The Mariners and Athletics meet for their fourth and final series matchup of the season...Seattle swept the last series in West Sacramento (3-0) from May 25-27.

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TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners, who have won 3 of their last 4 games, continue their final road trip of the regular season today with a rubber match against the Athletics (1-1)...Seattle will also face the Los Angeles Angels (3 G, 9/14-9/16) and Colorado Rockies (3 G, 9/18-9/20) on the trip...today's contest against the A's will be televised and streamed on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Angie Mentink** on the call and **Brad Adam** serving as field reporter...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners dominated the Athletics by a 19-1 score last night to even the series...Seattle's 18-run win marked the largest win differential in a game in franchise history, surpassing a 19-2 victory on May 20, 1994 vs. the Texas Rangers...Seattle is 30-44 (.405) on the road this season, as opposed to 40-35 (.533) at T-Mobile Park.

- **Like Mike - Michael Arroyo** went 3-for-4 with 2 runs, a double, home run, 3 RBI and a walk in his third career game last night, registering both his first career hit (4th inning double) and first career home run.
- **Three In The Top 15** - The Mariners have 3 players on their current roster who rank in the top 15 on the franchise's all-time *Baseball-Reference* wins above replacement list: **Julio Rodríguez** (25.5 WAR, 9th), **J.P. Crawford** (21.9, 12th) and **Cal Raleigh** (19.5, 15th).
- **Cal Reaches Base** - **Cal Raleigh** recorded 2 walks last night, extending his on-base streak to 14 games (8/28-c), the 4th-longest on-base streak (via hit, walk or HBP) of his career.

OH, WHAT A NIGHT...the Mariners offense scored 19 runs on 23 hits in last night's rout of the A's...the 19 runs were the most by Seattle since May 30, 2012 at the Rangers (21 R)...the 23 hits were the most by Seattle since Sept. 22, 2004 at the Angels (24 H, which tied a franchise record)...Seattle tied a season-high 5 home runs (**Dominic Canzone**, **Randy Arozarena**, **Cole Young**, **Michael Arroyo** and **J.P. Crawford**), also doing so July 28 at the Dodgers and Aug. 24 vs. the Phillies.

YOUTH MOVEMENT: COLT, LAZ & ARROYO...in just his third career game last night, top prospect **Michael Arroyo** hit his first career home run in the 7th inning...the 21-year-old, right-handed hitter joined **Colt Emerson** (hit first career HR in second game on May 18 vs. CWS) and **Lazaro Montes** (hit first career in MLB debut on Sept. 1 at BOS) as the only trio of 21-year-olds, or younger, to homer within their first 3 career games in the same season in MLB history...coming into this season, only the 1964 Red Sox (Tony Conigliaro & Dalton Jones) and 2005 Braves (Jeff Francoeur & Brian McCann) even had 2 players age 21-or-younger to homer within their first 3 career games.

8 WITH 2+; 5 WITH 3+ HITS LAST NIGHT...eight different Mariners recorded multi-hit games last night: **J.P. Crawford**, **Randy Arozarena**, **Dominic Canzone**, **Julio Rodríguez** (3 H), **Josh Naylor** (3 H), **Cole Young** (3 H), **Michael Arroyo** (3 H) and **Weston Wilson** (5 H)...the 8 players with 2+ hits tied a franchise record, done 9 times now and most recently before last night on Sept. 7, 2025 at Atlanta...the 3 common players who did it in each of the last 2 instances for the Mariners are Arozarena, Crawford and Naylor... additionally, the 5 players with 3+ hits tied a franchise record, done 6 times now and most recently before last night on Aug. 22, 2001 vs. Detroit, when David Bell, Bret Boone, John Olerud, Ichiro Suzuki and current manager **Dan Wilson** all recorded 3+ hits in a 16-1 home win vs. the Tigers.

WILSSSSOOOOONNNNN...last night **Weston Wilson** went 5-for-6 with 3 runs scored out of the 9-spot of the batting order...it marked the 51st time in Mariners history that a player recorded 5+ hits in a game, and just the second out of the 9-spot (other: Willie Bloomquist on Sept. 19, 2006 at Texas)...it marked the first time any Mariner recorded 5+ hits in a game since **Dominic Canzone** on Sept. 16, 2025 at Kansas City, as part of a 3-homer game.

