METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets opened up their homestand with a 3-1 victory over the Colorado Rockies...The Mets will play 16 of its next 22 games in New York City...The Mets are 63-12 when scoring first this season...New York is 28-8-3 in 39 series this year...The Mets continue an 11-day, 10-game homestand (1-0), the second-longest of the year, against the Rockies (1-0), Dodgers (three games) and Nationals (three games).

TAKE THE TRAIN TO THE GAME!: With anticipated high attendance figures tomorrow and next week due to the U.S. Open, the Mets are encouraging fans to take mass transit and arrive early to enter the ballpark in order to avoid traffic delays.

TOMMIE AGEE SCHOOL NAMING CEREMONY: Earlier today, Queens school, I.S. 419 was officially named the Tommie L. Agee Educational Campus in honor of legendary Mets outfielder Tommie Agee...The new state-of-the-art school located right around the corner from Citi Field will serve students in grades 6-8...Members of Agee's family, teammates from the '69 Mets and President, Sandy Alderson attended the naming ceremony and celebrated the opening of the school.

TOTAL deGROMINATION: Jacob deGrom retired the first 13 batters he faced last night...He has eight perfect bids 4.0 or more innings since 2014, tied with Madison Bumgarner and Justin Verlander for third-most during that span...Teammate Max Scherzer and Clayton Kershaw each have nine...*Courtesy of Sarah Langs*...He leads all pitchers with 46 strikeouts, 0.55 WHIP, a .139 opponent's batting average and a 14.11 K/9 rate (min. 100 batters faced) in August...He improved to 6-1 with a 1.20 (nine earned runs/67.1 innings) in 10 career starts against the Rockies, the second-best mark by an active pitcher against any single opponent (min. 50.0 IP)...He is 4-1 with a 0.96 ERA (five earned runs/47.0 innings) in seven career starts against Colorado at Citi Field...He posted his 150th career quality start, the sixth-most in Mets history...Including last night, he has allowed three earned runs or fewer in 36 consecutive starts dating back to September 9, 2019, tied for the third-longest such streak in major league history with Claude Osteen (1965-1966)...He joined Corbin Burnes (2021) as the only pitcher with 40 or more strikeouts and a WHIP of 0.55 or lower through a pitcher's first five starts...deGrom has allowed two earned runs or fewer in his last 23 home starts dating back to September 9, 2019.

BIG BASSITT FISHING: Chis Bassitt is set to make his fifth start in August...He is 4-0 with a 0.69 ERA (two earned runs/26.0 innings) with four walks and 21 strikeouts this month...His 0.69 ERA is second in the majors this month...Over his last 14 starts, Bassitt has posted a 7-5 record with a 2.86 ERA (28 earned runs/88.0 innings) with 20 walks and 85 strikeouts...He is set to make his 13th start at home...He is 4-5 with a 2.55 ERA (22 earned runs/77.2 innings) with 17 walks and 81 strikeouts at Citi Field in 2022.

HOW STRIKING: The Mets have struck out 1,193 batters this season, which places them second in the majors...The team's 1,193 strikeouts are already the 11th-most in a single-season in franchise history...The franchise record is 1,520 set in 2019...Mets pitchers are averaging 9.58 K/9, a rate that if kept up or improved upon would have them eclipse the franchise record before the end of the season...More than one of every four batters to face Mets pitching has struck out this season (25.7 percent), the highest rate in the majors...The Mets have struck out 15 or more batters in a game eight times this year, which is the tied for the second-most in the majors...The team has struck out 10 or more in a game 64 times this year, the most in MLB...On the other side of the ball, the Mets have struck out 956 times this season...That is the fifth-fewest times in the majors and the second-fewest times in the Senior Circuit.

ON THE ROX: Starling Marte is a .358 (72-201) career hitter with 47 runs, nine doubles, three triples, seven home runs, 30 RBI, 11 walks with a .414 OBP and a .537 SLG in 50 career games against Colorado...Pete Alonso has hit .347 (17-49) with eight runs, two doubles, five home runs, 10 RBI, two walks with a .385 OBP and a .694 SLG in 13 career games against the Rockies.

TAP THE ROCKIES: Brandon Nimmo, who grew up about 100 miles from Denver, is a .329 (23-70) hitter with 14 runs, four home runs, 12 RBI, 10 walks with a .407 OBP and a .500 SLG in 20 games against his "hometown" team...He has recorded a hit in each of his last 14 games against the club, batting .375 (21-56) in that span with 11 runs, four home runs, 11 RBI and six walks with a 1.018 OPS.

RIGHT THE SHIP: The Mets own a 56-28 record when facing a right-handed starting pitcher this season...As a team, the Mets are batting .266/.335/.421 against righties...Their .266 average is the best in the majors, while their .335 OBP ranks second and their .421 SLG ranks sixth...Jeff McNeil is batting .323/.371/.483 against righties this year...His .323 average is third in MLB and second in the Senior Circuit.

