IN IT TO WIN IT: New York is 3-5 in winner-take-all Postseason games, including a 2-3 record at home and 1-2 on the road.

DO OR DIE: The Mets are 9-8 in the Postseason when facing elimination, including 7-5 at home and 2-3 on the road.

THREE'S COMPANY: The Mets are 13-5 in Game 3 of a Postseason series. This includes going 10-4 in New York and 3-1 on the road.

ROAD TO RICHES: The Mets are 22-22 on the road in the Postseason...On Tuesday, the Mets earned their first road victory in the Postseason since an 8-3 victory over the Cubs on October 21, 205 in Game 4 of the NLCS.

HIP, HIP, JOSE: Jose Quintana is set to take the bump tonight in Milwaukee... It marks his sixth career Postseason game and his fifth career start...He is 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA (8 ER/18.2 IP) with six walks and 15 strikeouts in the Postseason...In his final six starts of the year, Quintana went 4-1 with a 0.74 ERA (3 ER/36.1 IP) with 11 walks and 29 strikeouts...He did not allow more than three walks in any start...The Mets went 4-2 in that span.

ADDICTED TO THE PLAYOFFS: J.D. Martinez has appeared in 35 Postseason games, batting .290 (36-124) with 15 runs, five doubles, 10 home runs, 33 RBI, 19 walks, a .384 OBP and a .573 SLG.

TO RYNE OWNSELF BE TRUE: Ryne Stanek has appeared in 25 Postseason games...He is 3-0 with a 2.45 ERA (6 ER/22.0 IP) with six walks and 22 strikeouts in the playoffs.

SAVE THE CHEERLEADER, SAVE THE WORLD: There have been 11 players in franchise history to record a save in the Postseason...Jeurys Familia owns the franchise record with five Postseason saves...Armando Benitez, Tug McGraw and Billy Wagner are tied for second with three saves each...Edwin Díaz has appeared in two Postseason games, both in 2022...he allowed two hits, one walk and struck out two over 2.2 scoreless innings.

TO THE POST: The Mets are 53-41 all-time in Postseason play...The club's .564 winning percentage is the third-best in major league history...Only the Marlins (24-16, .600) and the Yankees (244-178, .578) have a better winning percentage...The Mets own the fourth-best ERA in Postseason history with 3.23 ERA...Only the Orioles/Browns (2.80), Athletics (3.14) and Reds (3.22) have a lower FRA

WILD OUT: The Mets previously made the Postseason as the Wild Card team in 1999, 2000, 2016 and in 2022...ln 1999, New York defeated the Diamondbacks, 3-1, in National League Division Series and fell to the Atlanta Braves 4-2, in the League Championship Series...The 2000 Mets defeated the Giants, 3-1 in the NLDS and the Cardinals, 4-1 in the NLCS...The team fell to the Yankees 4-1 in the World Series...The 2016 Mets fell to the Giants, 1-0, in the one-game Wild Card Game...The Mets lost a best-of-three-game series to the San Diego Padres, dropping two games to one in 2022 at Citi Field.

POSTSEASON BOUND: The Mets are in the Postseason for the first time since 2022 and for the 11th time in franchise history...This marks the fifth Wild Card berth in team history...Also in 1999, 2000, 2016 and 2022.

POSTING UP: Pete Alonso appeared in all 162 Mets games this year...Outside of 2020, he became the second Mets player to appear in every single game, joining Félix Millán (1975)...John Olerud appeared in 162 of 163 games during the 1999...This year marked the third time in his career he has appeared in 160 or more games (also, 2019 & 2022).

PARTY IN THE CITI: Citi Field will be hosting watch parties for select Mets away games throughout the 2024 MLB Postseason on Citi Vision, the largest scoreboard in MLB, starting with Game 3 of the National League Wild Card Series...Gates open at 7:30 p.m. ET, with first pitch scheduled* for 8:38 p.m. ET...Fans can secure their tickets with a \$10 donation** per ticket to the Amazin' Mets Foundation...As part of admission, fans will enjoy free parking, special appearances from Mr. and Mrs. Met and select \$5 concessions throughout the event...The event will be first-come, first-served with a limit of 8 tickets per person.

ON THE RECORD: New York won 20 of their last 29 on the regular season... The Mets finished the year going 89-73...In 2023, the team finished at 75-87... The Mets were a season-low 11 games under .500 on June 2 (24-35)...Since then, the Mets went 65-38...Following a loss on May 29, the Mets played 107 games, going 67-40 in that span...Their .626 winning percentage was the best in the majors in that span...They outscored their opponents 541-433 during those 107 games.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets finished the season going 43-38 away from Citi Field in 2024...The Mets surpassed their road win total of 2023 (32-49)...The Mets hit .254/.316/.416 on the road this year...They ranked seventh in the majors in AVG and SLG and were 10th in OBP.