J.P. IN SEPTEMBER...in 11 September games, shortstop **J.P. Crawford**, who recorded 2 hits including a home run last night, is batting .342 (13x38) with a double, homer, 5 RBI and 9 walks compared to just 5 strikeouts, getting on base at a .469 clip with a .916 OPS across 50 plate appearances...Crawford's .469 OBP ranks 10th among qualifiers during the month.

CAN'T SMILE WITHOUT WOO...last night **Bryan Woo** went 6.0 innings with just one unearned run allowed, recording his 12th win of the season...Woo has a 1.78 ERA (14 ER, 70.2 IP) in 12 career starts against the Athletics, with the 1.78 ERA the lowest by a Mariners pitcher against any opponent in franchise history (min. 10 starts)...over his last 7 starts since the start of August, Woo is 5-1 with a 1.93 ERA (9 ER, 42.0 IP) with 41 strikeouts and 9 walks.

KEYSTONE COLE...**Cole Young** leads American League second basemen with 16 defensive runs saved this season...DRS is an advanced baseball statistic that estimates how many runs a player saved or cost their team through their fielding compared to an average player at that position...in his sophomore season, Young has appeared in all but one game (148 G played) for the Mariners.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Randy Arozarena** goes into play today with the most runs scored (97) in the American League...the left fielder has already established a season-high, surpassing his previous-high 95 runs scored for both the 2023 Rays and 2025 Mariners, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...Arozarena could become the first Mariners player to lead his league in runs scored since Ken Griffey Jr. in 1997?...the Hall of Fame center fielder paced the AL with 125 runs that year, marking the third consecutive season that a Mariner led the AL in runs scored...in 1995, Hall of Famer Edgar Martinez shared the AL lead in runs (121) with Albert Belle-CLE...in 1996, Alex Rodriguez led the AL in runs (141)...those 3 consecutive seasons mark the only 3 times in franchise history that a Mariners player has led the AL in runs scored.

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - SEPTEMBER 13

- **1992** - Harold Reynolds breaks up an 8.1 inning Athletics no-hit bid, and Greg Briley doubled with two outs to end the shutout.
- **1995** - Trailing 4-0, the club scores seven runs in the last two at-bats for a 7-4 win vs. Minnesota. Jay Buhner's three-run HR was the game winner.
- **1996** - Mark Whiten hit the second longest ball ever hit at the Metrodome for a grand slam in a 13-7 win at Minnesota.
- **1996** - Alex Rodriguez became the first player in Mariners history to collect 200 hits in a season. The 20 year-old Seattle shortstop, who gets an RBI single off Minnesota's Travis Miller in the first inning to reach the milestone, will finish the season with 215 hits and a Major League leading .358 batting average.
- **2025** - The Mariners win their 8th straight in a 5-3 win over the Angels with Bryan Woo recording a career-high 13 strikeouts, the 3rd Mariner this season to toss 13+ strikeouts with 1-or-fewer walks in a single start (also: **George Kirby** and **Logan Gilbert**), the first trio to do so in Mariners history...Jorge Polanco recorded a double in his 6th consecutive game, tied for the 2nd-longest streak by a Mariner in franchise history.

ABOUT BRYCE MILLER...

- The 27-year-old right-handed pitcher is set to make his 20th appearance (19th start) of the season and the 94th appearance (93rd start) of his career...it marks his 8th career start against the Athletics and 2nd of the season.
- Is in his 4th season with Seattle; selected by Seattle in the 4th round (113th overall) of the 2021 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Derek Miller on July 20, 2021.
- Played 3 seasons at Texas A&M from 2019-21.
- Was born in Mount Pleasant, Texas and attended New Braunfels High School in New Braunfels, Texas.

LAST TIME OUT...L#4 on Sept. 8 vs. TEX, tossing 3.2 innings with 4 runs (4 ER) allowed on 4 hits and 3 walks while striking out 6 batters...threw 84 pitches and 52 strikes...his 3.2 innings pitched are the fewest he has recorded in a start this season and is only the 3rd time in his career he has recorded 3.2-or-fewer innings in a start (last: 6/30/23 vs. TB).

