## PITTSBURGH PIRATES (44-44) vs. WASHINGTON NATIONALS (45-43)

July 3, 2026 - Nationals Park - Washington, D.C. - 6:45 EDT - Game #89/Road #44

RHP Mitch Keller (6-5, 4.87 ERA) vs. LHP Foster Griffin (8-2, 2.93 ERA)

**THE PIRATES:** have split the first four games of this seven-game road trip (their final road trip before the All-Star break) to Philadelphia (2-2, Monday-Thursday) and Washington (Friday-Sunday), including a 6-1 win on Thursday at Citizens Bank Park...Will host Atlanta (July 7-9) and Milwaukee (July 10-12) for six games during their final homestand prior to the All-Star break...Have 794 hits, tied with Los Angeles (NL) for the most throughout Major League Baseball...Have scored the third-most runs (452) in Major League Baseball, behind Los Angeles-NL (474) and Washington (470)...Have struck out the third-most batters (812) in Major League Baseball, behind Philadelphia (849) and Milwaukee (843)...Have won or split eight of their first 14 road series this season (they won or split only seven of their 26 road series in the 2025 season)...Are in the 11th game of a stretch of 35 straight games played in the Eastern Time Zone, a stretch that began on June 23 vs. Seattle and will end on August 2 at Cincinnati (their next game not played in the Eastern Time Zone will be on August 3 at Milwaukee).

**NATIONAL MATTER:** The Pirates have gone 19-13 (.594) vs. Washington since the start of the 2022 season, winning each of the four season series in that stretch...The Pirates and Nationals split a four-game series from April 13-16 at PNC Park...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, Saturday's scheduled start time of 11:05 AM EDT will be the Pirates' earliest local scheduled start time for a game since September 15 (G1), 1996 at San Francisco's 3Com Park at Candlestick Point, when they had a scheduled start of 11:05 AM PDT...Pittsburgh's July 4 game in 1987 vs. Los Angeles at Three Rivers Stadium had a local scheduled start time of 10:35 AM EDT.

**EXTRA! EXTRA!** Ryan O'Hearn doubled in the second inning on Thursday at Philadelphia, extending Pittsburgh's streak of games with at least one extra-base hit to 61 straight games (since April 26 at Milwaukee)...That is tied with another 61-game streak (last year from July 22-September 28) for the Pirates' fifth-longest such streak (within a single season) during the 21st century, trailing only a 97-game streak (May 23-September 7, 2007), a 75-game streak (June 21-September 15 [G1], 2015), a 71-game streak (April 4-June 23, 2005) and a 64-game streak (June 1-August 14, 2019)...Pittsburgh's 194 extra-base hits in that span are tied with Minnesota for the fourth-most in Major League Baseball, behind San Francisco (206), Washington (206) and Colorado (199).

**GOOD AS GONZO:** Nick Gonzales went 3-for-5 with a run-scoring single (seventh inning) and a solo home run (ninth inning) in Thursday's 6-1 win at Philadelphia...It was his second straight game with at least three hits, an RBI and a run scored (he went 3-for-4 with an RBI, a walk and a run scored on Wednesday at Philadelphia)...It marks the first time in his career that he has posted back-to-back games with at least three hits...The only other Pirate with consecutive three-hit games this season was Ryan O'Hearn (June 16-17 at the Athletics)...The last Pirate to do that in three consecutive games was Starling Marte (four, June 12-15, 2015)...Gonzales would become the 14th Pirate/18th instance (since RBI became an official statistic in 1920) to have at least three hits, an RBI and a run scored in at least three straight games and the first since Brian Giles (July 2-4, 2001)...Gonzales' 31 multi-hit games this year are the third-most in Major League Baseball, trailing Miami's Otto Lopez (36) and San Francisco's Luis Arraez (32).

**THE MAGICIAN:** Esmerlyn Valdez went 2-for-4 with a triple, three RBI and a run scored on Thursday at Philadelphia...It was his first Major League triple and the sixth of his professional career...His last triple prior to Thursday came last year on July 26 with Double-A Altoona vs. Chesapeake...Valdez has hit safely in nine of his last 10 games (since June 19 at Colorado), including seven consecutive games (since June 26 vs. Cincinnati)...He has gone 16-for-33 (.485) with nine extra-base hits, 10 RBI, a 1.556 OPS & 10 runs scored during the current 10-game stretch.

**JAKE RAKES:** Jake Mangum went 3-for-5 with a double and two runs on Thursday at Philadelphia, his second straight game with multiple hits and at least one run (he went 2-for-3 with a walk, a hit-by-pitch and a run on Wednesday at Philadelphia)...He has never had multiple hits in three straight games...He has hit safely in 14 of his last 16 games with a plate appearance (since June 13 vs. Miami), going 23-for-66 (.348)...His average in that time is tied w/Arizona's Ketel Marte for the sixth-best mark in Major League Baseball (min. 65 at-bats)...He trails Chicago (NL)'s Pete Crow-Armstrong (.403), Los Angeles (NL)' Mookie Betts (.375), Tampa Bay's Jonathan Aranda (.364), Kansas City's Carter Jensen (.357) & Colorado's TJ Rumfield (.352) on that list.

### ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

July 3, 2012: Drew Sutton recorded the first and only walkoff RBI of his career with his walkoff solo blast (off Wesley Wright) in the ninth inning of Pittsburgh's 8-7 win over Houston at PNC Park. The walkoff homer, which capped off the third three-hit game of his career, was his first home run since October 3, 2010 with Cleveland. Andrew McCutchen and Garrett Jones also went deep for the Pirates in the win.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the second round of the 2014 Draft.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Keller won a 9-4 decision after allowing four runs (three earned) over 6.0 innings on June 28 vs. Cincinnati (it was his first win since May 24 at Toronto).

**AGAINST THE NATIONALS:** Keller is 1-4 with a 5.31 ERA (42.1ip/25er) in eight career starts against Washington...He lost a 5-4 decision after allowing five runs over 4.0 innings on April 14 at PNC Park...Keller has a 6.75 ERA (14.2ip/11er) in three career starts at Nationals Park (gave up two runs over 5.1 innings last year on September 12).

**K IS FOR KELLER:** Keller, who has 910 career strikeouts, surpassed Steve Blass (896) for seventh place on the Pirates' all-time strikeouts list after striking out seven batters during his start on June 16 at the Athletics...He surpassed Rick Rhoden (852) during his start on April 19 vs. Tampa Bay and Deacon Phillippe (861) during his start on April 25 at Milwaukee...He also surpassed Dock Ellis (869) for eighth place on May 7 at Arizona.

**ON THE ROAD:** Keller is 2-1 with a 3.96 ERA (38.2ip/17er) in seven road starts this year (the Pirates are 4-3 in those seven games)...He had a no-decision after allowing five runs (one earned) in 5.1 innings in his last road start, which was on June 16 at the A's.

**SIX PACK:** Keller pitched 6.0 innings and allowed two or fewer runs in each of his first three starts this season (March 28 at New York-NL, April 3 vs. Baltimore, April 8 vs. San Diego)...He was the first Pirate to toss at least 6.0 innings while allowing two or fewer runs in each of his first three starts of a season since Joe Musgrove (April 5-16, 2019).

**CONSISTENT KELLER:** Keller pitched 6.0 scoreless innings during his start on April 8 vs. San Diego, marking his second scoreless start of at least 6.0 innings through his first three starts of the 2026 campaign (also March 28 at New York-NL)...He joined Salomon Torres (2002), Zach Duke (2005), Jeff Karstens (2008), Wandy Rodriguez (2013) and Jameson Taillon (2018) as the only Pirates during the 21st century with two scoreless starts of at least 6.0 innings through their first three games of a season...Keller's 17 starts of at least 6.0 scoreless innings during his career (since 2019) are the 10th-most by any Pirate in the Live Ball Era (since 1920)...Paul Skenes, who has done that on three occasions this season, ranks tied for 12th on the list (15).

**DAZZLING DEBUT:** Keller scattered three hits without issuing a walk (had three strikeouts) over 6.0 scoreless innings, but had a no-decision in Pittsburgh's 4-2, 11-inning loss on March 28 at New York (NL)...Keller left with the game scoreless after six frames...The Pirates took a short-lived, 1-0 lead into the bottom of the 10th before the Mets tied it...Pittsburgh also added a run in the top of the 11th before New York's Luis Robert Jr. hit a walkoff, three-run home run off Hunter Barco in the bottom half...Keller joined Vance Worley (June 15, 2014 at Miami), Nick Kingham (April 29, 2018 vs. St. Louis) and Joe Musgrove (May 25, 2018 vs. St. Louis) as the only Pirates in the 21st century to toss at least 6.0 scoreless innings without allowing a walk in a season debut.

**QUALITY AND QUANTITY:** Keller had 17 quality starts in 2025, his third straight season with at least 15 quality starts (he had 18 in 2023 and 15 in 2024)...Prior to Keller, the last Pirate to do that in three straight seasons was Paul Maholm from 2008-10 (A.J. Burnett did it from 2012-13 and in 2015, but he pitched for Philadelphia in 2014)...Keller made his 30th start of 2025 on September 12 at Washington, marking his third consecutive season with at least 30 starts...He joined Maholm (2008-10) and Ian Snell (2006-08) as the only Pirates pitchers in the 21st century to accomplish that.

 ⚔ Is 11-for-34 (.324) out of the No. 7 spot of the lineup...Posted his first MLB hit on 5/3/25 w/Cincinnati vs. Washington (RBI single, off Trevor Williams).

 ⚔ Has made four starts in center field, two starts in right field, one start at first base & one start in left field (last start, center field on Tuesday at Philly).

 ⚔ Has started in three of the Pirates' six shutouts...Has homered five times in his last 20 contests after hitting two over his first 35 games of the season.

 ⚔ His 31 multi-hit games (last, Thursday at Philadelphia) are third in Major League Baseball...Is 16-for-39 (.410) across his last 11 contests (since 6/21).  
 ⚔ Is hitting .320 (71-for-222) with 14 extra-base hits against right-handed pitchers...Has gone 50-for-145 (.345) with 37 RBI with runners on this year.

 ⚔ His 19 home runs as a second baseman this season are tied w/Bill Mazeroski (1958) for the second-most by a Bucs second baseman in a single season.
