TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners return to T-Mobile Park for the first game of a 4 game homestand against the Houston Astros...Seattle previously wrapped up their first road trip of 2026 where they traveled to face the Los Angeles Angels (1-2) and Texas Rangers (0-3)...tonight's game will be televised and streamed on **Mariners TV** and **KING 5** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Dave Valle** on the call, with **Ryan Rowland-Smith** serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners fell to the Rangers by a 3-0 score in Wednesday's series finale...7 of Seattle's 9 losses this season have been decided by 2 runs-or-fewer.

- **Long Division** - The Mariners today are playing their seventh of 10 consecutive divisional games... from April 3-22, Seattle is playing an AL West Division opponent in 16 of 19 games.
- **Programming Note** - In addition to being available on **Mariners TV**, tonight's game will also be available to be watched by fans in the Seattle area for free on **KING 5** as well as various affiliate stations in the Pacific Northwest...tonight's game is the first of 10 Friday home games that will be televised on KING 5.
- **The Fireman - Matt Brash** is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 4.0 IP) in 4 games this season...last season he set the Mariners record, beginning his season with 19 consecutive scoreless appearances.

ICHIRO'S STATUE UNVEILED TODAY...today, **Ichiro Suzuki** became the third Mariners legend to be honored with a statue outside of the ballpark, joining Ken Griffey Jr. and Edgar Martinez...legendary broadcaster Dave Niehaus is also honored with a statue on the centerfield concourse...fans attending tonight's game will have the first chance to see Ichiro's statue and the first 40,000 fans in attendance for will also receive a replica of the statue.

ELITE ARMS...the Mariners pitching staff has been stellar to begin the season, posting a combined 2.62 ERA (34 ER, 116.2 IP) that ranks 3rd in the Majors behind the Braves (2.03) and Yankees (2.35)...the Mariners pitching staff has held opponents to a .209 batting average...Seattle's 0.95 WHIP **leads the American League**, ranking 2nd in MLB to Atlanta (0.91)...the Mariners also **lead the Majors** in fewest walks-per-9 innings (2.01) and rank 2nd in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.58) in the early-going...Seattle ranks 4th in MLB in fewest hits-per-9 innings (6.56).

TERRIFIC AT T-MOBILE...since 2023, Seattle owns a 148-102 (.592) record when playing at T-Mobile Park, the 4th best home record in the Major Leagues during that span...over the Mariners first homestand, they drew 239,504 total fans during, the 6th-highest total in MLB this season behind only the Giants, Blue Jays, Dodgers, Padres and Yankees...an average of 34,214 fans watched the Mariners at T-Mobile Park through 7 games.

SEATTLE SUITS YOU, BRENDAN...in 30 plate appearances at T-Mobile Park this season, **Brendan Donovan** is batting .417 (10x24) with 4 runs, 2 doubles, 2 home runs, 4 RBI, 1 stolen base and 4 walks...he has reached base safely in all 7 games played at home in 2026, recording 18 total bases, the most total bases in a 7 game span by a Mariners player to begin a stint with the franchise since Abraham Toro (23 TB, 2021) and Kyle Lewis (23 TB, 2019)...overall this season, Donovan is batting .316 (12x38) with 5 runs, 2 doubles, 3 home runs, 5 RBI, 5, walks and 1 stolen base, reaching base at a .422 clip and slugging .605 (1.027 OPS) with a 210 OPS+ in 11 games.

HOMESTAND HIGHLIGHTS...the current 4 game homestand against the Houston Astros features a number notable events and promotions, including **Ichiro Replica Statue Night** tonight, **Humpy Shoulder Plush Night** tomorrow, **Ichiro Statue T-Shirt Day** on Sunday and the first **Value Game** of the season on Monday...tickets and more information can be found at Mariners.com/Tickets.

"THE CAL RALEIGH SHOW" RETURNS..."The Cal Raleigh Show" presented by the Puyallup Tribe returns for a second season on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)**...the show, hosted by Mariners insider **Shannon Drayer**, features in-depth conversations with Mariners star catcher, **Cal Raleigh**...the program will air **every Thursday**, usually at 5:00 p.m. PT, moving into an earlier slot when the Mariners play in different timezones...'catch' all of the episodes on SeattleSports.com or on the Seattle Sports app.

MARINERS TV...Mariners TV brings Mariners Baseball to fans across television and streaming services throughout the region...in-market streaming is be available on Mariners.TV for \$99.99/season or \$19.99/month...Mariners TV is available across major providers including XFINITY, DIRECTV, Fubo, Spectrum and more...fans can use the channel finder tool on Mariners.com/Watch to find providers in their area.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...the Mariners have a dominant starting rotation who have posted a combined 2.92 ERA with a Major League-leading 8 quality starts so far this season, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...since the 2022 season, Seattle's starting pitchers lead all MLB starting pitching staffs with a 3.72 ERA, ranking ahead of the next closest Astros (3.74 ERA) and Dodgers (3.78)?...during that timeframe, 3 Mariners starters also rank in the top 10 in quality starts in the American League: **Logan Gilbert** (T-4th, 65 G), **George Kirby** (T-4th, 65 G) and **Luis Castillo** (6th, 62 G).

