...the Mariners wrap up the 2023 season with the last of 4 games against the Texas Rangers (2-1) after beginning the 7-game homestand (3-3) with a 3-game series against the Houston Astros (1-2)...today's game will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS** with **Dave Sims** and **Mike Blowers** on the call...game #162 will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** and **Mariners.com** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Aaron Goldsmith**.

ODDS AND ENDS

...the Mariners dropped last night's contest to the Rangers by a 6-1 score...the Mariners are 24-19 over their last 43 games, 32-22 over their last 54, 34-23 over their last 57, 37-24 over their last 61, 40-26 over their last 66 and 49-32 over their last 81 contests...the Mariners are 67-26 when scoring at least 4 runs and 20-48 when scoring 3-or-fewer...the Mariners are 44-36 at T-Mobile Park and 43-38 on the road this season...they are 28-28 in day games and 59-46 at night.

- Series Record** - Seattle owns a 26-23-2 series record (14-10-1 at home) this season, with a chance to win their final series of 2023 with a win today.
- Wake Me Up When September Ends** - The Mariners finished the month of September with an 11-17 (.353) record.
- Happy Birthday** - Left-handed pitcher **Robbie Ray** celebrates his 32nd birthday today.

WINNING SEASON

...the 2023 Mariners (87-74) recorded the 17th winning season in franchise history...with a win today, Seattle would have its 10th 88+ win team, joining 1997 (90-72), 2000 (91-71), 2001 (116-46), 2002 (93-69), 2003 (93-69), 2007 (88-74), 2018 (89-73), 2021 (90-72) and 2022 (90-72).

GOLD GLOVE CANDIDATES

...defensively, **Cal Raleigh's** 24 catcher caught stealings lead MLB, ranking ahead of Shea Langeliers-OAK (23) and Jonah Heim-TEX (22)...**Julio Rodríguez's** 12 Outs Above Average rank 3rd among American League outfielders, trailing Kevin Kiermaier-TOR (13) and Luis Robert Jr.-CWS (13)...**Eugenio Suárez'** 11 OAA rank 2nd among AL third basemen, trailing only Maikel Garcia-KC (13).

ALL 162 GAMES

...**Eugenio Suárez** has a chance to play in all 162 of the Mariners games this season...entering play Sunday, he is one of 4 players across the Majors to appear in all of his team's games, along with Matt Olson-ATL, Marcus Semien-TEX and Juan Soto-SD...Suárez would become the 5th different Mariners player to appear in 162 games in a season, joining Willie Horton (1979), Ruppert Jones (1979), Raúl Ibañez (2x, 2005, '08) and Ichiro Suzuki (3x, 2005, '08, '10).

THE J-ROD SHOW: AL MVP CANDIDATE

...**Julio Rodríguez** leads American League outfielders in fWAR (6.0), ranking ahead of Aaron Judge-NYY (5.2) and Luis Robert Jr.-CWS (5.0)...among AL outfielders with at least 400 plate appearances for the rate stats, Julio ranks 1st in hits (180), 2nd in stolen bases (37), T-8th in batting average (.276), 4th in home runs (32), 2nd in runs scored (102), 3rd in RBI (103), 9th in slugging percentage (.487), 9th in OPS (.822), 8th in wRC+ (127), T-2nd in doubles (37), 1st in total bases (317) and 2nd in extra-base hits (71)...in 2022, Julio won an AL Silver Slugger Award in his rookie season, alongside outfielders Aaron Judge-NYY and Mike Trout-LAA.

RALEIGH: SILVER AND GOLD

...**Cal Raleigh** leads Major League catchers in home runs (30) this season, and will do so in back-to-back seasons after leading catchers with 27 HR in 2022...Raleigh is the first catcher in Mariners history with a 30+ homer season...Cal also leads the Majors in catcher caught stealings this season, nabbing 24 would-be base stealers...Raleigh could become the first catcher in 30 years to lead the Majors in both categories (HR & CCS)...the last catcher to lead the big leagues in home runs as a catcher and catcher caught stealings in the same season was Hall of Famer Mike Piazza-LAD in 1993...Piazza led the way with 35 home runs and 58 catcher caught stealings.

