METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Nationals in the final game of their four game series in Washington D.C....New York finished a sevengame road trip (3-4) to Cincinnati (1-2) and Washington D.C. (2-2)... Tonight, the Mets begin a six-game homestand against Tampa Bay (three games) and Cleveland (three games).

JUST IN TIME: Justin Verlander is set to make his Mets home debut tonight...He has made two previous starts at Citi Field, once in 2010 and again in 2022...In his last start on June 29, 2022, he tossed 8.0 scoreless innings, allowing two hits, a walk and striking out six in a 2-0 Astros victory.

IN THE CITI: The Mets are 7-8 at Citi Field this year...The team's 15 home games are the fewest in the major leagues...The team won 54 games at home last year...That was their highest total at Citi Field in franchise history...The last time the team won more than 50 games in New York was in 2000 when they went 55-26...Overall, the Mets went 54-27 at Citi Field...The team's .667 winning percentage was the fourth-highest in team history...Only the 1988 (56-24, .700), 2000 and 1986 teams (both 55-26, .679) had a better home winning percentage.

THEY'RE OUT OF MY LEAGUE: The new schedule format has New York playing a total of 43 Interleague games in 2023, more than double their previous high for a single season (20)...The Mets are 3-3 against the American League this year...Overall, New York owns a 238-230 record in Interleague play...The team's .509 winning percentage is the secondbest among National League clubs.

INTERLEAGUE PETE: Pete Alonso has hit 31 home runs in Interleague Play since the 2019 season...His 31 home runs against the American League is a franchise record, and the most among any player since 2019...Mike Piazza was the previous record holder with 28 Interleague home runs.

POWER OUTAGE: The Mets have not hit a home run since the second inning on May 10 in Cincinnati, when Pete Alonso hit a solo shot...The team has gone five games and a total of 52 innings without a home run...It's the team's longest homerless streak since they went six games without a blast from July 19-24, 2015...Overall, the Mets ranks 22nd in the majors and 10th in the NL with 41 homers.

FIRST IS THE WORST: The Mets have posted a 7.93 ERA (37 ER/42.0 IP) in the first inning this season, the highest mark in the majors...Outside the first frame, the Mets are pitching to a 4.30 ERA (151 ER/316.0 IP)...The Mets have been outscored 37-9 in the first inning this year...The Mets are 7-19 when their opponent scores first...On the other hand, the Mets are 13-2 when scoring first this season...Their .867 winning percentage when scoring first ranks second in the majors.

DOCTOR ROBERT-SON: David Robertson has pitched 15 games and allowed one run in 15.1 innings of work, good for a 0.53 ERA...He has allowed eight hits and five walks while striking out 24...He is holding lefthanded hitters to a .133 (4-30) average this season...He has converted all eight save opportunities he's had this season...Overall, he has recorded 164 saves in his career...That is the seventh-most among active players.

AND THEY'RE OFF: Starling Marte is tied for 12th in the majors and tied for sixth in the NL with 11 steals...He ranks third among active players with 325 career steals...Only Elvis Andrus (340) and Billy Hamilton (326) have more... The Mets are fourth in the National League with a 82.4% success rate in steals this season...The Mets are eighth the NL with 28 steals this season.

EMPIRE STATE OF MIND: Tomorrow, Mark Canha will light up the Empire State Building with his family at 11:00 a.m...The outfielder will turn on the lights in recognition of Food Allergy Awareness Week.

RAYS-METS NOTES: The Mets have dropped four straight to Tampa Bay and nine of their last 11 to the club.

BRIGHAM OUT, BRIGHAM OUT: Jeff Brigham has not allowed a run in his last six appearances....He has allowed two hits, a walk and struck out six in those 6.0 innings...Overall, Brigham has not allowed a run in 10 of his 12 appearances this season, posting a 2.77 ERA (4 ER/13.0 IP)...He has struck out 16 and allowed six hits and four walks in 13.0 innings this year.

WHAT A RELIEF: The Mets bullpen has held opponents to a .221 (128-579) batting average this season...That is the eighth-lowest mark in the majors and the second-lowest in the National League...They have allowed only 43 extra-base hits this year, which is the second-lowest in the National League.

STARTING PITCHING: Mets starting pitchers have tossed 202.2 innings this year, the fourth-fewest innings in the majors...They have surrendered 37 homers, the fifth-most in the majors...New York starters have issued 101 walks, the second-most in the majors...They are 14-17 with a 5.33 ERA (120 earned runs/202.2 innings)...Their 5.33 ERA is the fifth-highest in the majors and the third-highest in the National League.

METS ON THE MOVE: Mets on the Move, presented by the Hospital for Special Surgery, is a fitness program dedicated to keeping kids active and healthy by incentivizing them to track their steps throughout the month of May...The more steps they take, the more Mets prizes they will win...Mets pitchers Tommy Hunter and Brooks Raley joined members of the HSS Sports Safety Team at P.S. 110 and P.S. 22 to visit students for a fun Mets-themed workout...The pitchers helped lead different games and exercises throughout the day and encouraged the students to stay motivated throughout the remainder of the program, tracking as many steps as possible.

SHARE A MOMENT WITH MOM: The Mets teamed up with Northwell Health, The Susan G. Komen Foundation, and Major League Baseball to honor and recognize a strong woman in the community who has exemplified resilience, selflessness, and brought awareness to the fight against breast cancer, as part of the "Share A Moment with Mom" Mother's Day initiative...This year's honoree is Jovy Martins...Jovy is a breast cancer survivor, a loving wife and mother of two boys and has been a nurse for more than 23 years at the RJ Zuckerberg Infusion Center in Lake Success...Jovy will be presented a customized Mets jersey from Mets Manager Buck Showalter, attend batting practice, and will be honored in a pre-game ceremony.

