DODGERS-METS NOTES: Last season, the Mets won the season series over the Dodgers, 4-3...It was the first time the Mets won the season series over Los Angeles since 2015 (Also: 4-3).

CH-CH-CHANGES: After review, Major League Baseball has announced the following change...In the April 27 game vs. Washington, the winning pitcher is being changed from Brooks Raley to David Robertson...As a result there was no save in that game...Raley's updated record is 0-1, while Robertson's is 3-2 with 12 saves.

IF YOU START ME UP: From July 4-7, New York's starting pitcher completed 6.0 innings or more in four straight games for the second time this season (also, May 30-June 2)...The Mets are 27-4 when the starting pitcher throws at least 6.0 innings...New York has gone 11-1 when its starter pitches 7.0+ innings and are a perfect 4-0 when the starter completes 8.0 innings.

JUNIOR METS: The New York Mets hosted a Junior Mets clinic at Citi Field for the local youth baseball leagues who were recipients of the first Amazon' Mets Foundation League Sponsorship RFP Program...The youth players practiced their hitting, fielding, and sliding skills with Mets staff and coaches of their respective leagues...The athletes met Mr. & Mrs. Met and received tickets to a future game at Citi Field.

SEEING DODGER BLUE: In 33 games against the Dodgers, Brandon Nimmo owns a .347/.429/.520 slashline...During the Mets three-game series against the Dodgers in April, Nimmo batted .571 (8-14) and went 5-5 with a home run and two RBI in the series finale on April 19...In 24 career games against the Dodgers, Pete Alonso has seven home runs and a .553 SLG

HERE COME THE IRISH: Tonight, Notre Dame Head Football Coach Marcus Freeman and several members of the Notre Dame Football Team will be on hand to throw out the ceremonial first pitch tonight.

GETAWAY CAR: New York has been successful in all 10 of their stolen base attempts in July, bringing their season tally to 71 steals in 78 attempts...Their 71 steals are tied for ninth in the majors and tied for fifth in the NL...The team's 91.0 percent success rate is the best in the majors...The Mets had a franchise-record run of 35 consecutive stolen bases without being caught from May 14-June 29...Overall, New York has been successful in 45 of their last 46 stolen base attempts...Starling Marte has swiped 23 bags this year, sixth in the majors and third in the National League...His 337 career stolen bases rank second among active players...Elvis Andrus is the active leader with 341 steals.

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets return to action following the All-Star Break...Prior to the break...New York begins the second-half with a seven-day, six-game homestand against the Los Angeles Dodgers (three games) and the Chicago White Sox (three games).

VIVE LA METS!: New York has posted a 6-2 record in July after going 7-19 in June...The team's six wins in July are tied for the most in the National League...The Mets have posted a 2.66 ERA (21 ER/71.0 IP) with 27 walks and 74 strikeouts this month...Their 2.66 ERA is the fourth-best mark in the majors and second-best in the National League.

JUST THE TWO OF US: Pete Alonso and Francisco Lindor are one of three pairs of teammates to have 60 or more RBI this season, joining Atlanta's Matt Olson and Ozzie Albies and Los Angeles-NL's Mookie Betts and J.D. Martinez...The duo also recorded 60+ RBI before the All-Star Break last season...Prior to 2022, only three other times have the Mets had pairs of teammates drive in 60 or more runs before the All-Star Break...David Wright and Carlos Beltrán both drove in 60+ RBI before the All-Star Break in 2006 and 2008...Bernard Gilkey and Todd Hundley both drove in 60+ RBI before the All-Star Break in 1996.

JULY, JULY, JULY: New York has slashed .254/.361/.473 this month, while hitting 14 home runs...The team's 14 blasts are the third-most in the majors...New York has outscored their opponents, 41-25 this month...They rank among MLB leaders for July in OPS (.835, third), OBP (fifth), SLG (sixth), and walks (33, sixth).

ATTABOY ALVAREZ: Francisco Alvarez has 17 homers this season, tied with Sean Murphy for the most by a catcher in the majors and the third-most among rookies...Alvarez has eclipsed Travis d'Arnaud's previous franchise record for home runs by a rookie catcher...Alvarez's 17 home runs are the second-most in a season by a catcher in his age-behind Johnny Bench (26, age 21, 1969)...Courtesy of Sarah Langs...Alvarez has five long balls in his last eight appearances and has scored at least one run seven out of eight games during the month of July...On July 7, Alvarez had his first career four-hit game...He is the youngest Met to collect four or more hits in a game since José Reyes recorded four hits on July 25, 2004 vs. Atlanta at 21 years and 44 days.

SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT: Over his last 20 games, Francisco Lindor is batting .338 (25-74) with 18 runs, three doubles, two triples, seven home runs, 16 RBI, 11 walks and seven steals with a 1.137 OPS...Lindor ranks among NL leaders in fWAR (3.1, seventh), RBI (60, eighth), extra-base hits (41, tied for eighth), home runs (19, tied for 10th) and doubles (20, tied for 12th)...From July 6 - 7, Lindor became the only player in the Modern Era to have two eight or more hits, multiple home runs, multiple triples and multiple stolen bases over a two-game span...Courtesy of Stats Perform.

HITTING STRIDE: Over his last five starts dating back to June 14, Justin Verlander has pitched to a 2.03 ERA (7 ER/31.0 IP), the eighth-best mark in the majors during that span (Min. 27.0 IP)...Verlander sported a 4.85 ERA (21 ER/39.0 IP) in his first seven starts of the season...After allowing six runs over 5.0 innings in his Mets Citi Field debut on May 16, Verlander has pitched to a 0.84 ERA (3 ER/32.0 IP) over his last five home starts.

DR. ROBERTSON: On July 4-5, David Robertson recorded a save on back-to-back days for the third time this season (also, April 15-16 and May 30-31)...He recorded his 12th save of the year Wednesday night...The veteran right-hander has posted a 3-2 record with 12 saves and a 2.06 ERA (9 ER/39.1 IP) in 36 appearances this season...He has walked 11, while striking out 46...He ranks eighth in ERA among NL relievers...He is tied for 19th in the NL with 46 punchouts as a reliever...He is holding left-handed hitters to a .187 (14-75) average this year.

JUST IN TIME: Max Scherzer and Justin Verlander swapped places on the all-time strikeouts leaderboard all season long in 2022...Now teammates in 2023, the pair are neck and neck, with just 39 punchouts separating the two...With 116 more strikeouts, Verlander can enter the top-10...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time:

BROOKS WAS HERE: Since returning from the IL on May 14, Brooks Raley has posted a 0.90 ERA (2 ER/20.0 IP) over 24 games...That is the fifth-lowest mark during that span (Min. 15 relief appearances)...Raley has 17 holds, the third-most in the NL and tied for the fifth-most in the majors.

VERLANDER NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Allowed three runs, two earned over 6.0 innings of work on July 7 against the Padres at Petco Park...Surrendered five hits, issued three walks and struck out two.

MILESTONES AND MORE: Tonight, Verlander will make his 495th career start...With five more starts after tonight, Verlander will join CC Sabathia (560), Bartolo Colon (552), Zack Greinke (532) and Andy Pettitte (521) as the only pitchers to make 500 starts in the Wild Card Era...Verlander ranks 25th in major league history with 333 quality starts and is four quality starts shy of tying Walter Johnson, Jim Palmer and Rick Reuschel for 22nd all-time... Verlander is the active leader in career wins with 247 and is three wins shy of becoming the 49th player in major league history to reach the 250-career win mark.

HITTING STRIDE: Over his last five starts dating back to June 14, Verlander has pitched to a 2.03 ERA (7 ER/31.0 IP), the eighth-best mark in the majors during that span (Min. 27.0 IP)...Verlander sported a 4.85 ERA (21 ER/39.0 IP) in his first seven starts of the season... After allowing six runs over 5.0 innings in his Mets Citi Field debut on May 16, Verlander has pitched to a 0.84 ERA (3 ER/32.0 IP) over his last five home starts.

GO WEST YOUNG MAN: In 21 career starts against NL West opponents, Verlander is 14-2 with a 2.52 ERA (39 ER/139.1 IP), a 1.00 WHIP, a 10.33 SO/9 rate and a .581 opponent's OPS...17 of those starts have been quality starts and Verlander has recorded eight or more strikeouts in 10 of those starts.

3K AND COUNTING: Entering the 2023 season, Verlander was 12th on the all-time strikeout list with 3,198 strikeouts, five ahead of teammate Max Scherzer...Scherzer has since passed Verlander, but the pair remain close, with just 39 separating the two...Entering last season, Verlander ranked 19th on the all-time with 3,013 career strikeouts, seven behind Scherzer... During the 2022 season, Verlander passed all-time greats John Smoltz, C.C. Sabathia, Curt Schilling, Bob Gibson, Pedro Martinez and Fergie Jenkins...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time:

A TRUE COMEBACK STORY: In 2022, Verlander returned to the mound for the first time since July 24, 2020 and had a tremendous season after fully recovering from Tommy John Surgery...Verlander went 18-4 with a 1.75 ERA (34 ER/175.0 IP) in 28 starts with the Astros last season in route to his third career Cy Young Award and American League Comeback Player of the Year...His ERA was the lowest by an American League pitcher in a full season since Pedro Martinez had a 1.74 ERA (42 ER/217.0 IP) in 2000...It was the third-lowest ERA by an AL pitcher and the ninth-lowest in the majors in a single season in the Divisional ERA (1969)... Verlander led the AL in ERA, wins, WHIP (0.83), opponent OPS (.497), opponent average (.186), opponent slugging percentage (.297) and hits per nine innings (5.97)...At 39 years and 227 days, Verlander became the fourth oldest Cy Young Award winner in major league history behind Roger Clemens (2004, 42 years, 60 days), Gaylord Perry (1978, 40 years, 17 days) and Early Wynn (1959, 39 years, 267 days).

