The Braves went 50-31 at SunTrust Park in the regular season, winning 50 home games in a season for the first time since 2013.

The Braves also set a franchise modern-era record this season with 13 consecutive home wins from August 17-September 7.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and Cardinals finish their National League Division Series today with Game 5 at SunTrust Park...The winner will advance to the League Championship Series to play either Los Angeles (NL) or Washington...Both teams will either travel to Dodger Stadium, or play host to the Nationals in the LCS, which begins this Friday.

A The clubs met six times in the regular season, with the Braves winning four of the games while outscoring St. Louis, 29-27.

A The clubs have met four times previous in the postseason, with the Cardinals winning three of the matchups...St. Louis swept the 1982 LCS from Atlanta, before the Braves took the 1996 LCS in seven games...The Cardinals then swept the NLDS in 2000, before winning the 2012 Wildcard Game.

A The Braves won both of the series with the Cardinals in the regular season, taking two-of-three in Atlanta, May 14-16, before winning another two-of-three at Busch Stadium, May 24-26.

A RHP Mike Foltynewicz is set for his second start in this series after he tossed 7.0 shutout innings to win Game 2, 3-0...Tonight will mark Foltynewicz's fourth career postseason appearance, all starts, and the righty is 1-1 with a 3.46 ERA (5 ER/13.0 IP) in the playoffs.

A RHP Jack Flaherty is scheduled to start for the second time in this series after he lost Game 2, 3-0, despite going 7.0 innings and striking out eight...The righty made his postseason debut that day.

WINNER TAKE ALL: The Braves and Cardinals have each won two games this series, with the Braves outscoring the Cardinals, 16-13...The last time the Braves won a playoff round was in 2001, when they swept Houston in the NLDS.

A The Braves have played gone to a Game 5 three times in the division round and lost each time...All three games have come at home, and all three games came in a three-year span from 2002-2004.

A Overall, the Braves are 4-6 in winner-take-all games, including 1-1 against the Cardinals...They lost the 2012 Wild Card game to St. Louis here in Atlanta, but also beat them in Game 7 of the 1996 LCS at Turner Field...That '96 win was the Braves' last winner-take-all victory.

A The Braves split two Game 7s in 1957 (at New York-AL) and 1958 (vs. New York-AL)...They played two Game 7s in 1991, winning in the LCS at Pittsburgh, before losing in the World Series at Minnesota...They also won a Game 7 in the 1992 LCS vs. Pittsburgh.

A The Braves have lost nine consecutive playoff rounds (including the 2012 Wild Card game), dating to the 2001 League Championship Series against Arizona...That streak is the second longest in MLB history...Only Chicago (NL) owns a longer such skid, losing 10 consecutive rounds from 1910 through 1998.

FOLTYNEWICZ WINS: RHP Mike Foltynewicz is set to start tonight, and the Braves are 10-1 in his last 11 starts, including the postseason...The righty is 7-1 with a 2.37 ERA (17 ER/64.2 IP) during this stretch.

A Foltynewicz earned the win in Game 2...Only one Braves pitcher has ever won multiple games in the division series: Alejandro Peña earned two wins in Game 1 and Game 2 of the 1995 Division Series vs. Colorado...Peña came on in relief in both games.

A The last Braves starter to win multiple games in a single playoff round was RHP John Smoltz, who beat St. Louis twice in the 1996 NLCS...Smoltz won Game 1 and Game 5.

A Only 14 pitchers in MLB history have won two division series starts, with the last being RHP Jacob deGrom in 2015.

RISP: The Braves went 0-for-9 with runners in scoring position on Monday, and are now 4-for-34 (.118) in these situations for the series...Over the last two postseasons, the Braves have gone 6-for-49 (.122) with runners in scoring position.

A Over the last two regular seasons, the Braves lead the National League with a .272 (723-for-2,655) batting average in these situations...Their .360 on-base percentage is percentage points behind Los Angeles (.361) for the top spot as well.

ACUÑA JR IMPRESSES: OF Ronald Acuña Jr. has reached in 11 of his 19 plate appearances (.579 on-base percentage) this series, after recording four hits in Game 4 on Monday at St. Louis.

A Acuña Jr. had the Braves' first four-hit game in the postseason since Bret Boone also had four hits in Game 3 of the 1999 World Series.

A The outfielder had a double and triple on Monday...He has seven extra-base hits in eight career postseason games, tied with Bryce Harper for the most such hits by a player prior to his 22nd birthday in postseason history...Harper played in nine playoff games before turning 22.

