**RECENT REDBIRDS:** The St. Louis Cardinals and Baltimore Orioles (former crosstown-rival St. Louis Browns) wrap up a three-game Interleague series this afternoon at Busch Stadium ... The Cardinals are in the midst of their 131st season of play in the National League, and begin the day in 2nd place in the NL Central, 2.0 games behind Milwaukee ... The homestand continues tomorrow as San Francisco Giants visit St. Louis for a three-game weekend series.

**ALL IN THE GAME, YO. ALL IN THE GAME:** Prior to today's game, the Cardinals announced that they activated INF **Edmundo Sosa** from the Injured List and optioned INF **Kramer Robertson** to Memphis (AAA) following last night's game ... In two injury rehab games with Springfield (AA), Sosa went 3-for-8 with a hit-by-pitch while playing shortstop ... RHP **Drew Verhagen** (right hip) will continue his injury rehab assignment tonight at Springfield.

**DONNIE, YOU'RE OUT OF YOUR ELEMENT:** Rookie **Brendan Donovan** last night reached base safely in all four plate appearances, hitting a pair of doubles, walking twice, and scoring three runs from the 9th spot in the lineup ... The last Cardinals rookie to collect 2+ hits, 2+ walks and 3+ runs in a game was **Albert Pujols** (May 13, 2001 vs. Chicago Cubs) ... The only other Cardinals rookie with a game featuring 2 doubles, 2 walks and 3+ runs in a game was **Stan Musial** (May 19 1942 at New York Giants).

**PUJOLS PASSES BONDS:** With his start at first base today, **Albert Pujols** will play in the 2,987th game of his career today, passing former Pittsburgh Pirates and San Francisco Giants outfielder **Barry Bonds** for 10th place all-time ... The future first ballot Hall of Famer is also three hits shy from tying **Eddie Collins** (3,313) for 10th all-time in MLB history.

**SLEDGEHAMMER:** **Jake Walsh** last night struck out four over 2.0 scoreless innings in his Major League debut ... Walsh became the 17th Cardinals reliever all-time to fan four or more in an MLB debut, but only the 5th Cardinal overall to do so while pitching 2.0 innings of fewer: **Dean Kiekhefer** (5/14/16) **Kevin Siegrist** (6/6/13), **Shelby Miller** (9/5/12), **Eduardo Sanchez** (4/13/11), and **Harry Fanok** (4/16/63)

**JUAN TO REMEMBER:** **Juan Yenez** has reached base in 14 of 29 plate appearances (12 H, 1 HBP, 1 BB) and hit safely in each of his first seven career games, longest by a Cardinal to begin an MLB career since **Magneuris Sierra** (first nine games in 2017) ... Yenez, who already ranks T-3rd among NL rookies in HR (2) and extra-base hits (5), and T-6th in hits (12) since being recalled on May 3, is the 7th Cardinal with 12+ hits through their first seven career games, with **Bo Hart** (18), **Enos Slaughter** (13), **Ken Reitz** (12), **Stan Musial** (12), **Joe Cunningham** (12), and **Terry Pendelton** (12).

**RISP-Y BUSINESS:** The Cardinals went 5-for-12 (.417) with runners in scoring position last night while driving in 7-of-10 with two outs ... Collectively this season, St. Louis ranks 4th in the NL in batting average with runners in scoring position (.283) ... With RISP, **Paul Goldschmidt** co-leads the NL in OBP (.600, T-1st) and ranks T-5th in average (.444, T-5th) while **Tommy Edman** ranks T-4th in hits (11).

**WE'RE GOING STREAKING:** **Paul Goldschmidt** has reached base safely in his last 18 games while posting a .462 on-base percentage (April 22-present), longest on the Cardinals and ranking 3rd-longest active in the National League ... **Dylan Carlson** is slashing .381/.381/.667 (8-21) over his season-high six game hitting streak ... **Yadier Molina** was the lone starter last night not to record a hit, which ended a season-best nine-game hit streak.

**LETS GO BLUES:** Good luck to the St. Louis Blues tonight as they look to clinch a series win over the Minnesota Wild in Game 6 of the West 1st Round from the Enterprise Center ... The last 16 times both St. Louis teams played on the same day, the Cardinals have gone 7-9 and the Blues 12-4 ... However, the last three times they two teams played on the same day, one team lost and the other team won.