THE GAME OF RISP: The Mets are batting .271 with runners in scoring position this season...Their .271 average is third in the majors as is their 296 hits, while their 429 RBI with RISP are second...Pete Alonso has hit 13 home runs and 76 RBI with RISP...His 13 home runs with RISP are the most in the majors, while his 76 RBI ranks second in the majors and tops the National League...The single-season franchise record for home runs with RISP is 15 by Todd Hundley in 1996...Four players including Alonso have recorded 13 home runs with RISP - Carlos Beltran (2006), George Foster (1983) and Darryl Strawberry (1987)...The single-season franchise record for RBI with RISP set by David Wright with 91 in 2006.

ROCKIES-METS NOTES: The Mets won the season series against the Rockies in 2019 and 2021, going 4-2 and 5-2, respectively...The Mets have won four straight and six of the last seven games against the Rockies in New York.

M-V-PETE: Pete Alonso has collected 24 game-winning RBI this year, tying a Mets single-season record also held by Keith Hernandez (1985)...According to STATS LLC, Joe Torre (1971 Cardinals) and Willie Mays (1962 Giants) share the MLB record with 27 game-winning RBI...Alonso has 10 more game-winning RBI than any other player in the majors this year...He has driven in the game-winning run in 10 of the Mets' 21 second-half wins.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso socked the 137th home run of his career last night...He did it in his 495th career games...Only Ryan Howard (153) and Aaron Judge (138) have hit more home runs through their first 500 career games...He is tied for fifth in MLB history in home runs through a player's first four career seasons...This includes the 60-game COVID-19 shortened 2020 season.

JUICY J: He leads the majors in batting average with a .407 (37-91) mark in the month of August...In 24 games this month, he is batting .407/.433/.615 with 13 runs, 13 doubles, two triples, 11 RBI and three walks...In 31 games following the All-Star break, McNeil is batting .367 (44-120) with 16 runs, 15 doubles, three home runs, 14 RBI, a .394 OBP and a .567 SLG...He is batting .313 (35-112) batting average against left-handed pitchers this year...That is the fourth-best mark by a lefty this year in the majors.

ON THE RECORD: New York has won 80 games this season, second-most in the NL and third-most in the majors...Their .635 winning percentage is third in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 80-46 record through the team's first 126 games...Only the 1986 (84-42) team posted a better record through the first 126 games of the season.

CITI SLICKERS: New York has won nine of its last 10 games at Citi Field and 13 of their last 15 at home...Overall, the Mets are 41-19 at home...They are fourth in the majors and second in the National League with a .678 winning percentage at home...The team's .683 winning percentage is currently the second-highest in team history...Only the 1988 (56-24, .700) had a better winning percentage at home...They are right above the 2000 and 1986 teams (both 55-26, .679)...The Mets have posted a 3.08 ERA with 170 walks and 597 strikeouts at Citi Field...The Mets own the second-best home ERA in the NL.

AND I WOULD PLAY .500 TEAMS: The Mets will face the 54-72 Rockies today...23 of the their 36 remaining games are against teams who currently have records below .500...The Mets are 43-17 against teams with a record below .500 this year, the fifth-highest winning percentage in MLB vs. sub-.500 opponents.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: The Mets have been in first place since April 12, a streak of 136 consecutive days...According to Elias, it's now the fourth longest-streak in franchise history.

LIFE IN THE FAST LANE: Edwin Diaz leads the major leagues among relievers with 98 strikeouts...That is 18 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He has done so in 50.1 innings...He is seeking to become the fastest player to record 100 strikeouts in a season in major league history...Aroldis Chapman currently owns the record, recording his 100th strikeout on August 4, 2012 in 51.0 innings...Armando Benitez owns the franchise record, recording his 100th strikeout on August 21, 1999 in 60.0 innings...Courtesy of Elias.

BASSITT NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his fourth consecutive win in as many starts after going 6.0 innings of two-run ball on August 19 in Philadelphia...Struck out four batters and did not allow a walk for the fourth time this season...Bassitt snapped his 28.0 innings without allowing an earned run, the longest-streak of his career...The streak was broken up after he allowed two runs in the fifth inning.

ALL I DO IS WIN: Bassitt has won four consecutive starts for the first time in his career allowing only two earned runs in that span...His four-start win streak is tied for the second-longest active streak in the majors behind only Tony Gonsolin with five straight...The last Met to win earn a win in four straight starts and allow two runs or fewer was Jacob deGrom (9/21/18 - 4/3/19)... 11 Mets pitchers have earned the win in five or more consecutive starts while allowing two runs or fewer...Zack Wheeler was the last to accomplish the feat when he won five straight starts from 7/24/18 - 8/15/18 without yielding more than two runs in any of those outings.