BATTLE BACK FROM GAME 1: The Braves dropped Game 1 last Thursday and are 3-16 in postseason play when they drop Game 1...They last won a series when dropping Game 1 in 1999, when they lost 6-1 vs. Houston in the NLDS before going on to win the next three games.

A They also won the 1991 LCS over Pittsburgh after losing Game 1 and the 1957 World Series.

DUVALL STARTS: The Braves will start OF Adam Duvall in left field and batting sixth tonight, the first change to the 1-8 spots in the starting lineup this series...OF Matt Joyce played right and hit sixth in the first four games.

A Duvall is batting .429 with a homer and five RBI this series.

Tonight's Game

A Makes his fourth career postseason start...Is 1-1 with a 3.46 ERA (5 ER/13.0 IP) in his first three turns.

A Pitched Game 2 for Atlanta last Friday, and allowed just three hits over 7.0 scoreless innings...Did not walk a batter and struck out seven.

A Started Games 1 and 4 of the 2018 NLDS vs. Los Angeles...Allowed three hits and four runs over 2.0 innings to take the loss in Game 1, before allowing just two hits and one run over 4.0 innings in a no-decision in Game 4.

A In his last 11 starts, including the postseason, is 7-1 with a 2.37 ERA (17 ER/64.2 IP)...Atlanta is 10-1 in his starts.

A Started against St. Louis in Game 2 and pitched 7.0 scoreless innings, allowing three hits and striking out seven...He did not issue a walk.

A Became the first Atlanta starter to go 7.0 or more scoreless innings in a postseason game since Hall-of-Famer Tom Glavine went 8.0 scoreless frames in Game 2 of the 2001 NLDS against Houston.

A Foltyniewicz's outing was just the 17th time a Braves starter has gone 7.0 innings or more of scoreless ball in a playoff game, accounted for by 10 players...Of those 17 instances, only five other times had the pitcher given up no more than three hits...Glavine was also the last Brave to have one of these starts...He also allowed three hits in 7.0 scoreless frames in Game 7 of the 1996 NLCS, also against St. Louis.

A RH Kevin Millwood was the last Atlanta pitcher to strike out at least seven and not walk anyone in a postseason start...He did so twice in the 2002 NLDS against San Francisco, once in Game 2 (6.0 IP, 2 R, 0 BB, 7 K) and once in Game 5 (5.0 IP, 2 R, 0 BB, 7 K).

A Made 21 starts on the season for Atlanta and went 8-6 with a 4.54 ERA (59 ER/117.0 IP).

A Went just 2-5 and pitched to a 6.37 ERA (42 ER/59.1 IP) in 11 starts to open the season...Allowed a career high-tying eight runs on June 22 at Washington and was optioned to Triple-A Gwinnett following the game.

A Was recalled, August 5, and since his return from Gwinnett his 2.65 ERA was seventh lowest in the National League.

A Starts against the same opponent in consecutive turns for the sixth time in his career, and for the third time this season...Made back-to-back starts against Pittsburgh, June 6 and June 11, and against Toronto, August 28 and September 3.

A Is 2-1 with a 3.56 ERA (12 ER/30.1 IP) in his combined first starts, and 2-2 with a 3.51 ERA (10 ER/25.2 IP) in the second turn.

A Pitches an average of 1.0 inning fewer in the second leg.

2019 Recap

A Atlanta won each of his 12 starts from June 11 vs. Pittsburgh through September 20 vs. San Francisco, including each of his first nine turns since returning from his option to Gwinnett...Foltyniewicz went 7-0 with a 3.54 ERA (27 ER/68.2 IP) during the stretch.

A The run of team wins in his starts was the longest such streak of his career, and the longest by any Atlanta pitcher since the Braves won an MLB-record 23 straight starts by Kris Medlen from 2010 to 2012.

A Foltyniewicz's 12-game run was the longest by a starter in the National League this season...Houston won each of Gerrit Cole's final 13 starts of the season.

A Foltyniewicz went 7-0 during the stretch, which was the longest winning streak of his career...He had previously won six straight from June 7 to July 25, 2017.

A Was recalled by Atlanta, 8/5, and started at Minnesota the following day...Allowed five hits (two homers) and three runs in 5.1 innings.

A Proceeded to go 6-1 with a 2.65 ERA (17 ER/57.2 IP) in 10 starts after his recall...His ERA in that span was seventh best in the NL.

