LET'S TRY THIS AGAIN: The Detroit Tigers and Baltimore Orioles today settle in for a Memorial Day weekend split doubleheader to conclude their three-game series here in the Charm City ... yesterday's rainout was Detroit's first postponement of the season after beginning the year with 52 scheduled games played ... after today's doubleheader, the Tigers will take tomorrow's holiday off before beginning a quick three-game homestand on Tuesday vs. the Los Angeles Angels.

- Following Friday's 7-4 loss in the series opener, the Tigers have now dropped 10 of their last 11 games and 15 of their last 17 games ... Detroit has endured a stretch of 15 losses in 17 games for the first time since a 2-15 run from April 16-May 4, 2021.
- Through their first 26 games, the Tigers went 14-12 and woke up on April 24 with a share of first place in the A.L. Central ... in their last 26 games since then, the Tigers have gone 6-20 to drop their record to 20-32 and alone in last place in the A.L. Central ... Detroit's 6-20 (.231) record starting April 24 is the lowest win percentage in baseball in this span.
- The Tigers are amidst their third losing streak of five or more games already this season ... this marks only the second time in the last 20 years that the Tigers have had three five-game or more losing streaks prior to June 1, joining the 2021 campaign.

SERIES-LY SPEAKING: The Tigers arrived in Baltimore winless in their last seven road series (0-6-1) since winning their first series of the season at San Diego ... it's the club's longest winless series stretch away from home since going 0-5-4 in nine-straight series from June 28-August 17, 2022 ... it's the first time Detroit has lost six out of seven road series since April 26-June 5, 2022 (also 0-6-1).

- The Tigers have lost their last five series overall and seven of their last eight series dating to April 24 after going 5-2-1 in their first eight series to begin the season ... the Tigers last lost five series in a row when they lost their final five regular season series of 2025.
- The Tigers today will aim to avoid dropping a sixth-straight series within the same season for the first time since April 15-May 6, 2021 (0-6).

THIS IS ON THE RECORD: At 20-32, the Tigers have reached 12 games below .500 for the first time this season and for the first time since waking up on September 15, 2023 with a 67-79 record ... the Tigers are in last place in the A.L. Central, 10.0 games behind the Guardians.

ROAD RASH: Detroit is 7-20 on the road thus far, a .259 winning percentage, the lowest road mark in the majors and the club's roughest 27-game road start since a 6-21 opening salvo in 2022 ... the Tigers have been 7-20 or worse through 27 road games just four times in franchise history: 2026, 2022, 1996 (6-21) and 1931 (6-21).

A FIRST 50 TO REMEMBER: Kevin McGonigle is 50 games into his big league career and leads all American League rookies with 53 hits, 12 doubles, a .285 batting average and a .393 on-base percentage ... he has 31 walks compared to only 29 strikeouts, one of only four big leaguers, rookie or non-rookie, with more walks than strikeouts (minimum 31 walks) this season.

- Since the year 1990, McGonigle is one of only four players with at least 53 hits and 31 walks in his first 50 major league games, joining Juan Soto (Nationals, 2018), Logan Morrison (Marlins, 2010) and Kosuke Fukudome (Cubs, 2008).
- McGonigle is the first player 21-years-old or younger with at least 53 hits and 31 walks in his first 50 major league games since Soto in 2018 with the Washington Nationals (53 hits, 32 walks), the first to do so with more walks than strikeouts since Tim Raines from 1980-81 with the Montreal Expos (55 hits, 31 walks, 21 strikeouts).
- McGonigle is the first player in Tigers history with 53 hits and 31 walks in his first 50 big league games ... the last Tiger with 53 hits in his first 50 big league games: Cameron Maybin (53) in 2016 ... only six Tigers, including McGonigle, had 53 hits in their first 50 games since 2000.
- Only three Tigers in the history of the franchise have 53 or more hits in their first 50 major league games at 21-years-old or younger: Kevin McGonigle (53 hits in 2026), Travis Fryman (60 hits in 1990) and Lou Whitaker (53 hits in 1977-78).

IT'S GOOD FOR SOMETHING: Kevin McGonigle has a 2.8 bWAR through his first 50 major league games, tied with Cody Bellinger for the second-best mark in the American League this season behind only Bobby Witt Jr (3.3 bWAR) ... Kevin is 21-years-old.

IT'S NOT EASY BEING GREENE: Riley Greene is now batting .374 (49-for-131) with 11 doubles, four homers, 18 RBI, a .468 on-base, a .550 slugging and a 1.017 OPS in his last 38 games over the past six weeks starting April 11 ... he leads the majors in on-base percentage and batting average in this span while ranking third in OPS behind only Nick Kurtz (1.028) and Byron Buxton (1.026).