DANCING IN SEPTEMBER: The Mets went 17-9 in September...Their .654 winning percentage was third in the majors and the second-best in the National League...Their 3.21 ERA in the month was the third-best in the

OMG: Jose Iglesias recorded a hit in both games of the team's doubleheader on the final game of the season...He ended the year with a 22-game hitting streak...It is the longest hitting streak of his career and it is the longest streak by a Mets player this year...His previous high was an 18-game streak from May 27-June 18, 2013 with the Red Sox...The last time a Mets player had a longer streak was Wilson Ramos, when he recorded a 26-game hitting streak from August 3-September 3, 2019...lglesias batted .395 (34-86) over that span with 14 runs, four doubles, one home run, four RBI, one walk, two steals, a .429 OBP and a .477 SLG.

A LEADING MAN: Francisco Lindor hit 26 home runs when batting first this season...That tied a record for the most in franchise history...He joined Curtis Granderson (26 HR/140 Games, 2015) as the franchise leader...In 109 games batting in the leadoff spot this year, Lindor batted .303/.374/.552 with 82 runs, 31 doubles, one triple, 26 home runs, 71 RBI, 42 walks, 23 steals with a .926 OPS...The Mets went 64-43 when Lindor bated first this season.

30-FOR-30: Lindor recorded his second 30/30 season as a Met and the fifth of his career...Only four players in Mets history have recorded multiple seasons with 30 home runs and 30 doubles - David Wright (2007-08), Carlos Beltrán (2006-07), Carlos Delgado (2006 and 2008) and Howard Johnson (1989 and 1991)

FWAR, WHAT IS IT GOOD FOR?: Francisco Lindor finished the season with a 7.6 fWAR...That was the sixth-best mark in the majors and the second-best mark in the National League...Only Shohei Ohtani (9.1 fWAR) had a higher mark...Lindor's 17.4 defensive fWAR was third in the majors.

ALL YOUR BASE ARE BELONG TO US: The Mets stole 106 bases out of 128 attempts this year, giving them a 82.8% success rate...It is the second-highest in franchise history...Last year, the team was successful in 88.7% (118-133) of stolen base attempts, the highest in team history...Brandon Nimmo was not caught in 15 stolen base attempts this year...His 15 steals were a career-best...Francisco Lindor stole 29 bases this year...That is two shy from his career-best 31, accomplished last year.

WE FOUND NIMMO: Brandon Nimmo hit .241/.344/.419 with 44 runs, 14 doubles, one triple, 12 home runs, 39 RBI and 39 walks in 74 road games...This compared to a .207/.310/.379 slashline with 11 doubles, two triples, 11 home runs and 38 walks in 75 games at home in 2024...Overall, Nimmo hit 23 home runs this year, one short of his career-best 24 he accomplished last season... His 90 RBI were a career-best...He recorded 77 walks this year...That's three short of his career-best 80 he recorded in 2018.

THE PEN IS MIGHTIER: From the All-Star break until the end of the season, the Mets bullpen has posted a 3.74 ERA, the sixth-lowest mark in the National League in that span....Overall, the Mets relief staff have struck out 648 batters this season, which was fifth in the majors and third in the NL...Their 648 strikeouts were second-most in franchise history...The team recorded 571 punchouts in 2023...The 2021 team recorded the franchise record with 658 punchouts from the bullpen.

He joined Darryl Strawberry (1983-1986), David Wright (2005-2007), Michael Conforto (2017), Pete Alonso (2019) and Francisco Alvarez (2023) as the only players in franchise history age 24 or younger to have 25 or more home runs in a season...He joined Wright (2005-2008, 2010), Howard Johnson (1987, 1989, 1991) and Robin Ventura (1999) as the only third baseman in franchise history with 25 or more home runs in a season (min. 50% games at 3B each season).

ED, EDD & EDDY: In 15 games since August 29, Edwin Díaz has converted six save opportunities, posting a 1.69 ERA (3 ER/16.0 IP) with five walks and 30 strikeouts...He posted a 3.00 ERA (9 ER/27.0 IP)- with 10 walks and 47 strikeouts in 27 games following the All-Star break...He was 3-1 with 10 saves, a 4.05 ERA (12 ER/26.2 IP) with 10 walks and 37 strikeouts in 27 games prior to the break...This year marks his fourth year in which he converted at least 20 saves for the Mets...Only John Franco (seven) and Armando Benítez (five) had more as a Met...His 224 saves since his debut in 2016 are the second-most... Only Kenley Jansen (305) has more.