2022 SEASON, PART 2: In six starts since the All-Star Break, Bassitt has pitched to a 1.85 ERA (eight earned runs/39.0 innings) going 4-1, with 34 strikeouts and eight walks...He ranks eighth in the majors in ERA since the break (Min. 6 GS)...In his last four starts dating back to the trade deadline, Bassitt's 0.69 ERA ranks fourth in the majors (min. 20.0 IP)... Last year, Bassitt was 2-2 with a 2.75 post-All-Star Break ERA...He fanned 41 batters and walked 10 in eight games.

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE: Through 12 starts at Citi Field this season, Bassitt is 4-5 with a 2.55 ERA (22 earned runs/77.2 innings), 81 strikeouts and 17 walks...In his last seven starts at home, Bassitt owns a 1.54 ERA (eight earned runs/46.2 innings) with 50 strikeouts and nine walks...In 61 career home games (55 starts), he is 17-19 with a 2.57 ERA (101 earned runs/353.1 innings), 337 punchouts and 88 walks...His 2.57 career ERA at home is the third-best home ERA among active pitchers (min. 50 starts) behind Jacob deGrom (2.08), and Clayton Kershaw (2.22)

I WANNA ROCK: On June 30, 2015, Bassitt took the mound against the Rockies for the first time in his career going 5.0 innings, allowing only one run on five hits...The right-hander struck out three batters and did not walk a batter...Against the NL West this season, Bassitt owns a 7.16 ERA (26 earned runs/32.2 innings) with 11 walks and 41 strikeouts.

ANOTHER ONE: Recorded his 18th start of at least 6.0 innings in his last start, the most such starts in a single season for his career...His nine-game streak going 6.0 innings or more from 6/14 - 8/8 was the longest of his career...Bassitt has struck out six or more batters in 14 of his 22 starts, Max Scherzer is the only Mets starter with more games of six or more strikeouts with 15.

NO RUNS FOR YOU: Bassitt has allowed four or fewer runs in 13 of his last 14 games...His 11 consecutive starts allowing four runs or fewer is the longest streak in his career over the span of a single season...Chris Bassitt has allowed three or fewer runs in 10 of his last 11 starts...Bassitt's four-straight starts without allowing more than three runs is his fifth-longest such streak in a single season in his career.

DON'T GIVE IN TO PEER PRESSURE: Opponents are 5-36 (.139) with RISP against him since the All-Star break, the second-best mark in MLB (min. 30 batters faced)...This season, he is holding batters to a .188 batting average in those situations which ranks fourth in the NL and ninth in the majors (min. 100 batters faced).

LIVIN' IT UP IN THE CITI: His 138 strikeouts are the ninth-most and his 1.126 WHIP is the 7th-lowest in franchise history among starters through their first 23 games as a Met (Min 110.0 IP).

CAREER YEAR: Bassitt has generated 12 or more swings and misses in a 11 starts this season, a career-high...Tied a career-high set in 2021, with three starts this season going 7.0 innings or longer without allowing an earned run...Those three games are tied with teammate Max Scherzer for the second-most such games this season... The only pitcher on the Mets staff with more such games is Taijuan Walker who has done it four times...Set a career high after working 8.0 innings for the second time this season...Prior to this year, Bassitt had gone at least 8.0 innings one time in three separate seasons 2021, 2019, and 2015.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP DAVID PETERSON (6-3, 3.44 ERA)

LAST START: Suffered the loss on August 20 at Philadelphia in game two of a doubleheader...Tossed the 200th inning of his career in the contest...Allowed three runs on eight hits and two walks with six strikeouts through 4.2 innings... Gave up a career-high-tying eight hits, his most allowed this season.

FOUR-HIT WONDER: Has allowed four hits or fewer in 14 of his 19 games this season and 32 of 44 career games...Had allowed 163 hits through his first 43 career games...Among Mets hurlers, only Nolan Ryan (144 hits) allowed less hits in their first 43 major league games (min. 175.0 IP).

- His 104 RBI this year are tied for 20th in a single season in Mets history...Needs 10 RBI to enter the top-10...The Mets record is 124 RBI (done twice).
- Has eight multi-hit games in his last 10 contests vs. the Rockies...Is hitting .410 (16-39) with two doubles, four homers, nine RBI and seven runs in that span.
- Has 11 go-ahead RBI and 10 game-winning RBI in 33 games since the break...Leads the majors with 24 game-winning RBI and 32 go-ahead RBI this season... He has tied the Mets record for game-winning RBI (also, Keith Hernandez, 1985).
- Tied for fourth in MLB and tied for third in the NL with 31 homers...Ranks second in the NL and tied for third in MLB with 104 RBI...Tied for 13th in the NL with 72 runs.
- Ranks 11th in MLB and sixth in the NL with a .520 SLG...Is 13th in the majors and eighth in the NL with a .870 OPS...Is 18th in the NL in OBP (.350).
- Owns the MLB lead in games with at least four RBI (eight) and is tied for second in games with multiple RBI (27) this season.
- Batting .326 (15-46) with a 1.065 OPS against lefties since June 25...Prior to that date, was hitting .190 (11-58) with a .716 OPS vs. southpaws.
