**THE HUNT FOR A RED OCTOBER:** The Cardinals begin their final homestand of the season tonight with the opener of a three-game series against the division-rival Chicago Cubs. The Cardinals recently went 5-2 over a seven-game road trip through Chicago (4-0) and Arizona (1-2)...with three games remaining, St. Louis entered play today in first place in the NL Central, 1.0 game ahead of the Brewers. St. Louis clinched its first postseason berth since 2015 with Sunday's win.

**DIVISION DANDIES:** The Cardinals are seeking their first NL Central title since 2015 and a share of their 12th overall (co-winners with Houston in 2001)...the Cardinals have won outright NL Central titles in 1996, 2000, 2002, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2009, 2013, 2014 & 2015 since the division was formed in 1995. Their magic number for clinching the NL Central title stands at three over Milwaukee.

**TIME TO FLY:** Since August 9, the Cardinals are 32-14, leading MLB in wins while boasting a MLB-best 3.09 ERA and eight shutouts in that span...the Cardinals lead the NL in win pct. (.46-25; .648) since the All-Star break and are T2nd in the NL (Milwaukee, 20) in September wins (15).

**CLOSE CALLS:** The Cardinals have won their last four games over the Cubs by one run, which came last weekend as St. Louis recorded their first four-game series sweep of the Cubs at Wrigley Field since May 27-29 [2], 1921. The one-run win streak ties the longest in franchise history established by 1921 Cardinals, who defeated the Cubs by one run in all four games of back-to-back doubleheaders on September 5-6 at Busch Stadium 1. The last time St. Louis defeated any opponent by one run in five straight was a franchise record of six wins over the Phillies (May 10-July 20, 1928). Overall this season, seven St. Louis' nine wins over Chicago have been by one run, matching the 1943 Cardinals (seven of 13 wins) for the franchise's most one-run wins over the Cubs in a season.

**CUB KILLERS:** The Cardinals have won five in a row over the Cubs (August 1-present), their longest win streak over their division rivals since six straight from May 12-July 30, 2011. St. Louis is 5-1 vs. the Cubbies this season at Busch, the club's best home mark over Chicago since going 8-1 at Busch Stadium II in 2002. The 1961 Cardinals were 11-0 over the Cubs at Busch Stadium I.

**TAKING CARE OF BUSINESS:** St. Louis is 45-28 (.616) in divisional play, including a 30-11 (.731) mark since the All-Star Break...its .616 divisional win pct. leads the NL Central and is its 4th best all-time vs. the NL Central since 1994 (1996 Cardinals were 37-15, .712). A win tonight would give St. Louis a winning record vs. all NL Central opponents for the first time since 2015 (46-30 vs. NL Central).

**THE EDMAN EFFECT:** Rookie **Tommy Edman**, who ranks among NL September leaders in total bases (60, 1st), hits (31, 2nd), runs (20, T3rd), times on base (40, T3rd), SLG (.659, 6th), OPS (1.059, 8th), made his MLB debut on June 8 at Wrigley Field as the Cardinals fell to 31-31 that night...since then, the Cardinals are 59-38 (.608 win pct.). Edman has reached base safely in 15 straight (Sept. 10-present) and hit safely in a career best eight in a row (.441, 15-34)...seven have been multi-hit efforts, including the last five in a row that ties **Yadier Molina** (Aug 26-Sept. 1) for longest streak of multi-hit games by a Cardinal this season.

**STRENGTH IN NUMBERS:** The Cardinals and the 2019 Dodgers as the only teams in NL history to have 11 or more players hit 10+ homers. St. Louis is also seeking just its second trio of 30+ HR players, done only in 2004 by the MV3 of **Albert Pujols (46)**, **Jim Edmonds (42)** and **Scott Rolen (34)**...**Paul Goldschmidt (33)** is pacing the Cardinals in 2019, with **Marcell Ozuna** & **Paul DeJong** both at (29).

