METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Cardinals, 7-3, on Sunday in St. Louis...The Mets have won four their last five games...The Mets continue a seven-game road trip (3-1) to St. Louis (3-1) and Atlanta (three games)...The Mets are off on Thursday before returning to New York for a 10-day, ninegame homestand against the Angels (three games), Rangers (three games) and Mariners (three games).

RIP: Bill Murray, who served the Mets front office in various roles from 1966-1980, passed away at the age of 85 yesterday in Bronxville, NY...He most recently served as the Vice President, Treasurer with the organization.

TO THINE OWN SELF BE TRUIST: Jeff McNeil has hit .374 (37-99) with 15 runs, nine doubles, two home runs, seven RBI, six walks with a .415 OBP and a .525 SLG in 26 career games at the home of the Braves...In 65 career games against Atlanta, McNeil is a .339 (83-245) hitter with 32 runs, 22 doubles, five home runs, 24 RBI, 10 walks with an .868 OPS.

JEFF McHITS: Jeff McNeil has safely hit in 14 of his last 16 games, batting .339 (21-62) with 12 runs, three doubles, three home runs, 12 RBI, and four walks with a .391 OBP and a .532 SLG in that span...In 35 games following the All-Star break, McNeil is batting .285 (39-137) with 21 runs, six doubles, one triple, three home runs, 20 RBI, seven walks with a .340 OBP...He has struck out only 12 times in 150 plate appearances following the All-Star break.

EIGHT DAYS A WEEK: New York has won six of its last eight games...The Mets are batting .271/.345/.495 and have posted a 3.80 ERA (30 ER/71.0 IP) during the streak...Over the last eight games, the Mets have outscored their opponents 53-30.

DINGERS: The Mets have homered in seven straight games, blasting 17 home runs in that span...It is their fourth-longest streak of the season...Overall, the Mets have hit 161 home runs, which is fourth in the National League.

MONTHLY REPORT: Pete Alonso has recorded nine home runs in 20 games this month...His career-best for any singly month is 11 home runs, which he recorded in 27 games in September of 2019...He has recorded five months with at least 10 home runs in his career...His next home run would mark the second time this year that Alonso has hit 10 homers in a single month...He hit 10 home runs in May...He also hit one home run in March and nine in April.

THIS IS ALMOST 40: Pete Alonso is third in the majors and second in the National League with 39 home runs...Alonso is one home run shy of recording his third season of 40 or more home runs...He socked 53 in 2019 and 40 last season...He is the only player in franchise history with multiple seasons of 40 or more home runs...Since he entered the league in 2019, only two other players have recorded multiple seasons with 40 or more home runs (Shohei Ohtani and Mike Trout)... Only one active player (Nelson Cruz, four) has more than three 40-HR seasons...Alonso's 185 home runs since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues...With one more long ball, he'll become the fifth player in MLB history with three or more seasons with 40+ home runs in a player's first five years...He would join Ralph Kiner (4), Ryan Howard (3), Albert Pujols (3) and Eddie Matthews (3).

THE ROAD TO 100: Pete Alonso is second in the majors and in the NL with 94 RBI...He has previously recorded two seasons with 100 RBI (120 in 2019 and 131 in 2022)...He is seeking to become the fourth player in Mets history to record three or more seasons with 100 or more RBI...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Carlos Beltrán and Darryl Strawberry recorded three seasons each.

GIMME A BREAK: Alonso is hitting .256 (32-125) with 20 extra-base hits, 33 RBI, 22 runs, 17 walks and a .990 OPS in 35 games following the All-Star break...He batted .211 (64-304) with 50 runs, seven one triple, 26 home runs and 61 RBI in the 82 games before the break.

LINSANITY: Lindor is on a seven-game hitting streak, batting .400 (12-30) in that span with seven runs, three doubles, five RBI, one walk and two steals... Over his last 53 games, he is batting .307 (61-199) with 41 runs, 11 doubles, two triples, 10 home runs, 31 RBI, 26 walks, 15 steals with a .391 OBP, a .533 SLG and a .934 OPS...Lindor has stolen 21 bases in 123 games this season, exceeding his total from 2022 (16 steals in 161 games)...His career-best is 25 steals 158 games in 2018.

I DECLARE fWAR: Francisco Lindor ranks fifth in the majors and fourth in the National League with a 5.0 fWAR...Since he joined the Mets, Lindor has posted a 16.0 fWAR...Only Freddie Freeman (17.9) and Mookie Betts (16.8) have posted a higher mark in the Senior Circuit...His 16.0 fWAR since 2021 ranks fifth in the majors in that span.

INVADER NIM: Over the last 12 games, Brandon Nimmo is batting .391 (18-46) with six runs, two doubles, three home runs, four RBI, eight walks, a .481 OBP and a .630 SLG...He is batting .294 (45-153) with 11 doubles, one triple, two home runs, 13 RBI, 12 walks with a .364 OBP and a .418 SLG against lefthanded pitchers this year... His .294 average is the ninth best in the majors by a left-handed hitter against fellow lefties.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are 27-39 on the road this year...They have posted a 4.82 ERA in away games...New York has played 66 games on the road this year...That is tied for the most in the majors.

