Is the sixth game (2-3) of a 6-game, 7-day homestand against Pittsburgh (1-2) and Arizona (1-1)....following this homestand, the team takes a 6-game road trip to Washington (3g) and St. Louis (3g)....the Brewers return home on May 8 for 6 games in 7 days against New York-AL (3g) and San Diego (3g).

MANAGER:

Pat Murphy (353g, 205-148, .581) is in his third season as Brewers manager....he was voted NL Manager of the Year in 2024 and 2025....he is one of four managers ever to win Manager of the Year in consecutive seasons, joining the Braves' Bobby Cox (2004-05), Rays' Kevin Cash (2020-21) and Guardians' Stephen Vogt (2024-25)....Murphy was named the 20th manager in franchise history on 11/15/23, replacing Craig Counsell....he signed a multi-year contract extension on 2/20/26.

COACHES:

Returning from the 2025 staff is offense & strategy coordinator **Jason Lane** (11th season/1st in current role), pitching coordinator **Jim Henderson** (5th season/1st in current role), field coordinator **Néstor Corredor** (4th season/3rd in current role), pitching coach **Chris Hook** (8th season), bullpen coach **Charlie Greene** (3rd season), lead hitting coach **Eric Theisen** (2nd season/1st in current role) and third base coach **Matt Erickson** (3rd season/1st in current role)....assistant pitching coach **Juan Sandoval**, hitting coach **Guillermo Martinez**, hitting coach **Daniel Vogelbach** and first base coach **Spencer Allen** are all in their first seasons on the coaching staff.

IN THE STANDINGS (35 days):

The team has spent the following number of days alone or tied at each spot in the NL Central standings: **FIRST:** 16, **SECOND:** 1, **THIRD:** 5, **FOURTH:** 7, **FIFTH:** 6....the Brewers are currently in fourth place, trailing the first-place Reds by 3.5 games, second-place Cubs by 3.0 games and third-place Cardinals by 1.5 games....are ahead of the fifth-place Pirates by percentage points.

The Brewers have made 11 replay challenges this season, going 9-2....their last challenge (won) came on 4/29 vs. Arizona as a safe call at second base involving Nolan Arenado was overturned.

BREWING SUCCESS:

The Brewers have qualified for the postseason seven times in the last eight seasons and three seasons in a row....the team was just two games away from making the postseason in nine straight seasons (2017-25), missing out in both 2017 and 2022 by a single game....Milwaukee has won the NL Central in four of the last five seasons and three seasons in a row.

BREWING CONSISTENCY:

The Brewers, Astros and Dodgers are the only Major League teams with 86+ wins in each of the last eight full seasons (2017-25)....this does not include the shortened 2020 season....the Brewers have 778 wins since 2017, which ranks fourth in the majors behind the Dodgers (873), Astros (817) and Yankees (808).

WOODRUFF AT A GLANCE: Brandon Woodruff, 33, will be making his sixth start of the 2026 season....Woodruff last started last Friday vs. Pittsburgh and took a 6-0 defeat (5ip, 5h, 3r, 3er, 2bb, 3k, 1hr, 71 pitches)....the team is 3-2 in his starts....he has 2 quality starts....opponents are batting .217 (23-for-106, 4hr)....Woodruff was selected by Milwaukee in the 11th round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft out of Mississippi State University....he is signed through the 2026 season after accepting a qualifying offer on November 18 (declined his mutual option on November 3).

LAST SEASON: Woodruff went 7-2 with a 3.20 ERA in 12 starts with Milwaukee as he returned from October 2023 right shoulder surgery in July....the team went 10-2 in his starts....he had 6 quality starts....opponents batted .188 (45-for-239, 9hr)....he recorded 83 strikeouts in 64.2 innings....Woodruff was placed on the 15-day injured list on September 21 with a right lat strain, ending his season.

CAREER: Is 55-29 with a 3.13 ERA and 1 save in 147 games/132 starts (773.2ip, 603h, 282r, 269er, 196bb, 894k, 88hr)....is in his 10th Major League season, all with the Brewers (2017-26)....was a 2019 and 2021 All-Star....underwent surgery on 10/13/23 to repair the anterior capsule in his right shoulder, performed by Dr. Keith Meister, and missed the entire 2024 season.

SIMPLY THE BEST: Woodruff is the all-time franchise leader with a 3.13 ERA (min. 500ip)....his 894 strikeouts rank sixth in franchise history....**Jim Slaton** ranks fifth (929).

CAREER AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Is 30-10 with a 2.88 ERA in 74 games/67 starts (397.1ip, 127er)....is 1-1 with a 3.38 ERA in 3 starts this season (16ip, 6er).

CAREER ON THE ROAD: Is 25-19 with a 3.40 ERA in 73 games/65 starts (376.1ip, 142er)....is 1-0 with a 4.26 ERA in 2 starts this season (12.2ip, 6er).

CAREER vs. D-BACKS: Has gone 3-1 with a 4.81 ERA in 8 games/7 starts against Arizona (39.1ip, 31h, 21r, 21er, 13bb, 49k, 7hr), including a 7-5 win last season on 8/25 at American Family Field (5.2ip, 5h, 5r, 5er, 1bb, 8k, 1hr, 1hbp).

ODDS & ENDS: Woodruff graduated from Wheeler (MS) High School, where he played football and basketball in addition to baseball....he and his wife, Jonie, attended both high school and college together....he enjoys hunting, golf and fishing....his nicknames are "Woody" and "Big Woo."
