on 1 hit with 3 walks and 2 strikeouts in a 10-7 Mariners win.

<u>DEBUT...</u>..made his Major League debut and first career start at T-Mobile Park on September 12 vs. Cincinnati, logging a no-decision...tossed 0.2 innings and allowed 2 runs with 5 walks and no strikeouts, while throwing 37 pitches (14 strikes) and allowing 3 stolen bases...did not allow a hit.