AND FINALLY: The Tigers have seven hits or less in each of their last nine games, only their second such single-season streak in franchise history, joining a nine-game run from June 16-23, 1968 ... going back to 1901, the Tigers have never had seven hits or less in 10-straight games.

- Enters play today with a 2-3 record and a 4.58 ERA in 10 starts with Detroit...six of his 10 starts have been quality starts, but has allowed 21 earned runs over 17.1 innings in his other four.
- Allowed seven earned runs on nine hits including three home runs last time out against Boston...pitched 3.0+ innings and got ejected in the fourth after allowing back-to-back solo home runs.
- Tied his career high allowing eight earned runs including six in the first inning on April 8 against Minnesota...had previously surrendered eight earned runs twice, both with the Astros while facing the Angels.
- Spun six scoreless innings in his home debut and Detroit's home opener on Friday, April 3 against St. Louis.
- Made his Tigers debut on Friday, March 27 against San Diego...allowed one earned run on seven hits and a walk while striking out five over 6.0 innings.
- Signed with the Detroit Tigers as a free agent on Feb. 10, 2026...went 2-0 with a 0.98 ERA in four Spring Training starts for the Tigers.
- In 2025, led the Astros in wins (13) and innings (192)...marked the 3rd-highest win total of his career behind his 17 wins in 2022 and 15 wins in 2024...also led the team in starts alongside RHP Hunter Brown (31).
- Among AL pitchers on the 2025 season, finished 2nd in GB% (59.2), 2nd in opponent GIDP (22), 2nd in GIDP/9 (1.03), 5th in Pitching WAR (4.3), T-5th in quality starts (20), 6th in innings pitched (192.0), T-6th in wins, and 10th in opponent OPS (.667).
- Surpassed 1,000 career strikeouts in his start on July 28, 2025, vs. WSH, finishing the season with 1,053...surpassed 1,000 career innings during his start on July 5 at LAD last season.

- Made the third big league start of his career on May 20 against Cleveland, his first since Aug. 7, 2021, with the Texas Rangers against the Athletics...tossed 4.2 scoreless frames, allowing just two hits and two walks while striking out a career-high seven batters.
- Threw 4.0 scoreless innings on May 15 against Toronto, allowing just one hit while striking out one...was called upon for long relief after the original Tigers bulk pitcher left the game early with an injury.
- Earned his first win of the season and second of his major league career on April 30 against Atlanta, tossing 2.0 scoreless frames...allowed one hit and one walk while striking out two, keeping Detroit within a run before they took the lead late.
- Earned his first career major league save with 3.1 scoreless innings, allowing two walks while striking out two in a victory over the Marlins on April 11.
- Signed with Detroit on a one-year major league contract with a club option for the 2027 season on Dec. 16, 2025.
- Spent each of the previous two seasons with the SSG Langers of the KBO League...went 12-7 with a 2.25 ERA (43 ER/171.2 IP) in 30 starts for SSG last season, recording 245 strikeouts in his 171.2 innings pitched, an average of 12.8 strikeouts per nine innings.
- In his two seasons with SSG, went 23-10 with a 2.91 ERA (93 ER/287.1 IP) in 54 appearances (53 starts)...released by Detroit after nine appearances with Triple-A Toledo in 2024 prior to signing with the Langers.
- Has spent parts of five seasons with the Philadelphia Phillies (2017-19), Chicago White Sox (2020) and Texas Rangers (2021) prior to joining the Tigers this year...also pitched with Hiroshima in the NPB for the 2022-23 campaigns.

- Earned the win on Sunday Night Baseball on May 10 against Kansas City, delivering a perfect 2.1 innings with a strikeout.
- Optioned to Triple-A Toledo on April 22...recalled on April 29 after making one relief appearance with the Mud Hens...allowed one hit and one walk while striking out two over 2.0 innings in the outing.
- Earned the first Major League win of his career with a scoreless inning (one hit, two strikeouts) in his first appearance of the year on March 27 against San Diego.
- Posted a 2-0 record in the World Baseball Classic, helping Team Venezuela to a gold medal...struck out 11 batters with a 1.23 ERA (1 ER/7.1 IP) in the tournament.
- Had his contract selected by the Tigers on March 10, 2026, in the midst of the World Baseball Classic.
- Appeared and started in 30 games for the Kiwoom Heroes last season in the KBO with a 13-11 record and 3.68 ERA (72ER/171.1 IP), recording 171 strikeouts.
