RAY REPORT—The Rays continue a nine-game, 11-day, season-opening road trip through St. Louis (1-2), Milwaukee (1-2), and Minnesota (0-1, two to play) tonight at Target Field...marks the longest road trip to begin a season in club history...are opening with a road trip for the eighth time, first since 2021, and second time in the last 17 seasons (2010-26)...will return to Tropicana Field on April 6 vs. CHC, their first game at the ballpark in 561 days (Sept. 22, 2024 vs. TOR)...have started 2-5 (or worse) for the eighth time, first since 2018 (1-6)...need to win tonight to avoid a 2-6 (or worse) start for the fifth time (2-6 in 2018; 1-7 in 2018, 2011, 2001)...are tied for fourth in the AL East, 4.0 GB the first-place Yankees (6-1)...have spent two days in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth.

- ★ The Rays yielded seven runs in the 7th inning of yesterday's 10-4 loss, their MLB-most third time allowing six runs or more in a frame (also: 8R on March 26 at STL - 6th inn.; 7R on April 1 at MIL - 8th inn.)...the Diamondbacks (2) are the only other team with multiple such innings.
- ★ Of the 48 runs the Rays have permitted, 21 (43.8%) have come in those three innings...only the White Sox (56) have allowed more runs this season, and the last Tampa Bay squad to permit more runs through seven games was the 2007 Devil Rays (54).
- ★ The Rays need to win the next two games to avoid losing their first three series for the fourth time, joining 2018, 2011, and 2001...they are 0-8-1 in their last nine sets dating back to Sept. 4-7 vs. CLE, their longest stretch of winless series since Sept. 10, 2007-April 10, 2008 (0-6-3), with their last longer streak coming from Sept. 4, 2006-April 22, 2007 (0-10-4)...their most recent series win was a three-game sweep from Sept. 1-3 vs. SEA.
- ★ Tonight, **Steven Matz** will look to become the 11th Rays pitcher to win each of his first two starts with the club, first since **Ian Seymour** last season...Matz would join Seymour, **Josh Fleming** (2020), **John Halama** (2004), and **Joe Kennedy** (2001) as the only southpaws to turn the trick.

BABY, IT'S COLD OUTSIDE—Last night's 38-degree first-pitch temperature was tied for third-coldest in franchise history (see table to the right)...according to the National Weather Service, tonight's forecast calls for a 37-degree temperature at first pitch in Minneapolis...after yesterday's game, the Rays have now played 16 contests with a gametime temperature of 40 degrees or colder, going 8-8...two of those 16 games were played at Target Field (also: 8-2 win on April 27, 2011 - 40°).

★ If tonight's forecast holds, it would mark the second time the Rays have had 40-degree or colder first-pitch temperatures in back-to-back games, joining April 8-9, 2018 (38° at BOS, 35° at CWS).

BOOTS AND BLUNDERS—The Rays have committed three errors in back-to-back games for the third time in the last 22 seasons (2005-26), joining Sept. 19-20, 2025 and Sept. 17-18, 2012, and the eighth time in franchise history...their majors-leading 12 errors are their most through seven games and the most by any team since the 2024 Athletics had 13...the Rays previous fewest games to reach 12 errors was nine, done in 2003...the 12 errors are tied for their most on any road trip of nine games or fewer, matching May 8-15, 2012 (8G)...they have committed an error in each of their first seven games for the first time, tied with the Mariners in 2019 and Cleveland in 2005 for the second-longest season-opening streak by any team in the Wild Card era (since 1995) behind the 1996 Brewers (8)...the miscues have resulted in nine unearned runs, tied with the Diamondbacks for second most in the majors to the Angels (11).

★ The bullpen has yielded multiple runs in six of seven games and ranks 30th in the majors with a 10.48 ERA (22.1IP, 26ER)...their 31 total runs allowed are tied for the most in baseball along with the White Sox...before this season, the last MLB bullpen to yield 31 runs (or more) through seven games was the 1995 White Sox (33)...the 10.48 ERA surpasses 2012 (10.38) for the highest by any Tampa Bay bullpen through the club's first seven games and is the highest mark in the majors since the 1993 Brewers (11.57).