AMAZIN' SCHOLARS RECEPTION: The Amazin' Mets Foundation celebrated all the accomplishments of our 2022-23 Amazin' Scholars by hosting a reception prior to tonight's game...Students from the Amazin' Scholars Program and recipients of the Amazin' Mets Foundation Scholarship Fund were invited to join their fellow scholarship recipients, faculty, and staff from LaGuardia Community College, Queensborough Community College, LIU and St. John's University in the Bullpen Plaza.. The students met with Mets Owner and President of the Amazin' Mets Foundation, Alex Cohen, and received tickets to enjoy the game. Through the Amazin' Scholars program and the Amazin' Mets Foundation Scholarship Fund, the Foundation seeks to help low-income students gain access to a life changing education without any financial burdens.

COUNTDOWN TO THE HOF: Infielder Howard Johnson, LHP Al Leiter and broadcasters Gary Cohen and Howie Rose will be inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame on Saturday, June 3 in a pre-game ceremony prior to the 4:10 p.m. game vs. the Blue Jays at Citi Field...The four new additions will bring the total membership of the Mets Hall of Fame to 34...Jay Horwitz will also be honored with the Mets Hall of Fame Achievement Award for his contributions to the organization.

VERLANDER NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his first career win as a Met on May 10 against the Reds at Great American Ballpark...Threw 7.0 innings and allowed one run on two hits, two walks and seven strikeouts...Retired 18 of the last 19 batters faced...Was his 33rd career game with at least 7.0 innings and two or fewer hits allowed, tied with Roger Clemens for the third-most such

30 FOR 30: With a win in his last start against the Reds, Verlander became the 21st pitcher in major league history to have at least one win against all 30 current major league teams... He joined Gerrit Cole, Zack Greinke and teammate Max Scherzer as the only active pitchers to have at least one win against all 30 current major league teams...Courtesy of Elias.

WELCOME TO THE CITI: Tonight, Verlander will make his Mets Citi Field debut...In two starts as a visiting pitcher at Citi Field, Verlander went 1-1 with a 4.50 ERA (5 ER/10.0 IP)... In his Citi Field debut, June 22, 2010, Verlander allowed five runs over 2.2 innings with the Tigers in a 14-6 Mets victory...12 seasons later, Verlander tossed 8.0 scoreless innings in a 2-0 Astros victory on June 29, 2022.

INCREDIBLE IN INTERLEAGUE PLAY: In 56 career interleague starts, Verlander is 38-9 with a 2.60 ERA (106 ER/367.1 IP)...In interleague play history, Verlander has the most wins, the third-best ERA among qualifiers and the third-most strikeouts at 412 trailing only Max Scherzer (447) and Zack Greinke (414)...41 of Verlander's 56 career interleague starts have been quality starts, one behind Greinke for the most in interleague play history.

3K AND COUNTING: Entering the 2023 season, Verlander was 12th on the all-time strikeout list with 3.198 strikeouts, five ahead of teammate Max Scherzer...Scherzer has since passed Verlander, but the pair remain close, with just nine separating the two...Entering last season, Verlander ranked 19th on the all-time with 3,013 career strikeouts, seven behind Scherzer... During the 2022 season, Verlander passed all-time greats John Smoltz, C.C Sabathia, Curt Schilling, Bob Gibson, Pedro Martinez and Fergie Jenkins...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time:

A TRUE COMEBACK STORY: In 2022, Verlander returned to the mound for the first time since July 24, 2020 and had a tremendous season after fully recovering from Tommy John Surgery...Verlander went 18-4 with a 1.75 ERA (34 ER/175.0 IP) in 28 starts with the Astros last season in route to his third career Cy Young Award and American League Comeback Player of the Year...His ERA was the lowest by an American League pitcher in a full season since Pedro Martinez had a 1.74 ERA (42 ER/217.0 IP) in 2000...lt was the third-lowest ERA by an AL pitcher and the ninth-lowest in the majors in a single season in the Divisional ERA (1969)...Verlander led the AL in ERA, wins, WHIP (0.83), opponent OPS (.497), opponent average (.186), opponent slugging percentage (.297) and hits per nine innings (5.97)...At 39 years and 227 days, Verlander became the fourth oldest Cy Young Award winnner in major league history behind Roger Clemens (2004, 42 years, 60 days), Gaylord Perry (1978, 40 years, 17 days) and Early Wynn (1959, 39 years, 267 days).

LIKE A FINE WINE: Verlander's ERA last season was the second-best in major league history by a pitcher age 39 or older behind Cy Young's 1.26 ERA in 1908 during his age 41 season (Min. 20 starts)...His 0.83 WHIP last season was the highest mark by a pitcher age 39 or above in major league history (Min. 20 starts)...Verlander's 185 strikeouts last season were the most by a pitcher in a season age 39 or older since John Smoltz struck out 197 batters in his age 40 season in 2007...His 18 wins at 39 were the most at the age since Mike Mussina won 20 games in his age 39 season in 2008.

THE RÉSUMÉ SPEAKS FOR ITSELF: Verlander is one of 11 pitchers with at least three Cy Young Awards...In 2011, Verlander took both the AL Cy Young and the AL MVP after winning the AL pitching triple crown after leading the league in after leading the league in wins (24), strikeouts (250) and ERA (2.40)...He is one of 11 pitchers to win both a Cy Young and MVP in the same season...Verlander and Don Newcombe are the only pitchers in major league history to have won Rookie of the Year, Cy Young and MVP...A nine-time All-Star, Verlander is tied with Clayton Kershaw for the most All-Star game appearances by an active pitcher... Verlander has started two Mid-Summer classics (2012 and 2019) and is one of 12 pitchers in major league history to start the All-Star game with two different clubs.