**BABY BIRDS:** St. Louis and Baltimore Triple-A affiliates face off this morning when the Norfolk Tides host the Memphis Redbirds at Harbor Park at 11:05 a.m. CT ... Four of baseball's top prospects—C **Adley Rutschman** (No. 2 overall), RHP **Grayson Rodriguez** (6), 2B **Nolan Gorman** (31) & LHP **Matthew Liberatore** (41) will clash in the MLB Pipeline Game of the Month, which will be available to stream for free on MLB.TV ... Gorman's 12 home runs lead all of Triple-A, while Liberatore, who recently turned in back-to-back scoreless 7.0 IP starts, is tied for the Triple-A lead with 41 strikeouts.

#### BALTIMORE CONNECTIONS

**T.J. McFarland** pitched four seasons in Baltimore (2013-16), where he made his MLB debut.

**Ramon Urias** played two minor league seasons in the Cardinals organization (2018-19) ... claimed off waivers by Baltimore (Feb. 11, 2020).

**Chris Ellis** pitched parts of three minor league seasons in the Cardinals organization (2017-19)... originally joined the Cardinals with **John Gant** and **Luke Dykstra** from the Braves in the **Jaime Garcia** trade (Dec. 1, 2016).

**Harrison Bader** previously committed to play college baseball at the University of Pittsburgh and University of Maryland before receiving a partial scholarship from Florida.

Orioles EVP & GM **Mike Elias** spent five seasons as a scout with St. Louis, including over a year as the club's Manager of Amateur Scouting.

Orioles VP & AGM, Analytics **Sig Mejdal** worked for St. Louis for seven seasons (2005-11), spending his final year as the team's Director, Amateur Draft Analysis...began pro baseball career as a Quantitative Analyst for the Cardinals in 2005.

Orioles Assistant Pitching Coach **Darren Holmes** pitched in five games for St. Louis in 2000.

**Whitey Herzog** played 212 games as an outfielder for the Orioles over the 1961-62 seasons.

Cardinals Principal Owner and Chief Executive Officer **Bill DeWitt, Jr.** has been a prior owner of the Baltimore Orioles...his father, **William O. DeWitt**, began his baseball career in 1916 as a 14-year-old office boy with the St. Louis Browns, and later rejoined the organization as an executive and team owner, in the early 1940s...was majority owner of the Browns (1949-51) when Bill, Jr. served as the team's bat boy...DeWitt Jr.'s uniform (#1/8) was worn by **Eddie Gaedel** during his famous pinch hitting appearance on August 19, 1951.

Orioles Co-Hitting Coach **Matt Borgschulte** was born in St. Louis and graduated from Parkway Central High School in Chesterfield in 2009... Played collegiately at Western Kentucky and Drury University in Springfield, MO...began his pro coaching career with the Palm Beach Cardinals in the Cardinals organization in 2017...Prior to joining the Cardinals, coached at Southeast Missouri State Univ. in 2015-16 and spent 2014 as a volunteer coach at Drury Univ.

The St. Louis Browns played 52 seasons in the American League (1902-53), playing at Sportsman's Park and sharing the same ballpark with the Cardinals from 1920-53...Coinciding with the sale of the Cardinals and Sportsman's Park to Anheuser-Busch, the Browns relocated to Baltimore and were rebranded as the Orioles for the 1954 season.

In the only all-St. Louis World Series, Sportsman's Park hosted the 1944 World Series as the Cardinals defeated the Browns, 4-2, for their 5th World Series title in franchise history...dubbed the "St. Louis Showdown," "Trolley Series," and "Streetcar Series" as many fans used that mode of travel to and from the ballpark...third World Series in which both teams had the same home field (1921 & 1922 at New York City's Polo Grounds)...remains one of four World Series to feature teams from the same city (1906 Chicago & 1921-22 in New York)...first World Series where both teams played West of the Mississippi River...only World Series to date in which neither team was credited with a stolen base.