A Made six starts with the Stripers following his option on 6/22, and went 4-0 with a 2.67 ERA (10 ER/33.2 IP) and 31 strikeouts...Opponents batted .254/.299/.325 against him.

A Pitched to a 1.13 ERA (2 ER/16.0 IP) over his last three turns, and allowed opponents to hit just .179.

A Started, 5/14 vs. STL, for his 100th career start, all of which have come for Atlanta.

A Became the 20th pitcher to make 100 starts for the Braves since the team moved to Atlanta in 1966...Of the 20 pitchers to make 100 such starts, Foltyniewicz's 8.61 SO/9.0 IP at the time were most, and he stood as one of just two starters to strike out at least eight batters per 9.0 innings for Atlanta.

A Was activated off the 10-day injured list, 4/27, and made his first major league start of the season...Missed Atlanta's first 25 games.

A Placed on the injured list with a right elbow bone spur on March 28, retroactive to March 25.

A Acquired by the Atlanta Braves along with RHP Andrew Thurman and INF Rio Ruiz from the Houston Astros in exchange for C/OF Evan Gattis and RHP James Hoyt on 1/14/15.

- Has yet to allow a run in three relief appearances in the NLDS against St. Louis.
- Went 17-6 with a 4.02 ERA (74 ER/165.2 IP) in 33 appearances for Atlanta during the season, including 30 starts...In his three relief appearances, did not allow a run over 5.1 innings, walking three and fanning five.
- Appeared in relief in all four games of the 2018 NLDS, allowing one run and one hit in 2.1 innings.
- Pitched out of the bullpen in his last appearance, 9/28 at NYM...Struck out five in 3.2 scoreless innings.

Shane Greene • RHP • 6-4 • 200 • 30 yrs • #19

Saves/Opp: 1/3 **Holds:** 10 **1st Batter/Retired:** 27/19 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 4/4

- Scattered three hits and a run with three strikeouts in Game 4 of the NLDS against St. Louis, was credited with a blown save...Went 0-1 with a 4.01 ERA (11 ER/24.2 IP) in 27 games with the Braves, and 0-3 with a 2.30 ERA (16 ER/62.2 IP) in 65 games on the season...He has converted 23 of 28 save opportunities.
- Pitched to a 14.54 ERA (7 ER/4.1 IP) over his first six games with Atlanta...Pitched to a 1.77 ERA (4 ER/20.1 IP) in his final 21 appearances and converted his only save chance and all nine holds.
- Snapped a streak of 13 consecutive scoreless appearances on 9/7 vs. Washington...Held opponents to just four hits while striking out 14 through 13.0 innings during the streak...Logged his first save with Atlanta, 9/6 vs. WSH.
- Acquired from Detroit on 7/31 in exchange for LHP Joey Wentz and OF Travis Demeritte...At the time ranked fourth in the AL with his 22 saves, while his 1.18 ERA was the second lowest in baseball among qualifying relievers.
- Was 0-2 with 22 saves and a 1.18 ERA (5 ER/38.0 IP) with 43 strikeouts and 12 walks in 38 games out of the bullpen for the Tigers this season.

Luke Jackson • RHP • 6-2 • 210 • 27 yrs • #77

Saves/Opp: 18/25 **Holds:** 9 **1st Batter/Retired:** 70/44 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 26/12

- Pitched 1.1 scoreless innings in his second postseason appearance, 10/7...Went 9-2 with a 3.84 ERA (31 ER/72.2 IP) in 70 games this season...Converted 18 of his 25 save chances after logging just one career save prior to 2019.
- Had nine wins out of the bullpen, the most by a Braves reliever since Mike Remlinger had 10 in 1999...His nine wins tied for fifth most by a Braves reliever since 1913.
- Left-handers had just 17 hits in 108 at-bats (.157) against him...Righties batted .331 (59-for-178).
- Finished the season with 106 strikeouts, second most in the NL by a reliever behind Milwaukee's Josh Hader...Had a career-best 13.13 SO/9.0 IP ratio, sixth best in the NL.
- Recorded his second consecutive two-inning save, 5/15 vs. STL, to become the first Braves closer with back-to-back two-inning saves since Hall of Famer John Smoltz in 2002.

- Recorded his third postseason save and second of the series against St. Louis after being credited with a blown save in game one of the NLDS...Was 1-0 with a 3.60 ERA (4 ER/10.0 IP) and one save in 10 postseason appearances with Pittsburgh and Washington.