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - APRIL 10

- **1977** - The Mariners Juan Bernhardt hits the first home run in club history off Angels left-hander Frank Tanana in the Kingdome.
- **1989** - In their respective Kingdome debuts, the veteran Jeffrey Leonard and the rookie Ken Griffey Jr. each hit home runs to pace the Mariners to a 6-5 victory over Chicago before an Opening Night crowd of 33,866...Junior's homer comes in his first Kingdome at bat.
- **1992** - Ken Griffey Jr. hits the first 3rd-deck home run of his career to seal the Mariners first win of the season, a 9-3 triumph vs. Kansas City.
- **1994** - Randy Johnson strikes out Toronto's Mike Huff to become Seattle's all-time strikeout leader with 1,079 K's, passing Mark Langston.
- **1998** - Randy Johnson records his 15th career 15+ strikeout game on Opening Day at Fenway Park...he gets a no decision and the Mariners lose, 9-7.
- **2010** - Félix Hernández broke the club record for most consecutive quality starts, notching his 15th straight...he broke Erik Hanson's previous streak of 14 consecutive quality starts.

ABOUT EMERSON HANCOCK...

- The 26-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 3rd start of the season...
• Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (6th overall) of the 2020 MLB First-Year Player Draft...
• Spent 3 seasons at the University of Georgia, 2018-20...
• Was named to CoSIDA Academic All-America First Team in 2020.

LAST TIME OUT...Threw 6.2 innings of 1-run ball in his April 4 start vat the Angels...allowed 1 run (1 ER) on 6 hits and a homer, walked no batters and struck out 5...threw 82 pitches (58 strikes)...marked the first time in his career he has recorded back-to-back starts with 5-or-more strikeouts and 6.0+ IP.

HOME TURF...Across his last 8 appearances at home (5/29/25-3/29/26) he is 3-1 with a 1.91 ERA (8 ER, 37.2 IP), only 1 home run, 10 walks, 33 strikeouts and a 0.699 WHIP...he has allowed 3-or-fewer runs in 14 of his 18 career starts at T-Mobile Park, tossing 5.0+ innings in 14 starts.

WELCOME APRIL...Over four starts in April, since 2025, he has gone 1-1, recording a 3.04 ERA (8 ER, 23.2 IP) with 20 strikeouts and 4 walks for a 5.00 K/BB...3-of-4 starts in April since 2025 have been quality starts with 2-or-fewer walks, while he has thrown 5.0+ innings with 3-or-fewer runs scored in all 4 April starts since 2025.

FACING THE ASTROS...Tonight's game will be Hancock's first time facing the Astros in T-Mobile Park...has faced the Astros only once since he made his 3rd career MLB start in Houston in 2023...he pitched 2.0 innings and allowed 2 hits, no runs, no walks, and struck out 2 batters in his August 20, 2023 start at Houston...recorded a quality start in his 2nd time facing the Astros on May 23, 2025 at Houston.

FRIDAY NIGHT LIGHTS...Will make the 4th Friday night start of his career...the Mariners are 3-0 when Hancock starts on a Friday night...he has pitched 5+ innings in 3-of-3 starts, with 2 being quality starts, and allowed 3-or-fewer runs and 2-or-fewer walks in each of these outings...his last Friday night start was against Houston on May 23, 2025.

NO HITS HERE...In his first start of the 2026 season on March 29 vs Cleveland he threw a career high 9-strikeouts over 6.0 no-hit innings...he became the 2nd player in franchise history to toss 9+ SO without a hit allowed, joining Félix Hernández who threw 12 SO in his Perfect Game on Aug. 15, 2012 vs. Tampa Bay... is the first Mariners starter with 6.0+ IP and no hits allowed since James Paxton's threw a no-hitter (5/8/18 at TOR).

SWINGS AND MISSES...Has recorded 12 swinging strikeouts over his last 2 starts, throwing a career-high 8 in his first start of the season...his 8 swinging strikeouts on April 4 are the 3rd most thrown in a game among MLB pitchers in 2026.

GETTING IT DONE...Is 1-of-6 pitchers so far this season to have multiple outings with 6.0+ IP, 5+ strikeouts, and 1-or-fewer walks...of these pitchers he is 1-of-3 to have only pitched 2 times in 2026.

EFFECTIVE AND EFFICIENT...Became the third pitcher in Mariners history and the second starter to record 7-or-more strikeouts with no walks in 4.0-or-less innings pitched on 9/25/25 against Colorado (also: Yusei Kikuchi as a starting pitcher, 6/5/21 at LAA, and Roy Thomas as a relief pitcher, 4/23/1983 at DET).

LENGTH ON THE MOUND...Has tossed 6.0+ innings in 12 of his 33 career starts, including 6 times during the 2025 season and already twice in the 2026 season (last: 4/4 vs. LAA)...the Mariners are 8-4 when he tosses 6.0+ innings compared to 13-10 when he tosses less than 6.0 innings...has also tossed 5.0+ innings in 24 of 33 career starts, doing so in both of his starts this season.

LIGHTS OUT...Was one of 4 Mariners pitchers to toss 7.0+ shutout innings during the 2025 season after doing so in his July 15 start against the Guardians, joining Luis Castillo (done 2x, 5/19 at CWS and 7/5 vs. PIT), Bryan Woo (6/17 vs. BOS) and George Kirby (8/12 at BAL).

2025 SEASON...Went 4-5 with a 4.90 ERA (49 ER, 90.0 IP), 64 strikeouts and 31 walks across 22 appearances (16 starts).

QUICK TRIP TO TACOMA...was 1-2 with a 5.24 ERA (26 ER, 44.2 IP) with a 1.54 WHIP and 56 strikeouts across 11 games (9 starts) with Triple-A Tacoma during the 2025 season...between the 2024 and 2025 seasons, he is 8-5 with a 4.01 ERA (62 ER, 139.0 IP), 1.37 WHIP and 122 strikeouts across 28 appearances (26 starts) with Tacoma...tossed a complete game shutout across 9.0 innings on July 21, 2024 with Tacoma.