★ The Rays have led in each of their first seven games, including all five losses...they are the first team to hold a lead in each of their first five losses since the 2023 Dodgers (5), per Stats Perform, and this marks the longest season-opening streak in club history...the last longer streaks in MLB belong to the 2011 Athletics and White Sox (both led in first six losses)...the Rays have scored first in five consecutive games, including 1st-inning runs in three of the last four contests.

ON THE BRIGHT SIDE—The Rays pace the AL in batting average (.268) and singles (49), ranking second in hits (68) to the Astros (69)...they have tallied 12 doubles in their last five games since March 29, tied with the Rockies for second in the majors to the Astros (14), after having none in their first two...they are third in the AL in on-base pct. (.333) and total bases (100) while ranking fourth in runs per game (4.9) and OPS (.727)...the Rays have been out-hit only once in seven games (April 1 at MIL).

★ The starting rotation has pitched to a 0.95 WHIP, fourth in the majors behind the Yankees (0.69), Blue Jays (0.76), and Mariners (0.82) and third in franchise history through seven starts behind the 2015 (0.76) and 2019 (0.86) rotations...only the Yankees (4.1%) have posted a lower walk rate than Rays starters (5.3%)...the Rays staff as a whole leads the AL in first-pitch strike rate (64.4%).

MR. RELIABLE—**Yandy Diaz** has reached base safely 16 times (13H, 3BB), tied for third most in Rays history through the team's first seven games (see table to the right)...his MLB-leading 13 hits are tied with **Carl Crawford** (2003) for third most in such a span behind **Quinton McCracken** (16) in 1998 and **Evan Longoria** (14) in 2009...the club records for hits and times on base through eight games are 16 (McCracken) and 19 (Iwamura, 2007), respectively.

HOLDING DOWN THE FORT(ES)—**Nick Fortes** is the first catcher in franchise history to reach base safely in each of the Rays first seven games and has a career-high nine-game on-base streak overall dating back to Sept. 25, 2025...his eight hits while playing catcher lead the majors and are tied for most in Rays history through seven team games, matching **Toby Hall** (2004, 2002) and **John Flaherty** (2000)...Fortes' 6 RBI as catcher are the most by a Ray in such a span since Flaherty (7) in 2000...Flaherty also holds the club records for hits (11) and RBI (8) as a catcher through eight team games.

★ He is one of four catchers to appear in each of the Rays first seven games of a season, joining **Hank Conger** (2016), **René Rivera** (2015), and **Toby Hall** (2005)...Hall holds the record for most consecutive games played by a Rays backstop to begin a campaign (8).

★ All eight of Fortes' hits have come off fastballs (8-for-17/.471)...he has whiffed on only two of his 35 swings on heaters (94.3% contact rate)...his 84.7 pct. contact rate overall is eighth in the AL.

★ He has hit safely in a career-high 11 consecutive starts dating back to Sept. 17, 2025 vs. TOR, batting .341 (14-for-41) with 2 2B, 1 HR, and 7 RBI in those games...it marks the longest streak by a Rays backstop since **Wilson Ramos'** club-record (for a catcher) 17-game streak from April 14-May 12 (G2), 2018.

★ Fortes and **Chandler Simpson** are the first pair of teammates to both reach base safely in each of the Rays first seven games since **Kevin Kiermaier** and **Steven Souza Jr.** in 2017.

JONNY ROCKETS—**Jonny DeLuca** has hit safely and recorded an RBI in all three of his starts, going 5-for-12 (.417) with 1 2B, 1 HR, and 4 RBI in those games...he is looking to become the fifth Ray to tally an RBI in each of his first four starts...he would join **Jose Siri** (5G, 2023), **Manuel Margot** (4G, 2021), **Evan Longoria** (4G, 2009), and **Jorge Cantú** (4G, 2005)...in seven total games, DeLuca has already recorded the three hardest hits of his career (109.0-mph homer, two 108.1-mph singles).

CASH CONSIDERATIONS—**Kevin Cash** has 898 wins in his managerial career, two shy of becoming the fourth active skipper with 900 career victories...he would join CIN **Terry Francona** (2,037), DET **A.J. Hinch** (967), and LAD **Dave Roberts** (949)...Cash would also become the ninth manager in MLB history to reach the mark while managing only one team in his career, joining LAD **Walter Alston**, LAA **Mike Scioscia**, LAD **Tommy Lasorda**, BAL **Earl Weaver**, MIN **Tom Kelly**, DET **Hughie Jennings**, PIT **Danny Murtaugh**, and STL **Red Schoendienst** (Stats Perform).