150: Kodai Senga now has 154 strikeouts on the season...He became the seventh pitcher in franchise history to record at least 150 strikeouts in his rookie season...Senga is tied with Gary Gentry for sixth place among rookie pitchers in team history (Gentry had 154 in 1969)...His is the fifth pitcher of Japanese origin to post at least 150 strikeouts as a rookie, joining Hideo Nomo (236 in 1995), Yu Darvish (221 in 2012), Daisuke Matsuzaka (201 in 2007), and Kenta Maeda (179 in 2016)...Courtesy of sportsradar.

DOING THE SPLITS: Brandon Nimmo is batting .293 (71-242) with 35 runs, 11 doubles, three triples, seven home runs, 30 RBI, 34 walks, a .382 OBP and a .450 SLG on the road this season...This compares to a .238/.345/.444 slashline with 21 extra-base hits at home...Francisco Lindor is a .275 (71-259) with 47 runs, 19 doubles, two triples, 13 home runs, 50 RBI, 24 walks, a .345 OBP, and a .516 SLG on the road in 2023...He is slashing .223/.322/.398 with 18 extra-base hits at Citi Field this year.

IF YOU START ME UP: The Mets are 37-10 when the starting pitcher throws at least 6.0 innings...New York has gone 15-1 when its starter pitches 7.0+ innings and are a perfect 5-0 when the starter completes 8.0 innings.

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: On this day in 2005, Mike Jacobs hit his first career home run in his first career at-bat in a game at Shea Stadium....He is one of 13 players in franchise history who hit a home run in their first at-bat with the club...Jacobs is one of five players in Mets history to hit a home run in their first major league at-bat.

DOWN ON THE FARM: RHP Mike Vasil was dominant as the Syracuse Mets defeated the Columbus Clippers, 9-2, yesterday...Vasil hurled 6.0 innings and allowed one run on six hits with one walk and struck out four...He has struck out 53 in 50.1 innings at Triple-A this year...In 21 starts between two levels, Vasil is 4-4 with a 4.44 ERA with 34 walks and 110 strikeouts...Luke Ritter socked a two-run homer in the game...In 62 games with the Syracuse Mets in 2023, Ritter is batting .245/.359/.435 with 12 home runs and 32 RBI... Ritter has hit 26 home runs in 105 games across two levels this year.

LAST TIME OUT: Threw 3.2 innings in the Mets' 7-4 loss to the Pittsburgh Pirates at Citi Field...Allowed one run on three hits while issuing a career-high six walks and striking out five.

HOME OF THE BRAVE(S): Tonight, Peterson will make his ninth career appearance and eighth career start against the Braves...Has pitched to a 4-3 record and owns a 4.83 ERA (22 ER/41.0 IP) in those appearances... Faced the Braves at Citi Field this season on April 28...Threw 5.0 innings and allowed four runs on five hits while walking one and fanning six in the Mets' 4-0 loss...This will be Peterson's sixth time facing the Brayes on the road.

MAKIN' IT MAJOR: Since returning to the majors on June 27 after a stint with Syracuse (AAA), Peterson has pitched to a 2-1 record with a 2.41 ERA (9 ER/33.2 IP) in 12 games, six of which were starts.

A MINUTE IN THE MINORS: Peterson was optioned to Triple-A Syracuse on April 29, was recalled on May 9, then optioned again on May 16...In his first start with Syracuse following his May 16 option, he dealt 8.0 shutout innings, allowed just two hits and struck out nine...For his effort, he as named International League Pitcher of the Week...All told, he has made seven starts for the Syracuse Mets this season...Has a 1-2 record with a 4.86 ERA (20 ER/37.0 IP).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Over ten road outings (eight starts) this season, the southpaw has pitched to an 7.75 ERA (33 ER/38.1 IP)...This season, Peterson has pitched to a 2.88 ERA (11 ER/34.1 IP) in ten home outings (six starts).

LETHAL LEFTY: Peterson has limited lefties to a .239 (62-259) average in his career...He whiffed 32 of the 96 left-handed batters he faced last year, a 33 percent strikeout rate that ranked fourth among all left-handed pitchers to face a minimum of 90 LHB in 2022.

SLIP 'N' SLIDE: Peterson held batters to a .175 (24-137) average with his slider last season and 78 of his 126 strikeouts came on the pitch...His 52.0 slider-strikeout percentage was the second-highest in MLB (min. 150 PA) behind only teammate Edwin Díaz (54.7) and his 47.9 whiff percentage with the pitch was the thirdhighest in the majors behind only Díaz (54.7) and Seattle's Andres Muñoz (50.8).

STRIKE 'EM OUT, STRIKE 'EM OUT: Peterson struck out at least five batters in 11 straight starts from June 20-September 9 last season, the second-longest streak by a left-handed starter last season...It was the sixth-longest streak by a Mets left-handed starter in franchise history...Peterson had 82 strikeouts across 58.2 innings during that span (13 G/11 GS) good for a 12.58 K/9 ratio.

2022 RECAP: Set career-high marks in wins (seven), games (28), starts (19), innings (105.2), and strikeouts (126) last season...Went 7-5 with a 3.83 ERA for New York...Appeared mostly as a starter until mid-September...His final five appearances of the season came out of the bullpen...Went 6-5 with a 3.86 ERA (39 ER/91.0 IP) as a starter...In nine relief appearances, Peterson went 1-0 with a 3.68 ERA (6 ER/14.2 IP).
