### Texas Rangers (18-20) at Detroit Tigers (25-13)

**WE'RE WHERE THE HEART IS:** A mere dozen days since last we met like this, the Detroit Tigers tonight begin a six-game homestand with the first of three games against the Texas Rangers ... the Tigers return to Comerica Park on the heels of seven wins in their last eight games thanks to an exceptional 7-3 road trip through Houston (1-2), the L.A. Angels (3-1) and Colorado (3-0) ... after this weekend, Detroit finishes the homestand against Boston with three games starting Monday.

- At 25-13 overall, the Tigers are tied with the Dodgers for the best record in all of baseball and, at 13-3, have the best home record in the A.L. while playing the fewest home games of any team in the A.L. ... and yes, the Tigers have the overall best record in the A.L. despite playing more road games than any other team in the A.L. this season.
- With a 13-3 record at home, the Tigers have begun a season by winning 13 of their first 16 home games for the first time in 114 years when they started off 13-3 at Bennett Park in 1911.
- The Tigers woke up this morning within the month of May (or later) with at least a share of the best record in the majors for the first time since May 23, 2014 ... thanks to Elias.
- The Tigers have won their first five home series for the first time since 1942, though that run 83 years ago included a pair of one-game series victories.
- This past road trip plus the Eastern time zone series in Detroit was the first time in Tigers history that they played four consecutive series in each of the four time zones in the continental U.S.

**WATCH OUT FOR HIGH WATER:** With yesterday's doubleheader sweep in Denver, the Tigers moved a season-best 12 games above .500 this season, already matching, in 38 games, their best high-water mark last year of 86-74 that took 160 games to reach ... at 25-13, they have their best record to start a season through 38 games in 11 years when they began 26-12 in 2014.

- The Tigers have gone 25-10, a .714 winning percentage, in their last 35 games starting March 31 since enduring a three-game sweep to start the season at Dodger Stadium ... their 25-10 record starting March 31 is the best record in all of baseball in that span ... the Tigers have come all the way back to equal the Dodgers' record despite their opposite starts to the season.

**WHAT HAVE YOU DONE FOR ME LATELY?:** When last we met in Detroit, the Tigers were wrapping up an 8-2 homestand and about to embark on their 11-day, 10-game, three-city road trip, which they completed yesterday with a 7-3 record ... the Tigers have gone 15-5 in their last 20 games during this stretch that featured their longest homestand and longest road trip of the season.

**HOME OWNER:** Tigers ace and reigning unanimous Cy Young Award winner Tarik Skubal tonight makes his fourth start this year at Comerica Park, where he has gone 12-1 with a 1.86 ERA (25 ER/121.0 IP) in 19 starts since the start of 2024 ... his 12 home wins are tied for the major-league lead during that span while his 1.86 ERA and .923 winning percentage rank second in the majors.

**ZACH ALSO OWNS HIS OWN HOME:** Zach McKinstry leads the majors with a .467 batting average (21-for-45) at home this season, a whopping 70 points ahead of his next closest competitor in New York's Francisco Lindor and his .397 home batting average ... McKinstry has a .545 OBP and a .711 slugging percentage at home, good for a 1.257 OPS, also best in the majors.

**EL MAGO IS BACK!:** Javier Báez yesterday went 2-for-5 with a double and RBI (in game one) to extend his hitting streak to nine games, his longest hitting streak in more than two years ... Báez has a pair of four-RBI games in his last six games, plus a four-run-scored game in that stretch ... Báez is now batting a team-leading .317 (33-for-104) with an .835 OPS, easily his best early season numbers since his N.L. MVP runner-up campaign of 2018 with the Cubs ... he now has seven extra-base hits (4 2B, 3 HR), 11 runs scored and 14 RBI in his last seven games starting April 27.

- Báez's nine-game hitting streak is tied for the fourth-longest active streak in all of baseball.

**THIS DIFFERENCE ISN'T NEGLIGIBLE:** The Tigers begin the day with the best record in the A.L. on the strength of a +83 overall run differential this year, the best mark in all of baseball, light years ahead of the next-best Yankees (+61) ... the Tigers have a +97 run edge on the Cleveland Guardians (-14), occupants of second place in the A.L. Central.