The Baltimore Orioles of the National League went 72-30 against the St. Louis Browns/Perfectos from 1892-99 before being eliminated by the NL... Upon the foundation of the American League in 1901, a reorganized Baltimore Orioles franchise competed as a charter member, before relocating to New York City after two seasons, where they ultimately became known as the New York Yankees.

The Cardinals defeated the Orioles, 4-1, in the 40th Hall of Fame Game at Cooperstown (Aug. 1, 1983)...St. Louis minor leaguer **Danny Cox**, who started and earned the win, would make his big league debut five days later against the Phillies... **Ken Oberkfell** hit a two-run home run.

TODAY'S GAME

- Makes his 148th career appearance (143rd start) and 7th start as a Cardinal.
- Is facing the Orioles for the 5th time in his career, with each of his previous four starts coming in 2021 as a member of the Toronto Blue Jays.
- Returned from Bereavement List prior to 5/7 start at Oracle Park, and allowed a career high 8 runs and 3 HR's in his 2.0 IP vs. SF Giants.
- Had his 3-game win streak (April 16-May 2) snapped in the 5/7 defeat at SF.
- Allowed just five runs over his three starts (20.2 IP) from April 22-May 2 for a 2.18 ERA after yielding seven in his Cardinals debut on April 10 vs. the Pirates at Busch Stadium.
- Allowed 10 of 34 total hits on the first pitch of at-bats this season, with the opposition hitting .714/.733/1.286 (10-14).
- Has allowed 17 runs & 4 HR in innings 1-3, but just 3 runs and 0 HR's in innings 4-6 this season.
- Owns a 9-5, 3.22 ERA career mark in the month of May in 22 starts.
- His 3.22 ERA in May is his best monthly career ERA of any month.
- Since 2021, his 17 total wins rank T3rd-most among MLB left-handers, trailing only Julio Urias (22) and Max Fried (18).
- Signed a four-year (2022-25) free-agent contract on November 29, 2021 before the lockout.
- St. Louis is his third MLB organization, entering his inaugural Cardinals season with a 45-48 record and 4.24 ERA in 141 games (136 starts) while pitching for the New York Mets (2015-20) and Toronto Blue Jays (2021).

LAST TIME OUT

- Returned from Bereavement List and lasted just 2.0 IP, allowing a career-high 8 runs and 3 HR's in a 13-7 loss to the Giants at Oracle Park.
- Allowed 1st inning grand slam HR to Wilmer Flores after an infield single & two walks.

CAREER

- Lifetime .684 winning percentage (13-6) in the month of April ranks 3rd among active pitchers with 18 or more career April decisions. Boston's Michael Wacha leads the list at .750 (18-6).
- Tied for the American League lead with 14 wins among left-handed pitchers in 2021.
- Since 2018, has compiled 150 or more innings pitched in each of baseball's three full seasons played in that span, and he is among just 16 lefties to have compiled 30 or more wins since 2018 and ranks 7th in games started (95).
- Finished 6th in the 2016 National League Rookie of the Year voting (Corey Seager, LAD), with a 9-8 record and 3.40 ERA (1.21 WHIP) across 22 starts.
- Started series-clinching Game 4 of the 2015 NLCS at Wrigley Field pitching 4.2 innings in a no decision. Became the first Mets pitcher born in New York to start a playoff game when he started vs. LAD in the 2015 NLDS.
- Appeared in six regular season games prior to starting Game 4 of the World Series vs. KC. That tied for the fewest career regular season games at the time a pitcher made his 1st World Series start...Marty Bystrom also had six regular season appearances before starting Game 5 of the 1980 World Series for the Phillies.
- Was the first Mets pitcher to begin his career 4-0 after five career games or starts.

2022 SEASON

- Scattered four hits over 6.0 shutout IP on 5/2 in a 1-0 win over the Royals at Busch. Earned his 3rd straight win behind a Paul Goldschmidt solo homer in the first inning.
- Won his second consecutive start in the series-opening 4-2 win in Cincinnati on Apple (4/22). His lone run allowed was a Brandon Drury RBI single in the 5th inning.
- Earned his first win as a member of the Cardinals with 5.2 scoreless innings on 4/16 at Milwaukee. Allowed a 1st inning double to Hunter Renfroe and did not allow another runner past first base the rest of his start.