J.P. 'WALKING' INTO HISTORY

...**J.P. Crawford** has set career-highs in home runs (19), RBI (65) and walks (94) and is on pace to set additional highs in on-base percentage (.381), slugging percentage (.441) and OPS (.822)...**J.P. leads the American League with 94 walks** this season, ranking ahead of Nathaniel Lowe-TEX (93) and Alex Bregman-HOU (92)...no Mariners player has ever led the league in walks in franchise history (ties included)...Crawford's .381 OBP ranks 4th in the AL.

- All Aboard** - Crawford has 2 grand slams this season (4/26 at PHI, 9/29 vs. TEX) and is batting .688 (11x16) with 26 RBI in 17 plate appearances with the bases loaded this year, the 7th-best batting average with the bases loaded in MLB history (min. 15 PA).

BRASH TIES FRANCHISE RECORD, TOPA IN TOP-5

...right-hander **Matt Brash** made his Major League-leading 78th appearance of the season yesterday, tying Ed Vande Berg (78 G in 1982) for most pitching appearances in a season in Mariners history...in Brash's 78 appearances, he is 9-4 with 4 saves, 24 holds and a 3.06 ERA (24 ER, 70.2 IP) with 29 walks and 107 strikeouts...the 25-year-old hurler is the youngest pitcher to make 78+ appearances in a season since Kevin Siegrist-STL (81 G in 2015) and the youngest right-hander to do it since Craig Kimbrel-ATL (79 G in 2011), when Kimbrel took home NL Rookie of the Year honors...right-hander **Justin Topa** made his 75th appearance of the season yesterday, tied for 2nd-most in MLB this season with Emmanuel Clase-CLE and trailing only Brash...Topa's 75 appearances are tied for 4th-most in a season in Mariners history with Mark Lowe (2009), trailing Brash and Vande Berg twice (78 G in 1982, 76 G in 1985)...Topa is 5-4 with 3 saves, 23 holds and a 2.61 ERA (20 ER, 69.0 IP) with 18 walks and 61 strikeouts.

NOW THAT'S WHAT I CALL QUALITY

...the Mariners have 3 pitchers with 18+ quality starts this season: **George Kirby** (19), **Luis Castillo** (18) and **Logan Gilbert** (18)...the trio makes up 3 of the 19 MLB pitchers to toss 18+ quality starts in 2023...the Mariners are the only team with 3 pitchers to tally 18+, while Toronto is the only other team with 2 (Chris Bassitt, 21 & Kevin Gausman, 20)...it marks the first time Seattle has had 3+ pitchers register 18+ quality starts in a season since 2011: Félix Hernández (22), Michael Pineda (19) and Jason Vargas (18).

AS YOU MAY KNOW

...**Julio Rodríguez** has produced 6.0 fWAR this season, 4th-most in the American League behind Shohei Ohtani-LAA (6.6), Marcus Semien-TEX (6.3) and Corey Seager-TEX (6.1)...**George Kirby's** 4.1 fWAR places him 7th among AL pitchers, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that the second-year stalwarts produced 5.4 and 3.0 fWAR, respectively, during their 2022 rookie campaigns?...Rodríguez and Kirby became the first position player/pitcher rookie duo to accumulate 5.0+ and 3.0+ fWAR, respectively, as teammates since Alvin Davis and Mark Langston did it for the 1984 Mariners, and...**DID YOU ALSO KNOW?**...that Rodríguez and Kirby are the first teammate duo in Major League history with 5.0+ and 3.0+ fWAR, respectively, in their follow-up season of their rookie campaigns?

ABOUT KIRBY...

- 25-year-old right-hander is making his 31st start of the season, 2nd against Texas...he is also making his 56th career start, and 3rd career start against the Rangers.
- Selected by the Mariners in the first round (20th overall) of the 2019 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Ty Holub.
- Played 3 seasons (2017-2019) at Elon University (NC), going 19-8 with a 3.30 ERA (88 ER, 240.0 IP) in 45 games (34 GS) with the Phoenix.
- Became the first rookie in MLB history to record a save in the postseason in his first career relief appearance.
- Graduated from Rye HS (Rye, NY) where he was named to the all-metro, all-state, all-section and all-league baseball teams 3 times.