**POP, POP, FIZZ, FIZZ:** The Tigers bullpen has combined to post a 2.43 ERA (34 ER/126.0 IP) this season, the lowest relief ERA in the A.L. and the third-lowest mark in all of baseball, barely behind only San Francisco (2.33) and San Diego (2.42).

**HE'S JUST THE PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Riley Greene soared into this series as the reigning American League Player of the Week after he batted .464 (13-for-28) with four homers and eight RBI in seven games last week, recording at least one hit in every game ... Greene made major league history a week ago tonight in Los Angeles when he became the first player to ever hit two homers in the ninth inning of a game ... this is the first weekly honor of Greene's career, the first by a Tiger since Keider Montero in September of last season and first position player since Miguel Cabrera in 2022.

**AND FINALLY:** The Tigers yesterday scored double digits in runs in both ends of a doubleheader for the first time since August 31, 1947 at the St. Louis Browns.

- Went 3-1 with a 1.52 ERA (5 ER/29.2 IP) with 38 strikeouts and only four walks in five starts in April, a tick better than his April of 2024 when he went 3-0 with a 2.05 ERA (7 ER/30.2 IP) with 35 strikeouts and six walks in five starts en route to winning the A.L. Cy Young Award in unanimous fashion.
- Named the Tigers Opening Day starter for the second consecutive season...went 2-0 with a 2.33 ERA (5ER/19.1IP) in five starts in Spring Training, striking out 24 batters compared to just one walk
- Was the unanimous AL Cy Young winner in 2024, becoming the fifth Tiger to win the award, the first since Max Scherzer in 2013, and the second LHP in franchise history to ever do so (other, Willie Hernandez in 1984).
- Started 31 games last year, posting an 18-4 record with a 2.39 ERA (51ER/192.0IP) and 228 strikeouts...his 18 victories were the most by a Tigers pitcher since Max Scherzer also won 18 in 2014.
- Won the American League Pitching Triple Crown, finishing first in wins (18), ERA (2.39) and strikeouts (228)...became the third pitcher in franchise history and the 22<sup>nd</sup> pitcher in Major League history to win the Triple Crown, joining Justin Verlander (2011) and Hal Newhouser (1945).
- From Sept. 3, 2023-May 17, 2024, Skubal had a 10-0 record with a 1.48 ERA (14ER/85.0IP), 12 walks, 109 strikeouts and four home runs allowed...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, Skubal is the third starting pitcher since 1913 to have a 14-start span with an ERA below 1.50, 100-or-more strikeouts, 12-or-fewer walks and four-or-fewer home runs, joining Clayton Kershaw (twice, 9/29/15-6/4/16 and 5/1/16-9/19/16) and Jacob deGrom (4/5/21-7/1/21) while being the only starter with such a stretch while also earning 10 wins.
- Started three games during the postseason, compiling a 1-1 record with a 2.37 ERA (5ER/19.0IP) and 20 strikeouts...started his playoff career by not allowing a run in 17.0 consecutive innings, tied for the fifth-longest streak in MLB history and longest since Ian Anderson started his postseason career with 17.2 straight scoreless innings in 2020.
- Became the fourth pitcher in franchise history to throw 6.0-or-more shutout innings in his first career playoff game (Oct. 1), joining Max Scherzer (2011) and Joe Coleman (1972)

- Placed on the 15-day injured list on April 18 with right ankle inflammation...activated by Detroit on May 3.
- Made his first career Opening Day roster in 2025
- Pitched in 46 games (12 starts) for the Tigers in 2024, finishing with a 4-5 record, 3.59 ERA (27ER/67.2IP) and 69 strikeouts...set career-best marks in strikeouts, wins, holds (6), opponent batting average (.224), slugging percentage (.354) and OPS (.664).
- Started on Sept. 13 and 14 vs. Baltimore last season, becoming the first Tigers pitcher to start back-to-back team games, which were on consecutive days, since George Uhle on Aug. 4-5, 1929.
- Pitched in six games during the playoffs, combining for a 0-1 record, two saves, 1.50 ERA (1ER/6.0IP) and six strikeouts.
- Made his postseason debut on Oct. 1 at Houston, walking one in a scoreless two-thirds of an inning to pick up the save...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the first pitcher in franchise history to record a save in his first career playoff game.
- Started his postseason career with 5.1 no-hit innings with two walks and six strikeouts in his first four outings.