TWIN CITIES SHOWDOWN—The Rays and Twins continue a six-game season series this afternoon at Target Field after splitting, 3-3, in 2025...the Rays are unbeaten (2-0-1) in the last three season series and are 5-2-3 in the previous nine (2016-25; clubs did not meet in 2020)...before yesterday's 10-3 loss, each of the Rays previous seven games at Target Field (Sept. 13, 2023-July 6, 2025) were decided in the final at-bat, their longest streak at any ballpark, home or away, in franchise history (Stats Perform)...12 of the last 16 meetings between these clubs have been decided by two runs or fewer, including 10 one-run games.

★ The Rays are 4-1-1 in their last six series against the Twins since 2023...they have won two of three series at Target Field in that span.

★ Since the start of their last series at Target Field (July 4, 2025), the Rays are 6-14 vs. AL Central opponents, including 4-9 on the road.

TONIGHT'S START—Steven Matz takes the ball for his second start as a Ray tonight at Target Field...marks his 174th career start and fourth opposite the Twins...enters his 12th major league season and first with the Rays...is one of 14 active left-handed pitchers to cross the 1,000-inning mark for his career (1,009.1) and one of four in the AL along with NYY Max Fried (1,086.0), NYY Carlos Rodón (1,282.0), and DET Framber Valdez (1,086.2)...signed a two-year deal with the Rays on Dec. 16, 2025.

LAST TIME OUT—Earned the win in his first start as a Ray on March 29 at STL...he went 5.0 innings and allowed four runs on six hits, one walk, and one home run with two strikeouts...marked his first win since July 5, 2025 at CHC (w/STL) and his first win as a starter since April 16, 2025 vs. HOU (w/STL)...at 34 years, 303 days, was the oldest pitcher to start for Tampa Bay in his club debut since Corey Kluber (36.000) on April 10, 2022 vs. BAL.

THE TEAM FORMERLY KNOWN AS SENATORS—Matz will be making his fifth career outing and fourth career start against the Twins...in those four prior games, he is 1-0 with a 3.24 ERA (16.2IP, 6ER), 15 strikeouts, and one save...he has allowed two runs or fewer and pitched 3.0 innings or more in each outing.

- * In his most recent outing on March 30, 2025 vs. MIN (w/STL), he pitched 4.0 scoreless innings with one hit and two strikeouts to earn a save...it is one of two 4.0 inning saves by a Cardinals pitcher since 1999 (also: Zack Thompson - June 3, 2022 at CHC)...it was one of 11 4.0 inning or more saves in the majors last season.
- * Matz is 7-1 with a 2.32 ERA (108.2IP, 28ER) in 28 career appearances (16 starts) opposite AL Central foes.

ON THE ROAD—Matz went 3-1 with a 2.41 ERA (33.1IP, 9ER) over 22 appearances (1 start) away from home last season, the ninth-best road ERA among all left-handers in the majors (min. 30.0IP)...this includes a 0.90 ERA (11.0IP, 1ER) with one save and two holds in nine road appearances following the All-Star break, all in relief...the only run he allowed in that span was a solo homer to TB Brandon Lowe on Sept. 21 at Steinbrenner Field...the long ball was Lowe's 30th of the campaign, making him the third Ray with multiple career 30-homer seasons along with Evan Longoria (4) and Carlos Peña (3)...it was one of only three homers Matz yielded to left-handed batters on the season, all of which came with the Red Sox (also: Sept. 1 vs. CLE - Kyle Manzardo; Aug. 17 vs. MIA - Jacob Marsee).

- * His victory over the Cardinals on March 29 at Busch Stadium was his first win in a road start since Aug. 12, 2023 at KC.

A TALE OF TWO ROLES—Matz returns to a major league starting rotation for the first time since opening the 2024 season as the Cardinals No. 4 starter, a role he filled until a lower back strain cost him four months (May 1-Sept. 1)...for his career, he is 56-59 with a 4.33 ERA (902.1IP, 434ER) in 173 starts vs. 5-3 with a 3.20 ERA (107.0IP, 38ER) over 74 outings in relief.

- * Last season, he made a career-high 51 relief appearances against only two starts, his first time working primarily out of the bullpen...in his first 10 MLB seasons (2015-24), he made 170 starts and 23 relief appearances.
- * Matz is one of two active pitchers with 150 starts or more and 50 relief appearances or more in his career, joining ATL Chris Sale (314 starts, 81 relief appearances).

