TAKING OUR WORK HOME: Winners of five of their last six series, the Detroit Tigers tonight begin a two-team, seven-game homestand with the first of four games against the Kansas City Royals ... the stay at home concludes with three games against the Baltimore Orioles starting Monday ... thanks to a 5-1 win in their rubber match at the Cubs last night, the Tigers improved to 11-5 in July, trailing only the Boston Red Sox (15-2) for the best record in all of baseball this calendar month.

- Tonight continues a run of 13-games-in-13-days out of the All-Star Break for the Tigers, their second stretch of this type in the last month-plus ... the Tigers wrapped up a 14-games-in-14-days stretch on July 2 before enjoying two off days in four days ... the Tigers enjoy two off days in five days at the conclusion of this current run of games.
- The Tigers have won 13 of their last 18 and 18 of their last 28 games starting June 19 ... the Tigers are 26-16 (.619) in their last 42 games starting June 1, the second-best record in the A.L. and the third-best mark in baseball in this span (Milwaukee, 29-17, .630; Boston, 27-16, .628).

MELTON LAVA: Troy Melton tonight makes his 10th start of the season after making his 2026 debut on May 24 (due to right elbow inflammation) ... Melton is 5-1 with a 1.80 ERA in his first nine starts, the third-lowest ERA in the majors the last two months starting May 24 behind only Milwaukee's Jacob Misiorowski (1.24) and Washington's Foster Griffin (1.47).

- Melton's 0.87 WHIP is fifth lowest in the majors starting May 24 while his .170 batting average against is third lowest and his .555 OPS against is fifth lowest.
- Melton has pitched five innings or more while allowing one run and four hits or less in each of his last five starts, the longest active streak in baseball ... Melton joins Eduardo Rodriguez (also five starts in 2023) as the lone Tigers starters with such a stretch in the last 10 seasons.

CENTRAL CASTING: The Tigers tonight play their first A.L. Central foe in more than a month in welcoming the Royals back to town ... the Tigers completed a three-game sweep of the Royals here back in April and are 4-2 vs. Kansas City overall this season ... however, the Tigers are just 5-14 in 19 games against their other A.L. Central competitors ... the Tigers are just 9-16 vs. their division this season and have more wins vs. A.L. East (11 wins) and A.L. West (14 wins) competition this season.

WAR TIME: The Tigers have four players with a 2.8 fWAR or better this season: Dillon Dingler (4.6), Kevin McGonigle (4.1), Riley Greene (2.8) and Casey Mize (2.8) ... the Tigers are the only A.L. team and one of only two teams in all of baseball with at least four players owning a 2.8 fWAR or better this year, joining the Los Angeles Dodgers with six such players.

IT'S GOOD FOR SOMETHING: 21-year-old Kevin McGonigle plays his 100th career game tonight and boasts a 4.8 bWAR, the second-best mark by any position player in the A.L. (just behind recently I.L.'d Bobby Witt Jr., 4.9 bWAR) and tied for fourth best by any position player in the majors.

- Meanwhile, Dillon Dingler boasts a 4.6 fWAR this season, the fourth-best mark by a position player in baseball and tied for fifth-best overall ... there's no other catcher in Dingler's orbit in all of baseball as the next closest backstop is Shea Langeliers with a 2.8 fWAR.

GREENE STREAK: Riley Greene has reached 15 home runs for the third-straight season, only the second Tigers left-handed hitter to do so since Comerica Park opened in 2000 and the first since Chicago-native Curtis Granderson did so in four seasons in a row from 2006-09 ... Greene is only the seventh Tigers lefty to reach 15 homers, 20 doubles and 50 RBI in at least three-straight seasons in the last 50 years starting in 1976, the first since Granderson (also 2006-09).

ON THE DOUBLE: Dillon Dingler (21 doubles), Riley Greene (21 doubles) and Kevin McGonigle (20 doubles) have all reached 20 doubles this season, making the Tigers the only team in the A.L. with three players with at least 20 doubles so far this year ... in all of baseball, only the San Francisco Giants, with four players, have surpassed the Tigers' feat thus far in 2026.

HORSE SHOES, HAND GRENADES, TIGERS GAMES: The Tigers have seen a plethora of games - 46 - decided by two runs or less with the club going 13-33 ... the 33 such losses are the most in baseball while the 13 wins are the fewest in baseball despite being middle of the pack for most such games in baseball ... the Tigers are 36-21 in games decided by three runs or more.

IT HAS BEEN A GRIND: Through their first 26 games of 2026, the Tigers went 14-12 and woke up on April 24 with a share of first place in the A.L. Central ... in 76 games since, the Tigers have gone 34-42 to drop to 48-54 and fourth place in the division ... Detroit's 34-42 (.447) record starting April 24 is the eighth-lowest winning percentage in baseball in this span.

- Despite going 26-16 starting June 1, the Tigers have lost 29 of their last 57 games, 32 of their last 61 games and 37 of their last 67 games starting May 4.

AND FINALLY: Troy Melton made his major league debut one year ago today in Pittsburgh ... he has turned in a 2.14 ERA in his first 13 major league starts, one of only three Tigers starting pitchers in the last 50 years to post a sub-2.20 ERA in his first 13 major league starts (non-opener edition), joining Michael Fulmer (2.11 ERA in 2016) and Mark Fidrych (1.72 ERA in 1976).