QUINTANA NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Made his final start of the season on September 28 at American Family Field...Struck out a season-high nine, but took the loss...Allowed two earned runs on five hits with two walks in 4.1 innings.

PICK SIX: Over his final six starts of the year, Quintana went 4-1 with 0.74 ERA (3 ER/36.1 IP) with 11 walks and 29 strikeouts...The Mets went 4-2 in that span.

LET'S GO STREAKING: Quintana did not allowed a run in a career-best 25.2 innings from August 31 until the fourth inning of his last start...It marked the longest scoreless streak of his career.

KEEPING IT 100: Earned his 100th career win, throwing 6.2 scoreless innings on September 7 against the Reds...Became the 19th active pitcher to reach the 100-career win plateau...Is the sixth active left-handed pitcher with 100+ wins...Is the first Colombian born pitcher with 100 career wins...With a win tonight, Quintana will extend his streak to a season-high five wins.

HAVE TO ADMIT IT'S GETTING BETTER: After allowing eight runs on May 3 at Tampa Bay, Quintana has made 23 starts and posted a 9-6 record with a 3.33 ERA (48 ER/129.2 IP) with 45 walks and 101 strikeouts...Has given up one or fewer earned runs in each of his last five starts...Has a 0.28 ERA (1 ER/32.0 IP) over his last five starts.

JUNE BLOOM: Quintana made five starts in June and went 2-0 with a 3.38 ERA (9 ER/24.0 IP) with 11 walks and 26 strikeouts...The Mets went 4-1 in those starts.

8.0 IS GREAT: Threw a season-high 8.0 innings on April 28 vs. St. Louis in the Mets' 4-2 walk-off victory...Was his longest start as a Met and his longest start since September 17, 2022 vs. Cincinnati with St. Louis (Also 8.0 IP)...Was the longest start by a Met since Justin Verlander threw 8.0 innings on July 19 vs. Chicago-AL.

OPENING UP: Quintana took the mound for Opening Day on March 29 vs. Milwaukee at Citi Field...He became the 30th Opening Day starter in franchise history...He was the first southpaw since Jon Neise (2013) to be named the Mets Opening Day starter...Quintana started the opener just once prior to today (2017, with Chicago-AL).

PROUD TO BE AN AMERICAN: In March of 2024, the Colombian-born Quintana passed his naturalization test in Miami to become an American citizen.

METS DEBUT SEASON: After starting his first season with the Mets in 2023 on the IL due to a stress fracture in his rib cage, Quintana made his first start for the club on July 20, 2023, against his former team, the Chicago White Sox...The southpaw finished the last season 3-6 with a 3.57 ERA (30 ER/75.2 IP) in 13 starts.

300 CLUB: In his start on September 17, 2023, Quintana became the 11th active pitcher to reach 300 career starts and joined Clayton Kershaw, Madison Bumgarner and Wade Miley as the only active left-handed pitchers with 300 or more career starts.

HOT STREAK: Quintana's homerless inning streak came to an end at 97.1 innings in his start on August 12, 2023, at St. Louis after allowing a solo homer to Tyler O'Neill to lead off the bottom of the seventh inning...The last pitcher before Quintana to reach 90.0+homerless innings was Tyson Ross (100.0 IP) in 2015...Courtesy of Elias.

LEFT 'EM SPEECHLESS: Reached 1,500 career strikeouts in his start vs. Colorado on August 16, 2022...Quintana currently ranks fourth among active MLB lefties in strikeouts (1,592) behind Clayton Kershaw (2,944), Chris Sale (2,189), Madison Bumgarner (2,070).

YOU GOTTA MAKE 'EM EARN IT: Quintana allowed three earned runs or fewer in each of his 19 starts from July 23, 2022 to August 23, 2023...Is the longest such streak of his career and was the longest such active streak in the majors by a starting pitcher (excluding openers)...Quintana's streak of 16 straight starts allowing two earned runs or fewer came to an end in his start against Kansas City on August 1, 2023.

A PERFECT 10: The lefty pitcher struck out a season-high 10 batters on September 23, 2023 in Philadelphia...The fifth highest amount of strikeouts he has ever recorded in a game throughout his career...Was his first double-digit strikeout game since August 13, 2019 when he struck out a career-high 14 batters.