LIKE A FINE WINE: Verlander's ERA last season was the second-best in major league history by a pitcher age 39 or older behind Cy Young's 1.26 ERA in 1908 during his age 41 season (Min. 20 starts)...His 0.83 WHIP last season was the highest mark by a pitcher age 39 or above in major league history (Min. 20 starts)...Verlander's 185 strikeouts last season were the most by a pitcher in a season age 39 or older since John Smoltz struck out 197 batters in his age 40 season in 2007...His 18 wins at 39 were the most at the age since Mike Mussina won 20 games in his age 39 season in 2008.

THE RÉSUMÉ SPEAKS FOR ITSELF: Verlander is one of 11 pitchers with at least three Cy Young Awards...In 2011, Verlander took both the AL Cy Young and the AL MVP after winning the AL pitching triple crown after leading the league in after leading the league in wins (24), strikeouts (250) and ERA (2.40)...He is one of 11 pitchers to win both a Cy Young and MVP in the same season...Verlander and Don Newcombe are the only pitchers in major league history to have won Rookie of the Year, Cy Young and MVP...A nine-time All-Star, Verlander is tied with Clayton Kershaw for the most All-Star game appearances by an active pitcher... Verlander has started two Mid-Summer classics (2012 and 2019) and is one of 12 pitchers in major league history to start the All-Star game with two different clubs.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP KODAI SENGA (7-5, 3.31)

LAST TIME OUT: Threw a career-high 8.0 innings and struck out a career-high-tying 12 batters on July 5 at Arizona...Was the longest start by a Mets rookie since Steven Matz threw 8.0 scoreless innings on May 25, 2016 vs. Washington.

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: Senga joined Pete Alonso (2019), Dwight Gooden (1984), Jerry Koosman (1968) and Tom Seaver (1967) as the only Mets rookies selected to an All-Star Game...Senga was the eighth Japanese-born rookie ever selected to an All-Star Game and the first since Masahiro Tanaka (2014).

- Is tied for second in the NL and tied for third in the majors with 26 home runs...Tied for 10th in the majors and tied for sixth in the NL with 61 RBI...Ranks 20th in the NL with 50 runs...Is 14th in the league in SLG (.497).
- Has 13 long balls and 30 RBI in his last 40 appearances...15 of his last 33 hits have been home runs and 20 of his last 33 have gone for extra bases.
- Left the game on June 7 at Atlanta after a HBP...Returned on June 18 after missing eight games on the IL with a left wrist bone bruise and sprain.
- Hit a solo homer on June 4 vs. Toronto to set a Citi Field record with his 72nd career blast at the venue.
- Belted an opposite-field, game-tying grand slam on May 19 vs. Cleveland...Was his third career grand slam and the third game-tying slam in Mets history.
- His walk-off home run on May 17 was his fourth career extra-inning long ball...He is a .400 (10-25) hitter in extra innings with a 1.389 OPS in his career.
- Ranks fifth on the Mets all-time home run list with 172 homers...Howard Johnson (192) is next.
- Ranks 12th in franchise history with 441 career RBI...Up next: Kevin McReynolds (456) and Keith Hernandez (468).

- Homered in three-straight games for the first time in his career, July 4-6.
- His 17 homers this season are tied for the most by any catcher in the majors (Sean Murphy)...Owns the Mets franchise record for home runs by a rookie catcher...Ranks third among rookies in home runs this season.
- Hit three home runs in the Mets sweep of the D-backs, July 4-7...Also hit three homers in a three-game set in June vs. Atlanta...He is the only Mets rookie to hit three home runs in a three-game series twice.
- Hit a game-tying home run with two outs and two strikes in the ninth inning on July 5 at Arizona...Has five game-tying/go-ahead home runs in the sixth inning or later, the most by any player in 2023...It was his second game-tying home run with two outs in the ninth inning this season.
- Hit a solo home run on July 1 vs. San Francisco, his first since June 10, to tie Travis d'Arnaud's franchise record for home runs by a rookie catcher.
- Had his second multi-homer game of the season on June 8 at Atlanta...Only three other Mets have had more than one multi-homer game before turning 22: Darryl Strawberry (four), Ed Kranepool (three) and José Reyes (two)...Strawberry is the only other Met to have multiple in a single season (four in 1983).
- His 17 career homers before turning 22 years old are the most by a catcher since Iván Rodríguez had 21 from 1991-1993.