IN CONTROL—Matz produced a career-best 3.6 pct. walk rate last season, lowest among major league left-handers and third lowest overall (min. 75.0IP) to SF/NYM Tyler Rogers (2.3%) and DET Janson Junk (2.9%)...he did not issue a walk in 44 of his 52 appearances...he ended the year with 19.2 consecutive frames without a walk from Aug. 9 on...the 19-appearance, season-ending run tied CLE Cade Smith for the longest in the majors and was the longest by a left-hander since PIT Tony Watson (26G) in 2013...after walking Jonathan India on Aug. 4 vs. KC, Matz did not record a free pass against any of his final 75 BF in 2025.

THE ARSENAL—He relied on a four-pitch mix last season, using his sinker 58.4 pct. of the time...his most-thrown secondary offering was his curveball (21.8%)—Matz held opponents to a .197 clip (13-for-66) against the offering, ninth lowest on any MLB left-hander's curve...they batted a combined .264 (60-for-227) in at-bats ending with his sinker, changeup, or slider.

BEEN AROUND THE BLOCK—Matz enters the 2026 season with 10 years, 99 days of service time, most among Rays...he reached the 10-year mark last June and was one of 16 left-handed pitchers to appear in the majors last season to conclude the year with a decade of service time...joined Tyler Anderson, Andrew Chafin, Aroldis Chapman, Patrick Corbin, Andrew Heaney, Rich Hill, Wade Miley, Martín Pérez, Drew Pomeranz, José Quintana, Robbie Ray, Carlos Rodón, Eduardo Rodríguez, Chris Sale, and Justin Wilson.

2025 RUNDOWN—Matz set career bests in ERA (3.05, min. 40.0IP), WHIP (1.10), walk rate (3.6%), opp. on-base pct. (.280), home runs per 9.0 IP (0.94), and chase rate (29.8%) across a career-high 53 appearances (2 starts) between the Cardinals (32G/2GS) and Red Sox (21G)...was acquired by Boston on July 31 for INF Blaze Jordan...posted a 2.08 ERA (21.2IP, 5ER) with a 0.88 WHIP with the Sox compared to a 3.44 ERA (55.0IP, 21ER) and 1.18 WHIP as a Cardinal...pitched to a 0.73 ERA (12.1IP, 1ER) over 11 appearances in August, tied for ninth in the AL (10.0IP), during his first month in Boston...saw his first playoff action since his 2015 rookie season with the Mets, throwing a pair of scoreless frames across Games 2 and 3 of the Red Sox ALWC Series loss to the Yankees.

MLB CAREER RUNDOWN—In 2023, pitched to a 2-1 mark with a 2.14 ERA (42.0IP, 10ER) in eight appearances (3GS) with the Dodgers...began the year on the 15-day IL (left oblique strain) and was transferred to the 60-day IL on April 21 before making his season debut on Aug. 19 vs. MIA...from his debut through season's end, led the NL in WHIP (0.76) while ranking third in ERA behind SD Blake Snell (1.02) and NYM Kodai Senga (2.06).

- * In 2022, went 3-0 with a 3.47 ERA (36.1IP, 14ER) in nine appearances (7GS) spanning seven stints with the Dodgers...made his MLB debut on May 11 at PIT and earned his first win on July 5 vs. COL...went 9-1 with a 2.56 ERA (91.1IP, 26ER) over 19 outings (17GS) with Triple-A Oklahoma City.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTER @ BREWERS: RHP NICK MARTINEZ (0-0, 3.00)

LAST TIME OUT—Took the no-decision in his first start as a Ray on March 30 at MIL after allowing 2 ER on 6 H (HR) with 3 SO across 6.0 IP in a 3-2 victory over the Brewers...became the 19th Ray to log a quality start in his debut with the club, the first since Brendan McKay on June 29, 2019 vs. TEX.

vs. TWINS—Martinez has faced the Twins seven times (6 starts) in his career, going 1-2 with a 7.20 ERA (30.0IP, 24ER) with 28 SO...is 3-1 with 2 saves and a 3.33 ERA (27.0IP, 10ER) with a .230 (23-for-100) opp. AVG over his last eight road outings against AL Central clubs.