- Has gone 5.0+ innings and allowed one earned run or less in each of his last five starts and seven of his nine starts this season...has allowed more than two earned runs just once.
- Has the third-lowest ERA among pitchers to make at least nine starts this year...his 1.80 is behind only Jacob Misorowski (1.57, 19 starts) and Shohei Ohtani (1.79, 14 starts).
- From June 20-July 1, made three consecutive starts of 6.0+ innings pitched and one earned run or less allowed, striking out 18 batters compared to four walks over that span.
- Turned in the best start of his young major league career on June 3 against Tampa Bay, as he picked up his second win of the season, limiting the Rays to two runs on four hits and two walks in a career-best 8.0 innings pitched, the longest start by a Tigers pitcher this season...Melton retired his final 17 batters faced and at one point threw 22-consecutive strikes between the fifth and eighth innings.
- Allowed one run on six hits and a walk while striking out one over 7.0 innings on May 29 against Chicago-AL, his second straight outing of surrendering just one run to begin his season.
- Started the 2026 season on the 60-day injured list with right elbow inflammation...activated on May 24 and pitched that night, allowing just one earned run on two hits and three walks while striking out three over 5.2 innings.
- Made his Major League debut on July 23, 2025, against Pittsburgh...earned his first big league win on July 28 last year against Arizona in his first home start, tossing seven scoreless innings, allowing just five hits while also striking out five.
- Selected by Detroit in the fourth round (117th overall) of the 2022 MLB Draft out of San Diego State University.

- Suffered the loss on July 19 against the Angels, allowing an earned run on a hit and three walks over 1.1 innings...has allowed at least one run in eight of his last 11 outings.
- Was an emergency starter on June 15 against Houston, allowing just one earned run on two hits and two walks while striking out five over 2.2 innings pitched.
- Blew back-to-back save opportunities on May 29 and May 31 against Chicago-AL...allowed three earned runs on five hits over 1.1 innings between the two outings.
- Tossed 3.0 perfect innings and earned the win on May 27 against Los Angeles-AL...continued a stretch of 14.0 consecutive innings over five games dating back to May 13 in which he has not allowed an earned run...has allowed just five hits and four walks compared to 16 strikeouts over this span.
- Earned a six-out save on May 24 against Baltimore, striking out four over his two scoreless frames.
- Made the third big league start of his career on May 20 against Cleveland, his first since Aug. 7, 2021, with the Texas Rangers against the Athletics...tossed 4.2 scoreless frames, allowing just two hits and two walks while striking out a career-high seven batters.
- Earned his first win of the season and second of his major league career on April 30 against Atlanta.
- Earned his first career major league save with 3.1 scoreless innings, allowing two walks while striking out two in a victory over the Marlins on April 11.
- Signed with Detroit on a one-year major league contract with a club option for the 2027 season on Dec. 16, 2025.
- Spent each of the previous two seasons with the SSG Langers of the KBO League...went 12-7 with a 2.25 ERA (43 ER/171.2 IP) in 30 starts for SSG last season, recording 245 strikeouts in his 171.2 innings pitched, an average of 12.8 strikeouts per nine innings.
- Has spent parts of five seasons with the Philadelphia Phillies (2017-19), Chicago White Sox (2020) and Texas Rangers (2021) prior to joining the Tigers this year...also pitched with Hiroshima in the NPB for the 2022-23 campaigns.

- Struck out all four batters he faced in a perfect 1.1 innings on June 23 against the Yankees.
- Blew a save in the eighth inning against Kansas City on May 8 and ninth inning on May 29 against Chicago.
- Earned his first save of the season on April 30 against Atlanta, allowing one hit while striking out one in a scoreless ninth inning...marked his first save with the Tigers since Aug. 16, 2025, at Minnesota.
- Did not allow a run over his first 11 games (11.0 innings) this year, allowing five hits and eight walks while striking out five over that span...his first earned run came on April 24 against Cincinnati in a game in which he struck out four batters over 1.2 frames.
- Re-signed with Detroit on a two-year deal as a free agent on Dec. 20, 2025...appeared in 16 games with the Tigers last season, posting a 3-0 record with a 1.50 ERA (3ER/18IP) with 23 strikeouts.
- Made his first postseason appearance with the Tigers in 2025, playing six games and striking out three in 7.1 innings of work.
- Landed on the injured list on Sept. 5 with a right adductor strain...activated Sept. 19 and allowed one run in three of the first four games since returning from the IL.
- Became the first MLB reliever to change teams at the deadline and immediately throw 14+ scoreless innings since Erik Goeddel in 2018...the first Tigers reliever to do so since Doug Blair in 1983.
- Recorded a four-out save on Aug. 2 at Philadelphia in his Tigers debut...started his Tigers career going 3-0 with a hold and four saves, allowing just three hits and three walks while striking out 19 over his first 14.1 innings (12 games).
- Earned 20 saves with the Nationals in 2025 prior to being traded to Detroit on July 31, sixth-most in the N.L. at the time...went 1-4 with a 4.38 ERA (19 ER/39.0 IP) in 40 relief outings, including 34 games finished for Washington.

- Set the rookie record for the most games reaching base safely two or more times prior to the All-Star Break (since 1933)...is also the only 21-year-old or younger to ever reach base safely two or more times in 53 games prior to the All-Star Break.
- Named to his first All-Star team and will return to his home town of Philadelphia to play in the game...he is just the third Tiger to make the All-Star team at 21-years-old or younger, the first in 50 years when pitcher Mark Fidrych started the game at 21...Mr. Tiger Al Kaline is the only Tigers position player to previously do so when he made the club in 1954 and 1955 at the ages of 20 and 21...McGonigle is the first Tigers rookie to make the team since Matt Nokes in 1987, the first to do so in his first season since Fidrych in 1976.