**BASH & DASH:** The 2019 Cardinals (204 HR, 115 SB) are just the 3rd team in franchise history to have recorded 200+ HR and 100+ stolen bases in the same season, joining the 2004 (214 HR, 111 SB) and 1998 (223 HR, 133 SB) squads.

**HOLLIDAY SHOPPING LIST:** Not since 2012 (**Matt Holliday**, 102), has a Cardinal collected 100+RBI...**Paul Goldschmidt** is currently leading the Cardinals with 95, including 58 since the All-Star break (2nd in NL) and 22 in September (T1st, NL).

**THIS DATE IN CARDINALS HISTORY (September 27, 1942):** The Cardinals establish a new club record with 106 wins after a doubleheader sweep of the Cubs at Sportman's Park on the final day of the season, finishing two games ahead of the Brooklyn Dodgers to claim the National League Pennant and defeating the New York Yankees in five games in the World Series.

#### CHICAGO CONNECTIONS

**Dexter Fowler** played two seasons (2015-16) with Chicago...member of 2016 World Series champions...initially became a Cub via trade by the Astros for **Dan Straily** and **Luis Valbuena** (Jan. 19, 2005).

**Paul DeJong** graduated from Antioch (Ill.) Comm. High School...played college baseball at Illinois State University (2013-15) while majoring in biochemistry and pre-medicine.

**Daniel Ponce de Leon** was selected by the Cubs in the 14th round of the 2013 MLB Draft after his junior season, but failed his physical due to concerns about the ulnar nerve placement in his right elbow.

**Kolten Wong** (August 13, 2016 at Wrigley Field), **Dakota Hudson** (July 28, 2018 at Busch Stadium), **Tyler O'Neill** (April 19, 2018 at Wrigley Field), **Andrew Knizner** (June 2, 2019 at Busch Stadium), and **Tommy Edman** (June 8, 2019 at Wrigley Field) all made MLB debuts against the Cubs.

**John Brebbia** earned his first Major League win against Chicago (June 17, 2018).

**Mike Maddux's** younger brother, **Greg Maddux**, was a Hall of Fame pitcher for Chicago for parts of 10 seasons (1986-92, '04-06)...originally selected by the Cubs in the 2nd round of the 1984 MLB draft.

**Tommy Edman** (junior) and **Nico Hoerner** (freshman) were teammates at Stanford University in 2016.

**Jason Heyward** played the 2015 season with St. Louis...originally traded by Atlanta with pitcher **Jordan Walden** to St. Louis for pitchers **Tyrell Jenkins** & **Shelby Miller** (Nov. 17, 2014).

As compensation for the departure of Heyward signing with the Cubs, **Dakota Hudson** was selected by St. Louis with the 34th overall pick in the first round of the 2016 MLB draft.

**Daniel Descalso** played parts of five seasons in a Cardinals uniform (2010-14)...appeared in 44 postseason games and was a member of the 2011 World Champion Cardinals...originally selected by St. Louis in the 3rd round of the 2007 MLB Draft.

**Steve Cishek** appeared in 27 games with St. Louis in 2015...originally traded by the Marlins to St. Louis for **Kyle Barraclough** (July 24, 2015).

**Rowan Wick** was selected by St. Louis as a catcher in the 9th round of the 2012 MLB draft...played/pitched six minor league seasons in the Cardinals organization before selected off waivers by San Diego (Feb. 16, 2018).

Cardinals broadcaster and Hall of Fame outfielder **Jim Edmonds** played part of 2008 with the Cubs.

Cubs Coach **Lester Strode** pitched for the Triple-A Louisville Redbirds (1987-88) in the Cardinals' minor league organization.

Cubs Catching Coach **Mike Borzello** played four seasons (1991-94) in the Cardinals minor league system...originally selected by St. Louis in 1991.

Cardinals VP/General Manager **Michael Girsch** is a Chicago native...graduated from the University of Notre Dame and the University of Chicago.