**LAST TIME OUT...**W#12 in last start on 9/26 vs. HOU... pitched 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed 5 hits and 1 walk with 4 strikeouts.

**THESE BOOTS WERE NOT MADE FOR WALKING...**leads all qualified pitchers in the Majors with a 8.68 strikeouts-to-walk ratio, ranking ahead of Zach Eflin-TBR (7.75)... his 8.68 SO/BB ratio currently ranks as the 5th best in a single season in American League history among qualified starting pitchers.

**QUALITY KIRBY...**with his outing against Oakland on 9/20 Kirby recorded his 11th quality start with no walks allowed this season which leads the majors...he has 19 quality starts this season which is ranks 6th in the American League...pitched 8 consecutive quality starts (4/9-5/26), his longest quality start streak in his career...his 8-game quality start streak is tied for the 2nd longest streak in the Majors this season.

**ON ANOTHER LEVEL...**has made 7 starts this season where he has pitched 7.0+ innings and not allowed a walk which is the most in the Major Leagues this season...he currently ranks ahead of Zach Eflin-TBR and Logan Webb-SFG (6)...George now has 8 such starts in his career.

**NO FREE PASSES...**has the fewest walks allowed through a pitcher's 30 starts in a season in franchise history with 19...he currently ranks ahead of Logan Gilbert who allowed 32 walks through his first 30 starts this season...his 19 walks allowed are also tied for the 5th fewest in the first 30 starts of a pitcher's season in MLB history.

**NIFTY FIFTY...**through his first 50 career starts Kirby recorded 275 strikeouts and 36 walks...his 7.64 strikeout-to-walk ratio is highest in Major League history through a pitcher's first 50 career starts...Kirby ranks ahead of Shane Bieber (6.00), Corbin Burnes (5.81) and Masahiro Tanaka (5.73).

**CAREER-HIGH INNINGS...**threw 9.0 innings and allowed only 3 hits, 0 runs, 0 walks and struck out 7 over 103 pitches in his start against BAL on 8/12...his 9.0 IP is a new career high (previously: 8.0, 2x, last: 5/31/23 vs. NYY)...the last time a Mariners pitcher tossed 9.0+ innings in a team loss was Félix Hernández on 7/26/13 vs. Minnesota.

**ALL-STAR IN SEATTLE...**pitched 1.0 inning in the 2023 All-Star Game on July 11... Kirby pitched the 4th inning, becoming the 4th Mariners pitcher to appear in an All-Star Game in Seattle, joining Freddy Garcia, Jeff Nelson and Kazuhiro Sasaki, who all pitched in the 2001 All-Star Game...this was Kirby's 1st career All-Star appearance.

**CAREER-HIGH STRIKEOUTS...**matched a career high in strikeouts for a single game with 10 in his start against Minnesota on 7/20...this was the 7th instance this season of a Mariners pitcher recording at least 10 strikeouts in a start...he joined **Logan Gilbert**, **Bryce Miller**, and **Luis Castillo**...Castillo has recorded 10+ strikeouts in a game three times this season.

**LUCKY NUMBER 7...**pitched 7.0 innings in his last outing against Oakland...this marked the 11th time this season Kirby has pitched at least 7.0 innings in a game...he is tied for the 3th most 7.0+ inning games in the Majors this season.

**TRIPLE SEVENS...**pitched at least 7.0 innings in 3 consecutive starts (4/27-5/9)...this marked a career high in consecutive games with at least 7.0 innings pitched...prior to the streak, Kirby had never pitched 7.0+ innings in consecutive games...during the streak Kirby was 2-1 with a 1.64 ERA (4 ER, 22.0 IP) and allowed 2 walks while striking out 18.

**KIRBY'S COMPLETE...**pitched his first career complete game on 4/27 against Philadelphia, tossing 8.0 innings allowing just 1 run on 4 hits and 1 walk with 7 strikeouts...he became the first Mariners pitcher to lose a complete game since Taijuan Walker on Sept. 24, 2014 in a 1-0 loss at Toronto.