FACING THE A'S...has allowed 3-or-fewer earned runs in 6 of his 7 appearances against the A's...4 of those outings have been quality starts, including 2 starts of 1-or-fewer earned runs over 6.0+ IP...in his last appearance against the A's Miller entered the game out of the bullpen, making his first career relief appearance...he pitched 5.0+ innings out of the pen to follow, becoming the first Mariners pitcher to log 5.0+ innings of relief and earn the win since Tommy Milone on September 18, 2019 at Pittsburgh...owns a 7.8 K/BB against the A's, ranking 8th-best in MLB all-time (min. 25.0 IP) while his 1.16 BB/9 is 12th-lowest...his career 1.009 WHIP against the A's ranks 10th-best in MLB since 2023 (min. 25.0 IP).

SHERIFFS IN TOWN...has allowed 2-or-fewer earned runs over 5.0+ IP in 3 of his 5 appearances against AL West teams this season and in 16 of his 29 career games...the Mariners are 15-7 when Miller goes 5.0 innings against the AL West...in 29 career games (28 starts) against AL West teams, he owns a 3.82 ERA (66 ER, 155.1 IP) with a 3.82 K/BB and a 1.10 WHIP, ranking 16th-best in MLB since 2023 (min. 100.0 IP).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN...is making his 10th appearance (9th start) on the road this season...has allowed 2-or-fewer earned runs across 5.0+ innings in 4 of his 9 road starts this season...the Mariners are 3-1 over those 4 games...on June 25 at PIT, matched his career-high in strikeouts with 11 and in his June 12 start at WSH, tossed a career-high 8.0 innings...across 10 road games this season, he owns a 4.00 K/BB, ranking 9th best in the AL, ahead of Bryan Woo (3.95) and Logan Gilbert (3.94)...also owns a and a 1.94 BB/9, which ranks 9th-best in MLB (min. 50 IP).

LIKE PLAYING CATCH...Miller has allowed 2-or-fewer hits over 5.0+ IP in 4 outings this season, T-8th most since he made his season debut, and has recorded 5.0+ IP with a single hit allowed in 3 appearances...he is 1-of-4 players to record 3+ such games since May 13...this season marks the first in which he has recorded multiple games of 5.0+ innings with 1-or-fewer hits allowed...his league-leading 3 such outings are also tied for the 2nd most recorded by a Mariners pitcher in a single season, joining Luis Castillo (2023) and Roy Thomas (1985) and just trailing **Bryan Woo's** 4 outings in 2025.

THE GOLDEN RATIO...is 1-of-9 pitchers in MLB this season to own 95+ strikeouts and 26-or-fewer walks...his career 3.47 K/BB ranks 13th-best in the AL since 2023 (min. 400.0 IP) and ranks 7th among Mariners pitching leaders (min. 400.0 IP)...has recorded 8 games with 5+ strikeouts and 1-or-fewer walks since making his season debut on May 13...his 8 such games are T-10th most in the AL over that span...is 1-of-11 pitchers to make 4 appearances with 7+ strikeouts and no walks since May 13...on June 25 at PIT tossed 11 strikeouts to 0 walks for his 2nd such career outing (also: 9/11/25 vs. LAA), becoming 1-of-6 Mariners pitchers to record multiple such outings in their career.

JUST OUT OF REACH...owns a 38.7% chase rate this season, ranking 6th best in MLB (min. 100.0 IP)...his 11.1 hard hit% on pitches outside the zone ranks 7th best among pitchers with 500+ such pitches...among AL starting pitchers his .126 opponent batting average (14x111) on pitches out of the zone ranks 18th-lowest.

QUICK AND SNAPPY...records a first pitch strike 65.5% of the time, T-12th highest in the AL (min. 100.0 IP), while he earns a first pitch swing 41.3% of the time, highest in MLB...owns 42 strikeouts to 7 walks with a 1.023 WHIP when the they swing at the first pitch...after an 0-1 count he owns 68 strikeouts to 8 walks with a .831 WHIP while holding batters to a .192 (41x214) batting average.

LUCKY NUMBER 500.0...in his Sept. 2 start at BOS, surpassed 500 career innings pitched becoming the 33rd Mariners pitcher to record 500.0 innings with the franchise and the 15th to do so in the first 92 games of their career, joining **George Kirby**, **Logan Gilbert**, and **Bryan Woo**...is the 7th pitcher in MLB that made their debut in 2023-or-later to record their 500th inning pitched, joining Woo...the Mariners are 1-of-2 rotations in MLB to have 4+ pitchers with 500.0 IP with their current team (also: AZ).
